The Northeast adjoins five of our neighbours on land, its boundaries are the interface between the Indian subcontinent and the ASEAN," he said. The EAM further stated that many recent initiatives involving India's immediate neighbours emanate from this region. Others

Robert Vadra appears before ED on second consecutive day

MI News Service, New Vadra was a director ear-Delhi: Priyanka Gandhi's lier, as it purchased a 3.5 husband and Rahul Gandhi's brother in law Robert Vadra, appeared before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on the second consecutive day on Wednesday for questioning in a 2008 Haryana land deal linked money laundering case.

Unlike yesterday (Tuesday) today Vadra was accompanied by his wife Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, who is the Congress MP from Kerala's Wayanad. The two exchanged hugs before Robert Vadra went inside the ED office.

He was questioned for about five hours on Tuesday and his statement was recorded by the federal probe agency under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), official sources said adding that a similar session will resume on Wednesday.

Earlier speaking to newsmen before heading towards the ED office, the 56-year-old Vadra had termed the Agency's action as nothing but a "political vendetta"

He said he has always cooperated with investigative agencies and has furnished huge amount of documents of over26,000 pages. He also stressed that there needs to be a closure in cases which

are as old as 20 years. The probe against Vadra is linked to a land deal in Haryana's Manesar-Shikohpur (now sector 83) in Gurugram. The land deal of February 2008 was done by a company named Skylight Hospitality Pvt Ltd, where

lier, as it purchased a 3.5 acre land in Shikohpur from a firm named Onkareshwar Properties at a price of Rs 7.5 crore.A Congress govern-ment led by Chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda was in power that time. But four years later, in September, 2012, the company sold this 3.53 acre land to realty major DLF for Rs 58 crore.

The land deal got into 2012 after IAS officer Ashok Khemka, then posted as the Director General of Land Consolidation and Land Recordscum- Inspector-General Registration

Haryana, cancelled the mutation of this categorising the transaction as violative of state consolidation Act and some related procedures.

The opposition Haryana BJP then called this case an instance of "corruption" in land deals and that of "nepotism" hinting at Vadra's kinship with the first family of the Congress

After Haryana Police had filed an FIR to probe this deal in 2018, Vadra has been questioned multiple times by the federal probe agency in two different money laundering earlier. While speaking to reporters on Tuesday, he charged that, "This is nothing but political vendetta. Whenever I speak for the minorities and for the people they try to stop me, crush us.. they tried to stop Rahul (Gandhi) in

Mamata Banerjee says BJP, BSF and section of central agencies are involved in 'pre-planned Murshidabad riots'

MI News Service, Kolkata: Squarely blaming a section of the BSF, Central agencies, and the opposition BJP for allegedly "fanning tension by facilitating cross-border influx from Bangladesh", West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Wednesday termed the recent communal violence in Murshid-abad as nothing but "preplanned"

Speaking at a meeting with Imams and other leaders of the minority community at the Netaji Indoor Stadium here today, Mamata Banerjee alleged that despite the volatile situation in neighbouring Bangladesh, the "central government allowed illegal entry from across the border", and claimed that the BSF and certain agencies "played a role in triggering unrest in Bengal". Requesting Prime Minister Narendra Modi not to implement the "atrocious" Wagf Amendment Act, she also urged him to keep the Union Home Ministry, headed by Amit Shah, under control.

"I would request the Prime Minister to keep a check on Amit Shah, he is doing harm to the nation to serve his own political agenda," she said.

"I came across news claiming the role of elements from across the border in Murshidabad unrest. Is it not the role of the BSF to guard the border? The state government does not guard the international border. The Central government must take responsibility," the Chief minister as-

The CM announced a compensation of Rs 10 lakh each for the families of three people killed during the violence and directed state Chief secretary Manoj Pant to initiate a probe into the role of the BSF, alleging that the force opened fire which led to the death of one of the victims.

'I will find out whom the BSF had financed in the bordering areas by giving money to youths to pelt throw during the violence," she said.

Alleging that outsiders linked to the BJP entered the state and incited violence, Mamata Banerjee said, "Why did they allow BJP thugs from outside to come and create chaos before fleeing? Accountability must be fixed. They want to polarise and divide Hindus and Muslims. They want their Jumla government. Don't divide the country; unite all instead." Dubbing the violent protests in Murshidabad against the Waqf Act as "pre-planned communal riots", the Chief Minister alleged that the Border Security Force had wilfully allowed those from "outside" to enter the state and create chaos. She was reacting to reports that the initial probe into the Murshidabad violence indicated the involvement of Bangladeshi miscreants.

Further alleging that the Opposition BJP in the state was "inciting people", Mamata Banerjee claimed that attempts are being made to "defame" Bengal.

Some people are defying the Constitution. Ambedkar made the Constitution. They have made this Constitution; we cannot say the BJP Constitution. What are you doing with the Constitution? You are inciting people. Some media will defame Bengal. They all do fake news," she alleged.

The Chief Minister further

urged the members of the minority community not to take the

law into their own hands. "We have high respect for Imam and Purohit. Don't get excited by the BJP's words, don't take the law into your hands, and please control. I do Durga Puja, they say we don't do. We have respect for all religions," she said.

"I want to challenge and tell the Government of India – why were you so hurried about [Waqf Amendment]? Didn't you know the situation in Bangladesh? Bengal shares international borders with Bangladesh, Nepal, and Bhutan. Hold meetings with Muhammad Yunus(the Chief of the Interim government in Bangladesh), have pacts and agreements. I will be happy

China now faces up to 245 pc tariffs from US in a renewed trade war

MI News Service, Washington on Chinese goods over and above (DC) / Beijing: The ongoing trade war between the United States and China has assumed a new dimension following President Donald Trump's decision to impose a whopping 245 per cent tariff on China following its recent retaliatory actions.

White House sources said on Wednesday that am additional 100 per cent tariff was imposed

Trump's earlier announcement to levy a record 145 per cent tariff on Chinese exports to the United States.

Earlier with effect from April 2, US President Donald Trump had imposed reciprocal tariffs on almost all countries across the globe with which the USA has a trade deficit. Later, President Trump decided to pause the im-

plementation of the tariffs for 90 days after many countries initiated talks with the US administration for a trade deal. "More than 75 countries have already reached out to discuss new trade deals," the White House sources said. "As a result, the individualised higher tariffs are currently paused amid these discussions. except for China, which retaliated," the sources added. For the

time being, a baseline tariff of only 10 per cent would be applicable on US imports from all other countries. In ac ordance with his poll promises President Trump unveiled a "Fair and Reciprocal Plan" on trade last month to restore fairness in U.S. trade relationships and counter non-reciprocal trade

Bangladeshi national arrested in fake identity and hawala case

Kolkata: In a significant crackdown on cross-border financial crimes, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has arrested a Bangladeshi national, Azad Mallik, also known as Ahmed Hossain, from the Bishorpara area under Airport Police Station in North 24 Parganas district. Acting on multiple allegations, the ED took him into custody late Tuesday night on charges including the fabrication of a fake Indian identity and channeling large sums of money from India to Bangladesh via hawala net-

Sources within the ED revealed that Azad had been previously arrested in March Azad is a Bangladeshi citizen

2022 under the Foreigners Act. A subsequent investigation uncovered suspicious financial activities involving his bank accounts, which showed transactions amounting to several crores of rupees. This prompted the ED to register a case on March 26 this year under relevant provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act

On Tuesday morning, ED officials conducted a detailed raid at Azad's rented residence in Bishorpara. He was taken into custody later that night and produced before the 10th CJM Court of the City Sessions Court. During the court proceedings, the ED argued that

whose immediate family still resides in Bangladesh. They alleged that he had transferred approximately Rs. 2.62 crore to Bangladesh using illegal hawala channels. The ED charged him under Sections 3 and 4 of the PMLA and sought one day's custody for further interrogation. However, the defense counsel contested the claims, stating that Azad is a legal Indian citizen possessing a valid passport and voter ID. He argued that Azad is the proprietor of "Mallik Trading Corporation" and the financial transactions were strictly business-related. The defense also alleged that the ED did not question Azad about the source

Dog found gnawing on abandoned infant's body

Alipurduar: A gruesome discovery in the Itkhola area Ålipurduar District Hospital has triggered widespread shock and outrage. Residents were horrified to witness a dog chewing on the body of an infant, who had been left tied up in a package amidst garbage. The package reportedly burst open after being run over by a vehicle, revealing a hand that attracted the scavenging animal, leading to the grim discovery and the subsequent gathering of a distressed

crowd. A deeply unsettling incident has come to light in the Itkhola area, located within Ward No. 13 and in close proximity to the Alipurduar District Hospital, where the remains of a newborn infant were discovered being consumed by a stray dog. The horrific finding has sent shockwaves through the local community, triggering widespread outrage and prompting an immediate investigation by law enforcement authorities. Initial reports indicate that the infant's body was found concealed within a package tnat nad been abandoned the discovery suggest a trag-

ic sequence of events. It is believed that a vehicle traversing the road may have inadvertently run over the discarded package, causing it to rupture. This breach in the packaging reportedly exposed a limb of the infant, specifically a hand, which then attracted the attention of a stray dog scavenging in the vicinity.

Eyewitness accounts describe the distressing scene that unfolded as the dog began to maul the exposed remains. The unusual activity quickly drew the attention of nearby residents, who were horrified by the gruesome sight. A crowd rapidly gathered at the location, their initial curiosity quickly turning to shock and dismay as the reality of the situation became apparent. Upon being alerted to the incident, local police swiftly arrived at the scene to secure the area and initiate a thorough investigation. The infant's remains were recovered, and forensic procedures are expected to be conducted to determine the exact cause of death and the approximate age of the child. Authorities are treating the case with utmost seriousness, recognizing in the Itkhola area, a populated part of the town. The circumstances surrounding reliminary inquiries are folionidates which is deeply distressing incident that has shaken the peace of Alipur-

vidual or individuals responsible for abandoning the infant in such a callous manner. Investigators are canvassing the local area, seeking information from residents and examining any potential leads that could shed light on this tragic event. The possibility of identifying the parents or guardians of the child is a key priority in the ongoing investigation. The incident has sparked considerable anger and grief within the Alipurduar community. Residents have expressed their profound sadness and condemnation of the inhumane act. Many are demanding swift and decisive action from the authorities to bring the perpetrators to justice. The discovery has also raised concerns about child safety and the need for stronger measures to prevent such tragic occurrences in the future. This disturbing case serves as a stark reminder of the vulnerability of infants and the critical importance of ensuring their safety and well-being. The authorities are expected to provide further updates as the investigation progresses and more details become available. IMD predicts abovenormal monsoon rainfall

Kolkata: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has delivered encouraging news for the upcoming monsoon season, forecasting above-normal rainfall across the country. According to the latest bulletin, India is expected to receive 5% more rainfall than the seasonal average, a development that bodes well for the agricultural sector, particularly in monsoon-dependent regions like West Bengal.

Meteorologists also suggest that Bengal, too, is likely to experience high-er-than-usual rainfall this year. Farmers across the state have welcomed the forecast with optimism, hoping for a robust monsoon that would boost paddy production and improve overall yield. Consistent and ample rainfall is critical for rice cultivation, and a favorable monsoon often translates to a stronger rural economy.

In the short term, the weather department has forecast scattered thunaccompanied derstorms by lightning and light to moderate rainfall in several districts of western Bengal. These include East and West Midnapore, Jhargram, Purulia, Bankura, and West Burdwan. No severe storm activity is expected, although occasional gusty winds are likely.

The rainfall activity In North Bengal is projected to intensify on Wednesday and

Thursday, while South Bengal, including Kolkata, may witness an increase in rainfall on Thursday and Friday. The IMD has warned of sporadic thunderstorm activity with wind speeds reaching 30 to 50 km/h during this

India is likely to receive 'above normal' monsoon rainfall, or 5% more than the historical average of 87 cm, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Tuesday (April 15, 2025). Were this to bear out, it would be a second year of 'above normal' rains

Kolkata recorded a minimum temperature of 24°C on Monday, with the day's maximum temperature climbing to 34.7°C. The relative humidity in the city hovered between 45% and 91%, contributing to a sultry atmosphere.

Despite the pre-monsoon fluctuations, the overall outlook remains positive. The possibility of above-average monsoon rains is expected to alleviate water scarcity concerns and improve groundwater levels, especially in rural zones that have been grappling with prolonged dry spells.

The IMD's early monsoon forecast serves as a beacon of hope for the agrarian community and policy planners alike. With the monsoon being a key driver of India's agricultural output and rural livelihood, this prediction marks a critical step toward economic and ecological stability in the months ahead.

Bike car collision fatal for couple

News Service, Purulia: A fatal road accident in Purulia claimed the lives of a couple after their bike collided with a car. Responding to local reports, Balrampur police rescued the severely injured couple and transported them to a local health center, where they succumbed to their injuries. The car driver remains at large, and police have launched an investigation, including questioning eyewitnesses.

A fatal road accident in Purulia's Balrampur area resulted in the deaths of a couple on Wednesday. Local residents reported a collision between a motorcycle and a four-wheeler to the authorities. We promptly informed the police, who arrived swiftly to extricate the injured and transport them to the hospital." Minor girl allegedly harassed, accused arrested following mob justice

Fellow passengers and locals reportedly forced the accused off the bus and assaulted him before police intervened and made an arrest. The class eight student was on her way to tuition when the incident

occurred. A Wednesday morning commute on a crowded Bankura-Tata passenger bus was disrupted when a minor girl, a class eight student en route to tuition in Raipur, was allegedly subjected to indecent behavior by a fellow male passenger. The incident, which occurred near the Raipur traffic intersection in Bankura, sparked immediate outrage among passengers and local res-

Eyewitness accounts indicate that a commotion erupted on the bus following the girl's distress. Subsequently, the accused young man was forcibly removed from the vehicle and reportedly assaulted by agitated passengers and locals. Upon receiving information about the incident, officers from Raipur Police Station arrived at the scene and apprehended the accused.

Thief returns stolen iPhone after change of heart

Siliguri: A bizarre incident has unfolded in Siliguri, where a thief, after stealing an expensive iPhone, surprisingly returned it to the owner's doorstep a month later. The perplexed owner, Dawa Narbula Lama, had reported the theft to the Matigara police. The twist in the tale emerged when Lama returned to the police station to withdraw his complaint, revealing the unexpected return of his device. Initial reports suggest the thief was thwarted by the iPhone's robust security features, specifically its unbreakable lock and Face ID system, rendering it unsellable and ultimately leading to its return. This unusual case highlights the challenges faced by thieves and even law enforcement when dealing with the advanced privacy settings of

News Service, A peculiar case of theft has es at the Narbula police emerged in Siliguri, where an iPhone, reported stolen a month prior, was unexpectedly returned to its owner. Dawa Narbula Lama, a resident of Baniakhali, had filed a complaint with the Matigara police after his device was pilfered from his residence on March 19th. Following a fruitless search, Lama registered a formal complaint, harboring little hope of recovery. However, in an unusual turn of events, Lama recently revisited the police station, not to inquire further about the investigation, but to withdraw his complaint. The rationale behind this surprising development was the reappearance of his iPhone. Lama reported that the stolen device was discovered abandoned in front of his house, with the perpetrator having fled the scene. According to sourc-

station in Chhar Trish, the thief's inability to bypass the iPhone's security features is believed to be the reason for its return. The robust locking mechanism and sophisticated Face ID technology rendered the device unsellable, thwarting the thief's intentions of profiting from the stolen property. Authorities highlighted the inherent security of iPhones, noting the significant difficulty in circumventing their identification protocols. Unlike Android devices which can often be tracked via their IMEI numbers, tracing a lost or stolen iPhone presents a considerable challenge for both victims and law enforcement due to its stringent privacy settings. This incident underscores the effectiveness of Apple's security measures in deterring the illicit resale of their devices.

"Don't trust Dinhata," Minster's fear fuel's controversy

News Service, Dinhata: North Bengal Development Minister Udayan Guha's recent statement expressing distrust in Dinhata's voters has sparked political controversy. Despite a landslide 2021 victory, he fears losing in the next election. His remark, made at a swimming pool foundation event, reflects Trinamool's anxiety amid BJP's strong regional presence and past electoral clashes. Guha's history of controversial remarks and vote-rigging allegations further fuels speculation about his insecurity.

North Bengal Development Minister, Udayan Guha, has raised eyebrows and sparked political speculation with his candid expression of electoral uncertainty during a public event in Dinhata. Addressing attendees at the foundation stone laying ceremony for the town's sole

Guha openly questioned his prospects for re-election, despite securing a substantial victory in the 2021 assembly elections. "I have informed the construction company that the project must be completed within six months," Guha stated, "so that I can inaugurate it while still holding ministerial office. I do not possess confidence in the Dinhata electorate's decision to grant me a second term."

Guha's remarks suggest perceived vulnerabiliwithin his constituency, particularly given the BJP's strong electoral performance in North Bengal during the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. While the Trinamool Congress recently reclaimed the Cooch Behar Lok Sabha seat, the region remains a fiercely contested political arena. The minister's urgency to complete the swimming pool project within a six-month timeframe underscores

to personally inaugurate this project," he explained, "rather than witnessing a subsequent individual claim credit for its completion. This is a matter of personal significance.' Political analysts attribute Guha's anxieties to several factors, including the BJP's persistent presence in the region, the history of intense electoral clashes, and the minister's own track record of controversial statements. Mamata vows to repeal 'anti-people' laws, slams Yogi over Murshidabad remarks

MI News Service, Kolkata: West Bengal Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress (TMC) supremo Mamata Banerjee has strongly asserted that once the government changes at the Centre, the controversial and allegedly anti-people laws introduced by the current BJP regime will be repealed. Addressing a gathering amid unrest triggered by the Waqf Amendment Act, Banerjee delivered a clear message: "A lot will change in Delhi in a year. There will be a new government. The day BJP is ousted from power, these antipeople laws must be overturned. We must wait for a better future.

Speaking directly to

Banerjee called for restraint and patience. "If problems arise, we must wait for the right time to resolve them," she said, urging calm while voicing serious concerns over the recent legislative actions by the BJP-led Centre.

Banerjee also questioned why the BJP government avoided constitutional amendment while altering the Waqf Act. "If you intended to change the Waqf Act, why didn't you amend the Constitution? You bypassed that route because it requires two-thirds majority support," she said, accusing the Centre of exploiting legislative loopholes. She also pointed out that



many Hindus have historically donated land to Waqf boards, further de-bunking communal nar-ratives. Alleging a deeper conspiracy, Banerjee said, "You want state Waqf boards to be dismantled. How much more power do you want? You don't even have a single-party majority anymore, yet you push such divisive policies. Leaders like Chandrababu Naidu and Nitish Kumar remain silent in exchange for a little

Her comments came a day after Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath blamed her for the violence in Murshidabad during protests over the Waqf Act.

Adityanath marked, "Bengal is burning, and the Chief Minister is silent. Rioters only understand the language of the stick. In response, Banerjee

hit back sharply: "Yogi is the biggest 'Bhogi' (materialist). So many lives were lost during the Mahakumbh stampede. People die in fake encounters in Uttar Pradesh. He bans peaceful rallies. Mamata urges INDIA Bloc to unite against Waqf Amendment Bill

MI News Service, Kolkata: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, during a significant meeting with imams and muezzins at Netaji Indoor Stadium on Wednesday, issued a forceful appeal to the INDIA alliance to initiate a nationwide protest against the repassed Waqf Amendment Bill. Describing the law as "deeply unjust and divisive," Banerjee advised Bengal's minority leaders to maintain peace locally and take their protest to Delhi instead.

There is no need for agitation in Bengal. I am here to protect your rights. But go to Delhi and make your voices heard. Seek time from the Prime Minister and President if necessary," Mamata said, underscoring that the real battleagainst legislation lies at the national level

She criticised the conspicuous silence of NDA allies such as Chandrababu Naidu and Nitish Kumar on the issue and called upon leaderships from all states to stand in solidarity with the minority community. "Don't fall for BJP's provocations. If there is unrest, contain it. We must protest, but peacefully and with purpose," she added.

Addressing the recent violence in Murshidabad and Malda, Banerjee dismissed BJP's claim that Bangladeshi elements guards the borders. If infiltration happened, it is the Centre's failure, not she retorted. pointing a finger at the Union Home Ministry's report.

Speaking on the violence in Murshidabad, Mamata alleged that the unrest was incited and pointed fingers at the Congress. "The area where the violence took place doesn't fall under Murshidabad's parliamentary seat—it's under which is won by the Congress," she noted, referring to Congress MP Isha Khan Choudhury, who represents Malda South.

She further criticised the Congress for being absent during the crisis. "You win seats during elections but disappear when there's trouble. That is unacceptable. Elected representatives must stand with the people when incidents happen," she said. She also claimed that homes of three Trinamool MLAs were attacked during the unrest, questioning, "If TMC had sparked the violence, why were the homes of our legislators attacked? Even our party offices were vandalized.

Her speech strongly indicated that while Trinamool may contest elections independently, the party is prepared to unite on central issues, reaffirming its commitment to the broader goals of the INDIA alliance.

Three jobless youths detained outside Sourav Ganguly's house

Job scam under guise of central govt employment

MI News Service, Kolkata: A major case of job fraud has come to light in Kashipur, where two individuals were allegedly duped of Rs 16 lakh under the false promise of employment in a central government-run ammunition and cell factory. The victims have lodged a formal complaint with the Kashipur Police Station, triggering a police investigation into what could be a multi-crore recruitment scam.

According to police sources, the accused has been identified as Mrityunjay Prasad, a resident of Baruipur. Prasad allegedly posed as a high-ranking official in the central government sector and claimed to have the authority to offer jobs through a special quota. Relying on his convincing claims and forged credentials, the victims handed over large sums of money in exchange for promised government positions.

To make the scam appear legitimate, Mrityunjay reportedly provided the victims with forged appointment letters and fake identity cards. Trusting the documentation, the victims proceeded to report to their designated workplaces only to discover the shocking truth. Upon arrival, officials at the factory denied any record of their recruitment, revealing that both the appointment letters and ID cards were fraudulent. Following this revelation, the defrauded individuals filed a complaint, prompting immediate police action. Investigators believe that the scope of the fraud may extend bevond these two complainants, and that more victims may come forward. Authorities suspect that the total amount embezzled could run into crores.

ED arrests key accused in passport forgery case

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a major breakthrough in the ongoing investigation into a widespread passport forgery racket, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has arrested another key accused from the Gede border area in Nadia district, North 24 Parganas. The individual, identified as AlokNath, was taken into custody after over ten hours of intensive interrogation. He was subsequently brought to the

questioning and legal processing. On Wednesday, a team of ED officials arrived at AlokNath's residence in Uttarpara, a sensitive zone near the India-Bangladesh border. Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel cordoned off the entire premises to ensure a secure search operation. ED officers then entered the house and conducted an extensive investigation.

According to sources, the interrogation lasted more than ten hours, during which numerous documents were scrutinized. Inreportedly vestigators found inconsistencies in AlokNath's statements and discrepancies in the documents recovered. Based on these findings, the ED arrested him late in the evening. AlokNath is believed to have been associated with the e-passport issuance office for several years. He functioned as an agent facilitating the creation of passports and visas. His role, as per investigators, was central to the network that exploited

forged documentation to generate legitimate-looking Indian passports. The forgery racket was first uncovered in late 2024 when police discovered that several individuals had obtained passports using counterfeit documents. A formal investigation was launched, gradually exposing the depth and scale of the operation. Multiple raids across the state followed, leading to the seizure of forged identity papers and digital evi-

Fresh bomb threat sparks panic in Kolkata schools

MI News Service, Kolkata: Amid the celebrations of Bengali New Year, Kolkata was once again gripped by bomb scare panic after four prominent schools in the city received threatening emails claiming bombs had been planted on their premises. The emails, reportedly sent from a foreign IP address, have triggered highlevel investigations by the Special Task Force (STF) and the Intelligence Wing of Kolkata Police. According to sources at Lalbazar, the headquarters of Kolkata Police, the threatening email was received on Monday. The message, originating from an international IP,

warned that bombs had been placed in the buildings of four reputed schools across Kolkata. Since the day was a public holiday, police initially kept the matter under wraps to avoid public alarm. A senior officer from the Intelligence Division, speaking on condition of anonymity, stated, "There has been unrest in several parts of the state recently. In such a sensitive atmosphere, we aimed to prevent further panic by keeping the development confidential during initial verification." STF officials revealed that the email included a reference to Brazilian terrorists, although the credibility of

this claim remains unverified. Authorities are actively working to trace the origin of the message and identify the sender. An FIR has already been registered, and cyber experts are currently analyzing the metadata and routing of the email. As soon as the schools reopened on Tuesday, bomb disposal squads and sniffer dog units were immediately deployed to the affected campuses. Extensive searches were conducted, but no explosives were found. Officials now believe the threat may have been a hoax aimed at disrupting public peace and triggering mass hysteria.

Cal HC halts illegal construction on wetlands near city outskirts

MI News Service, Kolkata: Fresh allegations of illegal high-rise construction on reclaimed wetlands near Kolkata's outskirts have drawn judicial intervention. The Calcutta High Court has ordered an immediate halt to the ongoing construction activities and directed the Block Land and Land Reforms Officer (BLLRO) to inspect the site and submit a detailed report within a month. The case concerns a local real estate firm accused of illegally filling a waterbody near FoyraBhaban under Rajarhat Police Station to erect a multi-storey building. The matter reached the High Court after public interest litigation was filed by Prashanta Ghosh. During the hearing, the Division Bench led by Chief Justice T. S. Sivagnanam took serious note of the encroachment and issued a directive to cease all construction operations at the site.

Retail inflation drops to near 6-yr low in Mar

MI News Service, New Delhi: Retail inflation touched a near six-year low of 3.34 per cent in March, fuelled by falling vegetable prices. The easing of Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation has given the requisite room for a consumption boost, which is expected to aid the country's economic growth. CPI inflation was 3.61 per cent in February and 4.85 per cent in March last year. During March, a sharp decline of 106 basis points was observed in food inflation compared with February 2025. Food inflation in March 2025 is the lowest after November 2021. "The significant decline in headline inflation and food inflation during March 2025 is mainly attributed to the decline in inflation of vegetables, eggs, pulses and products, meat and fish, cereals and products and milk and products," a statement from the Union ministry of statistics and programme implementation (MOSPI) said. The key items having the lowest year-on-year inflation in March were ginger (-38.11 per cent).

USA top trading partner of India for 4th straight yr

MI News Service, New Delhi/Washington: The US remained India's largest trading partner for the fourth consecutive year in 2024-25 with bilateral trade valued at USD 131.84 billion, while the country's trade deficit with China widened to USD 99.2 billion during the same period, government data showed. In the last fiscal, India's exports to China contracted 14.5 per cent to USD 14.25 billion as against USD 16.66 billion in 2023-24. The imports, however, rose by 11.52 per cent in 2024-25 to USD 113.45 billion against USD 101.73 billion in 2023-24. The trade deficit with China has widened by about 17 per cent to USD 99.2 billion in the last fis-cal from USD 85.07 billion in 2023-24. China continues to be the second largest trading partner of India with USD 127.7 billion two-way commerce in 2024-25 as compared to USD 118.4 billion in 2023-24. According to the commerce ministry data, China was India's top trading partner from 2013-14 till 2017-18 and also in 2020-21. Before China, the UAE was the country's largest trading partner. The US has been the largest part-

ner since 2021-22. During the last fiscal. the UAE with USD 100.5 billion was the third largest trading partner of India. In the last fiscal,

Gems, jewellery exports dip 11.72%

MI News Service, New Delhi: India's overall gems and jewellery exports declined 11.72 per cent to \$28.5 billion (around ₹2.41 lakh crore) in 2024-25 compared with the previous financial year on continued geopolitical tensions, according to the Gem & Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC). The overall gems and jewellery exports stood at \$32.2 billion (₹2.67 lakh crore) in 2023-24, according to GJEPC data.

However, in March, the exports improved slightly, witnessing a growth of 1.02 per cent at \$2,582.97 million (₹22,340.89 crore) compared with \$2,556.97 million (₹21,228.71 crore) in the same month of the previous

"The decline in gems and jewellery exports is mainly due to the continuous dip in demand in China as well as the US, India's key export markets, due to the ongoing geopolitical tensions. Also, the correction in rough diamond prices by 10-15 per cent impacted the value, causing the overall decline in exports," GJEPC chairman Kirit Bhansali told

The overall exports of cut and polished diamonds dipped 16.75 per cent to \$13,292.0 million (₹1.12 lakh crore) compared with \$15,967.02 million (₹1.32 lakh crore) for the same period of the previous year. The export of polished labgrown diamonds for the period of April 2024-March 2025 declined 9.64 per cent at \$1,267.26 million (₹10,716.13 crore) from \$1,402.44 million (₹11,612. 36 crore) in the previous year. Total gold jewellery exports during FY25 showed a decline of 0.11 per cent at \$11,215.46 million (₹94,937. 78 crore) against \$11,227.72 million (₹93,0 66.82 crore) in FY24. Silver jewellery exports in FY25 dipped 40.58 per cent at \$961.79 million (₹8,115.32 crore) compared with \$1,618.63 million (₹13,424.4 crore) in the previous year.

Govt to mobilise Rs 8 lakh cr via bonds

MI News Service, New Delhi: The Centre plans to raise Rs 8 lakh crore through dated securities during April-September period of 2025-26 to fund the revenue gap, the finance ministry said.

Out of gross market borrowing of Rs 14.82 lakh crore estimated for 2025-26, Rs 8 lakh crore, or 54 per cent, is planned to be borrowed in the first half (H1) through issuance of dated securities, including Rs 10,000 crore of Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs), an official statement said. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the Budget proposed to borrow Rs 14.82 lakh crore by issuing dated securities to meet revenue shortfall in the next financial year.

Srinagar: A political storm has erupted in Jammu and Kashmir following revelations from former R&AW chief A.S. Dulat's upcoming book, The Chief Minister and the Spy, in which he claims veteran politician and National Conference president Farooq Abdullah privately supported the abrogation of Article 370.

Farooq Abdullah dismissed the claims as fiction. "Dulat sahab's book is full of so many inaccuracies, I can't even begin to describe them," he said. "It's unfortunate — if he really considers me a friend, then he wouldn't have written such things.'

But the claim, made by someone considered close to Abdullah, has fuelled accusations of hypocrisy, betrayal, and political opportunism in the valley.

Sajad Lone, president of J&K People's Conference and Handwara MLA, called the claim "very credible" coming from Dulat.

Central govt plans 50 airport projects in 5 yrs

MI News Service, New Delhi: The government plans to take up 50 airport development projects, including new airports, in the next five years as holistic efforts are being made to boost the country's aviation ecosystem.

Currently, there are 159 operational airports in the country and the number has doubled compared to 74 in

Civil Aviation Secretary Vumlunmang Vualnam on Wednesday said efforts are being made in a holistic manner to develop the aviation ecosystem, including supporting airlines and scaling up flying training organisations.

In five years, the plan is to have 50 airport development projects.

This will include new airports as well as significantly enhancing existing airports, civil aviation markets.

While emphasising that the government is focused on Public Private Partnership (PPP) for development of airports, the secretary said there is also a "well oiled mechanism" for land acquisition for airport proj-

Land for airports are provided by the respective state governments.

DGCA may review framework for pilot fitness

MI News Service, New **Delhi:** Aviation regulator DGCA is likely to review the framework in place for pilot fitness aspects and response system at airports in case of medical emergencies, according to a senior official.

The plan also comes against the backdrop of the death of an Air India Express pilot due to a medical condition in the national capital earlier this month soon after operating a flight from Sri-

The pilot operated the flight from Srinagar to Delhi and was not feeling well after landing at the Delhi airport. He was taken to a hospital where he died, a source had said.

The senior official said the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) is likely to review the framework to assess pilot fitness, medical emergency response system at airports and other related aspects.

The Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) in this regard are likely to be reviewed by the watchdog.

Justice BR Gavai

MI News Service, New Delhi: The Chief Justice of India, Sanjiv Khanna has officially recommended Justice Bhushan Ramkrishna Gavai as his successor, forwarding the proposal to the law ministry as part of the formal appointment process. Currently, Justice Gavai holds the position of the senior-most judge in the Supreme Court, after CJI Khanna.

Justice Gavai is set to assume office as the 52nd Chief Justice of India on May 14, succeeding CJI Khanna, who will retire on May 13. President Droupadi Murmu will administer the oath of office.

Justice Gavai's tenure as Chief Justice will span approximately six months, concluding with his retirement in November 2025.

Gavai was born on November 24, 1960, at Amravati. He joined Bar on 16th March, 1985. Worked with late Bar Raja S Bhonsale, former Advocate General and Judge of the High Court, till 1987. He practised independently at the Bombay High Court from 1987 to 1990. After 1990, practised mainly before the Nagpur Bench of the Bombay High Court.

Gavai practised in Constitutional Law and Administrative Law. He was Standing Counsel for Municipal Corporation of Nagpur, Amravati Municipal Corporation and Amravati University. Appeared regularly for various autonomous bodies and Corporations like SI-COM, DCVL, etc., and various Municipal Councils in the Vidarbha region.

Gavai was also appointed as Assistant Government Pleader and Additional Public Prosecutor in the High Court of Judicature at Bombay, Nagpur Bench, from August 1992 to July 1993. He was appointed as Government Pleader and Public Prosecutor for the Nagpur Bench on 17th January, 2000. Was elevated as Additional Judge of the High Court on 14th November, 2003.

Gavai became a permanent Judge of the Bombay High Court on 12th November 2005. Presided over Benches having all types of assignments at the Principal Šeat at Mumbai as well as Benches at Nagpur, Aurangabad and Panaji. Elevated as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India on 24th May, 2019. Due to retire on 23rd November,

Trump says he wants to give money and flight tickets to immigrants who 'self-deport'

Donald Trump said he wants to give money and an aeroplane tick et to any immigrant who is in the country illegally who chooses to "self-deport," and work to get those who are "good" back in the US, a break from his usual hardline immigration rhetoric.

Trump, who campaigned on a pledge to carry out mass deportations, said in a taped interview with Fox Noticias that aired Tuesday that his administration is focused right now on getting "murderers" out of the country But for others in the US illegally, he said, he's going to implement "a self-deportation program."

Trump offered few details about the plan, including timing, but said the U.S. would provide immigrants airfare and a stipend.

"We're going to give them a stipend. We're going to give them some money and a plane ticket, and then we're going to work with them - if they're good - if we want them back in, we're going to work with them to get them back in as quickly as we can," Trump said. Fox Noticias interviewer Rachel

Superb fairy-wrens' songs hold clues to their personalities

Adelaide: (The Conversation) When we think of bird songs, we often imagine a cheerful soundtrack during our morning walks. However, for birds, songs are much more than background music - they are crucial to attract a mate and defend a territory.

But what if a song could reveal something deeper about the singer's personality? A new study, published today in Royal Society Open Science by my colleagues and me, shows it might.

Addressing a research gap For many bird species, songs vary in complexity, with some individuals producing more intricate melodies than others. Such differences often indicate individual variation in genetic quality, age, or health. Yet most research to date has focused on males, and very few studies have investigated how song complexity relates to personality in birds.

The new study addresses this research gap.

My colleagues and I studied superb fairy-wrens (Maluruscyaneus), a small Australian songbird known for its bright plumage and complex vocal skills. Interestingly, in this species, both males and females learn to sing complex songs. This makes them a good example to study the relationship between song complexity and personality in both males and females.

We captured wild superb fairy-wrens and brought them into short-term captivity to assess their personality. Specifically, we measured their exploration by placing them in a novel environment, where we observed where they went and how much they explored the environment. We also tested their aggres-

siveness by using a mirror, as birds often see their reflection as a rival and respond accordingly.

We then released the birds and recorded their songs for sevplexity (that is, element types per song and syllables per song). Elements are the basic building blocks in bird songs (a little like letters in a word) and element types are categories of elements. Aggressive versus exploratory

We found that, regardless of sex or life stage, birds that were more exploratory had more element types per song than those that were less exploratory. Also, more aggressive birds produced songs with fewer syllables than those that were less aggressive. You can hear this in the recordings below. We also found that more aggressive fledglings, but not adults, had more element types per song. Our study demonstrates that both males and females can advertise their personality through their songs. It also raises questions as to whom birds learn their songs from.

In superb fairy-wrens, male and female juveniles learn from both parents as well as from other members of their species. It is possible that rather than learning from any available adults, birds may selectively copy song elements from specific individuals

based on their own personality. In superb fairy-wrens, more exploratory birds may approach and learn from a wider range of tutors than less exploratory ones who may limit themselves to more familiar tutors

Additionally, our study highlights that the relationship between personality and song complexity could be shifting between different life stages. More aggressive young may experiment with a greater diversity of element types to prepare for the establishment of their own territory in their first year of life, leading to increasing song complexity. In contrast, adults have already settled in their territories and may not need to experiment

Insights into how personality traits evolve

Our study illustrates that learned aspects of sexual signalling are personality dependent, and that this may have some potential implications for survival or reproduction. This opens up exciting new questions about how vocal communication reflects individual differences - not just in

males, but in females too. Understanding these links can give us deeper insights into how personality traits evolve and how they influence social interac-

Indians among 18 get Lifesaver Award for rescuing 22 from fire in Singapore

Singapore: Eighteen individuals, including construction workers from India, were recognised with the Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) Community Lifesaver Award for saving 16 children and six adults from a fire at a Singapore shophouse last Tuesday (April 8). Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister PawanKalyan's seven-year-old son was among those hurt in the fire at the threestorey River Valley Road building which houses a children's enrichment centre run by Newtonshow Camp. The children, aged between six and 10, six adults, aged between 23 and 55, were rescued and attended to by the 18 people from within the shophouse vicinity before the SCDF firefighting team arrived.

A 10-year-old Australian girl, rescued from the fire, subsequently died at one of the hospi-

"For all fire incidents, especially this one, time is of the critical essence. So, we really thank the members of (the) public who responded that day, even before SCDF's arrival," said Colonel TavZhi Wei, the commander of the 1st SCDF Division. "You would have seen in many of the videos that have been circulating so far



that their bravery, their quick action and their collective action really saved lives that day," Channel News Asia quoted Colonel Tay as saying on Tuesday. The SCDF Community Lifesaver Award is presented to members of the public whose actions contributed saving lives and involved an element of self-risk. The children on the ledge were "shivering" and "wanted to jump" from the ledge, and the community responders shouted at them to stop, said private-hire driver Benson Lo who helped to carry children to safety. Construction worker Shakil Mohammad, 35, was at the top of the step ladder

with fellow construction workers HasanEmamul, ChinnappaKannadasan, 32, who formed a human chain to carry

the children to safety Shakil said initially he tried to go up to the third storey of the building but could not make it past the blaze on the second floor, and went outside to help. Shakil took a step ladder from his worksite nearby when he realised that the scaffolding other construction workers had carried to the scene was not tall enough to reach the ledge. There was "no escape" from the building, said Shakil, and he saw a child trying to jump from the ledge. "I (said): 'Don't jump.

I'll help you,'" he said.

Ravi Kumar, a construction worker from India who assisted his colleagues in carrying the children to the ground, said that he was thinking of his younger sister who is around the same age as them, and started feeling scared.

"I saved lives and I still feel it today," said Kumar, adding that the girl who died from the fire was still stuck in his mind.

"Even when I'm working or eating, I'm thinking about her and feel very sad," said the 26-year-old worker. On Apr 9, Tomato Cooking School, one of the brands under Newtonshow, said it was cooperating with investigations into the fire. Authorities are investigating the fire. 'De-extinction' of dire wolves promotes false hope technology can't undo extinction

Over the past week, the media have been inundated with news of the "de-extinction" of the dire wolf (Aenocyondirus) - a species that went extinct about 13,000 years ago. The breakthrough has been achieved by Colossal Biosciences, a multibillion-dollar United States company that claims their goal is to restore biodiversity through the deextinction of species

The project is being celebrated and marketed as a conservation win. But does this technology really have the best interests of conservation in mind?

We argue as ecologists that genetic advancements like these, while they are major scientific and technological feats, still risk minimising the severity of the current extinction crisis

Importantly, they take away focus from proven conservation efforts that are needed to protect the biodiversity that remains.

High-tech copies of wolves First, it is important to recognise that Romulus, Remus and Khaleesi, the three "dire wolf" pups created, are not actually dire wolves. Colossal carried out 20 edits in 14 genes of the

grey wolf genome to create their "dire wolves" using a genetic technique called CRISPR-Cas9.

The grey wolf's genome is 2,447,000,000 individual bases long. Would we consider a chimpanzee, with which we share 98.8% of our genome, to be human after 20 edits?

The reality is that these are three slightly modified grey

This de-extinction project had millions of dollars poured into it - amounts of money most conservation programs could only dream of. There are proven solutions to help reverse biodiversity loss: habitat protection and restoration, the control of invasive species and the phasing out of fossil fuels.

However, these solutions are not slickly marketed as shiny, techno-fix packages like de-extinction. Instead, they are heavily underfunded. Extinction is irreversible

reversible risks downplaying its gravity and legacy Headlines like the one that appeared on the front cover of

TIME magazine - with the word

Promoting extinction as



"extinct" crossed out - seed a false hope that no matter what environmental damage is done, species loss can be easily undone. The risk is that deextinction will be used as an ultimate offset for any environmen-

tal impact. Humans fear death. It is possibly our most primal instinct. We mourn and feel great sadness for the death of an individual, not only because they are gone, but because it is irreversible and final. Permanent.

That finality is the same for humans or any living animal. It is what makes fighting biodiversity loss such an urgent concern, so much so that people risk their lives to prevent it, with 150 wildlife rangers dying each year

around the world in their fight to protect endangered species.

In the conservation movement, raising awareness of "martyr" species - like the northern white rhino and the passenger pigeon - helps underline the argument in favour of protecting current species. Framing extinction as temporary creates false hope and undermines motivation for real

conservation action. We might already be seeing this happen in response to the "de-extinction" of the dire wolf. Interior Secretary of the Trump administration, Doug Burgum, praised the new biotechnology advancement and used it as an argument for the removal of the US Endangered Species Act.

What good is bringing back species if there are no protective laws to address the drivers of their declines?

Would we protect the dire wolf even if it did come back?

It is deeply ironic that while millions are being spent recreating a dire wolf proxy, its cousin, the grey wolf, is heavily persecuted globally. Just last month, the Spanish government voted to overturn the legal protection that prevented wolves from being hunted north of the Duero River.

Other predators are affected, too. In Australia, the dingo, which has been shown to suppress invasive cats and red foxes, helping native biodiversity, is also heavily persecuted just like the thylacine or Tasmanian tiger was, which Colossal aims to de-extinct as well. If we can't safeguard or protect habitat for apex predators today, in ecosystems that are already under immense pressure, what kind of world would we be bringing extinct species back into? Up to 150 species are considered to go extinct every day. No amount of genetic tech will solve this unless we address the root causes: habitat destruction, overexploitation and climate change. The de-extinction of the

dire wolf may sound like a conservation breakthrough, but it risks distracting us from the protection of our current living species. This approach turns biodiversity conservation into a billionaire's Jurassic Park fantasy instead of addressing the crisis we already know how to fix.

Cow dung on DU classroom wall: **Student union** defaces principal's office

MI News Service, New Delhi: A controversy at Delhi University's Lakshmibai College escalated on Tuesday when Delhi University Students Union (DUSU) president Ronak Khatri smeared cow dung on the walls of the principal's office. This act was a response to a viral video that showed principal Pratyush Vatsala applying cow dung to classroom walls, claiming it was a sustainable method to cool the rooms. Khatri, while confronting a faculty member inside the office, stated that no consent was taken from students before implementing such a measure. "If you want to do research, do it at your home," he said, criticizing the principal's decision to experiment within the college premises. He added that students were never consulted and that such practices should not be imposed in educational spaces without their input.

The original video, which sparked widespread debate on social media, showed Principal Vatsala applying cow dung to the walls of classrooms in the C Block of the college. In her defense, she stated on April 13 that the initiative was part of an ongoing research project led by faculty members. The goal, she said, was to explore indigenous and eco-friendly cooling techniques amid the capital's rising temperatures. She clarified that the application was limited to porta cabins and the research was still in progress. "It is under process. I will be able to share details of the full research after a week," she said, urging people not to misinformation. spread "There's no harm in touching natural mud," she added. The principal had reportedly shared the video in a teachers' WhatsApp group, presenting the effort as a positive step toward making the classrooms more comfortable. "Those who have classes here will soon get these rooms in a new look. Efforts are being made to make your teaching experience pleasant," she

Israel says no humanitarian aid to enter Gaza

Lebanese army arrests members of **Hamas in Lebanon**

The report has not been officially confirmed

by the Lebanese army. The reason for the arrest is unclear. However, earlier, Jordan's King Abdullah II spoke with the Lebanese President Joseph Aoun regarding the exposure of a terror cell that had manufactured rockets in Jordan and was allegedly linked to Hamas. Jordan stated vesterday that the members of the cell who were arrested had trained in Jordan.

Iran's FM says "principle" of Tehran's uranium enrichment non-negotiable

Referring MOSSAD to something more than a 'myth' would not be a misnomer. Its glorious heritage in dealing with the domain of intelligence service has reached the apex long back with trail of intelligence and counter intelligence stories only exemplify Mossad's unmatched accuracy and ruthless precision. 'Mossad' is a Hebrew

word which means "Central Institute for Intelligence and Special gence and Special Operations".It is the prime intelligence organisation of Israel. There are other intelligence organizations in Israel like Aman (military intelligence) and Shin Bet (internal security). The Mossad is concerned with foreign intelligence gathering, intelligence analysis, and covert operations. Since its creation in 1948, the State of Israel has met its obvious need for intelligence and counterintelligence with services that have gained a first-class reputation. One mark of their professionalism is that less is known about them than about other sys-The Israeli intelligence

establishment comprises

several autonomous organizations. The Central Institute for Intelligence and Security, popularly known as Mossad, carries out foreign espionage and covert political and paramilitary operations, including the assassination of Palestinian terrorists and other figures. Its head reports directly to the prime minister. Post world war Mossad's biggest success was to nab the iconic Nazi general Adolf Ichmann, the architect of Jewish holocaust in gas chambers during the Second World War. Ichmann was nabbed from Argentina where he was living a rather low profile life, quite purposefully to keep him safe. But that proved quite incommensufrom Argentina after living many years in exile. He was arrested and put to trial and was eventually hanged. As mentioned earlier. Mossad. Israel's national intelligence agency, is widely regarded as one of the most efficient and effective intelligence agencies in the world. Its efficiency is often attributed to several key factors:

The highest number of enforced disappearances in March was reported in Quetta and Kalat, with 37 cases. Other areas affected included Dera Bugti (18 cases), Gwadar (15), Nushki (13), Dera Ghazi Khan (10), Kech (9), Barkhan (8), Awaran (7), Karachi

(6). Lasbela (5), Mastung (4), Panjgur (3), and Naseerabad (2). Single cases were also reported from Islamabad, Kachhi, Jaffarabad, Jacobabad, and Khuz-The Balochistan Post According to Paank, several

of those killed extrajudicially had previously been reported as forcibly disappeared. One such case was Nizam Baloch, who was abducted from Gilli, Buleda, on March 11 and found dead the following day. His brother, Shah Nawaz Baloch, was subsequently shot and killed in Kech. Another

victim, Shah Jahan Kurd--the brother of Zahid Baloch, a forcibly disappeared leader of the Baloch Students Organisation (BSO)--was killed in the Naal region of Khuzdar, the Balochistan Post reported.

On March 21, three people were shot and killed during a protest demanding the release of missing persons. Paank identified the victims as 12-year-old Naimat Baloch, Habib Baloch, and Imdad Baloch, describing Naimat's death as "a symbol of state oppression."
