West Bengal Board of Secondary Education moved the Supreme Court seeking modification of its earlier order

MI News Service, Kolkata: Within hours of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's speech at the Netaji Indoor Stadium for jobless teachers on Monday, the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education moved the Supreme Court with a plea seeking a modification of its earlier order.

The Board requested that candidates not tainted by malpractice be allowed to continue in service either until the end of the current academic session or until a new recruitment process is completed.

In her address, Banerjee urged the terminated candidates to continue voluntary service at their respective schools unless and until they receive formal dismissal letters. "Providing voluntary service is not contempt of court. Until you are officially removed, continue your duties," she advised.

During the meeting, representatives of the terminated candidates submitted an eight-point charter of demands, urging the state government to take immediate remedial action. Chief among their appeals was a request for the filing of a review petition in the Supreme Court, backed by accurate records and proper documentation. They further demanded a temporary suspension of dismissal orders until the review process is complete, alongside a halt on any new recruitment notifications during this period. The candidates also sought the publication of mirror images of their OMR answer sheets to ensure transparency. Additionally, they called for a clear and unbiased segregation of eligible and ineligible candidates in a publicly disclosed list. To strengthen their legal battle, they requested the appointment of competent legal representation. An all-party meeting was also proposed to build consensus across the political spectrum.

MI News Service, Jammu: Emphasizing that the Border Security Force is known for its relentless dedication, enduring extreme weather conditions, and remaining alert 24/7, Union Home minister Amit Shah has described the BSF jawans as the "country's first line of defense who play a vital role in ensuring the nation security".

Addressing the BSF officers and jawans at 'Vinay' border outpost in Kathua near Jammu on Monday on the first day of his two day visit to the Union Territory, Shah assured that the "government is committed to enhancing border security with advanced technologies, offering unwavering support to the BSF's mission.

Here, one can truly understand the challenging conditions under which you ensure the security of the nation's borders". He said "whether in intense cold, heavy rain, or 45-degree heat, not a single moment allows you to relax. You have to remain stationed 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, in all types of weather and terrain, staying vigilant so that no adversary can make a move".

"The entire country knows that the BSF is our first line of defense. In every war with Pakistan, the BSF has played a crucial role alongside the army. The technical support provided to the BSF over the next 3-4 years will be used to complete border security measures along the India-Pakistan border and later on at the India-Bangladesh border as well. This will include technologies such as advance threat detection and immediate response capabilities," the Union Home Minister highlighted.

He asserted further that the support from the Indian Government for the BSF has always been a top priority

"Whatever plans are provided to us; we are always ready to implement them. Currently, 26 experiments are underway, and within the next year, we will definitely reach a decision that will provide many benefits to you," Amit Shah said.

The Union Home Minister will also give appointment letters to the kin of Jammu and Kashmir police officials who lost their lives while fighting terrorism in the region.

Speaking on it, J-K Director General of Police, Nalin Prabhar said, "Today we have gathered to pay tribute to martyrs.

Altogetehr 1620 Policemen have been martyred so far. Few days back, two Pakistani terrorists were killed by our brave policemen. The Terror network has been destroyed by J-K police. " the DGP said.

Earlier, prior to the arrival of Union Home minister in Jammu and Kashmir on a two day visit from Monday, security has been beefed up across the region to prevent any

untoward incident during his tour.

To begin his tour Amit Shah first landed in Jammu on the first day of his visit on Monday to review the security situation across the Union Territory.

He is scheduled to visit the house of deceased police officer Humayun Muzammil Bhat in Humhama, before heading to the Rajbhawan for an overnight stay.

Deputy Superintendent of Police Bhat was among four security personnel who died in the line of duty while battling terrorists in 2023. The encounter took place on September 13 in the dense forests surrounding Gadool village of Kokernag in south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

Shah will review the security in Kashmir in a meeting with top security forces and police officers after reaching Srinagar on Tuesday.

He will also review the developmental projects underway in a separate meeting.

Supreme Courts of India and Nepal sign MoU for judicial cooperation

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Mamata Banerjee extends her full support to all eligible teachers who lost jobs in Bengal schools

MI News Service, Kolkata: Extending her full and unequivocal support to all eligible school teachers in West Bengal who lost their jobs following a Supreme Court order last week, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday assured them that her government "will do everything" to ensure that they don't remain jobless 'even for a day" or have a break in service.

The apex court had on April 3 invalidated the appointment of a total of 25,753 teachers and members of the non-teaching staff in state-run and aided schools in Bengal, calling the entire selection process "vitiated and tainted".

Ignoring all criticism in the social media for the alleged inept handling of the case, the Chief minister reiterated that "I will stand by those who have lost their jobs in an unjust manner. I don't care what others think. I will do everything to restore your dignity," Addressing a meeting with affected candidates and school staffers at the packed Netaji Indoor Stadium here on Monday, Mamata Banerjee repeatedly assured all eligible candidates who lost their jobs following the Supreme Court order, of her government's full support to ensure they would not face any financial constraints in the coming days. "Don't loose your heart and believe from us', she roared

In her nearly 40 minute long address at the meeting, Mamata Banerjee said, "I will stand by those who have lost their jobs in an unjust manner. I don't care what others think. I will do everything to restore

your dignity."

"We have separate plans in place

to ensure that the eligible candidates do not face any break in service. We will not allow them to remain jobless," she added

Reiterating that the state government respects the Supreme Court ruling, the Chief minister further stated that the administration is taking proactive steps to handle the situation with "utmost care and fairness".

The chief minister also claimed that her name was being dragged into something about which "I have no link and was not aware of", referring to discrepancies in the school job appointments.

"I am ready to even go to jail if anyone wants to penalise me for standing with those who lost school jobs," she asserted.

"There is a conspiracy to break the entire education system. A dirty game is being played by some people," she said, in an apparent reference to opposition BJP and the

Outlining her plan to file a Review Petition in the Apex Court against its verdict, the Chief minister said her government and state Education ministry will appoint all top and eminent lawyers and advocates in the country to fight on behalf the state government in the court to explore all possibilities to restore jobs of all eligible teachers.

'If the court gives us a positive result, we shall certainly welcome that. But if not, we have kept a Plan-B ready', she said but did not disclose further.

Chaos prevailed outside the stadium as many people who had not been issued entry passes could not enter at the venue to attend the programme and were prevented by the

Police officers, present in large numbers, had a tough time pacifying the assembled people who wanted to enter the indoor stadium to be present at the meeting.

Outside the meeting venue, a teaching staff member, Akhtar Ali, said that those who are in the institutions and have committed fraud should be put in jail.

"Why punish us when we have passed the examination, given interviews, and then been selected? Why did such a big fraud happen to us?" he said.

Meanwhile, another teacher hoped that CM Mamata Banerjee would understand their pain.

"We hope that she will understand the pain of us--almost 19,000 untainted people. We lost in the High Court but moved to the Supreme Court with the hope that we would win, but sadly, the judgment was not in our favour. We are trapped in this scam, and we are the collateral damage. We will not appear for the reexamination, and why should we? As per the order, the tainted (employees) have been asked to pay back whatever they have earned as salary with interest in the last six months, she said.Outside the venue of the meeting, a teacher Yasmin Parveen said that she had hopes from the West Bengal CM."We have hopes from the CM. We fulfilled all the procedures to get the job. After being employed for seven years, we are now unemployed. We need

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SC to consider listing for pleas challenging validity of Waqf law

MI News Service, New Delhi: In a major development the Supreme Court has agreed to consider listing for urgent hearing of the petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025.

On Monday a bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and justices Sanjay Kumar and KV Viswanathan took note of the submissions of senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind, that there were several petitions on the issue and they needed to be listed for urgent hearing.

Besides Sibal, senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi and lawyer Nizam Pasha have also mentioned other petitions for urgent listing.

The CJI, who has earlier cancelled the practice of oral mentioning of cases for urgent listing, asked the lawyers to file letters or send mails for getting the matters listed before a bench.

When Sibal said the same has already been done, the CJI said, "I will see the mentioning letter in the afternoon and take a call. We will list it." Pasha mentioned the petition filed by Lok Sabha MP Asaduddin Owaisi

President Droupadi Murmu on Saturday gave her assent to the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, which was earlier passed by both Houses Parliament after heated debates for several hours in both the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha . Several pleas, including those by Congress MP Mohammad Jawed, AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi and AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan, were filed in the top court challenging the validity of the Act. 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LPG cylinders become costlier by Rs 50, while excise duty on petrol, diesel go up by Rs 2 per litre

MI News Service, New Delhi: In yet another blow to the common people of India and putting further pressure in their monthly budget, the Central government has announced a hike in the prices of domestic LPG cylinders by Rs 50, besides raising the excise duties on diesel and petrol by Rs 2 per litre, effective from Tuesday,

Announcing the hike of LPG prices with effect from Tuesday, Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Puri told a press conference on Monday

"The price per cylinder of LPG will increase by Rs 50. From Rs 500, it will go up to Rs 550 in case of PMUY beneficiaries, and for others, it will go up from Rs 803 to Rs 853". The Union minister said "This is a step which we will review as we go along. We review these in every 2-3 weeks." The minister further stated that the imposition of additional excise duties of Rs 2 each on petrol and diesel is "intended to compensate the oil marketing companies for their previous losses"...

"The two rupees excise duty has been imposed by the finance ministry. It will not be passed on to the consumer. Rather it will come into the general kitty, and it will be utilized for reimbursing the LPG losses of the same (oil marketing) company," the minister added.

According to a notification from the Department of Revenue, "the central government has raised the excise duties on diesel and petrol by Rs 2 per litre, effective Tuesday"...

Currently, the government charges excise duty of Rs 19.90 per litre on petrol. From Tuesday, it will become Rs 21.90 a litre. Similarly, the current excise duty on diesel is Rs 15.80 per litre, and it will increase to Rs 17.80 per litre effective Tuesday.

Oil marketing companies have informed the Petroleum Ministry that retail prices of petrol and diesel will, however, remain the same.

However, interestingly, the Crude oil prices in the global market have softened over the past from over USD 70 per barrel to USD 63 per barrel on Monday, raising margins for the oil marketing companies (OMCs). This substantial decline in oil prices may have prompted the government to hike the excise duties on petrol and diesel, informed sources said.

Reserve Bank MPC starts deliberations amid expectations of further rate cut

MI News Service, Mumbai: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday started its bi-monthly monetary policy review amid expectations of a 25 bps cut in key interest rates in the backdrop of moderating inflation and the need to stimulate growth as tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump pose severe challenges to the global economy. The decision of the six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) headed by RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra will be announced on Wednesday. In February, the MPC slashed the repo rate by 25 basis points to 6.25 per cent. It was the first reduction since May 2020 and the first revision after two-

and-a-half years.

The RBI's Monetary Policy Committee meets every two months, holding a total of six sessions annually. These meetings are crucial in determining interest rate changes, guided by factors such as inflation trends, liquidity levels, and other macroeconomic conditions.

This will be the first monetary policy review for the financial year 2025-26, with the outcome — specifically regarding lending rates — expected to be made public on Wednesday, April 9. The RBI is expected to reduce key interest rates by as much as 25 basis points this week, with easing inflation creating room for a more accommodative policy approach. The move also comes amid growing concerns over global economic headwinds, particularly following the US's announcement of reciprocal tariffs.

In February, the Monetary Policy Committee of the RBI, led by Governor Sanjay Malhotra, reduced the repo rate by 25 basis points, bringing it down to 6.25 per cent. This marked the first rate cut since May 2020 and the first change in policy after a gap of two and a half years. ince February 2023, the RBI has maintained the repo rate — the short-term lending rate — at 6.5 per cent. The last rate cut occurred in May 2020 during the Covid-19 period, after which the rate was gradually increased to its current level. The RBI's MPC meeting for April 2025 is scheduled to take place over three days, from April 7 to April 9, 2025. The outcome of the meeting, including key decisions such as potential changes to the repo rate, will be announced by RBI

Governor Sanjay Malhotra

on April 9 at 10.00 am. The meeting is significant as it sets the tone for the RBI's monetary policy stance for the financial year 2025-26.

Also announcing adjustments to other key rates, RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra said the Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) was set at 6 per cent, while the Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate and the bank rate were fixed at 6.5 per cent

The central bank had kept its Consumer Price Inflation (CPI) projection for FY25 steady at 4.8 per cent, and expected inflation to ease further to 4.2 per cent in FY26. On the growth front, the RBI maintained its GDP growth estimate at 6.6 per cent for FY25 and forecasted a slight uptick to 6.7 per cent in FY26. Governor Malhotra said that the MPC has unanimously opted to retain a 'neutral' policy stance. This allows flexibility to either raise or lower interest rates based on evolveconomic

inflationary trends, with the dual goal of price stability and supporting growth. Additionally, the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) remained unchanged at 4 per cent, as confirmed by the RBI Governor.


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Kolkata's 'largest handmade telescope' inaugurated News Ser

"It is the largest handmade telescope in the city. It embodies both crafts-manship and scientific ambition. The core of this telescope is its large parabolic primary mirror, which was painstakingly hand-ground and shaped in Kolkata,' said Dr Sudipta Sasmal, co-founder and associate professor of IASES.

Tragic accident claims life of scooter passenger

Kolkata: In a heart-wrenching road accident that unfolded on Monday afternoon, a scooter passenger lost his life after being hit by a government-operated bus in Chingrighata, Kolkata. The deceased, identified as Harmohan, was riding pillion when the vehicle was struck by the bus. In a horrifying sequence of events, the victim fell onto the road and was run over by the same bus, resulting in his immediate

sustained minor injuries. According to eyewitnesses, the incident occurred at approximately 1:15 PM, when the duo was travelling from Shantinagar towards Garia via Chingrighata on the EM Bypass. As their two-wheeler ascended onto the Chingrighata stretch of the bypass, it was hit from behind by the speeding bus. The impact threw both riders off the vehicle. Nadia residents struggle with new electric meters, face recharge issues

The sudden installation of the meters has caused various issues, prompting concerns among the affected residents.

Bengal teachers face job losses amid recruitment scam

MI News Service, North Dinajpur: A sever teacher shortage has led to postponement of exams at the local school. With only 7 teacher, including students body has becoming impractical. The school has been forced to delay the exam by seven days to address the staffing crisis.

Goagaon High School in Uttar Dinajpur's Goalpokhar 1 block is grappling with a severe teacher shortage, forcing administrators to postpone exams for nearly 3,000 students. The crisis began when the Supreme Court canceled the appointments of nine teachers due to recruitment irregularities in 2016, leaving only seven instructors, includ-ing Headmaster Kaushar Ahmed, to manage the school.The sudden loss of staff has created uncertainty for students and parents. "We had prepared, but now we face many problems due to the sudden cancellation," said Guddi Khatun, a Class 10 student. Parents are also concerned, with local resident Mohammad Abu Taher expressing frustration: "We want the learning environment to return to school soon." The school's administration is seeking government intervention, hoping that a review petition or alternative measures by the Chief Minister might reinstate the terminated teachers. The Uttar Dinajpur District Primary School Council has a list of rejected prima-ry teachers, which might be relevant to this case. This incident is part of a larger issue affecting West Bengal, where 25,753 teachers and non-teaching staff lost their jobs due to similar recruitment irregularities. The West Bengal School Service Commission is expected to conduct fresh exams for 22 lakh candidates, but the process is anticipated to take time. Gaogaon High School is struggling to manage with only 7 teacher, including the headmaster. Exams have been postponed for 3,000 students due to the teacher shortage. The school administration is seeking government help to reinstate the terminated teacher. A shocking and disturbing incident occurred during a Ram Navami procession in Chandrakona, Paschim Medinipur district, where a sadhu, dressed in traditional attire, performed a daring and potentially hazardous act. The sadhu, wielding a sword, cut a cucumber placed on a young man's stomach, sparking a mixture of shock and applause from the onlookers. The incident, which took place amidst a large crowd of Ram devotees, has raised serious concerns about public safety and the role of the administration in ensuring the well-being of citizens. Addressing a gathering at Netaji Indoor Stadium on Monday, the Chief Minister hinted at a "conspiracy" and raised concerns

played" behind the scenes of the court's decision.

In response, the ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) has announced a series of mass mobilisation programmes to protest what they term a "BJP-Left conspiracy" aimed at de-railing the state's employment initiatives. At a press briefing held Monday afternoon, TMC's state general secretary Kunal Ghosh unveiled the party's protest plans in detail.

Ghosh stated that on April 9 at 3 PM, the TrinamoolChhatra-Parishad (TMCP) — the party's student wing — will lead a protest march from College Square to Dharmatala in central Kolkata. Furthermore, on April 11, statewide protest programmes will be held across all blocks, towns, and wards in West Bengal.

The controversy erupted following a Supreme Court ruling that struck down the entire 2016 SSC recruitment panel, citing large-scale procedural irregularities and unconstitutional appointments. The verdict resulted in the sudden termination of 26,000 school employees, triggering political shockwaves

TMC leaders have since alleged that the verdict may be influenced by vested political interests. They claim that opposition forces — particularly the BJP and the Left — are conspiring to obstruct the state government's pro-employment policies spearheaded by Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

During her Monday address, Banerjee reaffirmed her government's commitment to the affected candidates and hinted that the party would not remain silent in the face of what she described as "justice denied." Her statements echoed the party's earlier stance that the opposition is exploiting judicial channels to destabilise the Trinamool government ahead of the upcom-

Many plants have withered prematurely, resulting in reduced yield. As a result, prices have shot up not only in urban retail markets but also at the source—rural wholesale

markets. Farmers from nearby villages usually bring fresh produce daily to local rural markets, from where vegetables make their way into city markets. But this summer, the supply chain has disrupted by been weather conditions. On

Sunday, prices in various rural markets reflected the strain: pointed gourd and okra sold at Rs 70-80 per kg, ridge gourd and jackfruit at Rs 60, flat beans at Rs 80, and cucumber also at Rs 60

Urban buyers have expressed frustration at the escalation. Rahul Sengupta, a consumer in South Kolkata, remarked, "Yes, the heat has been intense, but prices for vegetables, as well as fish and meat, have suddenly spiked post-Eid. Just a few days ago, the rates were far more reasonable."

However, farmers remain cautiously optimistic. They assert that the arrival of rain could reverse the trend, replenishing farmlands and restoring balance to the supply chain. Until then, shoppers may need to brace for further increases, especially with festivities on the hori-

Justice Soumen Sen recuses himself from primary teachers' recruitment scam case

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a significant development in the high-profile case concerning the alleged corruption in the recruitment of primary school teachers in West Bengal, Justice Soumen Sen of the Calcutta High Court has recused himself from hearing the matter. The case, which involves the cancellation of nearly 32,000 appointments, was scheduled to be heard on Monday by a division bench headed by Justice Sen. However, prior to the proceedings, he formally withdrew, bringing the current bench's jurisdiction over the case to an

end. The matter will now be referred to Chief Justice T.S. Sivagnanam, who is expected to constitute a new division bench to continue the hearings. The decision adds a fresh layer of uncertainty to the ongoing legal battle, which has already sent shockwaves through the state's education and legal systems.

The genesis of the case dates back to a directive issued by former Calcutta High Court judge Justice AbhijitGangopadhyay, who ordered the termination of around 32,000 primary school teachers on grounds of irregularities and procedural lapses. The verdict was subsequently challenged by the state government, and the matter escalated to the Supreme Court, which remanded it back to a division bench of the Calcutta High Court for further adjudication.

Justice Sen, alongside Justice Uday Kumar, was overseeing the matter, and had previously sought detailed submissions from all stakeholders. The division bench had questioned the rationale behind the mass terminations and called for clarity on the procedural grounds that led to the disqualification of such a large number of candi-

Drunk driving horror leaves one dead, eight critically injured

MI News Service, Kolkata: Sources confirmed on Monday morning that a devastating road accident in Kolkata's Thakurpukur area has claimed the life of a local vegetable vendor and critically injured eight others. The tragic incident occurred around 9 AM on Sunday, when a black SUV-allegedly driven by 35-yearold film and television director Siddhant Das-careened into a crowded market after he lost control of the vehicle.

Preliminary investigations suggest Das was under the influence of alcohol at the time of the accident. Witnesses recounted scenes of panic and destruction as the

senger reportedly fled the scene. Police recovered four liquor bottles from the vehicle and have filed an FIR.

SUV rammed through parked two-wheelers and pedestrians, ultimately coming to a halt only after crashing into another scooter. The deceased vendor died from severe injuries sustained in the collision, while the injured were rushed to nearby hospitals. The condition of several victims remains critical. Das was physically assaulted by enraged locals before being rescued and arrested by police. A woman travelling with him in the front seat was also detained, while a second female pas-

This ruling is expected to escalate legal and political pressure on the Ma-Banerjee-led administration, which may now move to challenge the verdict before a division bench.

WBMC enforces new norms for license renewal

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a significant regulatory shift, the West Bengal Medical Council (WBMC) has introduced a new mandatory requirement for the renewal of medical registrations. From now on, all practicing doctors in the state must earn at least 30 credit hours over a five-year period to be eligible for re-registration. The council has issued an official notification detailing the guidelines, sparking widespread debate and discontent within the medical fraternity. According to the WBMC, the move aligns with the directives of the National Medical Commission (NMC), which recommends a minimum of 30 credit hours for doctors seeking promotions or engaging in research. The council has now made this standard obligatory for continued medical practice in the state. To accumulate these credit hours, doctors will be required to attend educational sessions such as seminars, conferences, training programs, or medical discussions. A doctor would need to participate in approximately six hours of such activities annually to meet the quota within the stipulated five-year timeframe.

However, the new rule has drawn sharp criticism from several doctors' associations. They argue that while continued education is necessary, making it a condition for license renewal imposes unfair logistical and financial burdens—especially on doctors serving in remote or rural areas. Traveling to urban centers like Kolkata to attend eligible sessions may not be feasible for all they claim.

AC bus catches fire, several injured

1,247 sexual harassment cases in Bengaluru

MI News Service, Bengaluru: Karnataka home minister G Parameshwara has once again courted controversy — this time over a remark many say trivialises women safety issues on the streets of Bengaluru. Speaking in response to a CCTV clip that went viral last week, the senior Congress leader said incidents like these are "common in big cities," a comment that has ignited public fury and drawn criticism. "Incidents like these tend to happen here and there in a big city like this," Parameshwara told reporters on Monday, adding, "Whatever legal action needs to be taken will be done in accordance with the law. I have also instructed our commissioner to increase beat patrolling," An unidentified man groped a woman in Bengaluru's BTM Layout in the early hours of April 3.

The CCTV footage, time stamped 1:52 am, showed two women walking through a dimly lit alley when a man lunged at one of them, groped her and fled. The woman hasn't filed any official complaint yet, but police have registered a suo motu case, India Today reported. The accused has been booked under Section 354B of the IPC, which pertains to assault or use of criminal force with intent to disrobe a woman. The home minister has yet to offer a clarification or retract his comment. According to city crime records, 1,247 cases of sexual harassment were reported in public places and workplaces in Bengaluru in 2024, up from 1,139 cases the previous year — a 9 per cent increase. Rape cases too have risen. From 110 in 2020 to 178 in 2024, the city has seen a year-on-year surge: 116 cases in 2021, 151 in 2022, and 172 in 2023. Bengaluru ranked third in India in 2023 for crimes against women, behind Delhi and Mumbai, with 639 cases of kidnapping and abduction and 763 assault cases, according to the National Crimes Records Bureau. A recent audit by the Bangalore Political Action Committee (B.PAC), cited by Deccan Herald, found that poor lighting, lack of secure bus stops, limited public toilets, and inadequate surveillance were key contributors to the city's unsafe conditions—especially for women.

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Keto diet metabolite may power up CAR T cells to kill cancer: Study


PENNSYLVANIA [US]: Researchers at Penn Medicine's Abramson Cancer Centre and the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine have found that a straightforward dietary supplement may offer a novel way to enhance CAR T cell performance.

The early research, presented at the 66th American Society of Haematology (ASH) Annual Meeting and Exposition (Abstract 4), suggests a potentially economical way to enhance CAR T cell function and cancer-fighting capabilities, even though the strategy needs to be evaluated in clinical trials.

CAR T cell therapy is a personalized treatment approach, pioneered at Penn Medicine, that reprograms patients' own immune cells to kill their cancer.

"Thousands of patients with blood cancers have been successfully treated with CAR T cell therapy, but it still doesn't work for everyone,' said co-lead author Shan Liu, PhD, a postdoctoral fellow who presented the study at ASH. "We took an outside-the-box approach to improve CAR T cell therapy, by targeting T cells through diet rather than further genetic

Liu co-led the study with Puneeth Guruprasad, PhD, who earned his PhD at Penn and is now a medical student in the Perelman



School of Medicine. The lead authors worked under the mentorship of co-senior authors Marco Ruella, MD, an assistant professor of Hematology-Oncology, a researcher with the Center for Cellular Immunotherapies and the scientific director of Penn Medicine's Lymphoma Program; and Maayan Levy, PhD, an assistant professor of Microbiology.

First, the research team tested the effect of several different diets, including ketogenic, high-fiber, high-fat, high-protein, high cholesterol, and a control diet, on CAR T cell's tumorfighting capabilities using a mouse model of

diffuse-large B-cell lymphoma. They found improved tumor control and survival in the mice receiving a ketogenic diet compared to all other diets. In subsequent studies, they found higher levels of beta-hydroxybutyrate (BHB), a metabolite produced by the liver in response to a ketogenic diet, was a key mediator of this effect. The research builds on previous work from Levy's team, which found that BHB strongly suppressed the growth of colorectal tumors in lab experiments. "Our theory is that CAR T cells prefer BHB as a fuel source rather than standard sugars in our body, such as glucose," Guruprasad said. "So, increasing the levels of BHB in the body gives the CAR T cells more power to take out the cancer cells." Next, the research team tested a BHB supplement combined with CAR T cell therapy in laboratory models of human cancer (on a standard diet); the results showed complete obliteration of the cancer in the vast majority of mice and resulted in higher CAR T cell expansion and activation. To see if BHB, which occurs naturally at various level in our bodies, had a similar effect in humans, the team assessed blood samples from patients who had recently received CAR T cell therapy and found that greater BHB levels were associated with better CAR T cell expansion in patients.

Researchers identify new potential treatment for cardiac arrhythmias

Arizona [US] : A recent study by researchers at the University of Arizona College of Medicine - Phoenix and the University of California Davis Health discovered a new target for developing a medication to treat atrial fibrillation, the most prevalent kind of irregular heart rhythm.

According to the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, atrial fibrillation, also known as AFib or AF, accounts for approximately one in every seven strokes and is associated with a considerable increase in morbidity and death. The American Heart Association predicts that more than 12 million people will have AFib by 2030, and existing treatment approaches are inadequate, according to researchers.

Proteins involved in physiological processes of the heart have been a target of research for AFib for some time. Until recently, most research suggested that treating AFib through inhibition of specific small-conductance calcium-activated potassium channels, or SK channels, could either reduce or worsen arrhythmias under different conditions.

"Our study used pioneering experimental and computational approaches to decipher how the human SK2 channel can be dynamically co-regulated. The study is especially timely considering inhibitors of SK channels are currently in clinical trials to treat AFib, making further insight into their regulatory mechanisms paramount," said Nipavan Chiamvimonvat, MD, chair of the Department of Basic Medical Sciences at the U of A College of Medicine - Phoenix. The paper, "Atomistic Mechanisms of the Regulation of Small Conductance Ca2+-Activated K+ channel (SK2) by PIP2," was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

The research team examined the role of a lipid - phosphatidylinositol 4,5-bisphosphate, or PIP2 - in regulating the SK2 channel. PIP2 is an integral component of all plant and animal cell membranes and acts as a messenger for a variety of signaling pathways in the body. "Because PIP2 plays such an essential role in multiple ion channels, regulating cardiac ion channels through PIP2 presents a new mechanism for the lipid regulation of cardiac excitability and function," said computational biologist Ryan Woltz, PhD, the paper's co-first author and an assistant research professor at the College of Medicine -

Currently, SK channels are the only known potassium channels that are upregulated in heart failure, and their regulation plays a critical role in cardiac excitability and how disturbances in the heart's rhythm develop. Since PIP2 is known to be dysregulated in heart failure, our study provides critical translational insights into possible mechanisms of cardiac arrhythmias in heart failure," said cofirst author Yang Zheng, PhD, a post-

doctoral research fellow at the College of Medicine - Phoenix. Using comparative modeling, the research team generated human SK2 channel models in closed, intermediate and open states. They then used molecular dynamics simulations to explore the molecular mechanisms of SK2 channel modulation by PIP2. 'Structural insights from our

study will be useful to design novel inhibitors of SK2 channels to treat cardiac arrhythmias," said Vladimir Yarov-Yarovoy, PhD, a professor at UC Davis Health.

Co-senior author Igor Vorobyov, PhD, an associate professor at UC Davis Health, said the team is already using similar computational approaches to study other SK channel subtypes.

"I am thrilled to participate in this collaborative multi-university and multidisciplinary research study and looking forward to a continued collaboration," Vorobyov said. "We are currently working on applying a similar pioneering experimental/computational approach to modulation of SK channels by drug molecules, which may enhance or inhibit function of these ion channels and can be used as prospective treatment options for AFib and other cardiovascular diseases." 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
Researchers discover that unique immune cells stop metastatic cancer

New York [US] : The majority of cancer deaths are caused by metastatic disease, which occurs when cancer spreads from the primary tumour to other areas of the body. and researchers understand how cancer cells escape the primary location to seed new tumours, it is unclear why some cancer cells produce new tumours decades later and others do not.

A research team at the National Cancer Institute-designated Montefiore Einstein Comprehensive Cancer Centre (MECCC) has uncovered a natural immunological response in mice that prevents escaping cancer cells from growing into tumours elsewhere in the body. The study was published today in the jour-

"Preventing or curing metastases is the most critical challenge in cancer," said study leader Julio Aguirre-Ghiso, Ph.D., director of MECCC's Cancer Dormancy Institute. "We think our findings have the potential to point to new therapies to prevent or treat metastatic disease." The study's co-first authors are Erica Dalla, Ph.D., a former student, and Michael Papanicolaou, Ph.D., a

Cells that migrate from primary tumors and seed metastatic tumors are called disseminated cancer cells (DCCs). Some DCCs



behave aggressively, immediately starting tumors in new tissue, while others remain in a state of suspended animation referred to as dormancy. "It's long been a mystery how some DCCs can remain in tissues for decades and never cause metastases, and we believe we've found the explanation," said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso, who is also professor of cell biology, of oncology, and of medicine and the Rose C. Falkenstein Chair in Cancer Research at Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Breast cancer and many other lungs. In research involving three mouse models of metastatic breast cancer, Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso and colleagues determined that when breast cancer DCCs spread to the lung's air sacs (alveoli), they are kept in a dormant state by immune cells known as alveolar macrophages

"Alveolar macrophages are the lung's first responders, defending the organ against bacteria and dangerous substances like environmental pollutants, said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso. These specialized macrophages, he notes, appear early in embryonic development and reside within lung tissue for life.

"Our findings demonstrate a new role for these macrophages, actively interact with them, and-by secreting a protein called TGFb2--produce signals in the cancer cells that keep them in a dormant state," Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso said.

Since every organ in the body has its own set of tissue-resident macrophages, they may function to keep DCCs in check in those organs as well. Our study has shown for the first time that these specialized macrophages function to actively induce dormancy in

Confirming the importance of alveolar macrophages in keeping DCCs dormant, Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso and his team found that depleting them in the mice significantly increased the number of activated DCCs and subsequent metastases in their lungs compared to mice with normal levels of the immune

As DCCs become more aggressive, the researchers found, they become resistant to the pro-dormancy signals produced by alveolar macrophages. Ultimately, this evasion mechanism enables some DCCs to "wake up" from dormancy and reactivate to form metas-

"Understanding how immune cells keep DCCs in check could lead to new anti-metastatic cell therapies among other strategies," Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso said. For example, he noted, it may be posto strengtnen signaling so that DCCs never awaken from dormancy or find ways to prevent older DCCs from becoming resistant to dormancy

Researchers find how cells recognize, repair DNA damage

Wurzburg [Germany] : When cells divide, there is a substantial risk of genetic harm. After all, the cell must repeat its whole genetic material, including billions of genetic letters, before it can divide. This repeatedly produces "reading errors" in the genome. Other factors, including as exposure to sunlight, alcohol, and cigarettes, are also responsible for the buildup of DNA damage over a person's lifetime.

Of course, the cell is not impotent in the presence of such injuries. It contains a large library of biological mechanisms that are activated in response to DNA damage. The precise term for this is DNA damage response (DDR). Specific signaling pathways are usually responsible for the immediate recognition and repair of DNA damage, ensuring the cell's survival.

A team of scientists from Julius-Maximilians-Universitat Wurzburg (JMU) in Bavaria, Germany, has recently conducted a closer examination of one of these signaling routes. The researchers discovered a new mechanism for the DNA damage response that is mediated by an RNA transcript. Their findings serve to widen the conceptual perspective of the DNA damage response and link it more closely


Dr Kaspar Burger, junior research group leader at the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, was responsible for this study. The group has published the results of their investigations in the journal Genes & Development.

"In our study, we focused on so-called long non-coding RNA that some of these transcripts act as regulators of genome stability," says Kaspar Burger, explaining the background to the work. The study focused on the nuclear enriched abundant transcript 1 also known as NEAT1 - which is found in high concentrations in many tumor cells. NEAT1 is also known to react to DNA damage and to cellular stress. However, its exact role in the DNA damage response was previously unclear.

"Our hypothesis was that RNA metabolism involves NEAT1 in the DNA damage response in order to ensure the stability of the genome," says Burger. To test this hypothesis, the research group experimentally investigated how NEAT1 reacts to serious damage to the genome - so-called DNA double-strand breaks - in human bone cancer cells. The result: "We were able to show that DNA double-strand breaks increase both the number of NEAT1 transcripts and the amount of N6-methyladenosine marks on NEAT1," says the scientist.

Methyladenosine marks on RNA transcripts are a topic that scientists have not been dealing with for very long. They fall into the area of epitranscriptomics the field of biology that deals with the question of how RNA modifications are involved in the regulation of gene expression. Methyl groups play a key role in this. It is known, for example, that RNA modifications are often misplaced in cancer cells.

The experiments conducted by Kaspar Burger and his team show that the frequent occurrence of DNA double-strand breaks causes excessive methylation of NEAT1,



which leads to changes in the NEAT1 secondary structure. As a result, highly methylated NEAT1 accumulates at some of these lesions to drive the recognition of broken DNA. In turn, experimentally induced suppression of NEAT1 levels delayed the DNA damage response, resulting in increased amounts of DNA dam-

NEAT1 itself does not repair DNA damage. However, as the Wurzburg team discovered, it enables the controlled release and activation of an RNA-binding DNA repair factor. In this way, the cell can recognize and repair DNA damage highly efficiently.

According to the scientists, knowledge about the role of NEAT1 methylation in the recognition and repair of DNA damage could open up new therapeutic options for tumors with high NEAT1 expression. However, it must first be clarified whether these results, which were obtained in simple cell systems, can also be transferred to complex tumor models.

Kaspar Burger's research was supported by the German Cancer Aid and the Mildred Scheel Early Career Center for Cancer

Research (MSNZ) in Wurzburg.

Whenever cells divide, there is a high risk of damage to the genetic material. After all, the cell has to duplicate its entire genetic material and copy billions of genetic letters before it divides. This repeatedly results in "reading errors" of the genome. However, other factors are also responsible for the accumulation of DNA damage in the course of a person's life: exposure to sun light, alcohol and cigarettes are just a few examples of factors that are known to damage the genetic cer, among other things

Of course, the cell is not powerless in the face of such lesions. It has an extensive catalog of cellular mechanisms that are set in motion following DNA damage. DNA damage response, or DDR for short, is the technical term for this. Specific signaling pathways usually initiate the immediate recognition and repair of DNA damage, thus ensuring the survival of the cell.

A team of scientists from Julius-Maximilians-Universitat Wurzburg (JMU) in Bavaria, Germany, has now taken a closer look at one of these signaling pathways. The group has identified a new mechanism of the DNA damage response that is mediated via an RNA transcript. Their results help to broaden the conceptual view on the DNA damage response and to link it more closely with RNA metabolism.

Hamas asked USD 500M from Iran to fund Oct 7 attack: Israel

MI News Service, Tel Aviv: Israel has made public an intelligence document that, according to its officials, reveals a direct financial and operational link between Hamas and Iran, including a request for USD 500 million to carry out its plans to invade Israel — an attack that was executed on October 7, 2023. Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz shared the document and accompanying video on social media platform X, stating, "I am presenting here for the first time a document that was found in the tunnels of senior Hamas officials in Gaza, which proves a direct relationship between Iran and Yahva Sinwar and Muhammad Deif, as part of Iran's support for the Hamas plan to Katz, the document outlines Hamas's request to Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) Quds Force for USD 20 million per month over two years. The stated goal — to "uproot this monstrous entity" and "end this dark period in the his-

tory of our nation. Katz also claimed that Hossein Akbari Izadi, head of the IRGC's Palestinian department, responded by assuring Hamas of continued support despite Iran's economic hardship, affirming Tehran's strategic priority of opposing Israel and the United States. "In the document, Hamas demands USD 500 million from the IRGC's Quds Force to fund Israel's destruction," Katz said, further asserting, "Iran is the head of the snake

He added that Iran's support extends beyond Gaza to other regions, including Lebanon, Syria, Judea and Houthis, branding it a broad "axis of terror." "Israel will do whatever it takes to prevent Iran from acquiring nuclear weapons and will continue striking its terror proxies until the Iranian axis of evil is dismantled," the Defence Minister declared.

Japan launches new maritime unit to counter China amid tensions over Taiwan Strait

MI News Service, Hiroshima: Japan's Defence Minister Gen Nakatani on Sunday expressed commitment to enhancing the transport capabilities of the Self-Defense Forces for remote southern islands via a newly established unit focused on maritime logistics amid rising tensions over the Taiwan Strait, as reported by Kyodo News.

The unit will facilitate quicker and more secure troop deployments," Nakatani stated during a ceremony in Kure, Hiroshima Prefecture, commemorating the establishment of the Maritime Transportation Group, which was formed on March 24 and is located in the city, Kyodo News reported. The group, which operates under the direct control of Japan's Defence Minister, comprises approximately 100 personnel. It aims to acquire 10 transport vessels by March 2028, with two already constructed, according to the Self-Defense Forces (SDF). The captains of the two ships are members of the Maritime Self-Defense Force, while most other crew members are from the Ground Self-Defense Force, with training support provided by the MSDF. Nakatani said, "It is a historically significant milestone that we established the new unit with collaboration between the GSDF and the MSDF." Japan's action comes as China intensifies its pressure on Taiwan, a democratic island self-governed but claimed by Beijing, which has not dismissed the possibility of using force to assert control over it, according to Kyodo News.

Pirsahebs of Furfura Sharif join movement against passed Waqf Bill

Bangladesh sees riots against brutalities in Gaza

MI News Service, Dhaka: Protests erupted across Bangladesh, including the capital Dhaka, on Monday against Israeli brutality in Gaza. Various political, social, cultural, religious, and professional organizations protested on the streets of Dhaka. Organizers say they are holding the demonstrations as part of a global campaign to protest the brutal attacks on Palestinians in Gaza. Students have boycotted the classes and exams to participate in protests.

Officials and professionals have observed strikes. The organizers have urged the people to boycott Israeli goods."We support humanity first of all. The things that Israel has been doing to Palestine to remove their identity from the world are brutally bad. As a human, if I don't support Palestine right now, my humanity will be lost," said a student who joined the protest at Dhaka University. Protesters have strongly criticized the United States for supporting Israel in its attacks on Gaza, as well as the silence of organizations such as the United Nations, the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), and the Arab League. She said, answering a

question about the US role, "They have been doing this for power, nothing else. If they had humanity in their hearts, they would not be doing this to the people right now." "We are demanding to stop the genocide and to stop the killing of people," she added. Protesters carried Palestinian flags and displayed placards expressing solidarity with the people of Palestine. They also burnt an effigy of Netanyahu. The US has been criticised over Trump's proposal to forcibly relocate Palestinians to make way for the redevelopment of Gaza. Arab nations have decried the plan, and

rights groups have called it ethnic cleansing. Protesters also con-demned US crackdowns on pro-Palestinian activism on university campuses, as reported by Al Jazeera. At least 57 people have been killed in Gaza in the past 24 hours, and 137 injured, Gaza's Government Media Office said in a latest update. Since Israel resumed attacks on Gaza on March 18, the death toll has reached 1,391, while 3,434 were injured. The overall number of casualties since October 2023, now stands at 50,752 killed and 1,15,475 injured, Al Jazeera reported.

Dangerous conspiracy: Jamiat moves SC challenging validity of Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025

MI News Service, Delhi: The Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind has filed a petition in the Supreme Court challenging the constitutional validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, which was passed after intense debates in Parliament. The Act, given assent by President Droupadi Murmu, has sparked controversy, with several petitions seeking its invalidation. Ulama-i-Hind has condemned the law as a "danconspiracy" gerous designed to undermine Muslims' religious freedom. In its petition, the organization argues that the Act attacks the Constitution's provisions for equal rights and religious freedom. The group claims that the law would strip Muslims of their rights and has taken the matter to the Supreme Court, with its state units planning similar challenges in various high courts. Additionally, the

Samastha Jamiathul Ulema, a religious body of Sunni Muslim clerics from Kerala, has filed its own plea, arguing that the Act infringes upon the right of religious denominations to manage their affairs.

Their petition, filed by advocate Zulfiker Ali P S, asserts that the amendments would distort the religious character of Waqfs and negatively affect the democratic process of managing Waqf properties. The plea further contends that the law violates Article 26 of the Constitution, which protects the right of religious communities to manage their own religious

The 2025 Act has also been criticized for centralizing control over Wagfs, with state governments and State Waqf Boards losing their authority. This shift of power to the Central government, according to the plea, would be detrimental to Waqfs and the Muslim community, particularly regarding the management properties.

Several prominent figures, including Congress MP Mohammad Jawed, AIMIM leader Asaduddin Owaisi, and AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan, have filed petitions against the Act. Jawed's petition claims that the Act imposes arbitrary restrictions on Waqf properties, which undermine the religious autonomy of the Muslim community.

Owaisi's plea asserts that the Act discriminates against Muslims by reducing protections for Wagfs, while keeping similar protections intact for other religious endowments. He argues that this constitutes discrimination hostile against Muslims, violating Articles 14 and 15 of the

Pakistan: Farmers to launch nationwide protest against corporate farming on April 13

MI News Service, Islamabad: Farmers in Pakistan have decided to start a nationwide protest on April 13 against corporate farming, which is being implemented under the Green Pakistan Initiative (GPI), Dawn reported. Rallies and conventions will be carried out in various towns and at publicsector farms on April 13. The decision was taken by a joint sitting of the Pakistan Kissan Rabita Committee, Anjuman Mazareen Punjab, Hari Jedojehad Committee, Crofter Foundation, and Through the protest, the participants will call for an end to corporate farming and the eviction of peasants from the lands they have been cultivating for generations, as per the Dawn report. The participants will also demand a ban on the construction of controversial canals in southern Punjab, the distribution of all public sector agricultural lands among the peasants, the withdrawal of notices to tenants for payment of outstanding dues worth millions of rupees, and the fixation of the wheat purchase price at Pakistani Rupees (PKR) 4,000 per 40 kg during the ongoing harvesting season. Harry Brook was announced as England's new white-ball captain following Jos Buttler's resignation from the position following a dismal and winless ICC Champions Trophy campaign. The announcement was made on Monday. Brook, who has been part of the white-ball setup since 2022, has been pivotal to England's batting lineup across

Jos Buttler had stepped down from the role following a dismal

ICC Champions Trophy 2025 campaign. Currently ranked number two in the ICC Men's Test Batting Rankings, Brook has spent the past year as vice-captain in both ODI

and T20I formats, as per the ICC. He made his captaincy debut against Australia last September in Buttler's absence, earning praise for his tactical awareness and calm leadership. The series was a closely contested one which Australia won 3-2. The burden of captaincy also did not seem to affect Brook as he top-scored in the series with 312 runs in five matches at an average of 78.00 and a strike rate of over 127, with a century and two half-centuries.

Brook was also the captain of England U19s in the Men's U19 World Cup 2018. In that tournament, Brook made 239 runs in five matches with a century and two fifties to his name. England finished at seventh spot in the competition.

"It is a real honour to be named England's white-ball captain," Brook said in a press statement by England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB), as quoted by ICC.

"Ever since I was a kid playing cricket at Burley in Wharfedale, I dreamed of representing Yorkshire, playing for England, and maybe one day leading the team. To now be given that chance means a

"I want to thank my family and coaches who've supported me every step of the way. Their belief in me has made all the difference, and I would not be in this position without them.

"There is so much talent in this country, and I am looking forward to getting started, moving us forward, and working towards winning series, World Cups and major events. I am excited to get going and give it everything I have got," he concluded.

Buttler's tenure as captain began on a high note with England's victory in the 2022 Men's T20 World Cup. However, England have been under the scanner in their recent outings at the ICC tournaments, with a dismal Cricket World Cup in 2023 (a seventh place finish after just three wins and six losses) followed by another unsuccessful title defence at the T20 World Cup in 2024, where they lost to India in semifinals.

During their white-ball tour of India and the Champions Trophy earlier this year, England managed to win only one out of the 11 matches they played across formats, eventually leading to Buttler's resignation from the captaincy. However, the swashbuckling batter confirmed he will continue to feature across formats.

The new skipper's first assignment will begin when England take on West Indies at home across three ODIs and as many T20Is from May 29, followed by a white-ball series against South Africa at home

Kalinga Super Cup 2025 fixtures announced

NEW DELHI [INDIA] : The fixtures for the Kalinga Super Cup 2025 are announced. The tournament, which will be played in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, from April 20 to May 3, will see the participation of 16 clubs (13 from the Indian Super League and three from the I-League) in a singleelimination knock-out format. All matches will take place at the Kalinga Stadium.

The ISL teams were seeded for the round of 16 according to their final league position in the 2024-25 season. Three I-League teams confirmed their participation -Churchill Brothers FC Goa, Inter Kashi and Gokulam Kerala FC They will face the top three ISL teams (Mohun Bagan Super Giant, FC Goa and Bengaluru FC). These three matchups will be decided by a draw on Wednesday, April 9.

The round of 16 will be played on April 20, April 21, April 23 and April 24, the quarter-finals on April 26 and April 27, the semifinals on April 30, and the final on May 3. If the scores are level at the end of 90 minutes in the round of 16, quarter-finals and semi-finals, there will be no extra time, and a penalty shoot-out will determine the winner. If the scores are level at the end of 90 minutes in the final, there will be extra time, followed by a penalty shoot-out to determine the champion.

The winners of the Kalinga Super Cup 2025 will qualify for the 2025-26 AFC Champions League Two Preliminary Round. East Bengal FC are the defending champions, having beaten Odisha FC in the 2024 final in Bhubaneswar. Odisha FC (2023), FC Goa (2019) and Bengaluru FC (2018) have been the past champions of the Super Cup.

Pakistan penalized for slow over-rate in third ODI against New Zealand

NEW DELHI [INDIA] : Pakistan has been penalized five percent of their match fee for having a slow over-rate against New Zealand in the third ODI in Mount Maunganui on Saturday, according to a press release from the

Jeff Crowe from the Emirates ICC Elite Panel of Match Referees applied the penalty after it was determined that Mohammad Rizwan's team was one over short of the mark after accounting for

time allowances. In accordance with Article 2.22 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which relates to minimum over-rate offences, players are fined five per cent of their match fee for every over their side fails to bowl in the allotted

Rizwan pleaded guilty to the offence and accepted the proposed sanction, so there was no need for a formal hearing. Onfield umpires Chris Brown and Paul Reiffel, third umpire Michael Gough, and fourth umpire Wayne Knights leveled the charge.

Ben Sears's second five-wicket haul on the trot inspired New Zealand (NZ) to whitewash Pakistan (PAK) with a 3-0 ODI series triumph, following their 43-run success in the third and final series clash at Bay Oval on Saturday.

The third and final ODI was reduced to 42 overs due to a wet outfield. Pakistan's attempt to chase a target of 265 ultimately fell short as they were bowled out by New Zealand for 221 in 40 overs. During the run-chase, Babar Azam (50 in 58 balls, with four boundaries and a six) did score a fifty along with useful 30s Abdullah Shafique, Mohammed Rizwan and Tayyab Tahir. Still, Ben Sears (5/34) made sure Pakistan faced a clean sweep, skittled out for 221 in 40 overs. New Zealand captain



Michael Bracewell received the outstanding fifty and one wicket.

AIFF President Kalyan Chaubey chaired the meeting, which was attended by Vice President NA Haris, Treasurer Kipa Ajay, Deputy Secretary General Satyanarayan M, along with members Arif Ali, GP Palguna, Lalnghinglova Hmar, Menla Ethenpa, Mohan Lal, Neibou Sekhose, Syed Husnain Naqvi, Syed Imtiaz Hussain, Valanka Alemao, Vijay Bali, Thongam Tababi Devi, Pinky Bompal Magar, Shabbir Ali, Bhaichung Bhutia and Climax Lawrence.

The committee deliberated in detail about the MRA, and decided to form an eight-member task force to look into the MRA negotiations with FSDL. The task force will consist of the AIFF President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, Chairperson and Deputy

Chairperson of the Finance Committee, and the Chairperson of the League Committee.

The committee proposed a set of communications guidelines be set for all AIFF affairs, including national teams.

Colaco - who were recently conferred with the Dronacharva Award, be nominated as advisors to the AIFF President. Ghosh and Colaco, in coordination with Technical Director Sved Sabir Pasha, National Teams Director Subrata Paul, Technical Committee Chairperson IM Vijayan, Padmashree Awardee. and Deputy Chairperson Shabbir Ali, Major Dhyanchand Awardee,

will support the chief coaches of

the men's and women's national teams across all age categories. They will coordinate with the

coaches on matters such as the requirement for the duration of camps, scouting, and exposure matches for the respective teams. The aforementioned task force will also submit a quarterly report on the same to the
