'We hit all 9 terror targets in Pak with precision in Operation Sindoor', says NSA Ajit Doval

MI News Service, Chennai : National Security Advisor Ajit Doval taking pride in India's military prowess and technological capabilities in neutralising the threats from across the border, has claimed that Indian Air Force hit as many as nine terror targets crisscrossing Pakistan with precision and missed none of them during Operation Sindoor .

Addressing the 62nd convo-cation ceremony of the IIT Madras on Friday, NSA Doval said amid cheers that the precision was so perfect and to the point where India knew who was where and the entire operation lasted hardly 23 minutes past 1 am on May 7. " Even thereafter, they said Pakistan did this and did that and so on. Can you show me of and so on. Can you show me of one image or photograph that shows any damage to India?" Doval asked while speaking at the jam packed convocation cere-mony. He said after lot of calcula-tions in the Army becomercies tions in the Army headquarters, India targeted nine terror targets in Pakistan with precision under Operation Sindoor and added that the entire operation took only 23 minutes. This is the result of the development of indigenous tech-nology, he remarked. Underscor-ing further development of indigenous technology, Doval said

"We have to develop our indigenous technology further. Mention of Sindoor was made here. We are really proud of how much of indigenous content was there...We decided to have 9 terrorist targets in the criss-cross of Pakistan, it was not in the border areas. We missed none. We hit nowhere else except that," Doval was quoted as saying . "It was precise to the point where we knew who was where. Entire operation took barely 23 minutes..." he added.

He also criticised foreign media for their alleged biased reportage on Operation Sindoor, India's military response to the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam, and challenged them to show any visuals of any destruction in India.

MI News Service, New Delhi : Two former Chief justices of India - J S Khehar and D Y Chandrachud • met the Parliamentary Committee members here on Friday to scrutinise the simultaneous election bill

in its eighth sitting. According to informed sources, both jurists are of the view that the concept of 'one nation one election' is not violative of the basic structure of the Constitution, but have questioned the extent of power vested with the Election Commis-sion in the proposed law.

They have also made certain suggestions while throwing light on the journey of Parliamentary system of democracy in the country.

The Joint Committee of Parliament headed by BJP MP P P Chaudhary has spoken to jurists and legal experts as it prepares its recommendation on the bill.

22 Naxalites with bounty of Rs 37.5 lakh surrender in Chhattisgarh

MI News Service, Raipur : In a significant development, as many as 22 hardcore Naxalites, who were active in the tribal dominated Abhujmad area and carrying collective re-wards of Rs 37.5 lakh, surrendered in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur

stated. Among those who surrendered were 14 male and eight female cadres, including a couple. The group comprised members from both the Kutul and Amdai Area Committees, long known for their activity in the dense forest zones of the Bastar division. Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai wrote on his X handle, "People are choosing the path of progress and unity over violence In Narayanpur district, 22 Naxalites with a combined bounty of Rs 37.5 lakh have laid down their arms. These individuals, who had rewards ranging from Rs 50,000 to Rs 8 lakh, are now stepping away from militancy. "Under our administration, 1,476 Maoists have surrendered so far. This reflects the growing impact of our government's 2025 surrender and rehabilitation policy, along with welfare initiatives that are building trust among tribal communities. Programmes like 'Niyad Nellnar' have empowered people to embrace development and return to the mainstream. Our government remains firmly committed to restoring the lives of those who have chosen peace, and we are determined to eradicate Naxalism by March 31, 2026," CM Sai said. MI News Service, Vadodara : The death toll in the Mahisagar river bridge collapse in Gujarat's Vadodara district climbed to 19 on Friday after one of the injured persons succumbed to injuries at a hospital, official sources said.

However, the search for the two missing persons is still underway, they said. Several vehicles plunged into the river after a 15 metre segment of the four-decade-old bridge, connecting Anand and Vadodara districts, collapsed near Gambhira village close to Padra town on Wednesday morning. "Forty five-year-old Narendrasinh Parmar, a resident of Dahevan, who was one of the five injured persons undergoing treatment at the SSG Hospital died on Friday," an official said. A total of 18 bodies were recovered till Thursday night, and the rescue operation resumed on the third day with efforts being made by the teams engaged at the site to trace two more persons, who are still missing, Vadodara Col-

The surrendered Naxalites told the police that they were dejected and disappointed with the "hollow" Maoist ideology and growing internal differences within the banned outfit, Narayanpur Superintendent of Police Robinson Guria said and described it as a significant development in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district, as the Maoists also laid down their arms and ammunition marking another step toward peace in the conflictridden Abujhmad region and as part of the state's ongoing anti-Maoists' campaign and rehabilitation initiative.

Collectively, the 22 individuals had rewards totalling 37.50 lakh rupees on their heads. Their decision to return to the mainstream is being seen as a major blow to the Maoists' network in the region, Narayanpur SP Guria

US yacht and two crew members rescued by Indian Coast Guards from Andaman sea

MI News Service, Chennai: The Indian Coast Guard rescued a US yacht in distress and its two crew members after the small sailing vessel got stranded in turbulent waters southeast of Indira Point in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, officials said on Friday. Indian Coast Guard's Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre at Port Blair received a distress alert from the US Consulate in Chennai at 11:57 am on July 10 regarding yacht 'Sea Angel' with two crew members -- one American one Turkish and stranded 52 nautical mile south-east of the Indira Point, they said. The vessel had got disabled amid extremely rough conditions with a blown sail and entangled propeller, a senior official of the ICG said. In a post on X, the Coast Guard said it had deployed ICG Ship Rajveer on July 10

after receiving a distress alert from the US Consulate in Chennai regarding the yacht Sea Angel, which had one US and one Turkish crew member on board. Upon arrival, the yacht was found with its sail blown off and its propeller entangled in ropes. The Sea Angel was taken under tow and safely brought to Campbell Bay today (on July 11). ICG Ship Rajveer was deployed and responded despite rough sea conditions," the ICG said Last month, the Indian Coast Guard rescued three Sri Lankan nationals who had been abandoned on a sandbar near Adam's Bridge, off the coast of Tamil Nadu's Dhanushkodi. The individuals had reportedly set out from Sri Lanka in an unidentified boat, which later dropped them on the sandbar within Indian territorial waters.

On July 13, 1931, 22 people were killed by the Dogra Army of Maharaja of Jammu and Kashmir Hari Singh. Mirwaiz said, "The sacrifice of these martyrs and all the martyrs since, is etched in the collective memory of Kashmir and cannot not be undone by restrictions and bans." "No living nation can forget the supreme sacrifice of life of its martyrs against tyranny and injustice," he added. The Hurriyat chairman appealed to the authorities to "remove the restrictions" and allow people to "peacefully pay homage to the martyrs of 13th July".

However, his opinion is not without notes of caution over some of the bill's features or the likely implications if it is to be enacted.

Chandrachud has appeared to share the concern that simultaneous elections could marginalise smaller or regional parties due to the dominance of better-resourced national parties, saying it is a significant policy aspect that warrants legislative attention.

He said, "To ensure a level playing field among political parties, the rules governing electoral campaigning, particularly those relating to campaign finance, must be strengthened.'

While the Representation of the People Act, 1951 and the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961, impose ceilings on the amount a candidate may

spend during the election campaign, there are no corresponding limits on the expenditure incurred by political parties themselves, he noted.

This gap in regulation weighs in the electoral process towards parties with greater financial resources, he said.

As the bill says that the term of a House elected after a midterm poll will be only for the remainder of the five year term, Chandrachud has said the ability of the government to take any meaningful proj-ect will be minimised if its

tenure is only of a year or less as the Model Code of Conduct will come into force around six months before the next polls.

Several MPs in the panel have also raised this point about the likely priorities and strength of a government elected for a short period.

TMC enforces strict discipline ahead of 2026 assembly polls

MI News Service, Kolkata: With the crucial 2026 West Bengal Assembly elections on the horizon, the Trinamool Congress has launched a state-wide disciplinary review, extending from district to booth level. The party's top leadership is leaving no room for internal dissent, making it abundantly clear that factionalism and indiscipline will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

In recent weeks, the party has initiated a rigorous screening process across all organisational tiers. Whether the complaints emerge from the grassroots or the upper echelons, the party is addressing them through showcause notices, direct summons to Trinamool Bhavan, or cor-

rective counsel. The message is unambiguous-unity is paramount, and individual ambitions must not eclipse collective goals. Sources confirm that the leadership believes there is no structural weakness in the party's organisation. Rather, certain individuals are attempting to exploit minor grievances to further personal interests, resulting in unwarranted intraparty accusations. This, they assert, damages the party's public image and will not be condoned.

State party president Subrata Bakshi, responding to recent incidents, issued a stern directive: "Everyone must adhere to party discipline. No one is above the party. Our supreme leader is Mamata Banerjee,

and the party functions through her re-lentless efforts and the organisational support of Abhishek Banerjee. If there's any issue, the leadership discusses it internally and chalks out the future strategy. Manufacturing conflict for petty gains is unacceptable.'

Preparations are already in full swing for the party's flagship event on July 21 at Dharmatala, where Mamata Banerjee is expected to lay down the roadmap for the upcoming election battle. Thousands of workers from North Bengal and other districts are scheduled to arrive in Kolkata ahead of the event, with accommodation and logistics being carefully coordinated by senior leaders. Simultaneously, the party's disciplinary committee is intensifying its scrutiny. Those found guilty of defiance are being firmly reminded of their obligations to the party's code of conduct.

Post July 21, the Trinamool Congress will officially begin its ground-level preparations for the 2026 polls. Govt mulls rare earth magnet subsidy to boost **EV** supply chain

MI News Service, New Delhi: The union government is expected to decide on a subsidy scheme to promote domestic production of rare earth magnets, a critical component for electric vehicles (EVs).

This move is vital to strengthening the supply chain and attracting investments, especially after the government opened applications for its EV incentive scheme. Union minister for

heavy industries, H.D. Kumaraswamy said that a Hyderabad-based company has committed to delivering 500 tonnes of rare earth magnets by December. Discussions are also ongoing with the mines ministry, and the final decision on the subsidy scheme is imminent.

Heavy industries ministry secretary Kamran Rizvi said stakeholder consultations are underway to determine the level of subsidy, with industry demands ranging from 20 per cent to 50 per cent. If the incentive amount remains below ₹1,000 crore, it can be cleared by the ministers of heavy industries and finance.

News Service, MI Bhubaneswar: In yet another infrastructure boost to Odisha, Hon'ble Minister of Railways Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw has sanctioned the Cuttack-Nergundi 4th Line (15.99 km) along with a Rail Flyover at Nergundi, at an estimated cost of ₹802.9 crore. This critical infrastructure project aims to significantly enhance the capacity and efficiency of train operations in the Howrah-Chennai mainline section and the Cuttack-Paradeep section.

The Cuttack-Nergundi section is part of the Howrah-Chennai High-Density Network (HDN). This corridor currently faces heavy congestion due to traffic from Paradeep Port intersecting the mainline at Cuttack. With no direct junction arrangements at Cuttack for Talcher-bound trains, significant delays often occur due to surface-level crossings. The fourth line and rail fly-

over are designed to decongest this corridor by separating port-bound traffic from the mainline routes, particularly between Cuttack and Dhenkanal. This will help reduce detention of passenger and Mail/

Axiom-4 mission Shubhanshu Shukla to return to earth on July 14, says NASA

New Delhi : Astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla and three other crew members of the Axiom-4 mission are set to return to earth from the International Space Station on July 14, NASA said on Thursday.

We are working with the station program, watching the Axiom-4 progress carefully. I think we need to undock that mission and the current target to undock is July 14 after the high beta period," Steve Stitch, Manager, NASA Commercial Crew Program, told a press conference on the Crew-11 mission to the space station slated for July 31.

The Axiom-4 mission was launched from the Kennedy Space Centre at Florida on June 25 and the Dragon spacecraft docked at the International Space Station on June 26 after a 28-hour journey. A "high beta period" for the space station refers

to times when the angle between the ISS's orbital plane and the sun is high, typically above 70 degrees. During these periods, the ISS experiences near-

constant sunlight, as it spends a greater portion of each orbit in daylight. This can cause overheating and requires careful thermal management by NASA. Shukla and his Axiom-4 crew have witnessed 230 sunrises onboard the International Space Station

(ISS) and travelled nearly 100 lakh kms in space at the end of two weeks on the orbital laboratory. The Axiom-4 crew, comprising Shukla, Peggy

Whitson, Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski and Tibor Kapu, also took their final off-duty day on the ISS.

The Axiom Mission 4 (Ax-4) crew has completed close to 230 orbits around Earth and travelled more than six million miles (96.5 lakh kms), an Axiom Space statement said.

During his two-week stay on the space station, Shukla has interacted with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, spoke to scientists at ISRO, addressed school students in a live session and also connect to ISRO



centres using HAM radio. "From about 250 miles above the Earth, the crew spent their downtime capturing images and video, taking in the view of our home planet below, and reconnecting with loved ones," the statement said. These moments offer a rare pause in an otherwise rigorous daily schedule, it said.

With over 60 experiments across biomedical science, advanced materials, neuroscience, agriculture, and space technology, the Ax-4 mission includes the most research conducted on an Axiom Space private astronaut mission to date.

These investigations could transform the future of human space exploration and life on Earth, with potential breakthroughs in areas such as diabetes management, innovative cancer treatments, and enhanced monitoring of human health and performance. As the crew resumes their scientific duties, they continue to demonstrate how commercial missions contribute meaningfully to microgravity research and space exploration.

"Every test tube, data point, and observation brings us one step closer to a global community living and working in low-Earth orbit and, eventually, beyond," Axiom Space said

Apple has alternatives to handle return of Chinese techies from Foxconn

New Delhi : The government is monitoring production targets at Foxconn and believes that Apple has alternatives to handle issues related to the return of Chinese professionals from Taiwanese electronics manufacturer's plant in India, sources said on Friday.

Hundreds of Chinese technology professionals who were facilitating and managing production at Foxconn plants in India have returned to China triggering speculation that it may hamper production of the upcoming iPhone 17 series.

"Government is monitoring the situa-tion. Apple has alternatives and they should be able to look at ways to handle this. Issue is primarily between Apple and Foxconn," a government source said.

Most of the equipment used for manufacturing of mobile phones are sourced from China and Chinese technology professionals have expertise in handling them.

According to sources, the engineers who have returned were handling assembly lines, factory design and also involved in training talents to handle tools and machines for iPhone production.

3rd Test (Day 2, Tea): Nair, Rahul stitch India's comeback after Jaiswal falters against Archer's pace

LONDON [UK] : Karun Nair and KL Rahul stitched India's return after Jofra Archer made early inroads and cut short Yashasvi Jaiswal's stay at the crease on Day 2 of the third Test against England on Friday at the 'Home of Cricket', Lord's.

At the stroke of Tea, India put 44/1 in 14 overs on the board, trailing by 343 runs with Rahul and Nair unbeaten with scores of 13(34) and 18(42), respectively.

The second session began with India making inroads to pull the curtains down on England's innings. Mohammed Siraj forced an outside edge from Jamie Smith (51), which travelled straight to the substitute wicketkeeper Dhruv Jurel behind the stumps

Brydon Carse flexed his boundary-hitting prowess, but Jofra perished as Bumrah rattled his stumps to punch his return ticket on 4(11), bringing up his maiden five-wicket haul at Lord's. Carse brought up his half-century by picking up Siraj's slower delivery and dispatching it for a towering maximum.

Siraj was left in dismay after Jurel managed to get fingertips on the ball but



fumbled it, allowing Carse the opportunity to continue with his belligerent approach. Eventually, Siraj got Carse wth the yorker ploy and castled him on 56(83), marking the end of England's innings on 387. England speedster Archer, who

returned to the format after four years, enchanted the spectators with his blister-ing pace in his first over. On the third delivery, he lured a healthy leading edge from Yashasvi Jaiswal, which flew to Harry Brook, stationed at the second slip. Karun and Rahul forged India's comeback and ensured India remained unscathed before returning for tea with an unbeaten partnership of 31.

At the beginning of the day, England took to the field in the first session at 251/4, with Root (99*) and skipper Ben Stokes (39*) unbeaten

In the first ball of the day with a boundary, Root continued his incredible run at Lord's, notching his ninth international ton at the venue and his 37th century in Test cricket, climbing to fifth spot among all-time Test centurions.

In the 86th over, Jasprit Bumrah produced the breakthrough for India, producing a brilliant nip-backer that crashed into Stokes' top of off-stump, removing him for 44 in 110 balls, with four boundaries. England was 260/5, ending an 88-run partnership between two of the most senior players in the group.

Jamie Smith was next up on the crease and immediately went after Mohammed Siraj with two cracking fours.

However, in the very next over, Bumrah once again came in clutch, castling Root for a 199-ball 104 consisting of 10 fours and then getting Chris Woakes caught behind by Dhruv Jurel for a golden duck. England was 271/7.

Smith continued his attacking brand of cricket, collecting boundaries against Siraj and Bumrah and playing some fine shots, displaying his class and power. The 300run mark came up for England in 92.3 overs. Even Carse produced some handy boundaries.

Smith continued his red-hot form, reaching his fifty in 52 balls, with six fours. On the same delivery, England reached their 350-run mark. Smith and Carse made sure that England ended the session without any further trouble

After sitting out in the second contest, Bumrah returned at the 'Home of Cricket', Lord's, with his mojo. He left England's top-class batters gobsmacked with his precise lines and troubling lengths. Bumrah blazed his way to his maiden five-wicket haul at Lord's to take his tally to 13 in away Tests, achieving the feat in 35 games. Bumrah toppled Kapil's record of 12 five-wicket hauls in

66 away Tests for India and moved to the top. Former spin-ner Anil Kumble slipped to the third spot with 10 five-fers in 69 Tests far from home.

In 47 Tests, Bumrah boasts 215 scalps at a stellar average of 19.49, with best figures of 6/27 and 15 five-wicket hauls. Across all formats, in 206 appearances, Bumrah crossed the 450-wicket mark. He has 453 scalps under his belt at an average of 20.48, with best figures of 6/19 and 17 five-wicket

DON'T THINK ALONSO'S SCARED TO DROP ANYONE: GARETH BALE EXPECTS "BIG CHANGES" IN REAL MADRID UNDER NEW COACH

NEW DELHI [INDIA] : Former Real Madrid star winger Gareth Bale expects new head coach Xabi Alonso to make "big changes" at the club, con-sidering he is not scared to "drop anyone"

After savouring success with Bayer Leverkusen, Alonso left the German side and returned to Madrid to add silverware after Los Blancos endured a trophyless season under former coach Carlos Ancelotti.

Bale, who won five Champions League and three LaLiga titles with Real Madrid, pondered whether Alonso can conjure a style of play that allows the team's premier for-wards Kylian Mbappe and Vinicius Junior to operate in a coherent team.

"I think if you look off what he did at Leverkusen, yes, and now he's arguably got better players to work with and I imagine a bigger transfer kitty. So I would like to think Xabi has got the respect of the players, and the players will play for him. So I expect big changes and I expect them to play the way he wants them, and if they don't, I don't think Xabi's scared to drop anyone,"

Ahead of the upcoming sea-son, Madrid have made two prominent acquisitions. Defenders Trent Alexander-Arnold was brought in from Liverpool, and Dean Huijsen from Bournemouth. The duo were unavailable as Real Madrid's 2024/25 campaign ended without a trophy following their 4-0 hammering against Paris Saint-Germain (PSG) at the Club World Cup semi-finals.

The result attracted widespread criticism for Mbappe, despite his rich goal-scoring form. After making a move from Paris to Madrid, PSG liftits maiden UEFA ed Champions League and stormed into the Club World Cup final despite Mbappe's absence. On the other hand, Mbappe netted 31 goals to finish as La Liga's top goal-scorer but failed to save Madrid from a trophyless season.

'It's a difficult one because he's still scoring the goals, he's still doing good things, it's just they haven't won anything this season. I think at Real Madrid you're expected to win everything, so it's a tough one because he's still delivering on the pitch, but maybe he's not having those moments," Bale said of Mbappe. "So I guess it's now up to Xabi to find that blend of pressing and trying to get the best out of him and saving his energy for when you need him. So yeah, it's going to be a tough one. I wouldn't like to criticise him and say he's had a bad season because of the goals and everything. But yeah, being his name, what you're expecting him to do, of course, everyone's going to always expect more," he added.
