Cloudburst leads to flash floods in Uttarkashi, 4 deaths, several others swept away

MI News Service, Dehradun : In a massive wrath of the nother nature, a cloudburst led to flash floods in the high altitude villages of Dharali in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi district on Tuesday with several houses being damaged or swept away in the raging waters, according to informed sources here.

The cloudburst took place in the catchment area of the Kheer Ganga river, leading to the devastating floods, the sources said.

At least 4 people were reportedly swept away and about 10-12 others including some women and children could be buried under the debris, Rajesh Panwar, a villager

said adding 20-25 hotels and homestays might also have been washed away.

There was panic in villages in the area with people scrambling for dry ground. Videos from the area showed a torrent of water rushing down and people could be heard screaming in panic.

A chilling video and pictures posted by the Indian Army show debris and water flowing through the settlement after a massive cloudburst in the high-altitude villages of Dharali on the way to Uttarakhand's Gangotri this afternoon.. "A massive mudslide struck #Dharali village in the #KheerGad area near Harsil, triggering sudden flow of

debris and water through the settlement," the Surya Command of the Indian Army posted on X. "Troops of #Ibexbrigade were immediately mobilised and have reached the affected site to assess the situation and undertake rescue operations. Extent of damage is being ascertained and updates will follow as relief operations unfold. The Army stands resolute in support of our citizens during this natural calamity," it added.

Several houses were damaged or swept away in the raging waters, and at least four people have repotedly been killed so far in the incident., they said. Dharali is the main stopover on the way to Gangotri and home

to many hotels, restaurants and home stays.

Locals said the devastating flashflood came in the wake of a cloudburst somewhere in the Kheer Ganga river's catchment area. According to initial reports quoting Uttarkashi District Magistrate Prashant Arya,an . Army team with relief and rescue materials from Harsil has been rushed to the spot. About 10-12 people could still be buried under the debris,a villager,said adding "The news of heavy losses due to cloudburst in Dharali (Uttarkashi) area is extremely sad and painful. SDRF, NDRF, district administration and other related teams are engaged on war footing in

relief and rescue operations."

Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami said in a post on X. "I am constantly in touch with senior officials in this regard and the situation is being closely monitored. I pray to God for everyone's safety," he said. There was widespread panic in the neighbouring villages following the flash-flood. Videos from the area showed people were screaming in fear. In one video, people can be heard in gasping for breath and trying to call their relatives in affected areas to find out if they were alright. A voice is heard in the video saying, "Everything is finished."

Mamata Banerjee again warns against ‘Bangladeshi Language’ remark

MI News Service, Arambagh: The Trinamool Congress has been opposing tooth and nail the harassment of Bengali-speaking citizens in other states for several days. Adding fuel to the fire, the party has now condemned the usage of the term "Bangladeshi language" in an official letter issued by the Delhi Police — a phrase that has sparked political controversy and strong backlash in Bengal. On Tuesday, at a foundation stone-laying ceremony for a new guest house at the Ramakrishna Math and Mission in Kamarpukur, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee took an indirect swipe at the BJP while passionately defending the Bengali language. Issuing a stern warning,

she declared, "No one should dare to play with our language."

In the same event, the Chief Minister also announced the formation of the Kamarpukur-Joyram-bati Development Board, assigning leadership of the board to Swami Lokot-tarananda Maharaj, the head of the Ramakrishna Math and Mission at Kamarpukur. She also announced a fund of Rs10 crore for the board.

The controversy stems from a letter reportedly sent by Delhi Police to Raj Bhavan in Kolkata, in which the phrase "Bangladeshi language" was used — a move that TMC claims is derogatory to Bengali. The BJP, however, maintains that there

was no error on Delhi Police's part. Amid this backdrop, Mamata Banerjee's remarks were pointed:

"No one should attempt to disrespect our language. Once something is embedded in the brain, it doesn't drain out. What we learned as children can't be erased — not even by force."

She added, "We don't need to go anywhere else to understand religion. One only needs to be near Sri Ramakrishna, Sarada Ma, and Swamiji to realize it. We learned the message of unity from Sri Ramakrishna. Kathamrita is etched in my memory. Everyone should read it deeply." Recalling Sri Ramakrishna's teachings, she said, "Some call it 'jal,'

some 'pani,' some 'water' — that's the only difference. Likewise, someone says 'ma,' another says 'mother,' another 'amma' — nothing more. This is our fundamental teaching." Citing Swami Vivekananda, she stressed, "What language did he speak? Bengali. And now they claim Bengali is not even a language?" She launched a scathing critique — without naming the BJP — stating, "Can India exist without Bengal? Can the world ignore it?" The Chief Minister emphasized that religion should bring peace and spiritual satisfaction. "We must now protect religion, protect humanity, and protect courtesy," she concluded.

PM Modi, Amit Shah express condolences over Uttarakhand cloudburst, assure all assistance

MI News Service, New Delhi : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday expressed grief over the cloudburst in Dharali, Uttarkashi, and said he had spoken to Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami to assess the situation. He assured that relief and rescue operations were being carried out under the supervision of the state government.

Four people have died and many are feared trapped under debris after the cloudburst, this afternoon, triggering a mudslide and flash floods that swept through a village, catching its residents by surprise.

"I express my condolences to

those affected by the tragedy in Dharali, Uttarkashi. I also pray for the well-being of all the victims. I have spoken to Chief Minister Pushkar Dhami and taken stock of the situation. Under the supervision of the state government, relief and rescue teams are making every possible effort. No stone is being left unturned in ensuring that help reaches the people," PM Modi tweeted in Hindi.

Authorities have deployed multiple rescue teams to the affected region, where challenging terrain and adverse weather have complicated the operation. The forces of the In-

dian Army, the State Disaster Response Force, and the National Disaster Response Force, along with other rescue teams, are on their way to the spot. The region is situated 10km away from the popular tourist site, Harshil.

Besides the Prime Minister,Union Home Minister Amit Shah also said that he spoke to Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Dhami and assured Centre's help in rescue operations. "I express my condolences to the people affected by the tragedy in Dharali, Uttarkashi. Along with this, I pray for the well-being of all the victims" , he said.

Mamata Banerjee serves food to flood victims in Hooghly, personally assessed the situation

MI News Service, Arambagh: Rows of flood-affected residents sat patiently with plates made of sal leaves laid out before them. From a large bucket, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee personally served khichuri onto their plates. But it wasn't just khichuri — arrangements had also been made for additional food items, which the Chief Minister also distributed with her own hands. Many among the displaced were visibly moved by her gesture, and some shared their personal stories and hardships directly with her.

Heavy rain caused by a low-pressure system, coupled with water released by the DVC (Damodar Valley Corporation), have inundated several regions, leading to a flood-like situation across multiple districts including Hooghly. As in previous years, large parts of

Hooghly have been submerged once again.

On Tuesday, Mamata Banerjee visited Arambagh to assess the flood vlike situation in the Arambagh region. Travelling by road from Kolkata, she reached a relief camp in Goghat, where she served food to af-

fectd people. From there, she later travelled to Kamarpukur. From there she would once again inspect other flood-hit areas in this south Bengal district. Last year, during a similar flood crisis, the Chief Minister had travelled through Arambagh to reach Ghatal.

This year too, she is undertaking visits across various regions in Hooghly to monitor the flood situation firsthand. During her journey, she made an unscheduled stop at the relief camp in Goghat.

The situation in Arambagh remains critical, with the water level of the Dwarakeswar River rising steadily. Already, 10 to 12 villages across five gram panchayats in Arambagh have been flooded. In Khanakul, around 20 to 22 villages across four gram panchayats are under water. Similarly, in Purshura, several villages and farmlands across three gram panchayat areas are submerged. In Goghat too, villages across three gram panchayats have recently been inundated. The water level in the rivers continues to surge rapidly, worsening the crisis.

Parliament extends President's Rule in Manipur by six more months

Amid protests by Oppo-

sition MPs, Chair Hari-vansh said it was a "constitutional obligation" to pass the resolution.

The Parliament has given its nod to the statutory resolution regarding the extension of President's rule in Manipur for a further period of six

month with effect from 13th August 2025. The Rajya Sabha today adopted the statutory resolution with voice vote. The Lok Sabha had already given its approval to the statutory resolution regarding the extension of President's rule in Manipur last week. Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai moved the resolution seeking approval of the House for the extension of President's rule which was imposed in

Manipur on 13th February 2025. Replying to a discussion on the resolution,Nityanand Rai said that since the imposition of President' rule, only one incident of violence took place in which one person lost his life . He added that not a single person lost life in the last four months in the state. The Minister said, several steps have been taken for the development of

Suvendu Adhikari Attacked in Cooch Behar Amid Protests, Vehicles Vandalized



MI News Service, Cooch Behar: Chaos erupted in Cooch Behar on Tuesday as Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari came under attack during his visit to the district. The situation turned tense as a group of protesters gathered at the New Cooch Behar station area, waving black flags and shouting slogans.

According to reports, as Adhikari's convoy was passing through the Khagrabari area, it was targeted with sticks, bamboo poles, and bricks. The windshield of his vehicle

was shattered in the incident, and several other cars in the convoy were allegedly vandalized. Despite heavy police deployment and the presence of central forces, the sudden escalation caught authorities off guard. Visuals captured by media outlets show the attack unfolding in real-time, raising concerns about security arrangements in the area. Police and security forces were later seen trying to bring the situation under control. Sources state that Adhikari was en route to the office of

the Superintendent of Police as part of a scheduled program. Political leaders from his party have condemned the incident, accusing local administration and law enforcement of failing to ensure safety and alleging attempts to disrupt his program. In response, a local representatives defending the demonstrations stated that public outrage has been growing over recent remarks perceived as offensive to the Bengali language. They insisted the gathering was peaceful and denied any organized violence, attributing the presence of large crowds—including women—to spontaneous public anger. State Minister Udayan Guha commented, "Those who disrespect the Bengali language must be prepared to face public protest wherever they go." As tensions remain high, additional forces have been deployed in the area to prevent further escalation.

Lighting tears through roof in Pandua, infant injured

MI News Service, Hooghly: A powerful lightning strike during a midnight thunderstorm caused severe damage to a home in Hatpukur village under Itachunachuna Gram Panchayat of Pandua on Monday night, leaving a three-month-old baby girl and her parents injured.

The incident occurred at the residence of Raju Malik in Khanyan, Pandua, when a bolt of lightning tore through the roof of the house, leaving a gaping hole. The intensity of the strike destroyed several electrical appliances, including the television and refrigerator, and caused panic in the neighborhood.

Local sources reported that frequent lightning and heavy rainfall had gripped the area late into the night. The baby, startled and injured by the sudden flash and deafening noise, was initially taken to Itachuna Rural Hospital along with her injured parents. After receiving preliminary treatment, the infant was referred to Chunchura Imambara District Hospital for further care. Family members stated that the baby has been lethargic since the incident. "The lightning strike was terrifying. Around midnight, we could feel the entire village shake. In the morning, we

found out that a house had been directly hit and a baby was injured," said Montu Mondal, a local resident. He added that other homes in the vicinity also reported damage to electrical equipment. The local Panchayat and Block Development Office have been informed about the incident. Authorities are assessing the extent of the damage and the condition of the injured family. Residents of Hatpukur remain alarmed as unseasonal thunderstorms continue to strike the region, raising concerns over the safety of homes and lives during extreme weather events.

Murder disguised as Kidnap: Wife and lover nabbed

MI News Service, South 24 Pgs: In a shocking revelation, a woman who had reported her husband missing has now been arrested along with her lover for his murder. The incident took place in the Usti area of South 24 Parganas, where the remains of the victim were recovered nearly two months after he was declared missing.

The deceased, identified as Mohsin Halder, had been missing since May. His wife, Tanuja Bibi, had approached the Usti police station to file a complaint, alleging that her husband had been kidnapped. How-

ever, during the course of the investigation, police noted inconsistencies in her statements and a gradual lack of cooperation. As the probe deepened, police questioned Mohsin's son, whose statement led to a major breakthrough. Based on the information provided, investigators uncovered a chilling murder conspiracy involving Tanuja Bibi and her lover, Habibullah Khan. The two had allegedly killed Mohsin Halder and disposed of his body in a forested area near Shibpur School, within the Hariharpur Gram Panchayat. On Monday, police

recovered skeletal remains from the suspected site, confirming it to be the body of Mohsin Halder. Following this discovery, both Tanuja Bibi and Habibullah Khan were arrested and produced before the court. They are currently in police custody as further investigation continues. The case has sent shockwaves across the region, highlighting a disturbing act of betrayal and a calculated attempt to mislead law enforcement. Police sources confirmed that the investigation is ongoing to uncover any additional involvement or evidence.

Home of horror: Blood, break-in and unanswered questions

MI News Service, Siliguri: A chilling mystery has emerged from a housing complex in the Dabgram area of Siliguri, where blood was found splattered across staircases, corridors, and even vacant land surrounding the premises. The unsettling scene has left both residents and police baffled. The incident came to light after an injured man, Rupak Sarkar, was rescued from his flat. While his injuries were reportedly minor—limited to his hand and parts of his body—the sheer volume of blood found across the complex has raised serious questions.

Police sources confirmed that blood stains were discovered from Rupak's third-floor apartment down to the ground floor, including the

area behind the building. The situation became even more suspicious when local residents alerted police to signs of ransacking inside the apartment. Cupboards and furniture were found broken—except one cupboard, which remained locked and had visible blood stains on its handle. Authorities have refrained from opening it until forensic experts arrive. Senior officers from Siliguri Police Station and the Siliguri Metropolitan Police reached the spot and cordoned off the area. The flat has since been sealed, and a forensic team is expected to examine the scene in detail. Rupak Sarkar, a temporary employee of the Siliguri Municipal Corporation, lives with his ailing father. His personal life has also come under scrutiny—

he is currently entangled in an alimony dispute with his estranged wife, who resides with their children at her paternal home. Additionally, sources claim that Rupak had expressed a desire to marry his sister-in-law, a matter that created friction among acquaintances. Local residents have also reported frequent arguments between Rupak and a local e-rickshaw driver, allegedly over financial matters. Police are currently treating Rupak at a hospital under custody to better understand the circumstances surrounding the incident. His father has been admitted to the Railway Hospital due to illness. The Siliguri Metropolitan Police has stated that a full investigation will commence once forensic analysis is complete.

Radha Raman Das described it as a milestone moment. The institution was established on December 1, 2024, with just 15 students. stone reflects the organization's commitment to excellence, hands-on learning, and preparing individuals for the future. The institution is affiliated with several national organizations, including: ASDC (Automotive Skill Development Council), NSDC (National Skill Development Corporation), ISO (International Organization for Standardization), and MSME (Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises). It also offers training in advanced technologies such as Civil CADD software and AutoCAD Civil 3D.

24-year old arrested for raping elderly woman

MI News Service, Bakura: A shocking and deeply disturbing incident has rocked the Chhatna area of Bankura district, where a 57-year-old woman was allegedly raped by a 24-year-old neighbor while she was out herding goats. The horrific assault reportedly occurred on Saturday afternoon when the woman, a resident of a nearby village, had gone to graze her goats in an open field. According to local sources, the accused youth lured her to the edge of the field and forcibly raped her. The victim, severely traumatised and physically unwell, was rescued and rushed by her family to Chhatna Super Specialty Hospital.



As her condition worsened, she was later transferred to Bankura Sammilani Medical College and Hospital for advanced treatment. The incident came to light when the family filed a formal complaint at the Chhatna police station on Monday night. Police acted swiftly and arrested the accused youth from the same village. A case has been registered against him under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code. Sources confirm that during initial interrogation, the accused admitted to the crime. As news of the incident spread, a wave of outrage and shock swept through the local community. Many expressed anger over the growing number of crimes against women, demanding strict action and swift justice. The accused was produced before the Bankura District Court on Tuesday. Meanwhile, police have launched a detailed investigation into the circumstances of the crime and are continuing to record statements from witnesses and residents. This heinous act has once again raised serious concerns about the safety of women, even in rural areas where they should feel most secure.

ECL road accident claims life of school going girl



MI News Service, Asansol: A tragic road accident in Asansol on Monday morning claimed the life of a Class 11 student, Nandini Gupta, after a collision with a vehicle allegedly belonging to Eastern Coalfields Limited (ECL).

The incident occurred at the Ranisayer intersection on ISCO Road, under the Kulti area of Asansol. Nandini Gupta, a resident of Radhanagar, was on her way to school on a motorbike with her uncle when the accident took place. According to local sources, the ECL vehicle—reportedly transporting explosives—collided with the two-wheeler, leaving the girl critically injured. She was immediately rushed to Asansol District Hospital, where doctors declared her brought dead. Following the autopsy, the victim's grieving family and local residents staged a protest by placing her body at the Bejdi colliery of ECL. They demanded compensation and accountability for the incident. The protest drew the presence of local leaders, including Ward No. 102 Councillor Sourav Majhi of the Asansol Municipal Corporation. Speaking to the media, Majhi said, "This morning, Nandini was heading to school with her uncle when an ECL van hit her. Despite efforts to save her, she couldn't survive. Her father passed away a few years ago, and she had since been living with her uncle, who enrolled her in school. This tragedy struck as she was trying to continue her education." Authorities are investigating the circumstances surrounding the accident, and no official statement has yet been released by ECL regarding the incident.

TMC leader's alleged killers caught with firearms

MI News Service, Murshidabad: In a major breakthrough, police in Murshidabad arrested three individuals suspected to be contract killers involved in the murder of a local Trinamool Congress leader. The arrests were made late Monday night during a routine vehicle check near the Balaichandighat area under Nawada police station. Acting on a tip-off, officers from Nawada police station intercepted a suspicious motorcycle and detained the three riders for questioning. Upon searching them, police recovered a significant cache of firearms, including two 7mm pistols, three single-shot firearms, and 13 rounds of live ammunition.

The arrested have been identified as Akhtar Sheikh, Samirul Sheikh, and Rabiul Sheikh — all residents of the Tungri area under Nawada police station limits. According to police sources, Rabiul Sheikh is also accused of a previous violent assault on a local pro-

moter and Trinamool leader that took place inside a panchayat office. Preliminary investigations reveal that the trio has a criminal background and is suspected to have worked as "supari" or contract killers. They are believed to be involved in multiple murder cases, including two high-profile killings in 2021 and 2023. Police further allege that they extorted money through intimidation and violence and were responsible for the targeted killing of a Trinamool leader in the area. A formal case has been registered against them under multiple sections of the Indian Penal Code and the Arms Act. All three have been taken into custody and were produced before the court on Tuesday. The arrests have sparked renewed concern in the district over rising contract killings and political violence. Police have intensified efforts to trace the source of the weapons and uncover the broader network linked to these suspects.

Theft in the temple after CCTV turned off, Temple Maharaj detained

MI News Service, Kaliganj: A sensational theft has rocked Debggram in Kaliganj, where valuable ornaments and cash worth Rs. 6 to 7 lakh were stolen from a temple after its CCTV cameras were allegedly turned off. Shockingly, the finger of accusation points towards the temple's own Maharaj.

The incident occurred at the Debggram Ram-

krishna Sarada Ashram temple around midnight on Monday. According to reports, gold and silver ornaments along with cash have gone missing. The temple authorities were stunned on Tuesday morning when they discovered that all the ornaments of the deity had vanished.

Interestingly, there were no signs of forced

entry. The locks of the temple were found to be intact, further deepening the mystery.

Sources reveal that the temple keys were in the possession of the Maharaj, identified as Adi Natha Nanda. On the night of the incident, a couple had reportedly visited him at the temple. Furthermore, it's alleged that the temple's CCTV system was deliber-

ately switched off during the time of the theft.

The temple authorities suspect that the Maharaj and the couple are directly involved in the incident. Acting on the complaint, the police have already detained the accused trio for questioning.

As the investigation progresses, all eyes are now on how the case unfolds in the coming days.

Housemaid held for theft in Kalyani, police recovers gold ornaments

MI News Service, Kalyani: The incidents of burglary has been increasing in Kalyan nowadays.

An elderly couple had gone out for medical treatment and after returning home, they discover that their gold ornaments and cash had been stolen. The incident took place at B-2 area in Nadia's Kalyani on Monday. Based on a complaint, police began an investigation and soon suspected the domestic help. On interrogation, she confessed to the crime, and the stolen items were recovered, police said.

The theft occurred on Monday night at the residence of 70-year-old Himanka Sekhar Pradhan, a resident of B-2/80 in Kalyani. Taking advantage of the couple's absence, the maid allegedly theft the gold jewellery and cash.

Following a formal complaint lodged at Kalyani Police Station, police launched a probe. Subsequently police suspected the maid. During interrogation, she confessed her crime. Police



recovered Rs.8 thousand cash along with the entire stolen jewellery, which included 6 gold chains, 6 gold bangles,

4 gold rings, 5 gold earrings and some imitation jewellery, Siddharth Dhapola, the Additional SP (HQ), Ranaghat police district, said.

The accused was arrested. Police said that the investigation was still underway.

Interestingly, just two

days earlier, another case of jewellery theft was reported from the same B-block in Kalyani. In that case, a nail artist was arrested for allegedly stealing a gold necklace while providing professional service at a flat.

According to police, Shubhankar Mondal, a resident of B-2/339 (LIG Flats) under Kalyani PS, filed a complaint on July 31. He reported that a gold necklace went missing from his

home a day after a nail artist had visited.

Acting on the complaint, police began an investigation and detained the accused a 23-year-old nail artist Isha Adhikari. Upon questioning, she confessed to stealing the necklace, which was later recovered.

Shubhankar Mondal stated, "My wife Trisha had booked Isha for a nail extension session. She was in our home for over two hours and left around 2:30 pm.

The next day, before leaving for a wedding ceremony, we noticed the necklace was missing. We immediately suspected Isha, as very few outsiders come to our flat and she was the only visitor recently. During the session, my wife had gone to other rooms and even to the washroom. Suspected that during that period the nail artist took away with the necklace.

Initiating investigation Kalyani police pin pointed her and recovered the stolen necklace from a Jeweller shop in Kalyani.

Live wire in rainwater kills porter in Howrah

MI News Service, Howrah: A man died by electrocution on Monday morning while helping shift furniture from a waterlogged residential flat in Howrah. The incident occurred at Kartik Ganesh Apartment on Ramcharan Seth Road, under Chatterjeehat Police Station.

Swapan Kumar Roy, a resident of the building, had hired porters to move belongings, including a cupboard, to Khanakul in Hooghly district. During heavy rainfall, while unloading the cupboard, a snapped electric wire reportedly came into contact with accumulated water. Vijay Das, one of the porters, was electrocuted on the spot while standing in the water. He collapsed immediately and was declared dead at the scene. Police reached the location and sent the body for a post-mortem examination. CESC personnel disconnected the building's power supply to ensure safety and assist in the investigation. The tragedy has caused panic among local residents, highlighting the risks of exposed electrical infrastructure during waterlogging. This incident adds to a series of recent monsoon-related tragedies in West Bengal. On Sunday, two individuals—Ramu Soren (51) and Bharati Hembram (40)—died after being struck by lightning in Shalban, West Midnapore. They were returning from agricultural work. In another case in Kaliachak, Malda, two people were electrocuted while bathing in a pond electrified by a water pump. Authorities have urged the public to remain cautious during the monsoon, especially in areas with flooding or exposed electrical setups. Investigations into all cases are underway.

Fake sadhus snatch mangalsutra, nabbed at police checkpoint

MI News Service, Asansol: In a dramatic turn of events, four men posing as holy men were arrested by Kulti police on Monday after allegedly snatching a gold mangalsutra from a woman near the Kalyaneshwari temple area. The accused, hailing from Uttarakhand and Haryana, were apprehended during a naka checking operation in the Melakola area. The incident occurred when Krishna Bauri, a resident of Jharkhand, visited the historic Kalyaneshwari temple on National Highway 19 with his wife. After offering prayers, the couple was on their way home when they were approached by four men dressed as sadhus near the Damagaria railway bridge.

According to police sources, the so-called sadhus engaged the couple in conversation under the pretext of offering blessings. During this interaction, they allegedly snatched the gold mangalsutra worn by Krishna's wife and fled the scene in a four-wheeler, speeding in the direction of Kolkata. The shocked couple immediately filed a complaint at the Chowranghi outpost under the Kulti police station. Acting swiftly, the police launched an investigation and began tracking the vehicle's movements. Based on intelligence inputs, the same vehicle was spotted returning towards Kulti from Kolkata. Anticipating their route, officers at the Chowranghi outpost set up a naka checking point near Melakola. The four suspects were intercepted and taken into custody. Upon interrogation, it was confirmed that they were residents of Uttarakhand and Haryana. The stolen mangalsutra was recovered, and further investigation is underway. The accused were produced before the Asansol court on Tuesday. Police suspect the group may be involved in similar crimes across state borders and are currently probing their criminal background. This incident has raised fresh concerns about criminals disguising themselves as spiritual figures to deceive unsuspecting devotees near temples and religious sites. Police have urged the public to remain cautious and report any suspicious activities immediately.

native place in Jharkhand's Ramgarh district, around 70 km from the state's capital Ranchi, the officials said. Soren, Jharkhand Mukti Morcha co-founder, who was undergoing treatment at the Sri Ganga Ram Hospital in Delhi for over a month for kidney-related problems, died at the age of 81.
Senior administrative officials, including Ramgarh deputy commissioner and the SP, were at Nemra since early morning on Tuesday to oversee the preparations for the last rite and take stock of the whole arrangements.
Special traffic arrangements have been made for the funeral as several political leaders, including Rahul Gandhi, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and others have arrived in Ranchi to participate in the final journey of Sibhu Soren. Mean-while, a pall of gloom has descended on Nemra village after Guruji's demise.
Before his last rites, his body was kept at the Jharkhand Assembly premises for people to pay their last respects at about 9 am. His demise marks the end of a defining political era, one that brought the tribal movement from the grassroots of Jharkhand to the forefront of national politics.
Shibu Soren had been the leader of the JMM for the past 38 years.
As a mark of respect, the Jharkhand government declared a three-day state mourning till August 6. All schools, colleges and other educational institutions in Jharkhand are closed on Tuesday, with many ensuring special prayers for peace to the departed soul.
Rajya Sabha proceedings were also adjourned for the day on Monday as a mark of respect, following the death of sitting MP Shibu Soren.
The ongoing monsoon session of the Jharkhand Assembly, which began on August 1, was adjourned sine die following the announcement of his death.
Speaker Rabindra Nath Mahato said Soren's passing was an irreparable loss not only to Jharkhand but to the entire nation.
"He was known for his fight for the poor," Mahato had said, expressing grief on behalf of the House.
Earlier in the day Shibu Soren's mortal remains were flown to Ranchi in a special aircraft from Delhi.
Chief Minister Hemant Soren, his legislator wife Kalpana Soren, and MLA brother Basant Soren also returned to Jharkhand in the same flight.
A flower-decked open carriage carried the mortal remains from the airport to Soren's Morabadi residence in Ranchi, with the Chief minister and his legislator brother seated beside his father's body throughout the procession.

Mamata launches flood relief push, blames Centre for delay in Ghatal master plan
Announce grant for RamaKrishna Mission in Kamarpukur

MI News Service, Kolkata: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, during her recent tour of flood-affected regions in Hooghly and PaschimMedinipur, intensified her criticism of the central government over the long-pending Ghatal Master Plan, even as she continued to personally oversee relief efforts across the region.
While visiting Kamarpukur in Hooghly — the birthplace of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahansa — the Chief Minister inaugurated a newly built guest house and parking lot at the Ramakrishna Math and Mission, and announced a substantial grant of 100 crore for the site's further development. Speaking at the spiritual centre, she paid rich tribute to the legacy of Sri Ramakrishna, Sarada Devi, and Swami Vivekananda. "There is no need to go elsewhere to understand Hinduism. This very soil — Kamarpukur — is the karmabhoomi of Sri Ramakrishna, Sri Ma Sarada Devi, and Swami Vivekananda," she stated. She further emphasized, "Let us not forget, the language they spoke was Bengali."
Earlier in the day, she visited a relief camp near Khanakul, where she served khichdi and other food

items to flood victims. She listened to their concerns firsthand and assured swift government action for their rehabilitation.
Following her Kamarpukur visit, Banerjee travelled to Ghatal, which has remained waterlogged for over a month. Standing beside actor-turned-MP Dev, she held the central government responsible for stalling the Ghatal Master Plan, which she said had remained pending at the Centre for years. "We have gone ahead and prepared a 1,500 crore master plan ourselves," she declared. "The state government is funding the project alone. Work will begin after the monsoon ends. Remember, this year the rains started early, and the entire month of September is now part of the monsoon season." She added that excessive water released by DVC, Maithon, and Panchet dams — reportedly 11 times more than usual — has worsened the flooding. The Chief Minister reiterated her long-standing accusation of "man-made floods" due to mismanagement of water release and poor drainage infrastructure. To ensure close monitoring of the Ghatal project, Banerjee announced the formation of a dedicated monitoring committee, including the Irrigation

Minister and local MPs and MLAs.
She further revealed that 25 km of riverbeds will undergo dredging, and pumping systems worth 7 crore will be installed. "DVC has released water beyond all previous records. How much more can Bengal endure?" she asked pointedly. She also stated that from 2026, new plans will be implemented to manage DVC's water releases more effectively.
On the issue of farmers' losses, Banerjee highlighted the state's Crop Insurance Scheme, under which compensation will be given to those whose lands are submerged. "The survey will begin as soon as the water recedes. The cost of the insurance is currently borne entirely by the state government," she added.
The Chief Minister also accused the Centre of halting funds for riverbank erosion prevention, a responsibility now left entirely to the state. "They used to fund such critical work, but now everything is on our shoulders," she said Her multi-stop visit underscored not just administrative urgency but also political sharpness — combining on-ground relief, cultural reaffirmation, and direct criticism of the central authorities for long-standing infrastructural neglect.

State Chief Secy issues key orders on 'Amader Para' Drive

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a bid to enhance grassroots governance and ensure direct public participation in developmental activities, the West Bengal Government has intensified its focus on the flagship initiative titled "Amader Para, Amader Samadhan" (Our Locality, Our Solution). The State Secretariat, Nabanna, has issued fresh directives to all District Magistrates, urging them to amplify awareness and outreach of the programme at the block level. Chief Secretary Manoj Pant, in a review meeting, remarked, "We have received encouraging responses over the past two days from citizens attending these camps. However, there remains an urgent need to scale up publicity efforts at the block level to

foster broader public engagement." As per sources, the steps need to be taken are: Publicity must be increased so that people are well informed about when and where the camps are being held in their respective areas. Senior officials in charge must remain present at the camps throughout their duration and camps must be set up in easily accessible locations. Notably, the state-wide initiative "Amader Para, Amader Samadhan" (Our Neighbourhood, Our Solution) commenced on Saturday with 632 camps. The state government has allocated ₹10 lakh for each booth. Citizens can access benefits from 37 welfare schemes at these camps, including LakshmiBhandar and old-age pension schemes. The state govern-

ment has also left the door open for expanding the initiative structurally. If deemed necessary, the number of camps organised under this programme is expected to increase. According to sources, the Chief Secretary has categorically instructed district administrations to take proactive steps to inform residents about the schedule, venue, and services available at these camps. "Amader Para, Amader Samadhan" is an ambitious community-centric project launched by the Government of West Bengal with the aim of addressing civic and infrastructural issues directly within local neighbourhoods. Through dedicated outreach camps, citizens can lodge grievances, seek solutions to

Kalyan Banerjee resigns as TMC Chief Whip, Kakoli Ghosh Dastidar named successor

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a significant internal shake-up within the Trinamool Congress (TMC) parliamentary structure, senior MP Kalyan Banerjee has resigned from his position as the Chief Whip in the Lok Sabha. The move came shortly after a virtual meeting convened on Monday by TMC supremo and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee with the party's Members of Parliament. The resignation has since been officially accepted by the party. The All India Trinamool Congress announced via its official X (formerly Twitter) handle that Kakoli Ghosh Dastidar has been appointed the new Chief Whip in the Lok Sabha. Simultaneously, veteran MP Shatabdi Roy has been el-



evated as the Deputy Leader of the TMC in the lower house. Interestingly, Kalyan Banerjee had claimed just a day earlier that Abhishek Banerjee—recently named as the Leader of the TMC in the Lok Sabha—had requested him to continue in his post for a while longer and that a meeting between the two was scheduled for August 7. However, the latest developments indicate that

the party has decided to proceed with a leadership overhaul regardless of that timeline.
Following the virtual meeting, Kalyan Banerjee publicly expressed dissatisfaction with the state of internal coordination within the party's parliamentary wing. He claimed that Mamata Banerjee had remarked on the lack of cohesion among the MPs, implicitly directing blame toward him. In his statement to a Bengali media outlet, the veteran MP from Srirampur voiced frustration, stating, "My worth has diminished. I am not a millionaire's son, nor have I studied at Cambridge or Oxford."
He further alleged that several MPs—naming constituencies such as South

Mithun Chakraborty moves Cal HC seeking dismissal of cheating allegations

MI News Service, Kolkata: Veteran actor and Member of Parliament Mithun Chakraborty has approached the Calcutta High Court, seeking the quashing of a cheating case filed against him by his former personal secretary and the secretary's wife. Legal proceedings have already been initiated, and according to court sources, a preliminary hearing in the matter is likely to take place later this week.

At the core of the complaint are allegations of financial breach and betrayal of trust. SumanRaychowdhury, Mithun Chakraborty's former secretary, and his wife lodged an FIR at Chitpur Police Station in North Kolkata. According to their complaint, Suman had been entrusted with overseeing the interior decoration of a hotel construction project, allegedly backed by Mithun. While some payment was made during the initial phase, they claim that further work was assigned to them without any written agreement.

To execute the additional responsibilities, Suman reportedly mortgaged his wife's jewellery to raise the necessary funds. Though the work was completed, the couple alleges they were not compensated for the extended portion, and that the outstanding amount of 35 lakh remains unpaid. Furthermore, they have claimed that when they attempted to follow up on the matter, they were subjected to verbal abuse and mistreatment.

In a further escalation, Suman's wife appeared before a magistrate at the Sealdah Court earlier this week to provide a confidential statement supporting their allegations.

Mithun Chakraborty has strongly refuted the claims, dismissing them as unfounded and defamatory. His legal team, comprised of senior and experienced lawyers, has filed a petition in the Calcutta High Court to have the case dismissed entirely.

In addition to Mithun, the complaint also names Biman Sarkar, a legal professional and a close associate of the actor. The complainants allege that Sarkar played a direct and active role in the financial irregularities in question.

As the matter moves to the courtroom, legal and public scrutiny is expected to intensify. Mithun's legal team remains confident of securing relief, while the complainants maintain that their grievance is genuine and deserving of legal redress.

Hospital staffer arrested for molesting patient post-surgery

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a deeply disturbing incident that has sent shockwaves across the city, a female patient was allegedly molested by a hospital staff member shortly after undergoing surgery at a private hospital in Kolkata's Ekbalpur area. Acting swiftly on the complaint, the police have arrested the accused employee, identified as Abdul Subhan. According to police and family sources, the incident occurred on Sunday. The woman had been admitted to the private hospital for a scheduled surgical procedure. Following the operation, she remained unconscious inside the operation theatre before being moved to another ward for post-operative care. Abdul Subhan, a hospital staffer, was reportedly tasked with relocating the patient from the operating room. It was during this vulnerable moment—when the patient was still semi-conscious—that the alleged molestation took place.

Abhishek Banerjee expresses gratitude after being appointed TMC Leader in LS

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a landmark decision that signals a generational shift within the Trinamool Congress (TMC), party supremo Mamata Banerjee on Monday appointed Abhishek Banerjee as the new leader of the party in the Lok Sabha. The move comes as veteran parliamentarian SudipBandyopadhyay stepped down from the role, citing prolonged health issues.

Abhishek, the Member of Parliament from Diamond Harbour and TMC's National General Secretary, will now spearhead the party's strategy and voice in the lower house of Parliament. His appointment is being viewed as a strategic effort to strengthen the party's position in national politics and bring renewed energy to its parliamentary presence. Soon after the announcement, Abhishek took to social media late Monday night to express his gratitude and sense of responsibility. "Didi has placed her trust in me. This faith and responsibility are a matter of pride and honour," he wrote. He further noted that the position is not just a title, but

a part of a broader ideological struggle. "Our mission is clear—to uphold the Indian Constitution and counter the anti-people policies of the central government. We are committed to justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity—the core principles of our Republic," his post read.

Sources within the party revealed that Mamata Banerjee, during a meeting with party MPs earlier in the day, voiced her dissatisfaction with the TMC's performance in the Lok Sabha. She observed that while the Rajya Sabha delegation has maintained an organised presence, the same could not be said of the lower house. Abhishek's appointment is therefore seen as an effort to reinvigorate the party's parliamentary focus and sharpen its opposition role.

Political analysts suggest that this move further consolidates Abhishek's growing influence within the party and indicates a long-term strategy to groom new leadership. It is also expected to give the TMC a more assertive voice on the national stage in the coming sessions of Parliament.

Cal HC grants conditional bail to inspector, home guard in post-poll violence case

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a significant development in the post-poll violence cases that rocked parts of West Bengal, the Calcutta High Court on Tuesday granted conditional bail to Inspector Ratna Sarkar and a home guard, both of whom were arrested in connection with one such incident. The order was passed by Justice Joy Sengupta. Following the state assembly elections, several regions across West Bengal witnessed a surge in political violence. In one of the FIRs related to those events, Inspector Ratna Sarkar and

the home guard were accused of instigating violence and gross dereliction of administrative duty. During the course of the investigation, both were questioned and subsequently taken into custody by the police.
Seeking relief, the accused approached the High Court for bail. On Tuesday, the court granted conditional bail, laying down strict guidelines to ensure the integrity of the ongoing investigation. As per the court's directive, both accused must fully cooperate with the probe and be present on all scheduled court dates.

"Tragic accident": MP CM Mohan Yadav takes note of Kubereshwar Dham incident

MI News Service, Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has taken cognisance of a stampede-like rush at Kubereshwar Dham in Madhya Pradesh's Sehore on Tuesday, which resulted in the deaths of two women and injuries to several others.

The Chief Minister has expressed sadness over the tragic accident and directed officials to ensure that such incidents do not recur in the future. CM Mohan Yadav has asked officials to take note of the incident and initiate necessary measures.

The Chief Minister has emphasised the need for better arrangements to prevent similar incidents in the future.

"I have received information. I have asked the officials to take note of it. It is

It was announced that the Kavayatra will take place in Kubereshwar Dham on August 6. Before this, a large crowd of devotees had already arrived at Kubereshwar Dham. While providing details, the officials stated that the incident took place around 12 pm when a large number of devotees had gathered to join the Kanwar Yatra. The eyewitnesses stated that a clash broke out between two groups of the devotees, which led to the stampede-like situation. They further informed that two people died and three others got injured due to the rush.

Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Sunita Rawat confirmed the death of two people, adding that efforts were being made to identify them. She further stated that all the injured have been admitted to a local hospital where they are receiving treatment.

The injured individuals were transferred to a hospital for appropriate medical care. Sehore Additional SP Sunita Rawat confirmed on a phone call with ANI about the tragic incident.

This is not the first time a stampede has occurred at Kubereshwar Dham. A similar incident happened in February 2023 during the Shri Mahapurana Katha and Rudraksh Mahotsav, raising concerns about crowd management and the preparedness of local authorities.

Both Centre and state have a share in Bengaluru metro project: DK Shivakumar

MI News Service, Bengaluru: Stating that both the state and the Centre hold shares in the metro project, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Tuesday said that serving the people was more important than 'credit' politics.

Speaking to reporters after inspecting the soon-to-be-launched Yellow line of Namma metro, the Deputy CM, who also holds the Bengaluru city portfolio, said, "This is our metro. The CM and I had requested the PM to inaugurate the Yellow line, and he has now given the time. This is not a project of the Central government alone; the state too has a 50% share in the project. We are all serving the public."

He was replying to a question about whether the inauguration of the Yellow line was decided by the Centre or the State.

"The PM will inaugurate the Yellow line on August 10. The 19.15 km line with 16 stations was built at Rs 7,610 crore. A small programme will be organised at the auditorium in the Indian Institute of Management, Bengaluru. The PM, CM and the local legislators would travel in the inaugural trip of the train

thereafter. We will submit an appeal to the PM on funds needed for the double-decker project's land acquisition," he said.

Asked about extension of metro network and building more double-decker metro lines, DK Shivakumar said, "It would be nice if the MPs who are making a lot of noise get us some funds. The MPs don't speak a word on the funds, but are engaged in nitpicking. We have decided to build double-decker metro lines for all lines in the future."

"The Commissionerate of Railway Safety gave the clearance for the Yellow line on July 31. We can't rush through things like safety. Tejaswi Surya is young blood in a hurry and doesn't have any experience," he said.

"Three train sets have arrived for the Yellow line, and the fourth set will come in August. Three trains will operate now at an interval of 25 minutes. The frequency would be increased to 10 minutes once more train sets arrive. This is a crucial line to link the IT hubs to the city," he informed.

Replying to a question on the inauguration of Hebbal flyover's new loop, the Deputy CM said, "We will throw it open to the public before

August 15 after considering the CM's availability. The KR-Puram-City loop will be opened now, and the Airport service road-City loop will be opened a little later. We are planning a new tunnel from Nagawara to Esteem Mall to the agricultural university. This would be a 1.5 km tunnel, and it is different from the larger tunnel road being planned."

Asked about growing passengers but very few train sets, he said, "Train sets have not arrived due to certain reasons. They had imported train sets from China, but there are some issues. Train sets have to come from many other domestic facilities. Frequency will be increased once more train sets arrive."

"I would like to congratulate on behalf of the state government everyone, including officials, contractors, labourers, who worked on the Yellow line," DK Shivakumar said.

Asked about burgeoning traffic in Bengaluru, he said, "People from all around the country are migrating to Bengaluru. Good weather, Cauvery water, and educational institutions are attracting people. We have also instructed BMRCL to acquire 3-4 acres of land for parking."

20,000 yaba tablets, 216g heroin seized

MI News Service, Cachar: Police recovered and seized 20,000 Yaba tablets and 216 grams of heroin in Assam's Cachar district, officials said on Tuesday. Five people have been arrested in connection with the case.

Cachar Superintendent of Police Numal Mahatta said that, acting on credible intelligence, the district police launched two special operations on Monday evening to intercept the illegal transportation of narcotic substances. The operations were carried out at Sonabarighat under Silchar police station and Hmarkhawlen under Lakhimpur police station.

"During the operations, police recovered 18 soap cases containing heroin weighing about 216 grams and 20000 Yaba tablets respectively. During the operations, two vehicles used in the illegal transportation of

narcotic substances were seized. In this connection, five persons have been arrested," SP Mahatta said.

The arrested persons were identified as Ayesha Begum Chaudhary, Muslima Begum Mazumder, Jalal Ahmed Chaudhary, Rabjuli Ali Chaudhary and Lalpu Singit.

"The price of the seized article is worth about Rs 7 crore in the black market. Both the vehicles and the narcotic substances have been seized in the presence of independent witnesses. During the examination, the drug detection kit showed positive results for heroin and methamphetamine. Further investigation into both cases has been on," Numal Mahatta said.

Earlier on July 21, Assam Police recovered and seized three gold biscuits weighing about 439 grams and apprehended a person in Cachar district, officials

said.

Numal Mahatta, Senior Superintendent of Police of Cachar district, said that, based on reliable information regarding the smuggling of suspected gold biscuits, on Sunday (July 20), an operation was conducted near Ramnagar bypass under the jurisdiction of Silchar Police Station.

"During the operation, the police team recovered 3 gold biscuits weighing about 439 grams. The gold biscuits were recovered from the possession of one person, namely Khamneu Munluah (32 years old) of Lamka area in Churachandpur district of Manipur. The same were seized in the presence of independent witnesses at the spot. The gold biscuits were transported from Manipur and were supposed to be delivered somewhere near ISBT, Silchar," Numal Mahatta said.

RSS to invite Opposition parties for 'Samvad' on completion of 100 years

Khatana accused regional parties of Jammu and Kashmir of lying and deceiving the people, adding that the BJP's policies have been more beneficial for the region.

"The regional parties of Jammu and Kashmir lied and frauded the people of the state. After the abrogation (of Article 370) under the leadership of PM Modi, people are moving towards joy, and the youth there are willing to participate in the startup trend of India..." Khatana told ANI.

August 5 marks six years since the abrogation of Article 370, which rendered the state of its statehood, and converted the former state into two Union Territories- Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh.

In August 2019, the Central government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, re-

pealed Article 370 of the Indian Constitution, effectively ending the special status given to Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcating the state into two Union Territories - Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh.

Trump unwilling to criticize China even after being largest Russian oil buyers, targets India unfairly: GTRI report

New Delhi : US President Donald Trump has been unfairly targeting India over Russian oil imports, while choosing not to criticize China, according to a recent report by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI).

The report suggested that this selective approach may be driven by geopolitical calculations.

As per the data from the report, China is the largest buyer of Russian oil. In 2024, China imported USD 62.6 billion worth of Russian oil, compared to India's USD 52.7 billion. Despite this, Trump has focused his criticism on India, ignoring China's bigger role.

GTRI stated, "Trump appears unwilling to criticize China, perhaps because of geopolitical calculations, and instead targets India unfairly".

The report also rejects Trump's recent claim posted on Truth Social, where he alleged that India is "buying massive amounts of Russian oil and selling it on the open market for big profits." GTRI clarified that this statement is factually incorrect and misleading.

The think tank explained that India does not export crude oil, Russian or otherwise.

India is a net importer of crude oil, and its total crude oil exports stand at zero. What India does export are refined petroleum products, including diesel and jet fuel, some of which are processed from Russian crude. This is standard practice among energy-importing countries, the report said.

GTRI further stated that India's oil refineries, both public and private, operate independently in deciding where to source crude oil from.

These companies do not need government permission to buy oil from Russia or any other country. Their decisions are based on commercial considerations, including price, supply reliability, and rules in export destinations.

The report noted that if Indian refiners find that importing Russian crude involves risks, such as secondary sanctions or restricted access to global markets, they may reduce or stop such imports voluntarily. For example, India exported diesel and aviation turbine fuel (ATF) to the European Union in FY2025, but these exports will now stop due to the EU's ban on products refined from Russian crude. In such cases, refiners will shift away from Russian oil without needing a government order.

Adoption of EV in India slower than leading countries like US, EU, China: NITI Aayog report

New Delhi : Electric Vehicles made up only 7.6 per cent of total vehicle sales in 2024, well short of the 30 per cent goal in 2030. While India has made notable progress in electric two- and three-wheelers, the adoption of electric buses, cars, and especially long-haul trucks remains sluggish, according to the NITI Aayog report titled "Electric Vehicles in India: Unlocking a USD 200 Billion Opportunity," outlining an ambitious roadmap to boost EV adoption in the country.

With a target of 30 per cent EV sales by 2030, the report identifies key challenges and proposes bold mandates, strategic investments, and regulatory reforms to accelerate the transition.

According to the report, India's EV sales grew from just 50,000 in 2016 to over 2.08 million in 2024, as against global EV sales having risen from 918,000 in 2016 to 18.78 million in 2024.

"Adoption of EV has been increasing in India but has been slower than the pace in some of the leading countries like the US, EU, and China," the report read.

"India is doing well with electric two-wheelers and electric-three wheelers. With regard to electric buses, it has made some progress but with electric cars it has been slow. Long haul electric trucks have virtually not taken off," it added.

India has progressed to only about 7.6 per cent of the sales in 2024 being electric,



which is far behind its target of 30 per cent by 2030.

The report noted that India has taken nearly 10 years to reach a penetration level of 7.6 per cent and now needs to increase this share by over 22 per cent in the next 5 years alone.

The report outlines multiple policy shifts and calls for a transition from incentives to mandates for Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) adoption.

Focused electrification of urban fleets -- buses, para-transit, and freight vehicles -- in 5 cities to create a demonstrable impact.

Establishment of a pooled fund with multilateral support to reduce capital cost barriers for e-buses and e-trucks.

Development of a robust charging infrastructure along 20 high-density freight corridors.

A nationwide unified EV charging app for ease of access and payment.

NITI Aayog proposes a progressive plan that includes disincentives for internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles, tighter Corporate Average Fuel Efficiency (CAFE) norms, and regulatory support for battery leasing and EV power lines (EVPL).

A special focus is placed on enabling small operators, who form the majority of bus and truck owners in India, through priority sector lending and risk-mitigation mechanisms.

The report notes India's vehicular land-

scape is dominated by two-wheelers (75 per cent) and small fleet owners, unlike the West, where private cars are the norm. The need for shorter travel distances and lower-cost mobility solutions makes India's EV trajectory distinct, warranting a saturation-based approach rather than nationwide distribution. While India fares reasonably in charger availability (1 charger for 14 electric cars), utilisation remains low due to poor location planning, land access issues, and lack of consumer awareness.

The report recommends setting up a nodal agency in each state, akin to Singapore's Eve, to streamline charging infrastructure rollouts.

The report emphasised immediate action plan to kickstart momentum. NITI Aayog has recommended that there should be a national EV transition policy with clear timelines. Stricter regulations to mandate EV adoption across public fleets and the electrification of 100 per cent urban transport in 5 pilot cities.

There is also a need to operationalise a blended finance fund for affordable EV loans and form an inter-ministerial task force to resolve regulatory bottlenecks.

With an estimated USD 200 billion opportunity at stake, the report positions India not just as a consumer of green technology but as a global leader in electric mobility manufacturing, innovation, and sustainability.

US condemns Brazil's court order for house arrest of former President Jair Bolsonaro



MI News Service, Washington: The US State Department has strongly condemned the Brazilian Supreme Court's decision to place former President Jair Bolsonaro under house arrest, who is facing trial for allegedly plotting to overturn the 2022 presidential election results, CNN reported.

According to Justice Alexandre de Moraes, Bolsonaro violated the court's restrictions by using social media to spread messages, including recordings where his ankle monitor was visible. The court decision comes at a time of tense relations between Washington and Brasilia, with the case against right-wing populist Bolsonaro being seized on by US President Donald Trump as a threat in trade negotiations, as per CNN. On Monday, the US State Department's Bureau of Western Hemisphere Affairs criticised Justice Moraes, saying he uses "Brazil's institutions to silence opposition and threaten democracy." "Putting even more restrictions on Jair Bolsonaro's ability to defend himself in public is not a public service. Let Bolsonaro speak!" the post stated. "The United States condemns Moraes' order imposing house arrest on Bolsonaro and will hold accountable all those aiding and abetting sanctioned conduct," it added. According to CNN, the court order said Bolsonaro recorded speeches to be posted on other users' social media accounts in which his ankle monitor is visible, which Moraes said defied an order prohibiting "exploitation of interviews or public or private speeches posted on third parties' social media." Bolsonaro will serve house arrest at his residence and will not be allowed to have visitors, except for his attorneys and people authorised by the court. The former president is also prohibited from using a cell phone, directly or through third parties. In February, Jair Bolsonaro was charged in connection with an alleged coup plot to overturn the results of the 2022 election and keep his opponent, President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, from taking power. Part of the coup plot, prosecutors allege, involved a plan to potentially assassinate Lula, his vice president and a minister of the Supreme Court. Bolsonaro has denied wrongdoing. US President Donald Trump, an ally of Bolsonaro, has criticised the trial, calling it "politically motivated." Last week, he signed executive actions imposing a 50 per cent tariff on Brazil, after threatening to do so if the country did not end the trial against Bolsonaro.

Marcos said that the Philippines was satisfied with the defence modernisation alongside India's Brahmos project. "We express satisfaction over the

"So we have agreed to establish mechanisms for service-to-service talks for information sharing and training exchanges amongst our militaries. We will foster naval and coast guard interoperability via port calls in cooperative activities and capacity building in the maritime domain," the Philippines President said.

Marcos further felicitated PM Modi's undertaking to make India a developed nation (Viksit Bharat) by 2047.

"Despite these challenges, I also bear felicitations on India's remarkable transformation and inexorable march to become Viksit Bharat by 2047 under Prime Minister Modi's guiding hand," he said. The Philippines' President said that the visit is a crucial one because on this day, the two leaders formally launched the strategic partnership between the Philippines and India.

Pak: Missing man's frozen body found after 28 years

MI News Service, Islamabad: The body of a man who went missing in 1997 has been discovered on a melting glacier in the Kohistan mountains of Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Baltistan (PoGB), exposed nearly three decades later due to climate change-induced ice melt, ARY News reported on Tuesday. The remains were found in the Lady Meadows area of Palas, Kohistan, and identified as those of Naseer Uddin, who disappeared during a snowstorm while travelling through the remote Supat Valley, as per ARY News. Remarkably well-preserved despite the passage of 28 years, the body was identified through a national identity card found in his pocket. Local resident Umar Khan and his friends came across the remains while trekking through the glacier-covered region. According to Umar Khan, Naseer Uddin and his family had left their hometown in Palas due to a long-standing family feud and were journeying through the area when the tragedy occurred, as per ARY News. Kohistan District Police Of-

ficer Amjad Hussain confirmed the discovery, stating that Naseer Uddin likely lost his life after falling into a crevasse during the snowstorm. Umar Khan said he temporarily buried the body to prevent decomposition and later traced and informed the deceased's family. Earlier, German Olympic and World Champion biathlete Laura Dahlmeier was confirmed dead on Wednesday after sustaining serious injuries in a climbing accident in Pakistan, the Alpine Club of Pakistan (ACP) reported, as per ARY News. Faizullah Faraq, spokesperson for the PoGB government, confirmed that Dahlmeier lost her life due to a landslide in the Baltistan region. He stated that a rescue team retrieved her body, and once they descended to the base camp, a government helicopter will be dispatched to transport it. Earlier, two German female climbers were caught in a landslide in the Shigar district of Baltistan. One of the climbers was successfully rescued, while Laura Dahlmeier tragically did not survive.

Mexico: 7 killed, 11 injured in prison riot

MI News Service, Mexico: A deadly riot in Mexico's Tuxpan prison left seven inmates dead and eleven injured, following clashes between prisoners and the criminal gang Grupo Sombra, Khaama Press reported on Tuesday. International media reported a deadly riot at the Tuxpan prison in Veracruz state, Mexico, that resulted in the deaths of at least seven inmates and left eleven others injured.

According to the Veracruz State Public Security Department, the violence erupted after a confrontation between a group of inmates and members of a criminal gang known as Grupo Sombra, who had reportedly been extorting and threatening other prisoners and their families. Some inmates, in videos circulated on social media, claimed the riot was sparked in protest against these threats and acts of intimidation, as per Khaama Press. Security forces were able to regain control of the prison on Sunday and extinguished fires that had been set by inmates during the chaos. Footage from inside the prison showed plumes of smoke rising above the facility and several inmates with burn injuries being transferred to external medical centers for treatment.

Mexican prisons—especially state-run facilities—have long faced challenges such as severe overcrowding and frequent violence, often fueled by rivalries between drug cartels and criminal gangs. Reports suggest that such prison clashes often mirror ongoing turf wars outside prison walls, as reported by Khaama Press. In 2023, a riot at a prison in Ciudad Juarez led to the escape of 25 inmates and resulted in several fatalities. Human rights organizations have since called for full investigations into these incidents and urgent reforms to prevent further bloodshed. This latest outbreak of violence highlights the fragile state of Mexico's prison system and the urgent need for structural and security reforms to curb gang influence within detention centers.

Canada conducts first humanitarian airdrop in Gaza

CBC News had exclusive access to the Canadian effort, which delivered food supplies like lentils, oil, milk powder and pasta using a CC-130J Hercules aircraft that departed from a Jordanian airbase. The drop was part of an attempt by six countries to alleviate the

hunger crisis in the Palestinian territory. "Canada is taking these exceptional measures with our international partners as access to humanitarian aid in Gaza is severely restricted and humanitarian needs have reached an unprecedented level," Global Affairs Canada said in a statement published Monday afternoon. "Despite the scale of need, humanitarian partners face severe challenges in delivering life-saving food and medical assistance by land due to ongoing restrictions imposed by the Israeli government."

US Immigration Services restricts sports visas for transgender women

MI News Service, Washington: The US Citizenship and Immigration Services updated its immigration policy to restrict visa eligibility for transgender women seeking to compete in women's sports. This move aligns with Executive Order 14201, "Keeping Men Out of Women's Sports," which directs the Department of

Homeland Security to develop policies to prevent the entry of male athletes seeking to compete in women's sports. "USCIS has clarified eligibility for certain visa categories: O-1A aliens of extraordinary ability, E11 aliens of exceptional ability, and for national interest waivers (NIWs), to

guarantee an even playing field for all women's athletics in the United States," the statement added. "Men do not belong in women's sports. USCIS is closing the loophole for foreign male athletes whose only chance at winning elite sports is to change their gender identity and leverage their biological advantages against

women," said USCIS Spokesperson Matthew Tragesser. "It's a matter of safety, fairness, respect, and truth that only female athletes receive a visa to come to the US to participate in women's sports. The Trump Administration is standing up for the silent majority who've long been victims of leftist policies that defy common sense."
