

Security stepped up at vital installations in Delhi amid soaring tensions

MI News Service, New Delhi : As tensions between India and Pakistan escalated after the Pakistani military targeted several border areas using drones and missiles on Thursday night, heavy security was deployed at all vital installations in and around the National capital including in government buildings and areas with high footfalls on Friday.

According to a senior Delhi police official, all vital installations, including government buildings, sewage treatment plants, water treatment plants, courts, and foreign embassies are being safeguarded by deploying additional forces, including paramilitary personnel.

Police also strengthened vigil in areas with high footfalls, including markets, railway stations, malls, parks and Metro stations across the city, the official said.

"Security has been beefed up in Delhi amid rising tensions between India and Pakistan on Thursday", the official said adding, a Pakistani drone attack was thwarted leading to loud explosions, sirens and blackouts in several border districts in India.

Police officials were seen regulating traffic and asking people to vacate the road around C-Hexagon, India Gate, on Thursday night. However, police officials said that the move was part of routine traffic regulation exercise generally carried out in the area.

"Security has been heightened across the city. We have increased night patrolling and DCPs have been told to neutralise any suspicious activity," said a senior police official.

The Delhi government has also cancelled all leave of its employees until further orders.

Special police commissioners of all zones are holding meetings with deputy commissioners of all 15 districts in the national capital. Security personnel have increased vigilance at malls, markets, metro stations, airports, residential areas, hotels and other crowded locations.

Bomb Disposal Squads have also carried out anti-sabotage checks at several locations. Police checks at the borders of the national capital have been ramped up, with vehicles coming to Delhi being checked.

"All DCPs are actively monitoring law and order in their areas. They have already briefed their officers like ACPs and SHOs. DCPs are personally monitoring their area and Delhi Police is ready to deal with any kind of situation," another official said.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (East) Abhishek Dhania stated, "As part of ongoing anti-terror measures, the police conducted a thorough security inspection at the Mayur

In response to Mamata Banerjee's plea, private schools declare early summer vacations in Bengal

MI News Service, Kolkata : Several private schools in West Bengal have declared summer vacations from today (Friday), after Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee urged the educational institutions to advance the holidays by a week for the students safety in the wake of the India-Pakistan military conflict.

St Xavier's Institution-Sodpore, Julien Day School and Delhi Public School Ruby Park were among the schools that announced summer vacations from Friday following Banerjee's appeal.

"We were scheduled to hold classes till May 13... But, in view of the emerging situation and as suggested by the Chief minister, we have decided to advance the dates by a few days," said Lipika

Ghosh, Principal of St Xavier's Institution, Sodpore.

In response to an urgent appeal by Mamata Banerjee several other private schools in Kolkata and other parts of West Bengal have also decided to advance their summer vacation and shut down from May 9, instead of their previously scheduled dates.

The move comes in the wake of escalating Indo-Pak tensions following India's missile strikes on Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) under Operation Sindoor.

"In view of the present situation and to ensure the safety and well-being of students, we have decided to close our school from Friday, May 9. Initially, we had planned to close from May 16," said Siddhartha

Dey, Principal of Julien Day School.

Echoing a similar sentiment, Joyoti Chaudhuri, Principal of Delhi Public School Ruby Park, said, "We are also closing from today and will reopen on June 9. It is important to follow the government's appeal in times like these."

The Chief Minister, during a press briefing on Wednesday, requested all private schools across the state to prepone their summer breaks as a precautionary measure. She urged them to declare Thursday, May 8 as the last working day and begin summer holidays from May 9, coinciding with the Birth Anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore. Sunita Sen, Principal of

'We are at war with terrorists', remarks Indian envoy to the US

MI News Service, Washington (DC): India is at war with the terrorists and will bring justice to victims of the Pahalgam attack by holding the "lowlifes, subhuman monsters" accountable, Indian Ambassador to the US Vinay Kwatra has said, underscoring that in no world would these terrorists be allowed a free pass.

"The frame and the template in which we look at is the terror template. April 22 was the most heinous terrorist act," Kwatra said in an interview to CNN on Friday.

"It is nobody's case to say that these terrorists should be given a free pass, and that's precisely what we did day before yesterday, held them accountable, brought them to justice," Kwatra said.

'let's not bring their morale down at this juncture', says SC on women Army officers

MI News Service, New Delhi : In a historic judgement with a possible far reaching effect, the Supreme Court on Friday asked the Centre not to release from service Short Service Commission women Army officers challenging the denial of permanent commission to them asking not to "bring their morale down" in "the prevailing situation".

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kottiswar Singh which posted a batch of pleas filed by 69 officers for hearing in August, said they should not be released till the next hearing.

"In the prevailing situation let's not bring their

morale down. They are brilliant officers, you can use their services somewhere else. This is not the time that they be asked to roam around in the Supreme Court. They have a better place to be and serve the country," Justice Kant said.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, said it was an administrative decision based on a policy to keep the armed forces young.

She urged the top court not to grant any stay on their release and said the Indian Army needed young officers and every year only 250 personnel were granted permanent com-

mission. Senior advocate Maneka Guruswamy, appearing for colonel Geeta Sharma, referred to the case of Colonel Sofia Qureshi, one of the two women officers who had briefed the media on the Operation Sindoor on May 7 and 8.

Guruswamy said Colonel Qureshi had to approach this court for a similar relief related to permanent commission and now she has made the country proud. The bench without commenting much on the submission said the case before the top court was purely a legal one, having nothing to do

Seven Pakistan backed terrorists killed in Jammu by BSF

MI News Service, Jammu : In the midst of an war like situation between India and Pakistan, the Border Security Force (BSF) jawans eliminated seven terrorists who were trying to infiltrate from across the Indo-Pak International Border in Jammu on Friday morning and destroyed a Pak Rangers post.

The incident took place in the Samba sector on the wee hours of Friday when the BSF jawans through the surveillance grid detected that a "big group" of terrorists was trying to infiltrate into Indian territory in the forested area of Jammu region. This infiltration bid was supported by fire from Pakistan Rangers post Dhandhar, a BSF spokesperson said.

He said the troops neutralised the infiltration bid, killing at least seven terrorists and caused extensive damage to the Dhandhar post. It also

shared a thermal imager clip of the destruction of the said post.

The Indian force is on high alert in the wake of the current hostilities between the two countries following the Pahalgam terrorist attack of April 22 and India's strike on terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir in retaliation.

Earlier, the BSF also announced that it thwarted another major infiltration attempt along the same International Border in Samba sector, while destroying yet another Pakistan Rangers post. In a major escalation along the India-Pakistan border during the past 72 hours, Pakistani forces launched coordinated drone and missile attacks targeting civilian areas and military installations in Jammu on Wednesday evening. But the Indian air defence systems responded swiftly, success-

fully intercepting and neutralising all eight missiles and multiple drones aimed at key targets, including the Jammu airport.

In addition to the missile and drone assault, Pakistani troops carried out intense mortar and artillery shelling along the Line of Control (LoC), spanning from Uri in north Kashmir to RS Pura in the Jammu region. Tragically, a woman was killed in Uri as a result of the shelling. In retaliation, the Indian armed forces initiated a very successful Operation Sindoor with a series of precision strikes targeting terror infrastructure deep inside Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The operation reportedly destroyed major terror hubs, including the Jaish-e-Mohammad headquarters in Bahawalpur, Lashkar-e-Toiba's base in Muridke,

and Hizbul Mujahideen's command centre.

Security along the border has been heightened in light of recent escalations between India and Pakistan. Tensions have risen following the April 22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam, which was followed by Indian strikes on terror targets across the border in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

Meanwhile, the Chandigarh administration sounded an air raid siren on Friday, urging residents to stay indoors, as tensions between India and Pakistan escalated. The alert was lifted about an hour later.

"An air warning has been received from the air force station of a possible attack. Sirens are being sounded. All are advised to remain indoors and stay away from balconies," the administration said in an official statement.

IPL 2025 called off now as Indo-Pak military tensions escalate

MI News Service, New Delhi / Mumbai : In the wake of mounting security concerns following the military escalation between India and Pakistan, the hugely popular Indian Premier League has been suspended at least for a week by the BCCI with effect from Friday.

According to informed sources here today, the decision was taken after the match between Delhi Capitals and Punjab Kings in Dharamsala was called off due to safety reasons. The venue is located less than 100 kilometres from the bordering area of Pathankot, where air raid alerts were sounded, prompting the BCCI to take the call.

"We have decided to indefinitely suspend the IPL. The players' safety is our utmost priority. Hence we decided to stop the tournament for now. We'll decide later if and when the tournament can resume. Right now, national interest is of utmost importance," sources in the BCCI said.

The match in Dharamsala, which had started later than scheduled time due to rain, was abruptly halted when floodlights in the stadium went out. Initially believed to be a technical glitch, the situation quickly escalated when players and officials were informed of the security risks posed by the air raid alerts. A player also told that there was "panic" among both teams, and foreign players were particularly worried for their safety. Australian media had earlier reported that their players had also expressed concerns over their safety and were "ready" to return home.

The crowd in Dharamsala, which had filled up about 80 per cent of the stadium's capacity, was immediately evacuated for safety reasons. Fans were also heard shouting anti-Pakistan slogans as they made their way out of the venue. In the aftermath, the BCCI, along with the IPL's governing body, reviewed the rapidly evolving security situation. IPL chairman Arun Dhumal said that the decision to continue the league was in flux, with government directives yet to arrive by Thursday night. The immediate impact of the security threats has already been felt, as flights to and from Dharamsala have been suspended, with

Amit Shah reviews security along Indo-Pak border, airports

MI News Service, New Delhi : Amid the ongoing military conflicts between the two neighbouring countries, Union Home minister Amit Shah on Friday reviewed the prevailing situation along India - Pakistan borders and in all airports across the country. Informing this official sources said here on Friday that the review meeting was held hours after the Border Security Force (BSF) jawans had foiled an infiltration bid from across the International border in Samba sector in Jammu, killing at least seven terrorists and destroying a Pakistan Rangers post. Apart from reviewing the security situation along the India-Pakistan border, Shah also took stock of the steps taken to beef up security at all airports across the country, the sources said. While the BSF guards the India-Pakistan borders on both sides of the country, the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) protects the country's airports and the Metro networks besides other vital government installations.

Those who attended the meeting included Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan, Director of Intelligence Bureau Tapan Deka, Directors General of the BSF, CISF and the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security. During the meeting which continued for over an hour, the Union Home minister directed the CISF to further enhance security at all critical infrastructure

and key establishments across the country in light of escalating tensions along the India-Pakistan border. CISF is tasked with safeguarding critical infrastructure across India, including airports, power plants, nuclear installations, space research facilities, and major government buildings.

Shah also gave separate directions to the Director General of Border Security Force (BSF), the Director General of CISF, and senior officials of the Ministry of Home Affairs regarding the present situation in the border areas and the security arrangements in and around all airports..

The meeting comes after Pakistan Armed Forces launched multiple attacks using drones and other munitions along the entire Western Border, targeting military establishments, airports and others on the intervening night of 08 and 09 May.

The drone attacks were effectively repulsed, and a befitting reply was given to the ceasefire violations on the LoC. The Indian Army shot down multiple Pakistani drones during a large-scale counter-drone operation along the Line of Control and International Borders on the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday. "Indian Army remains committed to safeguarding the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the Nation. All nefarious

Defence minister reviews security situation with three service chiefs

Singh chaired yet another comprehensive review meeting of the national security scenario with top military leadership in the national capital on Friday. A day after Pakistan's attempts to target Indian military installations were repelled, every aspect of the evolving security situation was discussed in the meeting, it is learnt.

The meeting was attended by Chief of Defence Staff Gen Anil Chauhan, Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi, Air Chief Marshal A P Singh, Navy Chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi and Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh. India last night neutralised Pakistan military's attempt to hit military stations in Jammu, Pathankot, Udhampur

Migrant workers ask govt to stop attack on Muslim workers outside Bengal

Twenty-eight-year-old Suraj Sheikh from Samsarganj in Murshidabad used to earn around ₹30,000 a month as a mason in Sambalpur, Odisha. Suraj, who is back home, earns only ₹500 a day nowadays. "And, there is no guarantee that I will get a job every day. While staying in Odisha, I used to send ₹20,000 to ₹23,000 to my family every month. But suddenly, the situation has changed," said the youth.

Hundreds of migrant workers returned to Bengal during the past one-and-a-half months, especially after the communal violence rocked Samsarganj in Murshidabad. "The violence in my home district led to repercussions, and a section of local people attacked us. I was assaulted and I almost ran for around 12km at night to reach a highway, took a bus and reached Bengal," said Suraj. Mainul Sheikh, a 42-year-old man from Hariharpara of Murshidabad, who was a wholesale trader of saris in Ganjam district of Odisha, also locked up his accommodation and returned home.

He used to buy saris from Cuttack and engaged youths from Murshidabad to sell the same door-to-door.

"I was fortunate to escape assault, but my salesmen were beaten up. They were attacked after the Pahalgam incident. They hurriedly left Ganjam after the attack, and I also followed them. I have no idea whether I would be able to return to Odisha," said Mainul, who used to make ₹35,000 to ₹40,000 a month.

Mainul is planning to take a room on rent at Burwan in Murshidabad district, where she would stock some garments and then go out and sell those door to door. "I have to earn at least ₹10,000 a month to run the family," he said.

Rakibul Molla, another mason from Nowda, has returned from Indore of Madhya Pradesh. There, he used to earn around ₹30,000 a month, but now, he is making ₹300 a day, working as a day wage worker on agricultural fields near his home. "I am in deep crisis but have no idea whether I would muster the courage to go to some other state for work," he said.

Many migrant workers

from Malda are also suffering.

Last month, a team of 40 construction workers returned to Malda from Sambalpur in Odisha following threats and attacks by a section of the local residents. On Thursday, 22 others, who used to work as hawkers in Jaipur of Rajasthan, started for Malda.

Like the earlier lot, the hawkers have also alleged harassment and threats by a section of locals and even some police men.

Rabiul Islam, who is from Bahor village of Harishchandrapur-I block, who spoke to The Telegraph over phone, said more than a thousand hawkers like him used to sell steel utensils in different areas of Jaipur.

"But after the Pahalgam tragedy, the situation changed. The locals intentionally lodged false complaints against us, merely suspecting we are not Indians but Bangladeshis. Police also harassed us by detaining us for an indefinite period, asking one after another questions," he said.

"Sensing that we might face more severity, some of us boarded a train to return

home," he added. Mahasin Ali, another migrant worker who is also returning from Rajasthan, said that he would make around Rs. 1,000 in Jaipur.

"But we feel insecure and cannot continue to stay to make higher earnings. It would be better to stay at home," he said.

While many have returned or are returning home, a few have still preferred to stay back in their workplaces with the anticipation that the situation will improve.

Mobarak Mondal from Choto Garalgara of Dinhat 2 block in Cooch Behar stays in Vasant Kunj of Delhi. He deals in plastic scrap.

"On May 3, a team of Delhi police intercepted eight Bengalis, including me, and took us to a police station. They suspected that we were Bangladeshis. We were released after we showed our Aadhaar cards," Mondal said over the phone.

"A section of people and police always suspect us to be Bangladeshis, particularly as we speak Bengali. Some people have left for Bengal, but I am still staying in Delhi, with the hope that the situation will change," he said.

SC dismisses plea for implementation of three-language formula in TN, Kerala, WB

The Supreme Court on Friday dismissed a PIL seeking implementation of the three-language formula, proposed by the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, in Tamil Nadu, Kerala and West Bengal.

A bench headed by Justice JB Pardiwala refused to entertain the plea, saying the court cannot directly compel a state to adopt a policy like the National Education Policy 2020.

The top court in its order stated, "It (court) cannot directly compel a state to adopt a policy like the National Education Policy 2020. The court may, however, intervene if a state's action or inaction related to the National Education Policy violates any fundamental rights. We do not propose to examine this issue in this writ petition. We believe that the petitioner has nothing to do with the cause he proposes to espouse. Although he may be from the state of Tamil Nadu, yet on his own admission, he is residing in New Delhi. In such cir-

cumstances, this petition stands dismissed."

The plea was filed by BJP lawyer GS Mani, stating the refusal or failure of the state government to implement the National Education Policy of the Central government or sign an MOU may harm the public interest or infringe on citizens' rights.

The petition sought direction to the state governments to implement the National Education Policy and sign an MOU which involves fundamental public welfare and rights of Education, constitutional rights, or government obligations that are being neglected or violated is very well maintainable.

"The state government is under a constitutional or legal obligation to implement the National Education Policy, 2020 of the Central government and to enter into an MOU for the implementation of the said policy, scheme, or project," the petition stated.

All state governments except Tamil Nadu, Kerala and West Bengal have adopted and implemented the Central government's

most important national education policy, the tri-language curriculum policy, advocate Mani said.

In the petition, the National Education Policy is a major education policy plan brought by the Central government with the aim of improving the quality of school education for students from all walks of life. "All Indian languages should be taught free of cost to school children belonging to the poor, scheduled, tribes, backwards, and the most backwards classes," the petition added.

The petition said that the state governments of Tamil Nadu, Kerala and West Bengal are refusing to accept the three-language formula for political reasons, citing the false reason of imposing Hindi.

The Central government's laws, plans and policies are applicable to all state governments, the petition further stated. It is the duty of the state government to implement such a policy and this is a fundamental duty and right given in the Consti-

tution, it added.

"Free education is a fundamental right given by the Constitution. By refusing to accept this plan, the state government is denying the fundamental right of free education to the school children concerned. Therefore, the Supreme Court should intervene in this matter and issue an order to these three state governments to immediately implement the Central government's National Education Policy," added the PIL.

While the Centre defended the policy as a step towards multilingualism, Tamil Nadu said that it unfairly pressures non-Hindi-speaking states.

The Tamil Nadu government has accused the Central government of trying to push Hindi "sideways" through the NEP, despite the state's longstanding resistance to such policies.

The government has strongly opposed implementing the NEP, raising concerns over the three-language formula and alleging that the Centre wants to "impose" Hindi.

164th birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore celebrated

The 164th birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore was celebrated at the Siliguri Municipal Corporation in Siliguri on Friday.

Rabindranath Tagore Jayanti or Poncheeshe Boishakh marks the birthday of the noted Nobel laureate.

Mayor of Siliguri Municipal Corporation, Goutam Deb, and other officials adorned the Rabindranath Tagore statue at Baghajatin Park with floral garlands.

Mayor of Siliguri Municipal Corporation, Goutam Deb, said, "Today is a special day for every

Bengali staying in Bengal or outside Bengal. Everyone is celebrating the birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore. We are offering flowers to the statue of Rabindranath Tagore. In the evening, we are organising a gala with a noted Rabindra Sangeet singer."

Born in Calcutta (present-day Kolkata) on May 7, 1861, Rabindranath Tagore was the first Indian to receive the Nobel Prize. He passed away on August 7, 1941.

Tagore was born on the 25th day of the month of Boishakh in the year 1422 according to the Bengali calendar, so in West Ben-

gal, his birth anniversary is being celebrated today.

Tagore, who reshaped Bengali literature, holds the distinction of being the first Asian to win the Nobel Prize in the year 1913 for his book of songs, 'Gitanjali' (Song Offerings).

Tagore has penned several renowned poems, songs, and literary works, including the national anthem of India - Jana Gana Mana.

Referred to as the 'Bard of Bengal', Tagore started writing poetry at the young age of eight. As an exponent of the 'Bengal Renaissance', he advanced a vast canon which comprised paintings, hun-

dreds of texts, sketches and doodles, and around two thousand songs.

His work reshaped Bengali literature and music and also changed Indian art in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

One of Tagore's most famous novels, 'Ghare-Baire' (The Home and the World), was adapted into a movie of the same name by India's Oscar-winning director Satyajit Ray.

Notably, two of his compositions were chosen as national anthems of two countries, which are India's Jana Gana Mana and Bangladesh's 'Amar Shonar Bangla' (My Golden Bengal).

STF arrests two JMB operatives for planning attacks in India

MI News Service, Kolkata: West Bengal's Special Task Force (STF) on Friday arrested two individuals, Ajmol Hossain (28) from Nalhati and Saheb Ali Khan (28) from Murarai, for allegedly spreading the ideology of the banned terrorist group Jamatul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) and planning attacks in India.

The arrests were made during simultaneous raids in the Birbhum district on May 8-9, 2025, according to the West Bengal STF.

The suspects were found to be propagating JMB's ideology and were part of a module that is engaged in dissemination of seditious and jihadi materials by using encrypted sophisticated mediums.

They were allegedly planning to target specific people and places in India, aiming to harm the country's sovereignty.

The suspects were involved in recruiting young Muslim men, trying to radicalise them and encourage them to join terrorist groups.

Ajmol Hossain had previously attempted to enter Bangladesh for jihadi activities and has connections across the subcontinent.

The suspects, along with others, tried to buy firearms and make explosives to support their cause of "Ghazwatul Hind."

The two suspects will be presented in court, and the police have requested remand to continue questioning them and investigating further links to their network. In a related incident, the STF of Kolkata Police had earlier arrested two individuals, including a woman, for the illegal possession of firearms. Aziz Molla (36) was found with 10 improvised single-barrel firearms, and Moyana Majhi (32) was found with a single-barrel firearm.

SMC panel to check food quality at eateries

The Trinamul Congress-run Siliguri Municipal Corporation (SMC) has formed a committee to check the city's eateries and confirm whether such outlets maintain proper standards and hygiene while serving food to people.

The committee comprises representatives of the SMC, the district health department, and officials of the Food Safety & Standards Authority of India (FSSAI).

Mayor Gautam Deb said: "A committee has been formed to check if the eateries, hotels, restaurants and other food joints in the civic area are maintaining hygiene and food safety standards. The committee will

regularly visit the eateries to confirm that the food people are having in Siliguri is safe."

On Thursday, he met officials of the SMC, the enforcement branch of Siliguri Metropolitan Police, and excise and health departments.

"The state government's food quality control laboratory is located at the Kisan Mandi in Salbari (on the outskirts of Siliguri). It is not operational these days. Along with the formation of the committee, we are taking steps to make the lab operational so that food samples can be tested," the mayor said.

A source in the SMC said the committee would hold review meetings at least once a week and conduct surprise inspections at different food

joints and eateries in all 47 wards to check if there is any violation of food safety measures.

"We often receive complaints that some eateries are not maintaining proper cleanliness and hygiene. We hear that the food has poor quality and is cooked in shabby and unclean kitchens. The committee will regularly visit these places," said the source.

"Some food stalls on the streets near Jalpai More and Darjeeling More remain open till late at night. Those have to close by 10pm. Or else, we will not let such stalls run. Also, some pubs and bars stay open till late at night. It will not be allowed," the source added.

Dist admin gives tailoring jobs to 50 women

Fifty women based in Alipurduar district were provided with tailoring jobs by the district administration.

The women, who are from economically weaker sections of the society, have been given jobs with a monthly salary of 8,000 under the "Utkarsh Bangla" scheme of the state government.

"All these women were trained in tailoring by the Falakata Fab-

ric Cluster Industrial Cooperative Society for 390 hours. Today, we handed over the certificates of training and engagement letters to them," said Santiraj Garai, the additional district magistrate (general) of Alipurduar.

Sources in the district administration said it was rare that 50 women were provided with jobs at one go.

An official of the district administration said the women

would be engaged to make uniforms for school and college students and staff serving in the district health department.

"They will get a monthly salary of 8,000 from the state government. It is indeed a major achievement that we could train them for three months and simultaneously provide them with obs. They will be economically self-reliant now and can support their families," the official added.

"Our academic calendar had been set" before the developments surrounding the Pahalgam incident, she said.

The Mahadevi Birla World Academy and Calcutta Girls High School also said dates for the summer vacations had been fixed well in advance.

In the districts as well, several private schools announced the commencement of summer vacations from Friday.

"Following the developments after 'Operation Sindoor', we have decided to advance the day of commencement of vacations from May 16 to May 9," a spokesperson of a private school in Jalpaiguri said.

Summer vacations are already underway in state-run and state-aided schools from April 30, owing to excess heat.

Perhaps West Bengal is the only state where private schools have listened to the Chief minister appeal in view of the present tense situation and declared summer vacations from Friday, advancing it by about a week.

he said the killings were religiously targeted, with non-Muslims being singled out.

Addressing reports of explosions in Kashmir, Kwatra emphasised that it proves that Pakistan continues to support terror groups. "Rather than take action against them, they are essentially lending them support," he said, adding, "We wouldn't be surprised if they are themselves involved in this."

Responding to Pakistan's denial of involvement, he said, "Denial and obfuscation has always been the first part of Pakistan's strategy."

Asked about the risk of escalation, including nuclear conflict, Kwatra said the world's focus should be on Pakistan's ongoing support for terrorism. "That's what the world should be concerned about... to stop supporting terrorism. I think that's the crux," he said. The two countries witnessed strikes and counter strikes on Thursday night as Pakistan fired drones and missiles targeting border states, including Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, and Rajasthan.

India, to save its innocent civilians, shot down all the Pak missiles and drones along with three of its jets. "We are at war with terrorists," reiterates Ambassador Kwatra

Referring to the April 22 Pahalgam attack killing 25 tourists and an innocent local civilian, the Indian envoy said "They killed them in front of their wives and children, and they did so on the basis of religion. What we did a day before yesterday (Operation Sindoor) was our response to terror," he said. India's response was measured and calibrated as it took out terror factories at nine locations, he said. "We were very careful in keeping targets only to those people and their backers who carried out these dastardly killings," he said.

He also asserted that the "entire Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of India", adding "the only issue is the return of the part occupied by Pakistan, which is Pakistan Occupied Kashmir."



Kolkata Airport on high alert, CISF leaves cancelled

This heightened security posture includes the immediate cancellation of all leave for Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) personnel, with those currently on leave instructed to return to duty. Further underscoring the gravity of the situation, a crucial video conference is scheduled today, convened by the DC Bureau of Civil Aviation Security, to address passenger safety protocols at the airport. These measures are part of a broader nationwide directive from the Ministry of Civil Aviation, urging all airports to implement enhanced security precautions in light of recent cross-border hostilities, which have included drone and missile attacks in Jammu and Kashmir, Rajasthan, and Punjab.

Heightened Security at Kolkata Airport Amidst India-Pakistan Conflict

In response to the escalating tensions and ongoing conflict between India and Pakistan, Kolkata's Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport has been placed under a state of high alert. Daylight robbery in Entally, crores looted, lakhs recovered

MI News Services, Kolkata: Following a brazen daylight robbery on May 5th in Kolkata's Entally area, where over Rs2.5 crore was looted from employees of a foreign exchange agency forced into a taxi en route to a bank, city police have apprehended five individuals. Identified as Sanjeev Das (alias Sonu), Riju Hazra, Sheikh Shahruck, and Alamgir Khan, the accused were arrested from various locations. So far, Rs29 lakh of the stolen Rs2.66 crore has been recovered, with authorities continuing their efforts to retrieve the remaining funds.

The Kolkata Police have made significant progress in the investigation of the audacious daylight robbery that occurred in the Entally area on May 5th, resulting in the theft of 2.66 crore. Following a meticulous investigation, law enforcement officials have successfully apprehended five individuals implicated in the crime.

The arrested suspects have been identified as Sanjeev Das (also known as Pacha), Mohammad Sarfaraz (alias Sonu), Riju Hazra, Sheikh Shahruck, and Alamgir Khan. These individuals were taken into custody from various locations across

the city. The incident unfolded when Samrat Ghosh and a colleague, employees of a foreign exchange agency, were en route to deposit 2.66 crore at a bank branch in the Park Circus area. According to the police complaint filed by Mr. Ghosh, two unidentified individuals forcibly entered their taxi and subsequently absconded with the substantial sum. Through diligent interrogation of the apprehended suspects, the police have managed to recover 29 lakh of the stolen money. Initial breakthroughs came from the questioning of Sanjeev Das, which led to the recovery of 26 lakh from the residence of his associate, Shailen, in the Subhashgram area of Baruipur. Further interrogation of Alamgir Khan resulted in the recovery of an additional 3 lakh from his residence in Tiljala. The Kolkata Police are continuing their active investigation to locate the remaining portion of the stolen 2.66 crore and to gather further details regarding the planning and execution of this bold daylight dacoity. The swift arrests and partial recovery underscore the commitment of the city's law enforcement to bringing the perpetrators to justice.

"Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata bolsters security amid National alert

with the achievements of the officers. Since the 2020 verdict, the top court has passed several orders on the issue of permanent commission to women officers in Armed Forces and similar orders was passed in the case of Navy, Indian Air Force and Coast Guard.

US tariffs to have small indirect effect: NITI Aayog member

MI News Service, New Delhi: The US reciprocal tariffs will have a small indirect effect on India given the domestic economy's low dependence on foreign trade, NITI Aayog member Arvind Virmani said. He further said that in the medium term, the negative factors emanating from the imposition of tariff would be minimised with the implementation of the first phase of the proposed USA-India Bilateral Trade Agreement. In the long term, the eminent economist said the final BTA with US will aim to enhance the potential gains during the next 5 to 10 years. The US has announced 26 per cent reciprocal tariffs on India saying New Delhi imposes high import duties on American goods. "This (26 per cent reciprocal tariffs) will have a small indirect effect on India given our low trade dependence," he said. Virmani explained that the reciprocal tariffs are calculated by a formula which includes US trade deficit with a country and imports from that country. He said every country is however feeling the effect of increased trade policy uncertainty during the last few months, adding "world trade, FDI, investment and GDP growth will all be affected." According to Virmani, in the short-medium term, the impact of differential US tariffs depends on the commodity and the relative tariffs on competitors. "Very broadly, there are three categories; (a) Exempt goods (e.g. Pharmaceuticals): Little or no effect. (b) Exports in which largest competitors in US market are from EU or LAC: Reduce demand for India, (c) Exports in which closest competitors are from East & S.E. Asia, the demand for India would tend to increase," he said. Responding to a question on impact of reciprocal tariffs on inflation rate, Virmani said, "Other things unchanged, the effect of US tariffs on any one country X, would be to reduce demand for imports from that country and have a deflationary impact (not inflationary)." He observed that to the extent to which US imports from many countries are reduced, all these countries would reduce the prices of their exports to other countries, besides the US. While noting that the direct effect on the rest of the world is therefore deflationary, Virmani said, "Supply-side disruptions can however produce sharp increase in prices of some goods, whose aggregate inflationary impact is difficult to predict at this point." Asked can India turn this crisis into an opportunity, he said every challenge is an opportunity and this one is no different. "From the time of the election of the US President many of us have been thinking about how to maximize the benefits and minimize the costs of likely US actions," he said. According to Virmani, the agreement between US President and Indian Prime Minister to target increased trade and promote supply chains, through a mutually beneficial USA-India Bilateral Trade Agreement, is expected to do that.

IA carried 1.45 Cr passengers in Mar, up 8.79% from last yr: DGCA

MI News Service, New Delhi: Indian airlines carried 1.45 crore passengers in March, an increase of 8.79 per cent compared to the year-ago period, according to official data released. The Indian carriers had flown a total of 1.33 crore passengers in March 2024. "Passengers carried by domestic airlines during March 2025 were 145.42 lakh as against 133.68 lakh during the corresponding period of the previous year," the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said in its monthly domestic passenger traffic report. In the month gone by, IndiGo transported a total of 93.1 lakh passengers with a market share of 64 per cent while Air India Group (full-service carrier Air India and low-cost carrier Air India Express) flew 38.8 lakh passengers with 26.7 per cent market share. The two other major carriers - Akasa Air and SpiceJet - flew 7.2 lakh and 4.8 lakh passengers, respectively in March 2025, cornering market share of 5 per cent and 3.3 per cent. IndiGo delivered the highest on-time performance (OTP) at 88.1 per cent for March 2025 followed by Akasa Air at 86.9 per cent while that of Air India Group and SpiceJet was at 82 per cent and 72.1 per cent, respectively. OTP has been computed for four metro airports -- Bengaluru, Delhi, Hyderabad, and Mumbai.

Railway Minister Reviews Operations, Directs Operation of Special Trains Based on Public Needs

GST collection hits 'highest-ever' Rs 2.37 lakh Cr in Apr
MI News Service, New Delhi: Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection rose 12.6 per cent Y-o-Y to an all-time high of about Rs 2.37 lakh crore in April, government data showed. The GST mop-up was Rs 2.10 lakh crore in April 2024 -- the second highest collection ever since the roll-out of the indirect tax regime on July 1, 2017. In March 2025, the collection was Rs 1.96 lakh crore. GST revenue from domestic transactions rose 10.7 per cent to about Rs 1.9 lakh crore, while revenue from imported goods was up 20.8 per cent to Rs 46,913 crore. Refunds issuance rose 48.3 per cent to Rs 27,341 crore during April. After adjusting refunds, net GST collection rose 9.1 per cent to over Rs 2.09 lakh crore in April.

India's largest lender also advised its customers not to rely on unverified information. Similar messages have been posted by Bank of Baroda, Punjab and Sindh Bank, Canara Bank and Bank of India. "All our digital services too are operating smoothly, ensuring a seamless banking experience from the comfort of your home," Punjab National Bank said in a post on social media platform X. Meanwhile, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will hold a review meeting on cybersecurity preparedness of banks and financial institutions in the evening, the ministry said.

Govt blocks 8,000 X accounts

MI News Service, New Delhi: Social media platform X said it had blocked 8,000 accounts in India following executive orders from the government. X said it received executive orders from the Indian government requiring it to block over 8,000 accounts in India, subject to potential penalties, including significant fines and imprisonment of the company's local employees. "To comply with the orders, we will withhold the specified accounts in India alone. We have begun that process. However, we disagree with the Indian government's demands," X said in a post on its Global Government Affairs handle. "This is not an easy decision, however, keeping the platform accessible in India is vital to Indians' ability to access information. We believe that making these executive orders public is essential for transparency — lack of disclosure discourages accountability and can contribute to arbitrary decision-making. However, due to legal restrictions, we are unable to publish the executive orders at this time. "X is exploring all possi-

ble legal avenues available to the company. Unlike users located in India, X is restricted by Indian law in its ability to bring legal challenges against these executive orders. However, we encourage all users who are impacted by these blocking orders to seek appropriate relief from the courts," it said. X, which has been in a prolonged legal battle with the Centre over the blocking of accounts, posted contacts on free legal aid services. In Srinagar, police booked three men for spreading misinformation and inflammatory content on social media about the current conflict. Saudi Arabia's deputy foreign minister Adel al-Jubeir landed in Delhi to meet India's top leadership with a focus on de-escalating tensions between India and Pakistan. Al-Jubeir, on an unannounced visit to India, is learnt to have carried a message from the Saudi leadership. "A good meeting with @AdelAljubeir, Minister of State for Foreign Affairs of Saudi Arabia this morning," Jaishankar said in a social media post. mother since the beginning. Court can't force states to implement NEP: SC

MI News Service, New Delhi: The Supreme Court dismissed a petition filed by BJP leader and lawyer G.S. Mani, which asked for the implementation of the three-language formula under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and West Bengal. A bench comprising Justice J.B. Pardiwala and Justice R. Mahadevan rejected the plea, stating that the court does not have the power to force a state to follow a central policy like the NEP. "Whether the states should adopt the National Education Policy 2020 or not is a vexed issue. The Supreme Court, through Article 32 of the Constitution, can issue directives to ensure that the rights of the citizens are protected. It cannot directly compel a state to adopt a policy like the NEP. The court may, however, intervene if a state's action or inaction related to the NEP violates any fundamental rights." The court also questioned the petitioner's connection to the issue, pointing out that

although Mani is from Tamil Nadu, he now lives in New Delhi. "We do not propose to examine this issue in this writ petition. We believe that the petitioner has nothing to do with the cause he proposes to espouse. Although he may be from the state of Tamil Nadu, yet on his own admission, he is residing in New Delhi. In such circumstances, this petition stands dismissed," the court said. The plea was filed amid ongoing row over Hindi imposition. While the Centre claimed the NEP promotes multilingualism, Tamil Nadu argued it puts unfair pressure on non-Hindi-speaking states. The state has opposed the policy, accusing the Centre of trying to "impose" Hindi through the three-language formula. Tamil Nadu chief minister M.K. Stalin has been a vocal opponent of the NEP, especially its three-language formula, accusing the Centre of attempting to impose Hindi and non-Hindi speaking states.

Pak tried to infiltrate through 36 locations using 300-400 Turkish drones: India

MI News Service, New Delhi: The ministry of external affairs on Friday said, Pakistan had used 300-400 armed drones on 36 locations from Leh to Sir Creek on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday to test India's air defence system. During the briefing wing commander Vyomika Singh and Colonel Sophia Qureshi said Pakistan is using its domestic passenger flights as a shield and India had shown restraint to ensure safe passage for international flights.

16 Bangladeshi nationals, 7 children, and one Indian Tout held for illegal cross-border activity in Nadia

MI News Service, Dhantala: In a significant breakthrough in curbing cross-border illegal movement, Dhantala Police on Wednesday evening apprehended sixteen Bangladeshi nationals, (16 + 7 children) including seven children, and one Indian tout from the Baranberia Nilaparana area under Duttapuria Gram Panchayat in Nadia. According to police sources, the foreign nationals had illegally entered India a few months ago with the assistance of an Indian handler. After traveling across various parts of the country, they had returned to the Dhantala area on Wednesday with the intention of crossing back into Bangladesh. Ashish Mourya, the Superintendent of police, Ranaghat police district said, " The arrested Bangla Na-



nationals spent long time at various corners of the country. While some of them stated that they were in Maharashtra, some in Gujarat. But all these are matter of investigation." The arrested Indian tout has been identified as Ram Udagar Kamat (45), a native of Madhubani district in Bihar, currently residing near the Fire Brigade in Kolkata. The Bangladeshi nationals hailed from the Narail and Jessore districts of Bangladesh. Police confirmed that they include men, women, and children who had crossed the Indo-Bangladesh border near North 24 Parganas district without valid documentation. During questioning, the group admitted to entering India illegally and revealed plans to re-enter Bangladesh through unauthorised means. They entered long months back. A case has been registered under relevant sections of the law at Dhantala Police Station. All arrested individuals were presented before the court on Thursday. Police have launched further raids to identify and apprehend other members of the cross-border trafficking network. Authorities have reiterated their commitment to tackling illegal migration and ensuring tight vigil along the international border.

Physicists snaps first images of 'free-range' atoms: Study

Washington Dc [US] : Physicists captured the first images of individual atoms freely interacting in space. The pictures reveal correlations among the 'free-range' particles that until now were predicted but never directly observed.

MIT physicists have captured the first images of individual atoms freely interacting in space.

Their findings, appearing in the journal *Physical Review Letters*, will help scientists visualize never-before-seen quantum phenomena in real space.

The images were taken using a technique developed by the team that first allows a cloud of atoms to move and interact freely.

The researchers then turn on a lattice of light that briefly freezes the atoms in their tracks, and apply finely tuned lasers to quickly illuminate the suspended atoms, creating a picture of their positions before the atoms naturally dissipate. The physicists applied the technique to visualize clouds of different types of atoms, and snapped a number of imaging firsts. The researchers directly observed atoms known as "bosons," which bunched up in a quantum phenomenon to form a wave. They also captured atoms known as "fermions" in the act of pairing up in free space -- a key mechanism that enables superconductivity.

"We are able to see single atoms in these interesting clouds of atoms and what they are doing in relation to each other, which is beautiful," says Martin Zwierlein, the Thomas A. Frank Professor of Physics at MIT. In the same journal issue, two other groups report using similar imaging techniques, including a team led by Nobel laureate Wolfgang Ketterle, the John D. MacArthur Professor of Physics at MIT. Ketterle's group visualized enhanced pair correlations among bosons, while the other group, from Ecole Normale Supérieure in Paris, led by Tarik Yefsah, a former postdoc in Zwierlein's lab, imaged a cloud of noninteracting fermions. The study by Zwierlein and his colleagues is co-authored by MIT graduate students Ruixiao Yao, Sungjae Chi, and Mingxuan Wang, and MIT assistant professor of physics Richard Fletcher.

"These techniques allow you to see the overall shape and structure of a cloud of atoms, but not the individual atoms themselves," Zwierlein notes. "It's like seeing a cloud in the sky, but not the individual water molecules that make up the cloud."

Indore claims to have become India's first beggar-free city



Indore : Indore has become the country's first beggar-free city, officials have said. There were about 5,000 beggars on the city streets a year ago before the administration launched a campaign, they said. "Indore has become the country's first beggar-free city," district magistrate Ashish Singh told reporters on Thursday. Beggars in the city were rehabilitated by helping them find employment, while children involved in begging were enrolled in schools, he said. "The campaign we launched for the elimination of begging has itself become a model. It has been recognised by the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and also a World Bank team," Singh added.

Indore is one of the 10 cities where the Union ministry has started a pilot project to eliminate

begging. District programme officer of the Women and Child Development Department, Ramnivas Budholia, said the campaign against begging was launched in February 2024.

There were about 5,000 beggars in the city, including 500 children, he said. "In the first phase, we ran an awareness campaign. Then the beggars were rehabilitated. We also found many beggars who used to come to Indore from Rajasthan to beg," said Budholia. Begging as well as giving money to beggars or buying anything from them has been banned in the city, and so far three FIRs have been registered for violations, he said.

A reward of Rs 1,000 is given to anyone providing information about begging, and many people have claimed the reward so far, said another official.

India's reservoir levels improve nationally but eastern northern regions face deficits

New Delhi : Even as India's overall water storage in major reservoirs has improved significantly over last year, several states are struggling with critically low levels, according to the bulletin issued on Friday.

The country's 161 major reservoirs currently hold 57.974 billion cubic meters (BCM) of live storage, accounting for 31.78% of their total capacity, according to the weekly bulletin issued by the Central Water Commission (CWC).

This marks an increase from the 49,290 BCM recorded during the same period last year and exceeds the ten-year average of 50,038 BCM.

Nationally, the current storage is 117.6% of last year's levels and 115.9% of the normal, a sign of overall improvement. However, this aggregated progress masks stark regional imbalances.

The eastern region, covering states like Bihar, Odisha, Jharkhand and West Bengal, is facing a sharp water shortage. The region's reservoirs are filled to just 27.87% of their capacity, well below last year's 35.97% and the normal 34.64%.

Critically low storage was reported in Odisha's Rengali and Upper Indravati reservoirs, Bihar's Badua and Chandan dams, and Mizoram's Tuirial reservoir, which is functioning at just 23.4% of its normal storage.

The situation is grimmer in the northern region, where states such as Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Rajasthan collectively recorded only 24.09% of reservoir capacity compared to 29.5% last year.

Himachal Pradesh's Pong Dam and Punjab's Thein Dam have reported substantial deficits.



Storage in the Pong Dam is down to 40.22% of normal and Gobind Sagar is operating at only 20.44% of its full capacity.

The live storage in the Indus basin stands at just 2,831 BCM - only 19.1% of its capacity of 14,819 BCM - representing a massive 40% shortfall from the average.

This shortfall is particularly alarming given that the Indus system supports large parts of Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh through irrigation, drinking water and hydropower generation.

The western region, comprising Maharashtra, Gujarat and Goa, fared relatively better. With 34.7% storage, it exceeded both last year's figure (28.15%) and the normal (27%). Gujarat showed a particularly positive trend, with some reservoirs reporting more than 50% of normal storage.

The reservoirs reached 37.8% of their full capacity in central India, which includes Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Uttarakhand.

This is up from 34.5% last year and well above the ten-year average of 30%. Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh saw sharp

gains, with key reservoirs like Gandhi Sagar, Indira Sagar and Bansagar performing significantly better than in previous years.

The southern region, with the highest number of monitored reservoirs (45), recorded 28.79% storage - an improvement over last year's 15.19% and above the normal of 20.58%.

Tamil Nadu stood out with an exceptional rise in storage levels, up by over 91% compared to the ten-year average. Andhra Pradesh's Nagarjuna Sagar reservoir, however, remains in distress, holding only 31.3% of its normal storage.

Telangana's Priyadarshini Jurla and Uttar Pradesh's Rangawan reservoirs have reported zero storage. Despite the improved national average, 41 reservoirs across the country have storage less than 80% of their normal levels and 17 of these are operating at 50% or less. These include major reservoirs like Pong Dam, Machchhu II (Gujarat), Bhima Ujjaini (Maharashtra) and Sholayar (Tamil Nadu). Alarming, five reservoirs, including Priyadarshini Jurla in Telangana and Rangawan in Uttar Pradesh, have reported no water at all. While rainfall and snowmelt have helped improve water levels in many parts of India, especially in central and western regions, the eastern and northern belts remain vulnerable ahead of the peak summer months. The Central Water Commission has flagged the need for close monitoring and region-specific water management strategies to mitigate risks to agriculture, drinking water supply and hydropower output.

The CWC noted that of the 20 hydroelectric reservoirs it monitors, storage was normal or better in only 12.

What is grounding could it improve my sleep Here's science behind this TikTok trend

Rockhampton (Australia) : (The Conversation) Have you ever felt an unexpected sense of calm while walking barefoot on grass? Or noticed your stress begin to fade as you stood ankle deep in the ocean? If so, you may have unknowingly "grounded" yourself to the earth.

Grounding, also known as earthing, is the practice of making direct physical contact with the Earth's surface. Our ancestors embraced this trend without knowing it. But with the invention of indoor homes, footpaths, roads, and even shoes, we have become less physically connected with the earth.

Grounding has been suggested to have a number of benefits, such as improving mood, and reducing stress and pain. But overall, there's limited conclusive evidence on the benefits of grounding.

Somewhat ironically, the concept of grounding in 2025 is heavily influenced by technology, rather than getting out into nature. Consumers are being hit with social media reels promoting a range of technologies that ground us, and improve our health.

Among the most common are promises of improved sleep

with the use of a grounding sheet or mat. But is this just another TikTok trend, or could these products really help us get a better night's sleep?


Bringing the outdoors in The human body is conductive, which means it can exchange electricity with Earth and artificial sources, such as electronic devices or objects. (Sometimes, this exchange can result in an electric or static shock.)

Proponents of grounding claim the practice reconnects "the conductive human body to the Earth's natural and subtle surface electric charge".

They credit this process with physiological and psychological benefits (but again, the evidence is limited).

Grounding technologies can vary in type (for example, under-desk foot mats, mattress toppers and bed sheets) but all are designed to provide a path for electric charges to flow between your body and the earth.

The bottom prong you see in your three-prong wall socket is a "ground" or "earth" terminal. It provides a direct connection to earth via your building's wiring, diverting excess or unsafe voltage into the ground. This protects you and your devices from potential



electrical faults. Grounding technology uses this terminal as a pathway for the proposed electrical exchange between you and earth, while in the comfort of your home.

Could grounding improve your sleep?

The research in this area is still emerging.

A 2025 study from Korea recruited 60 participants, gave

half of them a grounding mat, and gave the other half a visually identical mat that didn't have grounding technology. The researchers used a "double-blind" protocol, meaning neither the participants nor the researchers knew which participants were given grounding mats.

All participants wore sleep trackers and were asked to use their mat (that is, sit or lie on it)

for six hours per day. The researchers found that after 31 days, participants in the grounding mat group slept longer on average (as measured by their sleep trackers) than those in the control group.

The researchers also used questionnaires to collect measures of insomnia, sleep quality, daytime sleepiness, and stress. After 31 days, participants in both

groups improved on all measures.

There were no differences between the grounded and ungrounded groups for sleep quality, daytime sleepiness, and stress. And while grounded participants showed significantly lower insomnia severity after the intervention, this difference was also present at the start of the study. So it's unclear if grounding had a tangible impact on sleep.

In another double-blind study, published in 2022, researchers in Taiwan examined the effectiveness of using grounding mats to improve sleep among patients with Alzheimer's disease. The findings indicated that spending 30 minutes on a grounding mat five times per week resulted in improved sleep quality.

While previous research has suggested using grounding technologies may lead to improvements in mood, no differences were seen in measures of anxiety and depression in this study.

Grounding for gains? Grounding technology has also been touted as having other benefits, such as reducing pain and inflammation.

A 2019 study found participants who slept on a grounding mat after intense exercise felt less sore and showed lower levels of

inflammation in their blood compared to those who were ungrounded.

Grounding after a workout may help you feel better and recover faster, but it's still unclear whether and how grounding affects long-term training results or fitness gains.

Add to cart? So should you cash in on your favourite influencer's discount code and grab a grounding mat? At the risk of spouting a common cliché of cautious scientists, our answer is that we don't know yet.

What we do know is the existing research, albeit emerging, has shown no evidence grounding technology can negatively affect your sleep or recovery after exercise. So if you love your grounding mat or grounding sheet, or want to see if grounding works for you, feel free to give it a go.

Keep in mind, grounding products can retail for anywhere from around A\$30 to \$300 or more. On the other hand, grounding on the grass in the great outdoors is free. While there's limited evidence that grounding outdoors can improve sleep, spending time in outdoor light may itself benefit sleep, regulate circadian rhythms, and improve mood.

Pakistan violated airspace, used Turkish-made Asisguard Songar models: Colonel Sofiya Qureshi

NEW DELHI: In a major escalation along India's western front, the Pakistani army carried out multiple airspace violations and drone intrusions on the night of May 7 and 8, targeting Indian military infrastructure.

Addressing a press briefing on Friday, Colonel Sofiya Qureshi revealed that 300 to 400 drones were deployed across 36 locations, with several being shot down by Indian forces using both kinetic and non-kinetic methods. Initial investigations suggest the drones were Turkish-made Asisguard Songar models.

Colonel Sofiya Qureshi said during the press briefing, "On the night of May 7 and 8, the Pakistani army violated Indian airspace several times over the entire western border to target military infrastructure. Not only this, the Pakistani army also fired heavy-calibre weapons along the Line of Control. Around 300 to 400 drones were used to attempt infiltration at 36 locations."

She added, "The Indian armed forces shot down many of these drones using kinetic and non-kinetic means. The possible purpose of such large-scale aerial intrusions was to test air defence systems and collect intelligence. Forensic investigation of the wreckage of the drones is being done. Initial reports suggest that they are Turkish Asisguard Songar drones..."

During the press briefing, Wing Commander Vyomika Singh said, "Pakistan did not close its civil airspace despite it launching a failed unprovoked drone and missile attack on May 7 at 08:30 pm. Pakistan is using a civil airliner as a shield, knowing fully well that its attack on India would elicit a swift air defence response. This is unsafe for unsuspecting civil airliners, including international flights that fly near IB between India and Pakistan. She added, "As you have seen, the airspace on the Indian side is absolutely devoid of civil air traffic due to our declared closure. However, there are civil airlines flying the air route between Karachi and Lahore. Indian Air Force demonstrated considerable restraint in its response, thus ensuring the safety of international civil carriers. In response to the Pakistani attack, armed drones were launched at four air defence sites in Pakistan. One of the drones was able to destroy an AD radar. Pakistan also carried out artillery shelling across the line of control using heavy-calibre artillery guns and armed drones...which resulted in some losses and injuries to Indian army personnel. Pakistan army also suffered major losses in Indian retaliatory fire."

Escalating its tensions with India, Pakistan targeted Jammu using Hamas-style missiles to target multiple areas on Thursday, defence sources had told ANI. The sources said the attack resembled a Hamas-style operation in Israel, where multiple cheap rockets were used to target cities. Pakistan's attempted retaliation came in the wake of India's Operation Sindoor, where the Indian armed forces targeted nine terror infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir on Wednesday. The operation was a direct response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. Earlier on Thursday, the Indian Army had shot down more than 50 Pakistani drones during a large-scale counter-drone operation along the LoC and International Borders.

PAKISTAN IS USING CIVIL AIRLINES AS SHIELD, SAYS INDIAN ARMY

NEW DELHI: Wing Commander Vyomika Singh exposed Pakistan's airspace tactics, saying that Islamabad deliberately kept its civil airspace open after launching a "failed unprovoked drone" and missile attack on Wednesday, effectively using civil airliners as shields.

Addressing the special briefing on Operation Sindoor on Friday, Wing Commander Vyomika Singh said, "Pakistan did not close its civil airspace despite it launching a failed unprovoked drone and missile attack on 7 May at 08:30 hours in the evening. Pakistan is using civil airliner as a shield, knowing fully well that its attack on India would elicit a swift air defence response."

She further emphasised that this decision endangered unsuspecting civil airliners, including international flights operating near the India-Pakistan border.

"This is not safe for the unsuspecting civil airliners including the international flights which were flying near IB between India and Pakistan," she said.

During the briefing the Wing Commander showed the data of the application flight radar 24 during a high air defence alert situation in the Punjab sector.

Singh pointed out that while India's airspace was closed due to the heightened alert.

GOVERNMENT EXTENDS CLOSURE OF 28 AIRPORTS UNTIL MAY 15 AMID TENSIONS

NEW DELHI: After Pakistan attempted to attack multiple cities in Northern India using drones, the Ministry of Civil Aviation on Friday extended the closure of 28 airports across the country until 15 May morning from 10 May.

A senior government official confirmed that after a meeting with other stakeholders, the decision has been taken and airlines and airport authorities have been informed about it.

In their statement, Indigo Airlines mentioned that in accordance with the latest directives from the relevant authorities, all flights to and from the following destinations will remain cancelled



until 5.29 am on May 15 due to temporary airport closures.

Srinagar, Jammu, Amritsar, Leh, Chandigarh, Dharamshala, Bikaner, Rajkot, Jodhpur, and Kishangarh airports will be closed until May 15.

These precautionary measures have been instituted with your safety and security as our highest priority. We remain fully committed to providing unwavering support while navigating this situation together, reads the statement.

Air India also issued a travel advisory for the passengers.

In a social media post on X, they wrote, "Following a notification from aviation authorities on continued closure of multiple airports in India, Air India flights to and from the following stations - Jammu, Srinagar, Leh, Jodhpur, Amritsar, Chandigarh, Bhuj, Jammu and Rajkot - are being cancelled till 0529 hrs IST on 15 May, pending further updates. Customers holding valid tickets for travel during this period will be offered a one-time waiver on rescheduling charges or a full refund for cancellations."

MHA writes to states, UTs to strengthen Civil Defence measures amid hostile threats

NEW DELHI: In light of the current security environment and the threat of hostile attacks, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has urged all states and Union Territories (UTs) to augment civil defence measures under the Civil Defence Act and Rules of 1968.

Highlighting Section 11 of the Civil Defence Rules, 1968, the Ministry in a letter titled "augmentation of civil defence measures in the states/UTs" reminded that state governments are empowered to undertake all necessary actions for the protection of people and property, and to ensure the uninterrupted functioning of vital services during a hostile attack.

In the letter issued, considering the last night attacks by Pakistani forces in Jammu and Jaisalmer regions, the provision also authorizes the use of local authority funds for such emergency measures, giving them precedence over other financial obligations.

In the communication, the Ministry has requested that "states and UTs invoke Section 11 and grant emergency procurement powers to their respective Directors of Civil Defence." This step is aimed at enabling swift and efficient implementation of precautionary and protective measures.

"In the current hostile attack scenario, I would like to draw your kind attention towards Section 11 of the Civil Defence Rules, 1968, which inter-alia empowers the State Governments, to take such measures, which in the opinion of the state government necessary for the protection of persons and property from injury or damage, or for ensuring the due maintenance of the vital services, in the event of hostile attack. The funds of the local

authority shall be applicable to the payment of the charges and expenses incidental to such compliance, and priority shall be given to such compliance over all other duties and obligations of the local authority," reads the letter.

"I shall be grateful, if Section 11 of the CD Rules, 1968, can be invoked and necessary Emergency Procurement Powers to the Director Civil Defence of your state and UT, may be granted so that efficient implementation of the necessary precautionary measures can be implemented."

Officials emphasized that timely action and preparedness at the state and local levels are essential to mitigate the impact.

The call to strengthen civil defence measures follows a serious security incident along the India-Pakistan border as Pakistan on Thursday night launched a series of coordinated drone and missile attacks along India's western border, targeting regions in Jammu and Kashmir, and Rajasthan. According to Indian defence officials, the attacks were largely intercepted by India's air defence systems, including the S-400 missile defense system, preventing significant damage.

These strikes were reportedly in retaliation to India's Operation Sindoor conducted earlier this week, which targeted terrorist camps in Pakistan following a deadly terrorist attack in Kashmir that killed 26 tourists on April 22. The escalating conflict has led to heightened tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbors, with both sides accusing each other of aggression and violating airspace. The situation remains volatile, with international calls for restraint and diplomatic engagement to prevent further escalation.

Nirmala Sitharaman reviews banking sector preparedness amidst tension at borders

NEW DELHI: Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Friday convened a high-level meeting with the Managing Directors and CEOs of Public and Private sector banks and insurance companies amidst emerging security concerns arising from tensions at the western border.

Senior officials from the Department of Financial Services (Ministry of Finance), CERT-In, RBI, IRDAI and NPCI attended the meeting, which focused on reviewing the banking sector's operational and cybersecurity preparedness, including digital public-facing applications such as internet banking and UPI, as per a statement from the Ministry of Finance.

The Managing Directors and CEOs of all the Banks and Insurance Companies apprised the Union Finance Minister about the measures they are undertaking, given the ongoing tensions at the border.

Bank MDs and CEOs informed that cybersecurity measures have been reinforced throughout the banking system.

Anti-DDoS (Distributed Denial-of-Service) systems have been implemented by banks to protect against massive cyber-attacks.

To guarantee institutional



readiness, mock drills have been held encompassing cybersecurity and disaster recovery scenarios at the highest levels.

They apprised that phishing attempts are being actively watched, and staff members have received several internal alerts to increase awareness.

Bank officials stated that their Security Operations Centre (SOC) and Network Operations Centres are fully operational and on high alert.

These centres are coordinating closely with CERT-In and the National Critical Information Infrastructure Protection Centre (NCIIPC), facilitating real-time data sharing and threat monitoring.

AS PAK REELS UNDER INDIAN PRESSURE

Nawaz Sharif advises brother Shehbaz to ease tensions diplomatically

ISLAMABAD: Amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan following the Pahalgam attack and India's decision to suspend the Indus Waters Treaty, former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif stepped in to advise his brother, current Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, on the need for a diplomatic approach to ease the growing crisis, The Express Tribune reported.

Following India's suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty in the wake of the Pahalgam attack, Nawaz Sharif returned to Pakistan from London to help his brother the Prime Minister.

After his arrival, The Express Tribune reported that Sharif had advised PM Shehbaz Sharif to ease tensions diplomatically after he briefed the PML-N supremo on the decisions taken by the National Security Committee (NSC) meeting in the wake of the suspension of the IWT by India.

It was said that Sharif wanted the PML-N-led coalition government to utilise all available diplomatic resources to restore peace between the two nuclear-armed states, saying he was not keen on taking an aggressive position, The Express Tribune reported.



Earlier in 2023, Nawaz Sharif had underlined the importance of having good relations with India and said that his government was ousted in 1999 because he opposed the Kargil war.

According to The News International, Nawaz had said that PML-N always performed well but was always ousted from power.

"I want to know why my governments were overthrown in 1993 and 1999. Was it because we opposed the Kargil war," Nawaz had said.

Nawaz Sharif was the Prime Minister of Pakistan when his government was

overthrown in a coup d'etat on October 12, 1999. Last year, Nawaz also admitted that Pakistan had 'violated' an agreement with India in 1999.

Pakistan carried out five nuclear tests. After that Vajpayee Saheb came here and made an agreement with us. But we violated that agreement...it was our fault," the former PM had said.

The agreement mentioned by Sharif was the "Lahore Declaration," which he and then-Indian Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee signed on February 21, 1999, with the goal of fostering peace and stability between India and Pakistan. However, shortly after the signing, Pakistani troops infiltrated the Kargil district in Jammu and Kashmir, leading to the Kargil War.
