Another round of talks begin with Meitei-Kuki groups on Manipur conflict resolution

MI News Service, New Delhi: In a sincere but desperate effort to bring a lasting peace in the strifetorn North eastern state of Manipur, the Centre held a high level meeting here on Saturday with the representatives of the tiny state's two warring communities of Meitei and Kuki . Informing this official sources said the meeting was a part of the central government's multi-faceted initiatives to find an amicable solution to the ongoing conflict between the two major communities since May 2023, leaving more than 250 deaths of both the communities besides rendering thousands more homeless due to arson and constant violence.

In this background,

the meeting was aimed at enhancing trust and cooperation between the Meiteis and Kukis and finding a roadmap to restore permanent peace and normalcy in Manipur, sources said. The two hour long discussions centred around how to maintain law and order in the both the valley and mountainous regions of the state besides facilitating reconciliation between the two communities. While a six-member Meitei delegation comprising representatives from the All Manipur United Clubs' Organisation and the Federation of Civil Society Organisations attended the meeting, the Kuki delegation comprised about nine representatives. The central government interlocutors included A K Mishra, a retired Special Director of the Intelligence Bureau. During a debate on the passage of nipur budget in the Lok Sabha on Thursday night, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that the Ministry of Home Affairs had held discussions with the representatives of the Meitei and the Kuki communities in the past. He said separate meetings were also conducted on regular basis with different organisations from both the communities. "The Ministry of Home Affairs will soon convene a joint meeting," Shah said, replying to a short debate in the lower House, which adopted a Statutory Resolution confirming the imposition of President's rule in Manipur. The home minister also said that while the government is working to find a path to

India, Sri Lanka ink major defence pact as PM Modi accorded grand welcome in island nation

MI News Service, New Delhi / Colombo: In perhaps the first such honour given to a foreign leader, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was accorded a tri-services ceremonial welcome at the historic Independence Square in the heart of the Sri Lankan capital on his arrival here on Saturday . President Anura Kumara Dissanayake received the Prime minister at the Square, the venue for national day celebrations and takes its name from the Independence Memorial Hall built to commemorate the island nation's independence from British rule in 1948. Prime minister Modi arrived in Colombo after concluding a two day visit to Bangkok where he attended a summit of the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) along with the leaders of five other nations. "PM @narendramodiwas welcomed by President @anuradisanayake with a ceremonial reception at the Independence Square in Colombo," External Affairs Minspokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a social media post. "Bilateral discussions to foster a partnership for a shared future and mutual prosperity of our people, lie ahead," he said. Officials said it was the first time a foreign leader was accorded such a welcome at the Independence Square. Later in the day Prime minister Modi held a delegation-level talks with President Dissanayake to begin his official engagements in this small island nation. For the first time, India and Sri Lanka on Saturday inked

an ambitious defence cooperation pact following talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Anura Kumara Dissanayake. The two sides also signed a pact to develop Trincomalee as an energy hub. Another agreement was inked to facilitate New Delhi's multi-sectoral grant assistance to Sri Lanka's eastern region. The two sides are ex-

pected to ink around 10 ambitious bilateral agreements, including one about defence cooperation and another about launching frameworks for deeper engagement in the energy sector. The MoU on defence cooperation is set to signal a major upward trajectory in India-Sri Lanka defence cooperartion leaving behind the bitter

chapter relating to India pulling out the Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF) from the island nation around 35 years ago. The prime minister's visit to Sri Lanka comes at a time when the island nation is showing signs of recovery from its deep economic stress. As the country was reeling under a massive economic crisis three years ago during the change in regime, India extended a massive financial assistance worth USD 4.5 billion to help the nation overcome the economic criris. After the talks between Modi and Dissanayake, two documents facilitating India's assistance to Sri Lanka on debt restructuring and another one on currency swap are likely to be made public. The two sides are also expected to seal a separate pact on cooperation in the digital domain. Modi is also scheduled to lay a wreath at the Indian Peace Keeping Force memorial in th city later in the day. Meanwhile, Indian High Commissioner to Colombo Santosh Jha said on Friday that New Delhi's assistance to the island nation was "unprecedented" in terms of India's assistance to any country in the world. "It was a huge bit of assistance and we are continuing to work with Sri Lanka in providing it assistance in various areas and that is much appreciated here, Jha said. In Colombo, Modi and Dissanayake will also dedicate several projects that are being built in that country with India's assistance. The two leaders will also witness the virtual ground breaking of the Sampur solar en-

MI News Service, Kolkata: The West Bengal government has made elaborate arrangements to ensure peace and maintenance of law and Ram Navami day on Sunday. Accordingly, as preventive measures 3,500 to 4,000 police personnel have been posted for maintenance of peace and law and order in and around Kolkata. In addition as many as 29 IPS officers will be on special duty across the state during the next 48 hours as part of the preventive measure. According to the police, senior officers of the rank of Deputy Commissioners and Joint Commissioners of Police will be present during the conduct of religious processions in the city. These apart, the responsibilities of the police officers of the ranks of OC, DC, AC, Joint CP are also finalised. There will be sufficient police presence in every street from where the processions will pass. In addition, for further surveillance drones will deployed along with more CCTV cameras. Videography of every procession will also be

In fact, just as there is a BJP procession on the occasion of Ram Navami, various Hindutva organi-



zations have also decided to organise processions during the day tomorrow, the sources said adding Trinamool Congress is also taking to the streets on Ram Navami day in the city and elsewhere in districts. . They have also decided to take out a number of processions in areas where Hindi-speaking people live in large numbers like in Asansol and Siliguri. Interestingly in Jalpaiguri, TMC councillors are also distributing leaflets in every house inviting people to participate in Ram Navami processions in this north Bengal town.

Meanwhile, Kolkata Police

Commissioner Manoj Verma has warned that if people were found walking on the city streets carrying harmful weapons during Ram Navami processions, the police will

take legal action. However, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said that processions could be taken out as per law. According to Kolkata Police Commissioner, their Quick Response Team will remain alert round the clock on that day. Senior officers will be present at five or six places where big processions are to be taken out, including at Hastings, Entally, and Kashipur. There will

be patrolling on police bikes in these areas also. At the same time, many police personnel in plain clothes will accompany the procestermined to prevent even an isolated incident and unrest from happening on Ram Navami day. Police Commissioner Verma held a meeting with senior officers at Lalbazar on Saturday . Last year, around 60 Ram Navami processions were taken out in Kolkata. This time too, the number is expected to remain the same. A large number of IPS officers will remain present from Saturday in various vulnerable areas including in Howrah, Hooghly, Barrackpore, Malda, Murshidabad, and Siliguri and they will remain posted there till next Monday as a precautionary step. It is worth noting that, regarding the Ram Navami procession, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had said, "We all know that Punjabis can carry kirpan during their processions. Which is however allowed in the country's law, as they always strictly follow rules. Many of us also take out processions on Ram Navami day. I have no objection to that. But we

China hits back with 34% tariff on US goods after Trump's trade salvo

MI News Service, New Delhi / Beijing: In a direct retaliation to US President Donald Trump's latest wave of trade tariffs across the globe sending shock waves to many countries, an undeterred China has announced a fresh 34 per cent reciprocal duty on all US goods from April 10. The announcement in this regard, made by China's Finance Ministry on Friday night, marks a sharp escalation in the ongoing trade standoff between the world's two largest economies.

The move comes just a day after Beijing urged Washington to withdraw its latest tariffs and warned of "countermeasures to safeguard its own rights and interests." In a parallel move, China will also impose export controls on several key medium and heavy rare-earth elements, such as samarium, gadolinium, ter-



bium, dysprosium, lutetium, scandium, and yttrium, starting from April 5. These rare-earths are crucial to high-tech manufactur-

"The purpose of the Chinese government's implementation of export controls on relevant items in

ter safeguard national security and interests, and to fulfil international obligations such as nonproliferation," China's Commerce Ministry said in a statement.Beijing also added 11 foreign entities to its "unreliable entity" list, allowing for punitive action against them. The move shows China is ready to use rules and economic measures to push back against the t US pressure. China's State Council Tariff Commission also clarified that shipments already in transit will not be subject to the new tariffs. "If the goods have been shipped from the place of departure before 12:01 on April 10, 2025, and are imported between 12:01 on April 10, 2025, and 24:00 on May 13, 2025, the additional tariffs prescribed in this announcement will not be levied," it added. Earlier this

In addition to targeting China, a baseline 10 per cent tariff on nearly all imports, from China and other countries, is set to take effect this Saturday. The higher "reciprocal tariffs" specifically aimed at China will begin April 9. President Trump also signed an executive order closing the "de minimis" loophole, a rule that allowed low-value packages from China and Hong Kong to enter the US duty-free. This closure is expected to significantly impact e-commerce shipments and small

The Calcutta High Court has issued a stay order on the demolition of Dheu Sagar Park in New Digha, East Midnapore, until June 30. The Dheu Sagar Park, a popular tourist destination developed by the Digha Shankarpur Development Board, was constructed in 2020. However, the National Environment Tribunal observed that the park's construction breached the Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) norms. Justice Amrita Sinha stayed the implementation of the National Environment Court's order, considering the state's appeal. Justice served in Jalpaiguri child abuse case

MI News Service, Jalpaiguri: In a significant ruling, a local court Jalpaiguri has sentence a women to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment for sexually abusing a 6 years old girl in 2021. The accused, who lived in the same rented house as the victim's family, exploited the absence of the child's parents to commit the heinous crime. In a landmark verdict, the Jalpaiguri Protection of the Children from sexual offence (POCSO) Court has sentenced a women to 20 years rigorous imprisonment for sexually abusing her 6 year old nice. Judge Rintu Šur delivered the judgement, also directing the legal Aid Service to provide a compensation for Rs 5 lakh to the victim. The abuse occurred in 2021 at the Bhaktinagr police station area where the accused and the victim's family resided in the same rented house. Taking advantage of the parents' absence, the accused sexually assaulted the minor and threatened her. The victim later confided in her guardian, leading to a police complaint. A total of nine witnesses testified in the case, and medical reports were considered as evidence. Based on this testimony and evidence, Judge Sur convicted the accused, describing the act as a heinous crime. The court's decision includes, 20 years of rigorous imprisonment* for the convict And Compensation of ₹5 lakh* to the victim, to be paid by the Legal Aid Service This verdict serves as a stern warning against child abuse, emphasizing the impor-

Tragically, Arnab's mother, Manjula Yash, passed away due to a heart attack, which the family believes was triggered by the anxiety of her son and daughter-in-law losing their jobs simultaneously. The job cancellations have taken a significant emotional toll on the affected teachers. Many are struggling to cope with the loss of their livelihoods and the uncertainty of their future. The situation is further complicated by the social stigma associated with job loss, which can lead to feelings of shame, guilt, and anxiety. A psychologist, Ranjan Bhattacharya, shared a post on Facebook about a

couple who came to him for counseling. The couple, who have a 5-year-old daughter, expressed their desire to commit suicide due to the loss of their jobs and the subsequent loss of social respect. Ranjan Babu's post highlights the emotional turmoil faced by many affected teachers. The couple, who have been married for seven years, are struggling to cope with the loss of their jobs. Ranjan Babu's conversation with them revealed that their desire to commit suicide stems more from feelings of humiliation and self-loathing than financial uncertainty. Ranjan Babu's Facebook post has sparked a wave of discussion, with many calling for humanity to triumph over ideologies and interests. Last teacher leaves, Group D staff step in, crisis deepens at govt school

MI News Service, Hoogly: A concerning situation has arisen in Hooghly, where a government school has been left with no teachers. The sole teacher in the school has departed, leaving the entire responsibility in the hands of a Group D employee. This unexpected turn of events has raised concerns about the future of education in the affected school. Khanak Gujarat Junior High School is facing an uncertain future after Abhijit Palui, the only teacher and TIC, lost his job due to a Supreme Court verdict affecting 26,000 teachers in West Bengal. The school, with 40 students, is now relying on a Group D employee to manage its operations. Palui, who has been dedicated to his role, expressed his concerns about the impact on his family and the students. The Criminal Investigation Department (CID) has issued a directive to schools in Malda, West Bengal, seeking detailed information about students receiving scholar-(SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), and Other Backward Class (OBC) categories. This move comes amid a recent scam involving fake SC, ST, and OBC certificates uncovered in Malda and Dakshin Dinajpur. The CID has asked schools to provide information on students' current class, academic

status, and scholarship disbursement history since 2017. Specifically, the agency wants to know the amount of money received by each student, the number of students still enrolled, and those who have dropped out. The inquiry aims to verify whether the recipients are genuine beneficiaries or not.

Headmasters and headmistresses have expressed surprise and concern over the sudden directive. Subhash Chandra Sarkar, headmaster of Malda Town School, stated that the amount of money received by each student, the number of students still in school, and those who have dropped out. The headmistress of Barlow Girls High School echoed similar sentiments, saying they have been asked to provide details on students who have withdrawn the

money and their current activities. The Oasis Scholarship Portal, managed by the Backward Classes Welfare Department, Government of West Bengal, provides pre-matric and post-matric scholarships to students from SC, ST, and OBC categories. The scholarships aim to support students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, with family income limits ranging from ₹1,00,000 to ₹2,50,000 per annum. The CID's inquiry is likely aimed at identifying irregularities and potential misappropriation of scholarship

The recent scam involving fake certificates has raised concerns about the authenticity of scholarship recipients. The investigation seeks to verify the legitimacy of students receiving scholarships and uncover any possible wrongdoing.

Fires rage foresters on edge; frequent blazes stoke fears of damage to biodiversity in north

MI News Service, Siliguri: Wildfires continue unabated in north Bengal during the ongoing dry spell, much to the concern of foresters and nature conservationists. On Thursday, a fire broke out in the Gorumara National Park — the second largest habitat of one-horned rhinos in Bengal — in Jalpaiguri district and destroyed the foliage and undergrowth on around 50 hectares. Forest department personnel and fire tenders took hours to bring the fire under control. Similar fires broke out in a stretch of the Baikunthapur forest, on the outskirts of Siliguri, and in Jaowari, a village in the Bijanbari block of Darjeeling district, on Fri-Baikunthapur,

day. While foresters and firemen doused the flames Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), which is posted along the India-Nepal border, controlled the blaze in Jaowari. Smoke and the flames were seen under the Dabgram range of the Baikunthapur forest division. "The fire broke out near the Teesta canal on the way to Gajoldoba of Jalpaiguri. It started spreading steadily with thick smoke billowing across the area," said a Gajoldoba resident. The forest staff and fire tenders reached the spot and could

eventually control the flames. Earlier, a similar fire had broken out in the Sarugara range of the division and in some forests of the Kurseong forest division. Jaowari is under the jurisdiction of Lodhama police station of Darjeeling disand Manebhanjyang — known for the famous Sandakphu trek. When the flames were spotted at Jaowari, along with foresters, police and villagers, the SSB personnel doused the fire. A team of 20 personnel under the leadership of an inspector was sent to the spot to control the situation. "A timely intervention of the SSB and others helped in controlling the fire before it could reach the residential areas of the village. The SSB worked for hours to ensure that the fire didn't spread further," said a villager. Frequent wildfires have led to an increase in air pollution in Siliguri its surroundings. Bhaskar J.V, the chief conservator of forests (wildlife, north), said in most cases, it was found that fire occurred in such places of forests where people move in frequently. "These wildfires occurred in areas where stretches of the forest land are covered with foliage," he said.

MI News Service, Kolkata: Kolkata and West Bengal police have left no stone unturned to maintain calm and peace amid Ram Navami celebration. The police forces have taken all the possible measures so that the eternal communal tension does not let to any situation leading to absolute mops and brooms. Several restrictions have been imposed as the city and district levels. Sensitive and ultra sensitive areas have been marked and special arrangements have been made accordingly. Police have also urged all political parties and social organizations not to indulge in any provocative activities leading to absolute mayhem.

Kolkata Police Commissioner Manoj Kumar Verma has detailed an extensive security blueprint for the upcoming Ram Navami festivities, emphasizing zero tolerance for any

disruption of communal harmony. The police force will implement special deployments across more than 200 identified sensitive locations citywide, with Commissioner Verma saying, "We are fully prepared to take stringent action against any attempts to disturb peace." The security apparatus includes heightened cyber surveillance to monitor inflammatory content, pre-emptive meetings with community leaders, and strategically positioned quick response teams. This comes in the wake of recent tensions, including a communal violence case registered at Shyampur police station in Howrah and the filing of 19 related cases resulting in 61 arrests in Malda's Mothabari unrest.

In the mean time, Additional Director General (South Bengal) Supratim Sarkar confirmed the initiation of legal proceedings under stringent IPC

sections (153A, 295A, 353) against those circulating provocative materials. ADG (Law and Order) Jawed Shamim reinforced public safety advisories, urging citizens to verify information before sharing on social media and to immediately report suspicious activities through the police emergency number 100. Police highlighted West Bengal's historical precedent of peaceful concurrent celebrations of Ram Na9vami and Eid, with this year's security preparations being the most comprehensive to date. The situation in previously volatile Mothabari remains stable with continued police vigilance following recent unrest in the Malda region. Police officials expressed confidence in maintaining law and order through coordinated efforts with community stakeholders and robust ground-level presence.

KMC mulls setting up pumping stn at Rifle

Range Rd MI News Service, Kolkata: In a bid to solve the drinking water crisis, as well as replace ground water with Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) has decided to construct a semi-underground reservoir cum booster pumping station in ward 65 at Rifle Range Road. According to KMC, ground water served through a big diameter tubewell is required to be substituted by means of treated surface water. There are some pockets in different wards where the area is being served through ground water with the help of power-driven tube wells. Also, there are some crisis pockets which are required to be augmented providing treated surface water at these areas. Water Supply department officials said that about ten wards have been identified; such substitution is to be implemented and water pressure profile is to be improved. These wards are 13, 97, 110, 67, 100, 103, 89, 65, 99 and 130. Surveys were conducted and spaces have been earmarked for construction of the booster pumping stations and semi underground reservoirs. As per information made available, KMC has already taken up construction of one additional 20 MGD capacity water treatment plant inside the Jai Hind WTP campus. Also, another new treatment plant of 10 MGD capacity will be constructed at the available land near Dhalai Bridge at the junction of Garia Station Road and EM Bypass. This project is

KMC records tampered: Mayor

MI News Service, Kolkata: The Kolkata Municipal Corporation's (KMC) assessment records were "tampered with" to get permission to construct a five-storey building off Creek Row, Kolkata mayor Firhad Hakim said. The tampering came to light after a Creek Row resident filed an RTI appeal about the 1-cottah 15-chhatak plot with the civic body. He KMC had approved any new building on the plot.

According to Sayantak Das, who had filed the RTI, the reply revealed that a five-storey building was approved under a special provision meant for tenanted buildings. Das said he and several other neighbours then wrote to the KMC that a two-storey building on the plot never had any tenants. "I applied to see the inspection book (IB). I was shown both the physical copy and the copy on the online server. The discrepancy came to light at this point. The name of the tenant was there in the physical IB record, but not uploaded on-



said Das. The IB record is the primary report prepared by KMC officials after field visits and mentions the necessary details about a property. The plot on Mahendra Sarkar Street, off Creek Row, in Ward 50, had a two-storey building standing till last year. The demolition started a little after Durga Puja. "The inspection book records of the KMC were tampered with. This is a criminal offence. The complainant has also filed a criminal case. We have forwarded the matter for further probe. Whoever is involved will be punished," Hakim said. The mayor admitted that people within the

HC rejects plea opposing NCLT Kolkata Bench shift to New Town

The Calcutta High Court has dismissed a plea challenging the shifting of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), Kolkata Bench, to New Town while highlighting that the plans to shift the High Court to the same place is in the pipeline. The bench of Justice Amrita Sinha was hearing the writ petition challenging the act of the Centre to shift the NCLT, Kolkata bench from its present location at 5, Esplanade Row West, B.B.D. Bag to Corporate Bhawan at New Town. Petitioners submitted that the building where NCLT is currently located is in the vicinity of the High Court and has enough space to house the benches presently functioning. The present location is easily ac-

cessible by all stakeholders,

their staff and the litigants. It was contended that the place where NCLT is sought to be shifted is in an extremely remote area, approximately twenty-eight kilometres away from the High Court. The place is not properly accessible. There is a lack of supportive infrastructure in and around the new site.

None of the stakeholders will be able to avail the facility for which the tribunal has been set up. Further, it was contended that there is high chance of the judiciary being influenced if the corporate affairs department is permitted to set up the infrastructural facility of NCLT The Deputy Solicitor General, appearing for the Centre, submitted that the pleading relating to interferand not part of the writ petition. The decision to shift the venue is a policy decision and the court ought not to interfere with the same. It was not a PIL. Hence, petitioners can't claim themselves as aggrieved parties. On the location issue, the court observed: "These are the initial birth pangs which occur whenever a new site or a place is tried to be developed. One has to overcome these factors to achieve anything new. Over a period of time the subject place will definitely be bustling with life." "The shift of the location of the High Court to New Town is also in the pipeline, and may be, over a period of time, both the institutions will again be in the vicinity of the other," court observed.

Ajay Kumar Bhalla, who took charge as governor on January 3, has ever since been meeting a cross section of people and taking feedback from them on how to bring back normalcy in the state. Bhalla, a former Union home secretary, who had closely worked with Shah for five years till August 2024, was hand-picked by the Union home minister and is said to have been tasked with restoring peace in the restive state. After the imposition of President's rule, the governor had taken a number of steps to restore peace and bring back normalcy, including asking those who looted arms from security forces to surrender them. The central government also endeavoured to open the state's road for normal traffic, though theeffort was not successful due to op-position from the Kukis. Travel through areas inhabited by Meiteis or Kukis is completely prohibited for the other community. While Kukis travel mostly through Mizoram to travel outside the state, the Meiteis do not go to the hills dominated by the Kukis. Mothabari Clash: HC asks state govt to file reports

MI News Service, Kolkata: Calcutta High Court directed the central and state governments to file reports on the recent clash at Mothabari in Malda last week. "The issue is no doubt serious. The state administration should take every possible step to protect common people and maintain harmony in the area," said Justice Soumen Sen, who headed a division bench. The state and central governments will have to file separate reports after four weeks of filing a supplementary affidavit by the petitioner within one week. The matter will be heard after five weeks.

The bench, however, refused to accede to the request of the additional solicitor general of eastern India that the Centre could deploy paramilitary forces if the court felt it necessary. The order followed a public interest litigation filed by residents of Mothabari demanding the central government's intervention in the issue. On Friday last week, the same bench had sought separate reports from the SP and DM of Malda, along with video footage of the incident. In their reports, the SP and the DM said a clash between two communities had occurred while a procession was passing by a place of worship. The reports admitted that injuries, arson and damage to vehicles took

place during the clash.

JU Alumnus provides Rs 1 Cr for chemical engg lab

China hits back with 34% tariff on **US** goods after Trump's trade salvo

businesses relying on cross-border logistics. This latest escalation comes as US trade officials re-examine China's compliance with the 2020 "Phase 1" trade deal. Under the agreement, Beijing had committed to increasing US imports by USD 200 billion over two years. However, China has consistently fallen short of those targets, blaming the Covid-19 pandemic and global supply chain issues. Despite heightened tensions, economic ties between the two countries remain deeply entrenched. Chinese customs data reveals that China imported USD 154 billion worth of US goods in 2017, before the trade war began. That number rose to USD 164 billion in 2024, showing continued trade even amid policy clashes. After months of speculation and public hullabaloo, US President Donald Trump announced a barrage of "reciprocal tariffs" on nearly all the countries in the world, including India on Wednesday afternoon (local time). The 27 per cent reciprocal tariffs or import duties on Indian goods will pose significant challenges for Indian industries to enter into the American markets. However, captains of several Industries are also of the view that despite such high tariff, India's position is comparatively 'more favourable' than that of its competitor nations. US President Donald Trump celebrated America's "Liberation Day" on April 2 by announcing "reciprocal tariffs" against all major trading partners saying the US runs a trade deficit of around USD1.2 trillion. Trade deficit is the difference between the value of goods the US exports and the value of goods the US imports. Absconding contractor, accused of killing

Branch Cyber Cell has arrested a fugitive contractor who had been absconding since 2018 after murdering his employee from Gaya, Bihar. The accused has been identified as Lakshman Prasad.

"Cyber Cell of the Crime Branch, Daryaganj has traced and arrested a fugitive Contractor Lakshman Prasad (40 years) resident of District Nawada, Bihar from Gaya, Bihar, who had been absconding since 2018 after committing a brutal murder of his employee, a daily wage earner, in PS Mandawali, Delhi area," as per an official release.

In 2018, Lakshman Prasad, along with his nephew, murdered their employee Ram Pravesh for demanding his rightful wages. A case of murder was registered at Police Station Mandawali, and the accused was absconding since registration of FIR, hence was declared a Proclaimed Offender by the Hon'ble Court in

"With surveillance and advanced tracking efforts, he successfully pinpointed the movements of Lakshman Prasad in Bihar. It was further revealed that he is changing his hideouts frequently. Acting swiftly, a team of Crime Branch strategically laid traps at multiple locations in Bihar, leading to the successful apprehension of the accused from Gaya, Bihar," the release read.

The accused Lakshman Prasad, a graduate from Bihar was working as a contractor of Plaster of Paris (POP) work in Delhi. In 2018, he was working in the Mandawali area of East Delhi and several daily wages

earners were also working under his supervision including the deceased, Ram Pravesh.

"Ram Pravesh had been persistently demanding his pending wages, which were not paid to him in a timely manner. This led to frequent confrontations and heated arguments between the deceased and the accused. The situation escalated over time, and Ram Pravesh allegedly began publicly confronting and pressuring Lakshman Prasad for payment," the release read.

Feeling humiliated and angered by the repeated altercations, Lakshman Prasad hatched a plan with his nephew, Murari, to eliminate the victim. On the pretext of settling the matter, Lakshman Prasad fraudulently called Ram Pravesh to a specific location. When the victim arrived, he was attacked with a knife by both Lakshman and Murari, resulting in serious injuries. Before succumbing to his injuries, Ram Pravesh gave a dying declaration in the hospital, naming both the accused - Lakshman Prasad and Murari - as the perpetrators of

the attack. "Following the incident, both accused persons absconded from the scene and managed to evade arrest. Despite multiple efforts by local police, Lakshman Prasad remained untraceable and was therefore declared a Proclaimed Offender by the Hon'ble Court in 2019. After fleeing from Delhi, he continued working as a POP contractor in various towns and cities, frequently changing his location to avoid detection and arrest," as per the

New Delhi: parts of India brace for an unforgiving summer, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued heatwave alerts for several northern and western states, warning residents to prepare for scorching days ahead.

From the dry plains of Rajasthan to the bustling streets of Delhi and the sunbaked Saurashtra-Kutch region of Gujarat, citizens are already feeling the heat -- and it's only going to intensify over the next week, according to the weather department

Speaking to ANI, IMD Scientist Akhil Srivastava said that Rajasthan will also experience a severe heatwave over the next

4-5 days. "Heatwaves are being reported in Gujarat and Saurashtra-Kutch region, which are expected to continue for the next 5-7 days. Rajasthan will also face severe heatwave conditions over the next 4-5 days, for which an alert has been issued," he said.

Srivastava also mentioned that states in North India, such as Punjab and Haryana, may experience heatwave conditions.

"Delhi is currently witnessing temperatures 3 degrees above normal, hovering around 38 to 40 degrees Celsius. There is a possibility of heat-wave-like conditions by April 7. A western disturbance is expected to affect the Western Himalayan

region between April 8 by Kadaladi, which reand 10, possibly leading to thunderstorms, strong winds and rainfall," he

Speaking on South India, the IMD scientist said that Tamil Nadu and Kerala are expected to receive heavy rainfall over the

next two days. "Heavy isolated rainfall is expected in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and south interior Karnataka over the next two days. From April 7 or 8, eastern parts of India may experience thunderstorms accompanied by strong winds," he said.

Earlier in the day, several parts of Chennai received rainfall. The IMD's regional centre in Chennai issued warnings for rain, light thunderstorms, and lightning in a few districts of Tamil Nadu.

Heavy rainfall in Tiruppur district on Friday night caused waterlogging in homes. Municipal corporation workers were deployed to drain the excess water.

According to IMD data, Tiruppur North witnessed 11 centimetres of rainfall, while the Kozhiporvilai station in Kanyakumari recorded 19 cm. Nambiyur in Erode district, Coimbatore AP, and Sulur stations in Coimbatore dis-

trict recorded 8 cm each. Kavundapadi in Erode, Kil Kotagiri Estate in Nilgiris, and Sothuparai in Theni received 9 cm of rainfall each.

Similarly, the Ramanathapuram district received 7 cm of rainfall, followed and Tamil Nadu.

corded 5 cm; Mudukulatur and Mandapam received 2 cm each; and Tondi and Pamban with 1 cm of rainfall each.

Meanwhile, the IMD has ruled out the presence of El Nino conditions for the upcoming monsoon but has warned of an exceptionally hot summer ahead. The latest forecast indicates above-normal temperatures and an increased number of heatwave days across several parts of the country from April to June 2025.

"We are not expecting El Nino conditions during the monsoon season. April-June to be hotter than usual, with more heatwave days likely in many states," said IMD Director General Dr Mrutyunjay Mohapatra.

The forecast predicts above-normal maximum temperatures in most parts of India, except in some areas of west peninsular India, east-central India, and eastern India, where temperatures are likely to remain normal. Minimum temperatures are also expected to remain above normal across most regions.

States likely to experience more heatwave days from April to June include Rajasthan, Gujarat, Haryana, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, and northern Karnataka

Researchers find how antiviral drug associated with SARS-**CoV-2 mutations**

London: Molnupiravir, an antiviral medication for COVID-19 infections, and a pattern of mutations in the SARS-CoV-2 virus have been linked, according to research from the Francis Crick Institute, the University of Cambridge, Imperial College London, the University of Liverpool, the University of Cape Town, and UKHSA. When a virus replicates, molnupiravir causes alterations in its genome, or genetic code. Many of these alterations will weaken or eradicate the virus, lowering the level of infection in the body. During the COVID-19 pandemic, it was among the first antivirals on the market and was widely used by several nations. In research published in Nature, the scientists used global sequencing databases to map mutations in the SARS-CoV-2 virus over time. They analysed a family tree of 15 million SARS-CoV-2 sequences so that at each point in each virus's evolutionary history they could see which mutations had occurred

Although viruses mutate all the time, the researchers identified mutational events in the global sequencing database which looked very different to typical patterns of COVID-19 mutations, and that they were strongly associated with individuals who had taken molnupiravir. These mutations increased in 2022, coinciding with the introduction of molnupiravir. They were also more likely to be seen in older age groups, consistent with the use of the antivirals to treat people who are more at risk, and in countries which are known to have high molnupiravir use. In England, the researchers

analysed treatment data and found that at least 30% of the events involved use of molnupiravir. The causes of mutational events can be traced by looking at their 'mutational signature': a preference for mutations to occur at particular sequences in the genome. The researchers found a close match between the signature seen in these mutational events and the signature in clinical trials of molnupiravir. The researchers also saw small clusters of mutations which suggests onward transmission from one person to another, although no established variants of concern are currently linked to this signature. Understanding the impact of molnupiravir treatment on the risks of new variants, and any impact they might have on public health is difficult. It is also important to consider that chronic COVID-19 infections, which molnupiravir is used for, can themselves result in new mutations. Theo Sanderson, lead author and postdoctoral researcher at the Francis Crick Institute. said: "COVID-19 is still having a major effect on human health, and some people have difficulty clearing the virus, so it's important we develop drugs which aim to cut short the length of infection. But our evidence shows that a specific antiviral drug, molnupiravir, also results in new mutations, increasing the genetic diversity in the surviving viral population. "Our findings are useful for ongoing assessment of the risks and benefits of molnupiravir treatment. The possibility of persistent antiviralinduced mutations needs to be taken into account for the development of new drugs.

Researchers find potentially cheaper way of hydrogen transport

have created a novel material capable of storing hydrogen energy in a more efficient and costeffective manner, as part of the ongoing drive to transition humanity away from fossil fuels and towards more ecologically friendly energy sources.

The new hydrogen energy carrier can even store energy at ambient temperature for up to three months. Furthermore, because the material is nickel-based, it is quite inexpensive.

The findings were published in Chemistry--A European Journal. As humanity fights the growing climate problem, one option that academics are focusing on is the shift to alternate energy sources such as hydrogen. Kyushu University has been researching techniques to more efficiently use and store hydrogen energy in order to achieve a carbon-neutral society for several decades.

"We have been working on developing new materials that can store and transport hydrogen energy," explained Professor Seiji Ogo of Kyushu University's Institute



Carbon-Neutral Energy Research who led the research team.

"Transporting it in its gaseous state requires significant energy. An alternative way of storing and transporting it would be to 'split up' the hydrogen atoms into its base components, electrons and protons.

Many candidates have been considered as possible hydrogen energy carriers such as ammonia, formic acid, and metal hydrides. However, the final energy carrier had not yet been estab-

So, we looked to nature for hints. There are a series of enzymes called hydrogenases that catalyze hydrogen into protons and electrons and can store that energy for later use, even at room temperature," continued Ogo.

By studying these enzymes our team was able to develop a new compound that does exactly

Not only was their new compound able to extract and store electrons at room temperature.

showed that it could be its own catalyst to extract said electron, something that had not been possible with previous hydrogen energy carriers. The team also showed that the energy could be stored for up the three months. Ogo also highlighted the fact that the compound uses an inexpensive element: nickel. Until now, similar catalysts have used expensive metals like platinum, rhodium, or iridium. Now that nickel is a viable option for hydrogen energy storage, it can potentially reduce the cost of future compounds.

The team intends to collaborate with the industrial sector to transfer their new findings into more practical applications.

'We would also like to work on improving storage time and efficiency as well as investigate the viability of cheaper metals for such compounds, " concluded

"Hopefully our findings will contribute to the goal of decarbonization so that we can build a greener and environmentally

WASHINGTON DC [US]: A study found that Micron sized microplastic waste can be carried across oceans and continents by the jet stream, and their shape influences how far they travel.

A Cornell University team built a model to mimic the atmospheric transport of microplastic fibres, which demonstrates that flat fibres travel farther and are more frequent in the lower atmosphere than spherical fibres. Previous research suggested that these fibres were spherical.

The modelling has the potential to assist scientists in determining the sources of the ubiquitous trash, which might inform policy attempts to minimise it.

The study was published in Nature Geoscience.

Microplastics in the atmosphere come from a variety of sources, including shredded tyres and road dust, as well as soda bottles floating in the ocean. If the plastic breaks down or is ground up, it can become small enough to be transported by the

Previous studies exaggerated the rate of deposition of flat fibres by characterising them as spherical or cylindrical in shape. When the fibres' flat structure is taken into account, they spend 450 per cent more time in the atmosphere than previously anticipated, allowing them to travel larger distances. Furthermore, the modelling implies that the ocean may play a larger role than previously thought in directly generating microplastic particles into the atmosphere, according to Qi Li, assistant professor in the Department of Civil and **Environmental Engineering** and senior author of the

"We can now more accurately attribute the sources of microplastic paring that the shape of these fibres are spheres," Li said.

Researchers develop new antibody against breast cancers

NEW YORK [US] : An antibody devel oped in the lab of Cold Spring Harbour Laboratory Professor Nicholas Tonks can inhibit an enzyme that may aid in the spread of some breast tumours. With additional research, the antibody could provide a viable therapeutic treatment for the same breast tumours.

The novel antibody targets PTPRD, an enzyme that is overexpressed in some breast tumours. PTPRD is a member of the protein tyrosine phosphatase (PTP) family of molecules, which aid in the regulation of numerous cellular functions. They accomplish this by collaborating with enzymes known as kinases to regulate the behaviour of other proteins within cells. Kinases are enzymes that add tiny chemical regulators known as phosphates to proteins. PTPs remove them. Disruptions in the addition or removal of phosphates can contribute to inflamma-

tion, diabetes, and cancer. Some disru tions can be corrected with kinase-blocking drugs

"People have targeted kinases for 25, 30 years," Tonks explains. "It's a multibillion-dollar industry. But many challenges remain. In cancer, patients will respond to these sorts of kinase inhibitors and then, after a period of

time, resistance develops. Drugs that control PTP activity could have a major impact on human health. However, such drugs have been difficult to develop. Tonks has studied PTPs since he discovered them as a postdoctoral researcher. He calls the enzymes "an untapped resource for drug develop-

Many enzymes can be switched off with small molecules designed to latch onto and block the part of the enzyme that carries out its work. But that won't





Study finds Antibiotics for common childhood infections no longer effective in large parts of world

that due to high rates of antibiotic resistance, drugs used to treat common infections in children and babies are no longer effective in significant regions of the world.

Many antibiotics recommended by the World Health Organisation (WHO) showed less than 50% efficiency in treating childhood diseases such as pneumonia, sepsis (bloodstream infections), and meningitis, according to a study headed by the University of Sydney. The findings reveal that global antibiotic guidelines are out of date and need to be updated.

The most severely affected places are in Southeast Asia and the Pacific, particularly near Indonesia and the Philippines, where antibiotic resistance causes thousands of avoidable deaths in children each year.

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) has been identified by the WHO as one of the top ten global public health risks facing humanity. Each year, an estimated three million episodes of sepsis in infants occur worldwide, with up to 570,000 deaths; many of these are caused by a lack of effective antibiotics to treat resistant bacteria.

The findings, published in the journal Lancet South East Asia, added to accumulating evidence that common bacteria causing sepsis and meningitis in children are frequently resistant to medications.



The study discovered that one antibiotic in particular, ceftriaxone, was likely to be helpful in treating only one out of every three instances of infant sepsis or meningitis. Ceftriaxone is also frequently used in Australia to treat a variety of paediatric diseases, including pneumonia and urinary tract infections.

Gentamicin, another antibiotic, was shown to be likely successful in treating less than half of all sepsis and meningitis cases in children.

Gentamicin is routinely used in conjunction with aminopenicillins, which the study found to be ineffective in treating bloodstream infections in newborns and chil-

Dr Phoebe Williams of the University of Sydney's School of Public Health and the Sydney Infectious Diseases Institute is an infectious disease specialist whose research focuses on lowering AMR in highburden healthcare settings in Southeast

She is also a clinician in Australia. According to Dr. Williams, multidrugresistant bacterial illnesses in children are becoming more common around the world.

than adults because new antibiotics are less likely to be tested on and made available to them.

According to Dr. Williams, the study should serve as a wake-up call for the entire world, including Australia.

"We are not immune to this problem the burden of anti-microbial resistance is on our doorstep," she said.

"Antibiotic resistance is rising more rapidly than we realise. We urgently need new solutions to stop invasive multidrugresistant infections and the needless deaths of thousands of children each year.

The study analysed 6,648 bacterial isolates from 11 countries across 86 publications to review antibiotic susceptibility for common bacteria causing childhood infections. Dr Wiliams said the best way to tackle antibiotic resistance in childhood infections is to make funding to investigate new antibiotic treatments for children and newborns a priority.

"Antibiotic clinical focus on adults and too often children and newborns are left out. That means we have very limited options and data for new treatments.

Dr Williams is currently looking into an old antibiotic, fosfomycin, as a temporary lifeline to treat multidrug-resistant urinary tract infections in children in Australia.

WOMEN STROKE SURVIVORS BELIEVE THEY ARE LESS LIKELY TO GET PROPER **EMERGENCY CARE: RESEARCH**

CALIFORNIA [US]: Women who have survived a stroke believe they are less likely to obtain proper emergency care, according to a study headed by Michigan Medicine and Brown

The study looked at survey data from the American Heart Association Research Goes Red Registry to see how women with and without a history of stroke perceived emergency

According to the findings published in Stroke, women with a history of stroke are more than three times more likely to believe "to a great extent" that they will not receive proper care in the emergency room due to their gender, race or eth-

"It's clear from our findings that some women who have experienced a stroke feel that they will not receive the highest quality care when facing health emergencies," said first author Brian Stamm, M.D., clinical instructor of neurology at

the University of Michigan Medical School. "This is directly relevant to prior studies reporting that women who experienced cerebrovascular events, such as stroke, are more likely to be misdiagnosed and are less likely to receive clot-busting medications.

Women accounted for 57.1 per cent of stroke deaths in 2019, and stroke caused 6.2 per cent of all female deaths that year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention National Vital Statistics System.

Black Americans are known to have a greater risk of stroke than white Americans, and a past study found that Black women less frequently receive advanced therapies for stroke, partially due to delays in getting to the emergency department after symptom onset.

Muslims hit roads against Waqf Amendment Bill; call for its withdrawal

MI News Sevice, Ahmedabad: Several Muslims on Friday staged a massive protest against the Waqf Amendment Bill 2025 after its passage in Kolkata, Chennai and Ahmedabad.

Earlier on Friday after a 12 hour long debate the bill was passed from the Rajya Sabha. Thousands of Muslims along with Muslim organisations took to the streets after Friday prayers to express their opposition against the controversial

The protesters in Bengal carried posters proclaiming "We reject Waqf Amendment" and "Reject Waqf Bill" while several waved the national flag. The visuals show demonstrators expressing their outrage over the passage of the Bill.

In Ahmedabad, the visuals show the protesters being forcibly removed by the police. AIMIM's chief of the state unit along with 40 others from his party were detained.

In Chennai Vijaya Tamilaga Vettei Kazhagam had announced a statewide protest. Its workers gathered in Chennai, Coimbatore and Tiruchirapalli and raised slogans against the bill. Slogans like "reject the Waqf Bill and "do not take away Muslims' rights" echoed on the streets.

The protestors voice their concerns that the new bill will affect the existing properties. Calling it unconstitutional, the demonstrators accused the BJP of divisive politics and asserted that such laws won't be tolerat-

Security beefed up in Jammu's **RS Pura sector after BSF foils** infiltration attempt

MI News Sevice, Jammu: The security has been height-ened in Jammu's Ranbir Singh Pura sector following a recent intervention by the Border Security Force (BSF) to foil an infiltration attempt by an intruder crossing the International Border (IB) in the region.

According to PRO BSF Jammu, the security forces neutralised the intruder, who kept moving to cross the border.

"On the intervening night of April 4 and 5, 2025, BSF troops observed a suspicious movement across the IB (International Border) in the Jammu border area and an intruder was observed crossing the IB. 2024, from Turbat." BYC further highlighted that the Malik Baloch family has been relentlessly seeking justice, participating in every sitin and rally advocating for the forcibly disappeared Baloch in-

They were also present at the March sit-ins in Kalat, where the district administration promised, among other things, to reveal the whereabouts of the missing within 15 days. However, instead of being reunited with him, they received his bullet-riddled body, marked with the label of a "terrorist," claiming he was killed in an encounter with security forces.

RSS focus shifts to Catholic Church land after passage of Waqf Amendment Bill

UN calls for urgent action to protect Iraqi children trom landmine

MI News Sevice, Baghdad: The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS) on Friday jointly called for immediate action to protect Iraqi children from the ongoing landmine threat.

Landmines and explosive remnants of war continue to endanger lives in Iraq, with children among the most vulnerable, according to a joint statement released by the two organizations.

The statement revealed that at least 314 children have been killed or injured by explosive ordnance over the past five years, citing UN official reports.

Iraq still faces significant dangers from explosive ordnance, with more than 2,700 square km of land remaining contaminated,

"These hidden dangers not only endanger lives but also deprive children of their rights to play, learn, and thrive," UNICEF Representative in Iraq Sandra Lattouf said.

Waqf Amendment Bill Puts 98% of Waqf properties in U.P. at risk

MI News Service: The vate landowners discovpassage of the Waqf Amendment Bill has put nearly 98% of Waqf properties in Uttar Pradesh in a state of uncertainty. A significant number of these properties remain unrecorded in revenue records. Under the new law, decision-making authority over Waqf assets will shift from the Waqf Board to district magistrates, fundamentally altering the governance structure of these properties. Additionally, the 57,792 government properties claimed by the Waqf Board will now fall outside its jurisdiction, significantly diminishing the board's

control over these lands. independence, Since the management of Waqf properties in Uttar Pradesh has been plagued by irregularities, with allegations of wrongful registration and land encroachments surfacing over the years. A confidential report from the state's Minority Welfare Department reveals that even public utili-ty lands—designated for schools, hospitals, and community centers—have been wrongfully registered as Waqf properties. In several districts, including Rampur and Hardoi, cases have emerged where priered that their properties had been falsely recorded as Waqf assets. These misregistrations have led to prolonged legal battles and ownership disputes.

Moving forward, disputes concerning Waqf properties will be adjudicated by district magistrates, who will base their decisions on revenue records from the agricultural year 1359 (1952). The amendment directly affects 57,792 government properties spread across multiple districts, covering a total of 11,712 acres. According to legal provisions, these properties should never have been designated as Waqf assets. With the new law in effect, these properties will be immediately excluded from Waqf jurisdiction, and local administrations will take physical possession to ensure their proper use as per state

regulations. Critics argue that the unchecked authority of the Waqf Board enabled largescale misappropriation of government land under the guise of religious endowments. The amended law is expected to restore governmental control over these lands and prevent future disputes.

AIMPLB to Challenge Bill in Court

Maulana Khalid Rasheed Firangi Mahali, a member of the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB), has strongly opposed the bill and warned of legal action. "If the bill is passed in the Rajya Sabha, we will challenge it in court. We are hopeful of getting justice, as our position aligns with constitutional facts,

he stated. He also expressed disappointment over the lack of opposition from key political parties, including Nitish Kumar's Janata Dal (United) and Chandrababu Naidu's Telugu Desam Party, which he had expected to resist the bill. 'It would have been better if all parties had taken a strong and well-researched stance against the bill," he added.

The bill's passage in the Rajya Sabha is expected to set the stage for a legal battle, with the AIMPLB prepared to challenge the legislation in court. As the issue unfolds, it is likely to generate significant political and legal discourse, with both sides debating the constitutional validity and socio-religious implications of the amendments.

Islamic scholars issue fatwa calling for war against Israel

MI News Service, Doha/ **Dublin:** The International Union of Muslim Scholars (IUMS), via its Ijtihad and Fatwa Committee, has issued a fatwa calling for jihad (war) against Israel, urging Muslim nations and communities worldwide to mobilise in support of the Palestinian cause—including through military intervention.

The fatwa, shared by Secretary-General Ali AlQaradaghi on X on Friday evening, April 4, declares armed jihad against the Israeli force a religious obligation for every able Muslim. It stresses that this duty applies across the en-

The plight of Pakistani women has drawn international attention, yet meaningful change remains elusive due to entrenched societal norms,

MOUNT MAUNGANUI : Ben Sears's second five-wicket haul on the trot inspired New Zealand to whitewash Pakistan with a 3-0 ODI series triumph, following their 43-run success in the third and final clash of the series at Bay

Oval on Saturday.

In a 42-over-reduced game due to a wet outfield, Pakistan's pursuit of a 265-run target began with Imam-ul-Haq retiring hurt after taking a bouncer from William O'Rourke on his helmet. He instantly removed his helmet, holding his jaw. After a brief halt, he was eventually taken off the field, and Pakistan's premier batter, Babar Azam, arrived at the crease to carry the fight for his

A 69-run partnership brewed between Babar and Abdullah Shafique as the duo flaunted their textbook strokeplay. Babar danced around the track to dispatch Michael Bracewell's flighted delivery past the boundary rope for a maximum

Sears, who effectively used the short ball ploy, broke the threat-



ening partnership. Shafique (33) swivelled his hook without any timing straight down to Jacob Duffy. The floodgates opened, and Pakistan started losing scalps at regular intervals.

Babar's 50 kept Pakistan's hopes high, but Daryl Mitchell set him up perfectly to scythe his scalp. Skipper Mohammad Rizwan (37) and Tayyab Tahir (33) resisted but gave away their wickets to Duffy. Sears cleaned up the middle and tail-end to force

Pakistan to pack on 221, surrendering to a 43-run defeat.
