
Guv praises CM Mamata's upcoming Oxford lecture

GI-tagged jaggery from UP exported to **Bangladesh despite** strained relations

MI News Service, New Delhi: In the midst of a continuous diplomatic row between India and Bangladesh since last year over a number of issues, including attacks on the minorities, a consignment of 300 tonnes of GItagged jaggery from Uttar Pradesh has been shipped to Bangladesh as a goodwill gesture from India. Informing this an official statement said on Saturday that a Geographical Indication (GI) is primarily an agricultural, natural or manufactured product like handicrafts and industrial goods originating from a definite geographical territory. Typically, such a name conveys an assurance of quality and distinctiveness, which is essentially attributable to the place of its origin. "This initiative also marks the beginning of direct exports of jaggery from western Uttar Pradesh to Bangladesh through Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) and Farmer Producer Companies (FPCs)," the statement said adding Muzaffarnagar region of Western UP is renowned for its high-quality sugarcane. After long delay Mamata Banerjee leaves for London on Saturday night for a week-long working visit

MI News Service, Kolkata: After a long unusual delay because of the closure of London's Heathrow airport, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee will finally leave for the British capital via Dubai on a Saturday late night flight for a week-long visit. The Chief minister and her entourage including state Chief Secretary Manoj Pant and others, were to leave for urday. But her flight was delayed for abour 20 hours because of a power outage at London's Heathrow Airport early on Friday. As a result of the accidental fire at the nearby power grid, the entire operation of Europe's and the busiest (Heathrow)airport was immedi-



shut down cancelling nearly 2,000 incoming and outgoing flights from across the globe and causing immense trouble to lakhs of travellers from everywhere including from India and Kolkata.

However, the situation was

gradually became normal at the airport after about 18 hours last night (local time) as the authorities worked round the clock to restore power at the airport on a war footing . As a result after almost a day's wait finally, the Chief Minister will leave for London via Dubai on a Saturday night flight. After a brief stop over at Dubai, Mamata's flight will land at Heathrow airport on Sunday morning (according to London time). Though initially it was thought that her plane will land at Gatwick Airport, also in as an emergency London. arrangement, but later it was decided that her flight will indeed

land at Heathrow airport. Since Heathrow is the busiest

Delhi Police busts illegal Bangladeshi immigration racket; 8 held, six deported

MI News Service, New Delhi: Delhi Police claimed to have busted an illegal immigration network, arresting eight Bangladeshi nationals and as many Indian accomplices, who were facilitating their unlawful stay in south Delhi, an official said on Saturday. Six other immigrants were deported via the Foreigner Regional Registration Office (FRRO), while four more are under scrutiny, he said.

During the crackdown, police uncovered a fake identity document syndicate and a cross-border money laundering racket that routed funds to Bangladesh through digital payment apps. Some of the immigrants had even enrolled their children in local schools, he added.

The network allegedly helped Bangladeshi migrants enter India illegally and provided them with shelter, employment, and forged Aadhaar, PAN, voter ID cards, and even Indian passports," Deputy Commissioner of Police (DSP) (South) Ankita Chauhan said. Among those arrested was Md Alamgir (34), who came to India in 2007 and worked as a scrap dealer. He had married an Indian

aged 13 and 9. His younger brother, Md Jewel Islam (27), arrived in 2021 and was also engaged in the scrap trade, the officer said. Another accused, Md Rejaul, had been living in India since 2000 and had obtained an Indian passport, allow ing him to between India and Bangladesh frequently. He allegedly used his travels to transport money and other goods, Chauhan said. Police also identified one Kamruzzaman, who entered India in 2014 and was working as a delivery agent for an online food delivery platform

using forged identity documents, he said. Meanwhile, Mohammad Nadeem Sheikh was employed as a cleaner and sweeper in Delhi and Md Latif Khan (37), a resident since 2015, worked as a ragpicker and frequently remitted money to Bangladesh through informal channels, he added. The DSP further said that Md Mizanur Rehman (43), who came to India in 2022, was working as a scrap dealer in Kotla Mubarakpur, while Rabiul (25), who arrived the same year, was employed as a hospital

Bengali films rooted in social consciousness, literature, remarks Guv Ananda Bose



Paying rich tributes to the director trio of Satyajit Ray, Mrinal Sen and Ritwik Ghatak, West Bengal Governor C V Ananda Bose on Saturday said Bengali films have been rooted in social consciousness and literature. Addressing the 'Purbo Bharat Big Picture Summit' of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), Bose said he hails from Kerala and heard a lot about Ray and other renowned filmmakers renowned filmmakers from Bengal at a very young age. 'I watched Ray, Ghatak

and Sen's films; these were great names that had inspired film lovers in Kerala besides Bengal," he said. The Governor said he watched Ray's Apu trilogy
- 'Pather Panchali',
'Aparajito' and "Apur
Sansar', Sen's 'Ekdin Pratidin' and films made by Ghatak. "Their works show how Bengali cinema is rooted in social consciousness and literature,"

Referring to 'Ekdin Pratidin', Bose said, "I was struck by the storyline where the complexity of human mind comes to the fore in the wake of the return of a missing woman home in the morning as anxiety gives way to suspicion." Noting that Bengali movies "seek truth" more in their narratives rather than going for spectacular effects, Bose said that in works of masters like Sen and Ghatak, "Cinema lies in the arena of radical ideas and social introspection." He also dwelt on the rich literary tradition of Bengali cinema and the role of musical scores.

Bose referred to the rich tribute paid to Ray by filmmakers like Akira Kurosawa of Japan and Richard Attenborough of the UK. "Remember what Kurosawa had said about Ray - not watching Ray's cinema means living in a world where the sun or moon does not exist," he

Bose said India boasts of one of the greatest soft powers - in culture and heritage - and the world of cinema, particularly of Bengal, has an important role in this regard. Ace film director Goutam Ghosh, Bengali film superstars Prosenjit Chatterjee and Rituparna Sengupta attended the session organised by CII's Forum for Films and Entertainment

M K Stalin favours legal fight on the issue of Delimitation of **Parliamentary seats** MI News Service, Chennai

Saturday that fight for the proposed delimitation of Parliamentary seats by the Centre, is likely to be taken forward through the legal route. Participating in the first Joint Action Committee meeting of states, hosted by the ruling DMK here, Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan also said that delimitation of LS seats was hanging like the "sword of Damocles," and alleged that the BJP government was going ahead with the issue without any consultation. He said "This sudden move is not driven by Constitutional principles or democratic imperatives,' but by narrow political interests. Delimitation, if done after Census will lead to an increase in seats for Northern states and a reduction for Southern states. Such a cut in seats for the South and, an increase for the North will suit the BJP as it holds greater influence



in the North. In his address at the meeting, CM Stalin, favoured setting up of an expert panel to draw up the political and legal action plan. He proposed christening the panel as 'Joint Action Committee for fair delimitation' and sought ideas to initiate legal action, by taking forward political fight. He said: "We are not against delimitation, we are for fair delimitation," adding "Continuous action is very essential to establish rights." On the JAC he said it was very essential to create awareness among people, and to urge Centre.

JFK assassination related records reveal past CIA secrets and several sensitive personal data

MI News Service, Washington (DC): After President Donald Trump's announcement last week, history buffs dove into thousands of pages of government records released online on Thursday, hoping for new nuggets about former US President John F Kennedy's assassination. Instead they found revelations about the wide global network of US espionage in the massive document dump that also exposed some previously redacted personal information. After Trump's announcement ans the signing of his Executive Order in this regard, the US National Archives and Records Administration have posted more than 63,000 pages of records on its website.

However, many of these

documents were already released previously, but they had hid the names of CIA sources or details about its spying and covert operations in the 1960s. Kennedy was killed on Nov 23, 1963, during a visit to Dallas. As his motorcade finished its parade route downtown, shots rang out from the Texas School Book Depository building. Police arrested Lee Harvey Oswald, who had positioned himself from a sniper's perch on the sixth floor. Two days later, night club owner Jack Ruby fatally shot Oswald during a jail transfer broadcast live on television. The latest release of documents pumped new energy into conspiracy theories about the assassination. Kennedy scholars said



they haven't seen anything out Oswald, a 24-year-old ex-Maof line with the conclusion that rine, was the lone gunman.

The chase for the truth will go on forever, I suspect," said Philip Shenon, who wrote a 2013 book about the killing of JFK. "It's a big document dump, but it doesn't include everything", he stated further. The vast majority of the National Archives' collection of more than 6 million related pages of records, photographs, motion pictures, sound recordings and artifacts had already been released before the archives posted about 2,200 files online this week. Writers, historians and conspiracy promoters have spent decades pushing for the release of all the records. In the early 1990s, the federal government mandated that all assassination-related documents be housed in a single collection in the National Archives and Records Administration. The collection was required to be opened by 2017, barring any exemptions designated by the President.

According to researchers and the FBI, roughly 3,700 files held by federal authorities still been haven't released. Trump's order also called for declassifying the remaining federal records related to the 1968 assassinations of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy and the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. Scholars and history buffs described the latest release as rushed and expressed frustration that going through the files one by one represented a random search for unreleased information. We've all heard the reports about the lawyers staying up all night, which I believe, because there's a lot of sloppiness in this, said Larry Sabato, director of the University of Virginia Center for Politics and author of The Kennedy Half-Century.

Scholars and history buffs grumbled that, unlike past releases, the National Archives didn't provide an index or workable search tool. Also, the files included material generated after the 1960s, and some people listed in the records were angry to find out that sensitive information about them including revealed, Social Security numbers. They include Joseph diGenova,

ring in the future. Viswa-Bharati University shuts doors to tourists, citing unspecified reason.

However, in a press re-leased issued today, the university's public relations officer stated that the ashram premises will not be opened to tourists presthe need for adequate planning, infrastructure, and rules before reopening the present to tourists. The decision has come as a disappointment to tourists who were eagerly looking forward to visiting the iconic ashram premises. The university had earlier closed to premises to tourist during the COVID-19 pandemic and had not reopened them since. The reversal of the decision has raised questioned about the university's management and communication. The university's administration has assured that the ashram premises will be opened to tourist in the future, but only after planning and infrastructure are in place.

Patients Flee in Panic Amid Unbearable Conditions

MI News Service, Malda: A chaotic scene unfolded at the RN Roy Rural Hospital in Malda, West Bengal, on Saturday after a massive snake was spotted inside the hospital premises. The reptile's presence sent patients, families, and healthcare workers fleeing in panic. According to eyewitnesses, the snake was seen slithering into the balcony of the X-ray department, emerging from the emergency department, and roaming freely within the hospital. The sudden appearance of the snake triggered widespread fear, with patients and staff rushing to escape the premises. This incident comes on the heels of a similar snake sighting at a local primary school in Malda's English Bazar Municipality, where students and parents were left shaken.



Cyclone and hailstorm wreak havoc, destroy crops and homes

MI News Service, Pachim Medinipur: A sudden and intense cyclone hailstorm struck Dantan, Paschim Mednipur district on Friday evening, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake. The disaster damaged hundreds of bighas of land under Boro cultivation in Dantan 1 n\and 2 blocks, uprooted several trees, and blew off the roots of over 20 house. The storm also caused extensive damage to farmland, betel nut trees, and homes in several villages, including Palashiya, Bamanda, Kariya, Kulida, and Mulida. The hailstorm, which lasted only a few minutes, left a thick layer of hailstones on the ground, causing significant damage to crops and property. The

A massive fire engulfed a paper box manufacturing factory in Narkeldanga on Saturday morning, triggering panic among local residents. The blaze, which erupted around 8 AM, quickly spread, blanketing the entire area in thick black smoke. Upon receiving the alert, the fire department dispatched seven fire engines to the scene, where emergency efforts to douse the flames commenced immediately. The inferno was first spotted by locals, who noticed dense smoke billowing from the factory. Within moments, flames became visible, intensifying fears among nearby residents. The factory is located in a congested area, residential flats situated directly above it. As the fire escalated, residents evacuated their homes in haste, assisting in initial firefighting efforts before professional responders arrived. The fire department was promptly notified, and seven fire tenders were deployed to combat

the blaze. However, the narrow lanes and dense urban landscape posed significant challenges for firefighters. Despite these obstacles, the fire brigade managed to bring the situation under control after a prolonged battle. However, by late morning, the fire was yet to be completely extinguished, with intermittent flames still being

doused. During the intense op-eration, two firefighters sustained injuries while working to contain the inferno. Their condition remains stable, and they are receiving medical attention. The cause of the fire is yet to be determined, but preliminary reports suggest that the factory lacked adequate fire safety measures. Residents allege that the absence of a proper fire suppression system contributed to the rapid spread of the flames. Authorities have launched an inquiry into the incident, with efforts underway to contact the factory's owner, who is reportedly not a local resident.

Collection of tourist tax falters in Sikkim, move going **Darjeeling municipality way**



MI News Service, Darjeeling: The Sikkim government has decided to collect tourist tax, but the move is going the Darjeeling way. The Darjeeling municipality has attempted to collect tourist tax at least four times since 2008 but has not succeeded. Sources said the Sikkim government planned to collect ₹50 per visitor as the tourism sustainable development (TSD) funds under the Sikkim Registration of Tourist Trade Rules, 2005.

The funds are meant to enhance tourism infrastructure and services, sustainable promote tourism and preserve the cultural heritage of Sikkim. Among the most visited northeastern Sikkim records more than 10 lakh tourists a year.

Sources said the government planned to levy the one-time tax on guests staying overnight and it was valid for a maximum of 30 days or until the tourists exited the state, whichever was earlier. Children under five years, government employees and local people are exempted from the tax. The state wants hotels to collect the tax and transfer the amounts to a designated government account with relevant data every week. The tax was to be collected from March 14. "The process is yet to be fully implemented as hoteliers in Sikkim have a similar reservation as expressed by their counterparts in Darjeeling when the hill town wanted to charge a similar tax," said a source Representatives of hotel owners in the Himalayan state and tourism department officials met in Gangtok on Tuesday to discuss the issue.

"The tourism stake-

holders felt that the collection should be done at a central point and the burden should not be imposed on the hotels," said a source.Darjeeling hoteliers, too, had a similar objection. "The tax could be clubbed either with permits or entry fees in some major tourist points," said a hotelier from Gangtok. Some tourism stakeholders also suggested that the government introduce a QR code so that the tax could be directly credited to the government. "Collecting the tourist tax at the hotel levels comes with complications and is a burden on the hotel management," said the hotelier. The sources said at the meeting on Tuesday, the tourism department officials asked the tourism representatives to submit their suggestions in writing so that the matter could be taken up with the "policy-makers". In August 2024, the Darjeeling municipality decided to collect ₹20 each from a visitor. According to the Bengal Municipality Act, civic bodies cannot charge more than ₹3 per tourist a day. The Darjeeling municipality had made similar moves before also.

Dilip Ghosh Sparks Controversy Again with Derogatory Remarks, Triggers Protests in Kharagpur

MI News Service, Kharag-pur: Former Bengal BJP chief Dilip Ghosh has ignited a fresh controversy with his derogatory comments in Kharagpur, prompting protests from Trinamool workers and supporters. Ghosh's remarks, which targeted those who criticize him, have been condemned as misogynistic and inflammatory. Ghosh's outburst came after he faced opposition while inaugurating a road in Kharagpur on Friday. Local women questioned his authority to inaugurate the road, given that he is not an MP or MLA. Ghosh responded by asserting his influence and knowledge of the area, sparking further outrage. The former BJP state president has a history of makcontroversial statements, which have

often landed him in trouble. He has been reprimanded by his own party for his intemperate comments and Ghosh's remarks have also been criticized by other politicians, with many calling for him to apologize and retract his statements.

The incident has triggered a political firestorm in West Bengal, with the BJP and Trinamool Congress engaging in a war of words. The protests in Kharagpur are a testament to the growing outrage against Ghosh's comments, which many see as a reflection of his misogynistic and authoritarian attitude. MI News Service, Bakura: A growing crisis is unfolding in West Bengal's agricultural sector, as farmers in Bankura district claim that substandard chemical fertilizers, pesticides, and seeds are being sold to them, resulting in reduced yields and increased costs. Farmers report that to achieve the same yields as before, they now require 20 kg of chemical fertilizer, up from 3 kg previously. This has led to suspicions about the quality of fertilizers being sold in the market. Furthermore, pesticides are reportedly losing their effectiveness, with some farmers claiming that pests return within 3-4 days of application, compared to the previous 10-day effectiveness. The quality of seeds is also under scrutiny, particularly for rice cultivation. Farmers allege that certified seeds are being mixed with local seeds, resulting in poor yields and high costs. This has led to concerns about the authenticity of certified seeds being sold in the market. Farmers in Bankura district, which is a major producer of rice, potatoes, and vegetables, are bearing the brunt

Adventure sports training for hill youths by GTA, aim to create job opportunities

MI News Service, Darjeeling: The Gorkhaland Territorial Administration (GTA) has sent 10 youths from the region to Uttarakhand for specialised training in adventure sports. The aim is to boost adventure tourism and create jobs for hill

GTA officials said the batch of 10 has gone for an advanced course. Six of them will be trained to work as team leaders on trekking expeditions and the other four will be trained in kayaking, a common water sport. Dawa Sherpa, the field director of GTA's tourism department, said adventure tourism has witnessed a

steady rise in hills in recent years, drawing both domestic and international tourists. The training, he said, started on March 13 and will continue until March 29.

"We want to create a pool of trained professionals in the hills for adventure tourism. Once these 10 youths return from Uttarakhand, they will conduct training sessions to teach the skills to others. We believe this will be a self-sustaining cycle of learning and employment that will benefit youths of this region," said Dawa. A source in the GTA said the training, spanning 16 days, will cover practical and theoretical aspects of trekking leader-

ment. "The participants will learn navigation, first aid, crisis management, and sustainability practices. The skills they acquire will help them secure employment in the tourism sector and position them to mentor others," said a source. The candidates for training were chosen from among 50 local youths who had undergone basic training under a joint initiative of the GTA, the Union tourism ministry and the Adventure Tour Operators Association of India (ATOAI). "We wanted to ensure that those who showed dedication and potential got the opportunity to further refine their

skills," said an official. In the hills, tourism has been one of the most viable sources of income for many

families for years The GTA is now focusing on skill development to boost tourism and also ensuring that the local population is directly benefitted. There are plans to establish a paragliding institute in the GTA area," said Dawa. Basic and advanced courses on paragliding would be available at the proposed institute. "Any boy or girl who has completed his/her twelfth standard can join the paragliding training course which would span eight to 10 days," he added.

State govt introduces new digital transfer and posting system for police

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a major administrative reform, the West Bengal government has introduced a new digital system for police personnel seeking transfers and postings. From now on, written applications will no longer be accepted, and all requests must be made exclusively through the PPMS mobile app and the e-HRMS portal. This decision, announced by the Nabanna Secretariat, marks a significant shift in how police personnel manage their career movements.

Police officers seeking a transfer closer to home or a new posting must submit their applications online between March 18 and April 11, 2025. However, applications related to medical emergencies will be accepted year-round. This move aims to eliminate bureaucratic delays and provide a more transparent and efficient process for police personnel. Under the new rules, Sub-Inspectors (SIs), Assistant Sub-Inspectors (ASIs), Motor Transport ASIs, Constables, Lady Constables, and Police Drivers can apply for transfers or postings online. The introduction of this system has been widely welcomed by police personnel, as it removes the need for personal lobbying or dependency on superiors for approvals. One of the most striking aspects of this reform is that all previous written applications will be considered void. Officers who previously submitted requests in written form will now have to reapply through the online system. This sud-den change has left some police personnel concerned, as they now need to resubmit their requests digitally. To ensure a seamless transition, the government has decided to set up "Help Centers" in each district and police unit headquarters. These centers will be staffed with trained personnel to assist officers in submitting their applications online. Additionally, the government has instructed disand unit-level authorities to implement the new system swiftly and ensure all police personnel are informed about the changes. The authorities have emphasized that officers must use only the digital platform for transfer requests, reinforcing the move towards a pa-

Firhad Hakim addresses key civic and political issues in Kolkata and Howrah

State initiates disciplinary action against teachers over missing student funds

The West Bengal government has launched a disciplinary probe against three teachers following allegations of misappropriation of funds meant for students under 'TarunerSwapno' (Dream of the Youth) scheme. The West Bengal Board of Sec-Education (WBBSE) has issued showcause notices to the accused teachers, initiating a departmental investigation

According to official sources, the School Education Department has di-MadhyamikShiksha-Parishad (Board of Secondary Education) to begin an internal probe against the teachers. The investigation was prompted by police reports that linked the disappearance of funds to certain teachers.

The missing funds scandal surfaced when students reported that ₹10,000, which was meant to be credited into their bank accounts for purchasing educational tablets, had mysteriously disappeared. The state government, under Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's initiative, had sanctioned this amount for Class XI and XII students

MI News Service, Kolkata: to support their education. However, complaints from multiple schools revealed that the money had vanished from student accounts, leading to massive public outcry and official Following the revela-

tions, the Chief Minister herself expressed deep dissatisfaction over the mismanagement of funds. In response, the School Education Department issued strict directives to identify the culprits and ensure accountability. The probe, backed by police findings, led to the suspension of three teachers, who have now been ordered to explain their roles in the scandal. The Taruner-Swapno scheme was designed to empower students with digital access by providing them financial assistance to purchase tablets. However, the recent fund misappropriation case has raised serious concerns about transparency in the system. The government has assured that strict action will be taken against anyone found guilty of tampering with student funds. Additionally, authorities are closely monitoring financial disbursements in schools to prevent any future irregularities.

IPL ticket black market scandal: 3 arrested in Kolkata

MI News Service, Kolkata: Kolkata is set to host the grand opening of the Indian Premier League (IPL) today, Saturday, with Bollywood superstar Shah Rukh Khan and other celebrities gracing the inaugural ceremony. Following the event, the much-anticipated first match between Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) and Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) will take place at Eden Gardens. The excitement surrounding the game has led to an overwhelming demand for tickets, resulting in widespread black-market sales.

Authorities have taken swift action, arresting three individuals in connection with ticket scalping. On Friday, two young men, PiyushMahendra Kamal Hossain, were apprehended in central Kolkata for their involvement in illegal ticket sales. According to police sources, Dheeraj Mali, a potential buyer, came across an advertisement on social media claiming IPL tickets were available. Upon contacting the seller, he was directed to meet at Girish Park. Mali handed over ₹20,000 in cash in exchange for an envelope supposedly containing tickets. However, upon opening it. he discovered only two tickets worth ₹2,000 each, realizing he had been duped. Following his formal complaint at the Girish Park police station, law enforcement launched an investigation. On Friday, they arrested PivushMahendra and Kamal Hossain from Mitra Lane, seizing 17 tickets, four premium-category tickets of high value, ₹20,600 in cash, and two mobile phones used in the operation. The crackdown continued on Saturday when another suspect, Shahbaz Khan, was caught in the New Market area. Acting on a tip-off, police raided Marquis Street and arrested him. Six tickets for the day's match were resion.

The menace of black-market ticket sales has become a recurring issue during IPL seasons, with previous incidents of betting rackets also coming under scrutiny. The key figure behind the identity forgery syndi-cate was Md Moinuddin, who operated a computer shop in Delhi and was responsible for manufacturing fake birth certificates and other documents, they said. The forged papers were then used to create Aadhaar, PAN, and voter ID cards, which in turn allowed the immigrants to access jobs and government services, they added. Police said that Moinuddin worked closely with three enrollment Aadhaar agents -- "Zulfiqar Ansari, Javed, and Farman Khan -- who used their official authorization to register the illegal immigrants into the government database. Investigations also revealed the financial aspect of the racket, with two li-

censed forex agents, Manwar Hussain and Nimai Karmakar, who allegedly managed the transfer of illicit funds to Bangladesh, DCP Chauhan said. Hussain, who worked at Dargah Hazrat Nizamuddin, collected money from illegal Bangladeshi migrants and facilitated its transfer through a hawala-like system, he said. Karmakar and another agent, Gouranga Dutta, allegedly handled currency exchanges, further enabling the network to operate undetected, the officer added. Police also recovered 23 voter ID cards, 19 PAN cards, 17 Aadhaar cards, 11 birth certificates, six blank voter ID cards, and a computer CPU used for document forgery, he said. A case has been registered under the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) for forgery and conspiracy, along with sections of the Foreigners Act, 1946, and the Aadhaar Act, 2016, police said. Further investigation is underway, they said.

a former campaign lawyer for Trump. His personal information was on documents relating to his work for a U.S. Senate select committee that investigated abuses of power by government officials in the 1970s, including the surveillance of US citizens. He is planning to sue the US National Archives and Records Administration for violating privacy laws. "I think it's the result of incompetent people doing the reviewing," he said. "The people who reviewed these documents did not do their job. White House officials said a plan was in place to help those whose personal information was disclosed, including credit monitoring, until new Social Security numbers are issued. Officials are still screening the records to identify all the Social Security numbers that were released. The latest release represented a boon to mainstream historians, particularly those researching international relations, the Cold War and the activities of the CIA. One revelation was that a key adviser warned President Kennedy after the disastrous Bay of Pigs invasion of Cuba in 1961 that the CIA had grown too powerful. The aide proposed giving the State Department control of all clandestine activities and breaking up the CIA. The page of Special Assistant Arthur Schlesinger Jr.'s memo outlining the proposal had not been released before. A previous release of part of his memo redacted Schlesinger's statement that 47 per cent of the political officers in U.S. embassies were controlled by the CIA. Schlesinger's plan never came to fruition. Timothy Naftali, an adjunct professor at Columbia University who is writing a book about JFK's presidency, said scholars likely now have more details about US intelligence activities under Kennedy than under any other President. It's quite remarkable to be able to walk through that secret world, he said.

"The Bet" - A short story by Anton Chekhov, known for its philosophical depth, has also been eliminated and "Tara" – A play by Mahesh Dattani, which deals with gender discrimination, has been removed from the drama

Meanwhile, the new additions to the syllabus are: "Riders to the Sea" by J.M. Synge, an Irish one-act play renowned for its portrayal of human struggle against destiny. This play will be studied across both the third and fourth semesters, ensuring a more in-depth analysis for students. Apart from the syllabus revisions, changes have also been made to the exam Multiple-Choice structure: Questions (MCQs) will now be a mandatory part of the third semester's examination. In the fourth semester, students must answer compulsory descriptive questions, making con-

The official notification regarding these modifications will be dispatched to all higher secondary institutions soon. Educators and students are advised to stay updated with the new syllabus to avoid any last-minute confusion before the academic assessments.

The frequent syllabus changes have sparked discussions among teachers and students alike, with many questioning the impact of such sudden revisions on exam preparations. However, authorities have assured that the adjustments are aimed at enhancing literary comprehension and aligning with modern academic standards. As the education system

In response, water tankers have been deployed to supply drinking water to affected residents. The municipal authorities have assured that there is no imminent risk of further subsidence and expect the situation to stabilize by

The crisis began on Thursday when a landslide occurred at the Belgachia dumping ground, causing extensive damage. The impact led to fractures across a 1.5-square-kilometer stretch of roads and ruptured a crucial water pipeline supplying North Howrah and Shibpur constituencies. The damaged pipeline, approximately one kilometer long, has severely disrupted water supply in the area, leaving residents struggling for drinking water amid sweltering heat.

To mitigate the crisis, Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) has deployed 15 water tankers, ensuring continuous supply until the pipeline is fully repaired. Additionally, tankers have been dispatched from Uttarpara, bringing the total number of water tankers operating in the area to 28. Meanwhile, 350 residents from 18 severely affected families have been relocated to a local school for safety.

Authorities have reassured residents that no fur-

pected and that restoration efforts are progressing swiftly. Despite this, certain areas continue to experience water shortages. Officials have set Monday as the target for restoring nor-

On March 5, the Indian Army said, a young man and woman from the villages of Basgran and Kamalkote tragically "drowned" in the Jhelum River. In response, the Indian Army immediately launched an extensive search operation to recover their bodies.

"Despite sustained efforts, their remains could not be located. On March 20, the Indian Army spotted the body of the deceased male in the kistani armies coordinated thankful to our Police and

Jhelum River. A rescue team, including deep-sea divers, was promptly deployed to retrieve the remains. However, due to strong water currents, the body drifted beyond the Line of Control (LoC) into the Chakothi sector of Pakistan-Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (POJK), making recovery from the Indian side impossible. In a demonstration of humanitarian cooperation, the Indian and Pa-

Speaking at a press conference after the meeting, CM Fadnavis, who also serves as the state's Home Minister, said that the violence was triggered by media alleging that a holy CM Fadnavis said. 'chadar' had been burnt on He commended

that day. "I chaired a high-level meeting regarding the violence, which was also attended by state minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule. I reviewed every detail and shared my thoughts... The tomb of Aurangzeb was burnt that day when this incident occurred. Following the incident, a case was registered with the police. However, some people spread a rumour via podcasts and social media posts that a holy 'chadar' was burnt. This led to rioters pelting stones, torching vehicles and attacking shops in Nagpur,"

He commended the police for bringing the situation under control swiftly. "Despite the intensity, the police brought the situation under control within 4-4.5 hours. They did everything to control the situation. However, many police personnel, including three DCP-level officers, were injured in the incident. A total of 104 people have been identified, of whom 92 have been arrested...The police will continue to make further arrests," the CM said.

Current antivirals may be leseffective against severe infection caused by bird flu virus in cows' milk: Study



Washington DC [US] : Scientists found that frequently used flu antivirals do not work well against the H5N1 avian influenza virus in cows' milk

Existing antivirals may be less effective against this H5N1 bird flu strain, and prevention measures, such as avoiding raw milk consumption and reducing exposure in dairy workers, maybe the most effective way to protect against the virus.

As the H5N1 avian influenza outbreak continues in the United States, scientists are working to better understand the virus's threat to human health.

The virus has been found in dairy cows' milk and has infected farm workers, prompting scientists at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital to study potential treatments.

Results showed that in a pre-

clinical model, two FDA-approved flu antivirals generally did not successfully treat severe H5N1 Additionally, the infections. researchers found that the route of infection, whether through the eye, the nose or the mouth, significantly impacts a treatment's effectiveness.

The findings were published

today in Nature Microbiology.
"Our evidence suggests that it is likely going to be hard to treat people severely infected with this bovine H5N1 bird flu strain," said corresponding author Richard Webby, PhD, St. Jude Department of Host-Microbe Interactions.

"Instead, reducing infection risk by not drinking raw milk and reducing dairy farm workers' exposures, for example, may be the most effective interventions."

Though H5N1 infections in people are rare, there are more

than 60 people who have become infected from dairy exposures to date in the current outbreak.

Some were infected through exposure to contaminated raw cows' milk, such as dairy workers who were infected through splashes or aerosolized particles reaching their noses or eyes

Given the risks to human health, the scientists used a mouse model to test how each antiviral drug worked against the virus when it was obtained through three different exposure routes. "In general, baloxavir [Xofluza] caused a greater reduction in viral levels than oseltamivir [Tamiflu], but neither was always effective," said first author Jeremy Jones, PhD, St. Jude Department of Host-Microbe Interactions

The researchers studied exposure routes that included the eye, mouth and nose, which are the most common ways to become infected with the virus. The oral route, which mimics drinking raw infected cow's milk, caused the worst infections that were hardest to treat. In contrast, findings showed that baloxavir controlled infections through the eye fairly well. These results are particularly relevant as the ocular route appears to be the common infection pathway for people who work directly with

Union Government approves infusion of Rs 11,400 crore for revival of RINL plant

New Delhi: The Government of India has approved infusion of Rs 11,440 crore as Equity/ Preferential capital in RINL, to sustain the operations of RINL and to keep it as a going concern, a press release from Ministry of Steel said. Chandigarh (Punjab) : Bhartiya Kisan Union (Lakhowal) leader Harinder Singh Lakhowal and Samyukt Kisan Morcha leader Raminder Singh refused to attend a meeting called by the Punjab government and announced a protest at district headquarters across the state on March 28, alleging repression by the state government.

The decision comes after key farmer leaders accused the Punjab administration of using excessive force against protesting farmers and unlawfully detaining several leaders. They also cited unfavourable conditions for not participating in the meeting.

Notably, two days after Punjab police cleared the Sambhu and Khanauri border and removed the temporary structures erected by the protesting farmers, the state's Agriculture minister, Gurmeet Singh Khuddian, called for a meeting of farmer leaders on Friday in Chandigarh.

Harinder Singh Lakhowal said, "Today, the Punjab government called a meeting with us. The kind of atrocities that happened to us, we were removed (from protest sites) illegally...so many people are still jailed. We have decided not to attend this meeting. We will hold a protest on 28th (March) against this at district headquarters...'

Raminder Singh echoed similar concerns, stating that the situation in Punjab was being turned into a "police state" where farmers were being targeted unfairly.

...During the meeting we held here, we have reached this conclusion that efforts are being made to make Punjab a Police state...farmers

The task facing me, as the fifth president of the Republic of Namibia, is to preserve the gains of our independence on all fronts and to ensure that the unfinished agenda of economic and social advancement of our people is carried forward with vigor and determination to bring about shared balanced prosperity for all," Nandi-Ndaitwah said in her inaugural speech as

president. "I am optimistic that,

MI News Service, Lahore: The Deputy Commissioner of Lahore has rejected an application by former Prime Minister Imran Khan's political party, Pakistan Tehreek-i-insaaf (PTI) for holding a public gathering at Minar-i-Pakistan due to security concerns and law and order situation in the country, Dawn reported.

According to Dawn, the request had been rejected "in view of serious security issues, threats, and the general law and order situation in the country.'

This decision comes after PTI, through its Punjab Vice President Akmal Khan Bari, asked for permission on March 22.

Dawn reported that in an order issued on Friday, DC Syed Musa Raza stated that the decision to reject the application had been taken on the recommendation of the District Intelligence Committee (DIC).

The DIC said granting permission to PTI to hold the public gathering on March 22 would not be feasible because of the prevalent security threats, and it observed that March 22 falls on the death anniversary of Hazrat Ali, who is an important religious figure for Shia Muslims thus the security forces would be deployed for peaceful conduct of the event. Furthermore, it said law enforcement agencies were already facing life threats.\ According to Dawn, Bari

Srinagar: As journalist Irfan Mehraj marked two years in jail, the Journalist Federation Kashmir (JFK) issued a call for his immediate release, condemning his prolonged detention. Mehraj, an award-winning journalist and researcher, was arrested by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) on March 20, 2023. He was charged under the Indian Penal Code and the controversial Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

In a press release on Thursday, JFK emphasized that Mehraj's detention remains a critical issue for media freedom in Kashmir. The statement highlighted Mehraj's diligent commitment to his journalistic duties, stating that his continued imprisonment is a direct attack on press freedom in the region. JFK also noted that for a democracy to flourish, a free press must be allowed to operate without fear or threat.

The Federation demanded that authorities create a more conducive environment for journalists in Kashmir, enabling them to report facts and express opinions without the constant fear of arrest.

The Federation has previously expressed serious concerns over the increasing targeting of journalists

in the region, which they view as part of a broader strategy to undermine truth accountability. The crackdown on journalists in Kashmir has intensified, particularly after the revocation of Jammu and Kashmir's special status in 2019.

Irfan Mehraj, a Sri-nagar-based journalist, is known for his investigative wrk and his role as the founding editor of Wande Magazine and as editor of TwoCircles.net. He has contributed to both national and international media outlets, including Deutsche and Himal Magazine.

Mehraj has also written for local newspapers such as Brighter Kashmir and Rising Kashmir. His previous work as a researcher at the Jammu Kashmir Coalition of Civil Society (JKCCS), a respected human rights organization, further exemplifies his dedication to doc-

Apart from Babar, Mohammad Rizwan was dropped from the T20I phase in New Zealand. The axing of seasoned stars allowed the team to infuse it with new blood and youth.

After tasting back-to-back defeats in the first two T20Is, Pakistan's youngsters, with nerves of steel, completed a 205-run chase courtesy of a blistering unbeaten ton from Hasan Nawaz. Pakistan's three-match ODI series against New Zealand will begin on

March 29 after the conclusion of the five

Pakistan will conclude its white-ball tour of New Zealand on April 5 and then shift its focus to the nation's highly regarded T20 tournament, the PSL.

The action-packed tournament will begin on April 11, with Islamabad United taking on Lahore Qalandars. Basit prophecised that Babar, who represents Peshawar Zalmi, will be the best batter in the tournament.

"Babar Azam will be the best batter in PSL," Basit added.

IPL 2025: MS Dhoni on cusp of making history for CSK; Rohit Sharma eyes elusive feat

NEW DELHI [INDIA]: Several records are in line, waiting to be broken in the upcoming 'El Clasico' clash between Mumbai Indians and Chennai Super Kings in the cash-rich Indian Premier League (IPL)

MI and CSK, each five-time champions, will add another chapter to their fierce rivalry on Sunday at the MA Chidambaram Stadium. Some of the most renowned faces in the history of Indian cricket will square off against each other and fight for victory.

CSK stalwart and legend MS Dhoni is 19 runs shy of becoming the franchise's highest run-scorer in the IPL. Former franchise icon Suresh Raina sits at the summit with 4687 runs.

KANE WILLIAMSON PREDICTS BIG THINGS FOR RACHIN RAVINDRA, ABHISHEK SHARMA AHEAD OF IPL 2025

MUMBAI (MAHARASHTRA): Ahead of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025 campaign opener, New Zealand batter Kane Williamson predicted big things for two young talented batters: Kiwi star Rachin Ravindra and Indian T20I opener Abhishek Sharma.

The IPL 2025 season will finally kickstart with the 'OG Derby' between defending champions Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) and Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) at Eden Gardens in Kolkata on Saturday.

Ahead of the high-octane clash, Kane, a JioStar expert for IPL 2025, addressed the media.

Speaking to ANI about the star Kiwi batter Rachin, who will be representing Chennai Super Kings (CSK), Kane said, "He is a fast learner and his high side is extremely high. He is such a gifted player and I am sure he will get plenty of opportunities this

season. And I would never bet against him."

Having made his international debut in 2021, things started looking up for Rachin with a breakout 2023 50-over World Cup in India, where he emerged as NZ's top run-getter and overall fourth, with 578 runs in 10 matches and three centuries, two fifties. Following some fine Test outings which included a double ton against South Africa, Rachin got to play for CSK in 2024 season after being bought for Rs 1.8 crore. In a decent season, he made 222 runs in 10 matches with a half-century to his name.

He was released from the team ahead of the 2024 Mega Auction and bought back for Rs 4 crores. Rachin, who had played a crucial role in India's first Test home series loss in over 12 years, continued his fine spree of form, scoring 263 runs in the Champions Trophy with two cen-



turies, winning the prestigious Golden Bat and 'Player of the Tournament' following loss to India in final. This IPL would be a

chance for him to finally ace the T20 format, where he has so far shown mixed but promising results Kane is also optimistic that Indian opener Abhishek will be confident heading into this season following a bumper IPL 2024 at the top with Travis Head, forming the duo 'Travishek'. He had scored 484 runs in 16 matches at an average of 32.26, with a strike rate of above 204, three fifties and a whopping 42 sixes.

and a whopping 42 sixes.
Following some initial poor scores in international cricket despite a century in his second T20I against Zimbabwe,
Abhishek started delivering more consistently during the back end of the South Africa tour last year and the home series against England. In his last seven T20Is, Abhishek has scored 365 runs at an average of 73.00 and a strike rate of over 214. with a century (against England, a knock of 135 in 54 balls with seven fours and 13 sixes) and two fifties.

In his last 22 innings, including his domestic scores in Syed Mushtaq Ali and Vijay Hazare Trophy fixtures, Abhishek has made 1,087 runs at an average of 51.76, with three centuries and

six fifties to his name. This also includes a brutal 170 against Saurashtra for Punjab in the Vijay Hazare Trophy (VHT), which came in just 96 balls.

Speaking on the exciting

youngster, Kane said, "I have got no doubt that his recent international performances will help, those sorts of games grow anybody's confidence. And as a young, dynamic player, last year was an incredible year for Abhishek. But to then do pretty much the same thing at the international level and recently against England, one of the top teams was amazing to see. So, he will be very confident coming into this season." "They (SRH) have got a huge amount of power in their batting line-up. So, you have your good days and bad days. But when the Sunrisers have a good one, they are going to be scoring huge scores as we saw last year, he concluded.
