

SC dismisses Justice Varma's plea for invalidation of panel report

MI News Service, New Delhi : The Supreme Court on Thursday dismissed Allahabad High Court judge Yashwant Varma's plea seeking invalidation of a report by an in-house inquiry panel, which found him guilty of misconduct in the cash discovery row.

A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and A G Masih said Justice Varma's conduct does not inspire confidence and his plea should not be entertained.

The apex court held that in-house procedure and the judges committee appointed by the then CJI adhered to the stipulated procedure and sending of the report to the Prime minister and President with recommendation for his removal was not unconstitutional.

Trump's first tranche of 25 % tariffs on India comes into effect

MI News Service, Washington (DC) : The initial 25 per cent tariffs announced by US President Donald Trump on Indian imports came into effect on Thursday. Last week, the White House announced that India will face tariffs of 25 per cent after Trump issued an executive order listing the various duties that Washington will impose on exports from countries around the world. In the Executive Order titled 'Further Modifying The Reciprocal Tariff Rates', Trump had announced tariff rates for nearly 70 nations.

Though the sweeping new tariffs have been imposed on several countries, India is facing the steepest hike of 50 per cent like Brazil. Earlier last week a 25 per cent tariff on Indian imports came into effect following a directive signed by US President Donald Trump in the White House.

But in a fresh blow, Trump on Thursday announced an additional 25 per cent duty on India for buying Russian oil, bringing the total tariff burden on Indian goods to 50 per cent. The second round of tariffs will come into force on August 27, 21 days from the latest announcement.

The new duties range from 10 per cent to 40 per cent, with countries like Laos and Myanmar facing 40 per cent, Pakistan 19 per cent, Sri Lanka 20 per cent, the UK 10 per cent, and Japan 15 per cent.

Most of these tariffs came into effect just after midnight in New York on August 7. "It's Midnight!!! Billions of Dollars In Tariffs Are Now Flowing Into The United States Of America " Trump posted on his social media platform, Truth Social.

In another post, he said, "Reciprocal tariffs take effect at midnight tonight! Billions of dollars, largely from countries that have taken advantage of the United States for many years, laughing all the way, will start flowing into the USA. The only thing that can stop America's greatness would be a radical left court that wants to see our country fail!"

On Wednesday, Trump signed an executive order imposing an additional 25 per cent tariff on goods imported from India, citing New Delhi's ongoing oil trade with Russia. The White House said that India's "direct or indirect" imports of Russian crude violate sanctions and threaten US foreign pol-

Justice Varma had contested both the findings of the panel and the CJI's recommendation to the President and Prime Minister for his removal.

The top court, however, dismissed a separate plea filed by a lawyer seeking an FIR in connection with the allegations, stating there was no ground for criminal investigation.

The court said Justice Varma's conduct does not inspire confidence, and his plea should not be entertained. The Supreme Court had earlier told Justice Varma that his conduct did not inspire confidence and also defended the CJI's authority to act on any judicial misconduct, saying he cannot be merely a "post office but has certain duties to the nation.

Mamata Banerjee targets voter list overhaul, Bengali identity ahead of 2026 polls

MI News Service, Jhargram : West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday launched a scathing attack on the Election Commission of India (ECI) and the central government over the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll, warning that the exercise could be a veiled attempt to disenfranchise voters, especially from marginalised communities.

Speaking at an event marking World Adivasi (tribal) Day in Jhargram, Mamata Banerjee alleged that the central government was attempting to manipulate the voter list under the guise of bureaucratic formalities. She also pledged to resist what she described as a conspiracy against Bengali identity, indicating that the twin issues of voter disenfranchisement and linguistic pride would shape her campaign in the 2026 state assembly elections.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has alleged a major conspiracy under the guise of voter list revision. Speaking on the issue, she said, "Everyone

must first check whether their name is on the voter list. A new conspiracy is being hatched by the Centre to delete names."

"If someone tells you to fill out a form promising benefits, don't do it without understanding. Your details could be used to remove your name from the voter list. Then they will send you an NRC notice,"

New voters should remember, parents' certificates will be required. The double-engine government is behind this conspiracy," she added.

Referring to the controversial National Register of Citizens, the Chief Minister alleged that the new voters' list norms require individuals born before or in 2002 to produce their parents' birth certificates. "Only 60% had birth certificates back then. How can those born after 2004 be expected to provide their parents' certificates?" she questioned, calling the demand discriminatory and impractical. Mamata Banerjee further alleged that the Election Commission had changed rules arbitrarily,

saying, "Just possessing an EPIC card isn't enough anymore. You need to cross-check your name in the new voter list." She accused the Centre of targeting state government officials for resisting these changes. "Two of my officers were suspended and sent notices yesterday. On what basis? The elections haven't even been announced yet. I won't let anyone be punished unjustly," she said.

Earlier this week, the Election Commission had recommended FIRs against two Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) in West Bengal for alleged lapses in the voter list revision process. The Commission also wrote to West Bengal Chief Secretary Manoj Pant urging disciplinary action. The Chief minister also turned her fire on BJP leaders for comments allegedly questioning the legitimacy of the Bengali language. "If Bengali is not a language, then in what language was the national anthem written? What language did Tagore, Swamiji, Raja Rammohan Roy, and

Vidyasagar speak?" she asked, adding, "Language is identity. Language is pride."

In a pointed criticism of the BJP, Mamata Banerjee said, "These people were born with silver spoons in their mouths. They don't understand the struggles of the working class."

On Thursday, once again from Jhargram, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee launched a sharp attack on the BJP over the alleged harassment of Bengalis in other states, particularly in BJP-ruled states. Targeting the saffron party on the issue, she said, "We have brought back more than 2,000 people. Even now, atrocities continue in states like Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Assam — they are being sent off to Bangladesh."

Her remarks mark a sharp escalation in political rhetoric ahead of the 2026 state elections, with the Trinamool Congress positioning itself as the defender of both voter rights and Bengali cultural identity.

Abhishek Banerjee accuses EC of 'shameless role' in denying voters democratic rights

MI News Service, Kolkata : Trinamool Congress' (TMC) new leader in the Lok Sabha Abhishek Banerjee, MP, on Thursday joined party supremo and Chief minister Mamata Banerjee in launching yet another scathing attack on the Election Commission of India (ECI), accusing it of compromising its constitutional neutrality and attempting to undermine the voting rights of genuine citizens of West Bengal.

Addressing a news conference before leaving for Delhi to attend a dinner at Rahul Gandhi's residence for formulating a joint strategy on Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and discuss fielding a joint candidate for the forthcoming election of a new Vice President (following the resignation of Jagdeep Dhankar), TMC All India General Secretary Abhishek Banerjee said, "The EC also needs to understand and realise that it is an impartial, unbiased organisation and it has to operate within the ambit of the Constitution."

The TMC MP went on to accuse the poll body of playing an "active and shameless role" in denying legitimate voters their democratic rights.

"Now the EC has taken a shameless role to snatch the voting rights of genuine voters," he alleged.

"Yesterday, I saw a report that a residential certificate had been issued under the name of Donald Trump. You should ask the Election Commission about it instead of shooting questions at us," the TMC leader told reporters.

Banerjee also alleged that the ECI was being used by the BJP as a tool "so that the established Bengalis of Bengal, who speak Bengali and live in Bengal cannot exercise their voting rights."

Questioning the EC's mandate, Banerjee alleged that the poll panel was in-

terfering in areas beyond its jurisdiction.

Defending the autonomy of the elected state government, the TMC second in command after the Chief minister, stressed, "It was voted to power for the third consecutive term in 2021 by 12 crore people of Bengal."

The government is solely committed and accountable to these 12 crore people, not to any political party or any central government, Abhishek Banerjee said

Incidentally, only yesterday while addressing a massive rally at Jhargram Chief minister Mamata Banerjee also came down heavily on the ECI and said it is working as the "puppet of BJP".

Also ridiculing the Commission for demanding documents for identification of true voters, which are next to impossible for the common voters anywhere in India to produce, for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of ECI, she gave the example of Abhishek Banerjee, who is also her nephew, to explain the difficulties .

"The Election Commission says those born before 2002 will have to produce the birth certificates of their parents. Take Abhishek's example. He was born in 1987. He is now 37 years old. From where will he get the birth certificates of his parents? Can Amit Shah produce the birth certificates of his parents?" Mamata Banerjee asked the people at the meeting here after her third 'Bhasha Andolan' (language movement) march after Kolkata and Bolpur .

Since the day Bihar's SIR drive became public, Mamata Banerjee has been warning that the Commission's real target is Bengal — due to vote next year — and "genuine" voters will be deprived of their right.

India will not compromise, ready to pay heavy price, declares PM Modi

MI News Service, New Delhi : In a subtle message directed towards US President Donald Trump after his announcement of imposing 25 per cent additional tariff on India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Thursday that "India will never compromise on the interests of its farmers and dairy sector", and declared he was "prepared to bear a significant personal cost if necessary".

In a strong statement a day after Trump ratcheted up tariffs on Indian goods to 50 per cent, even as the two nations discuss a bilateral trade deal, Prime minister Modi said though the trade deal has not yet been struck over the US demand for greater access to India's agricultural and dairy market, in any way 'we are not going to compromise any further'.

Incidentally the US wants reduced tariffs on products like corn, soybeans, apples, almonds and ethanol, as well as increased access for American dairy products. New Delhi is, however, resisting these demands as these will have a direct bearing on farmers.

"Hamare liye apane kisanon ka hit sarvoch prathamikta hai. Bharat apne kisanon, pashu paalakon aur macchuaare bhai-bahanon ke hiton ke saath kabhi bhi samjhuata nahin karega. (For us, the interests of farmers are our top priority. India will never compromise on the interests of its farmers, dairy farmers and fishermen)," Modi said while addressing a

three-day global conference to mark the birth centenary of late renowned agri-scientist M S Swaminathan.

To protect farmers' interests, the Prime minister said he was ready to personally pay the huge price. "Main jaanata hoon ki vyaktigat roop se mujhe bahut badee keemat chukaane padegee. Lekin main iske liye taiyaar hoon." (I know that I will personally have to pay a heavy price. But I am ready for it).

Further, he said, "Mere desh ke machhuaeeron ke liye, mere desh ke pashu paalokon ke liye aaj Bharat taiyaar hai." (Today, India is ready (to pay the price) for the fishermen and dairy farmers.)

Modi also released a commemorative coin and stamp in honour of the legendary scientist.

During his address, the Prime minister highlighted various schemes implemented by his government for the all-around development of the farm and allied sector. He also stressed the need to sustain food production amid the growing challenges of climate change and called for developing more climate-resilient varieties of crops, including heat-resistant. Trump announced an additional 25 per cent tariff on the South Asian nation on Thursday, taking the total levy on Indian goods being exported to the U.S. to 50 per cent - among

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Teenage boy dies by suicide after alleged reprimand over haircut

MI News Service, Kalyani : A teen age boy committed suicide by hanging from the ceiling of their home with a towel on Wednesday evening, police said. There was none in home at the time of the mishap. The deceased was identified as Uday Das (14), son of Anodis Das. According to family sources, the incident took place at Fatepur - Barasat Para, under Haringhata

Police Station in Nadia district. Uday was reportedly studying at home while his parents had gone to the market. Upon returning, they found Uday hanging from the ceiling with a towel tied around his neck. He was immediately brought down and rushed to Haringhata Rural Hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. Uday's father, Anodis Das, stated that ear-

lier in the day, Uday had gone to a local saloon and got a trendy haircut. Anodis disapproved of the hairstyle and questioned him about it, saying it might lead to people speaking ill of him. Taking his father's remarks seriously, Uday went back to the saloon and got his haircut corrected. Later in the evening, while Uday's parents went to the market, the boy was left alone

at home. When they returned, they found him hanging. Despite rushing him to the hospital, nothing could be done. The family is in deep shock and unable to comprehend what could have led Uday to take such a drastic step. On Thursday, Uday's body was sent for post-mortem at the Jawaharlal Nehru Memorial Hospital in Kalyani under police supervision.

Insects found in mid-day meal food, blame game begins

MI News Service, Medinipur: A disturbing incident has triggered controversy in the Laldighi area of Ward No. 9 under Medinipur Municipality, where caterpillars were allegedly found in khichdi served by an Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) center. According to reports, on Thursday, a local resident, Anima Sahu, collected khichdi in a tiffin box from the Laldighi Purbapar Anganwadi Center to feed her children at home. However, upon opening the container, she claimed to have discovered live caterpillars in the food. Shocked by the finding, she rushed back to the center to report the issue

but found it had already closed for the day. She then alerted nearby residents. The incident has sparked local outrage, especially given that the food was meant for children. However, the Anganwadi worker in charge dismissed the allegation, stating that the food was prepared with proper care and hygiene. "All the other children ate the same food and none reported any issues. It's possible that the contamination occurred after the food was collected," the worker said. Meanwhile, the matter has taken a political turn. District BJP General Secretary Shankar Guchhait has lodged a formal com-

plaint with the District Magistrate via email, condemning the alleged negligence and demanding accountability. Ward Councillor Saurabh Basu, however, suspects foul play. "If the food had been contaminated during preparation, others would have fallen ill. Since no such cases have been reported, this appears to be a deliberate attempt to malign the center. An investigation is needed to uncover the truth," he said. The district administration has yet to issue an official statement, but the incident has raised concerns over food safety and possible political motivations in sensitive public service areas like child nutrition.

BHISHM Cube is proposed to include in school syllabus

MI News Service, Kalyani : The BHISHM Cube project of Central Government is implemented to provide all required treatment supports primarily on spot, soon after any disaster, with a view to decrease the death. However, this is a unique and effective project to use soon after disasters. However, a program of demonstration on BHISHM (Bharat Health Initiative for Sahyog, Hita and Maitri) cubes took place at All India Institute of Medical sciences (AIIMS), Kalyani in Nadia on Thursday. Persons from the NDRF, BSF, Armed Force, AIIMS doctors, nurses, many professors and officers attended the program. It is world's first portable hospital for better management to safe more lives through quick treatment arrangement on the spot of any disaster. Retired Col. Tapas Roy, who is one of the important persons in developing the BHISHM Project, delivered the key lecture and demonstrated on the same. It is an initiative of 'Make in India'. The Arogya Maitri Disaster Management Cube - BHISHM, is a revolutionary mobile hospital equipped with cutting edge technology. Dr. Ramji Singh, Executive Director, AIIMS Kalyani said. " It is an innovative project and



developed by India firstever. The students from medical colleges to common people will gradually be trained and once it will be highly spread through out the country as the common people can work after any disaster, if provided little training. Because the cube is developed in such a way, that a person can use it without high qualification and knowledge," he added. According to Tapas Roy, they will approach to the central government to introduce the same in the school level syllabus. The cube is a part of the broader initiative named project BHISHM. It is tailored to treat upto 200 casualties emphasizing rapid response and comprehensive care. The Aid Cube is equipped with several innovative tools designed to

enhance disaster response and medical support during emergencies, said Dr. Ajay Mallick, Superintendent, AIIMS Kalyani. It integrates Artificial Intelligence and data analytics to facilitate effective coordination, real time monitoring and efficient management of Medical Services in the field. The whole unit contains 72 easily transportable components that can be conveniently carried by hand, by cycle or even drone providing unmatched flexibility. In the face of mess casualty incidents where requirements range from basic aid to advanced medical and surgical care, the Aid cube stands out with its ability to be deployed within an astonishing 12 minutes. During his speech, Roy stated that during his job in Army, he faced vari-

ous problems in field for 7 times and since then he thought to develop a kit for on spot medical supports without killing time. However, while the cubes can be lifted by helicopter to disaster spots and left on ground by parachute, if helicopter can not be landed following geographical situation due to earthquake, train accident or plain crash, cloud burst etc. The cube contains primary injury treatment goods to small operations those are needed as life support as dictum of golden hour can't be overlooked. Generally, after a disaster like earthquake, it appears hard to reach spot soon. However, generally, the injured persons are rescued and taken to hospital. It takes 10 to 12 hours and meanwhile many seriously injured persons get died. But this innovative project helps starting treatment on spot as the cube helps to set up tent to huge treatment facilities and within 10 to 12 minutes. Generally there are some specific type of treatments are required after disasters and the cube is developed keeping that in mind. When the goods in the cube are used, it comes to the knowledge of monitoring team through on line system and fill up is kept on head.

“Golden spoon logic won’t work”- Mamata Banerjee on SIR

MI News Service, Bolpur: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has once again raised strong objections to the ongoing SIR process, alleging it is a disguised attempt to implement the National Register of Citizens (NRC). Speaking at a Tribal Day event on Bolpur on Thursday, she questioned the practicality and fairness of the documentation requirements being imposed, particularly the demand for parental birth Certificates for the born after 2004. Referring to recent guidelines reportedly introduced during the SIR process in Bihar, Mamata Banerjee said, "Is it possible for everyone to have their parents' birth certificates?"

When I came to power, only 60 percent of people even had their own birth certificates." Highlighting the reality of many citizens who were born at home or lack formal documentation, she remarked, "We are also home-delivered. Many only have school certificates. Do those who practice law or come from privileged backgrounds have such documents? They were born with golden spoons. How can they understand the struggles of ordinary people?" Mamata Banerjee urged the public to be cautious, stating, "No one should fill up any form without knowing what it is for. There is a larger plan in motion. I don't know if I should say this or

not, but it seems like a conspiracy to delete names again." She also questioned recent recommendations to suspend government employees under the SIR process. "Under what law are such decisions being taken before the elections? There must be transparency and accountability." This is not the first time the Chief Minister has voiced her concern over the SIR process, which she believes poses a risk to the rights and identity of common citizens. Her latest remarks reflect growing political tension over the issue, with critics warning that the process could disenfranchise large sections of the population.

Mystery deepens: Missing man found dead after 22 days

MI News Service, Rabindranagar: Rabindranagar witnessed a chilling discovery as the decomposed body of a missing youth was recovered 22 days after his disappearance. The deceased, identified as Tajuddin, had left his home on the 16th to visit his in-laws but never returned. According to family sources, Tajuddin's last known location was en route to his in-laws' residence. When he failed to return or make contact, his family filed a missing person report at the Rajabagan police station. A day after his disappearance, his motorcycles was found abandoned near Mahestala Akra station, raising further concerns. On Wednesday evening, his body was discovered wrapped in a plastic sheet and tied with rope in a forested area near Panchur Gazi Para under the Rabindranagar

police station. The remains were severely decomposed, and the area was cordoned off by police following the discovery. The body has been sent for post-mortem examination to determine the exact cause of death. Tajuddin's family has alleged foul play and accused a man named Mithu of being involved in the incident. A formal complaint has been lodged against the accused, who is currently absconding. His residence

was found locked during a police visit. Police from both Rabindranagar and Rajabagan stations are jointly investigating the case. CCTV footage from key locations is being reviewed to trace the movements leading up to the incident. Authorities have yet to confirm the motive behind the suspected murder. Further behind the suspected murder. Further updates are awaited as the investigation progresses.

Multiple homes vandalized despite security cover

MI News Service, Cooch Behar: Fresh unrest has erupted in the Nazirhat No. 2 Gram Panchayat area of Dinhat, where the homes of four local residents associated with a prominent political organization were allegedly attacked and vandalized on Thursday morning. Among the victims are a current gram panchayat member, a local women's wing leader, a grassroots worker, and a former Mandal-level leader. Eyewitnesses and victims claim that a group of miscreants stormed the houses, ransacked property, and assaulted family members, including

an elderly woman and a pregnant woman—who has since been hospitalized. The gram panchayat member, who had been granted police protection by a High Court order two months ago, expressed shock that such a serious incident could occur despite security measures being in place. "My house was ambushed early this morning. They beat up my elderly mother and brother-in-law and looted everything they could," she said. The situation has created considerable tension in the area, especially in light of recent allegations of harassment against a high-profile

opposition leader in a neighboring region. In response to the allegations, a local regional president of another political group denied any involvement, stating that their leadership was not present in the area at the time. "Our team was in Sahebganj attending a scheduled organizational meeting. I have no idea who carried out the vandalism," he said. Local authorities have launched an investigation into the incident, which has drawn significant public attention due to its brazenness and the apparent failure of previously mandated security measures.

Water dividers collapse, traffic banned

MI News Service, Birbhum: A critical situation has emerged at the Tilpara Barrage in Siuri, Birbhum, following the collapse of multiple water dividers, severely affecting the structure's integrity and forcing a complete shutdown of vehicular movement across the barrage. Officials report that uncontrolled sand mining from surrounding sandbanks—both upstream and downstream of the barrage—is the primary cause of structural dam-

age. According to government sources, a significant portion of the barrage deck has already eroded, leading to the collapse of several key water dividers. Cracks in two major dividers were detected days ago, and those have since worsened. On Thursday morning, around five to six smaller dividers collapsed entirely. The downstream section of the barrage has suffered considerable damage, and further collapses are feared as instability in-

creases. Local administration and engineers have rushed to the spot, and repair work is currently underway. However, concerns about a potential disaster have led to strict movement restrictions. While the passage of heavy vehicles was already prohibited, Birbhum Superintendent of Police announced on Thursday that the movement of two-wheelers and small four-wheelers has also been banned until further notice. 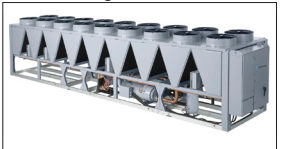

Metro to replace water cool chillers with air cool chillers to conserve ground water



MI News Service, Kolkata: Rapid depletion of ground water reserve is a big concern for the world. With the advent of new technologies and progress of civilization, natural resources like water are being used more and more. Experts have already warned about the negative impact of such extensive use of ground water on mother nature. Ground water is part of hydrologic cycle. Ground water contributes to streams in most physiographic and climatic settings. It may cause land subsidence. It takes thousands of years to accumulate ground water. So, ground water depletion means we are extracting more than what is being replenished. In order to preserve precious ground water in a densely populated city like Kolkata, Metro Railway, Kolkata has taken a great initiative and is going to introduce modern alternative cooling system in Blue Line, India's oldest Metro Corridor soon. For this, a tender has already been opened and evaluation work is going on. After evaluation, the work order will be placed. Work will commence from 2026 and will be completed by 2029.

In this initiative, out of 15 underground stations, the cooling system of 11 underground stations of Blue Line is earmarked for change from traditional water cool chiller to air cool chiller immediately. The familiar scene of cooling towers outside Metro stations is going to change. For this ambitious project, Central Government has already allotted 150 Cr. Once this is implemented, Metro Railway will be able to save 18 crore liters of ground water consumption annually. This amount of ground water is required to run the water cool chillers for making Metro stations cool every year. Once air cool chiller replaced the water cool chillers then

Streak of global temperature records over for now, says European climate agency

New Delhi :The recent streak of record-breaking global temperatures is over for now, according to Europe's climate agency Copernicus, even as July 2025 ranked as the third-warmest July on record worldwide.

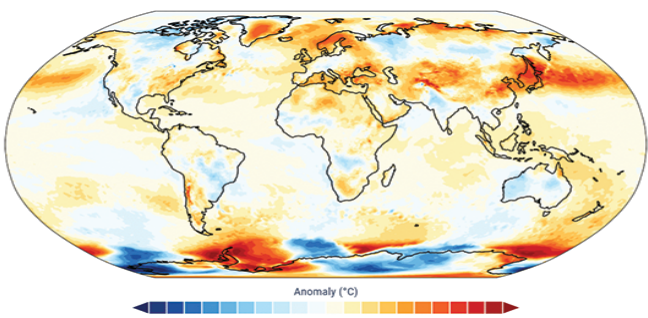
The agency also reported that the past 12 months (August 2024 to July 2025) were 1.53 degrees Celsius warmer than the pre-industrial average.

The agency said July's global average surface air temperature of 16.68 degrees Celsius was 0.45 degrees Celsius above the 1991-2020 average for the month.

It said July 2025 was 0.27 degree Celsius cooler than the record of July 2023 and 0.23 degree Celsius cooler than July 2024, which was the second warmest.

Scientists at Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) said July 2025 was 1.25 degrees Celsius above the estimated 1850-1900 average used to define the pre-industrial level.

"It was only the fourth month in the last 25 with a global



temperature less than 1.5 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial level," the European climate agency said in a statement.

"Two years after the hottest July on record, the recent streak of global temperature records is over -- for now. But this does not mean climate change has stopped. We continued to witness the effects of a warming world in events such as extreme heat and catastrophic floods in July. Unless we rapidly stabilise greenhouse gas concentrations in the atmosphere, we should expect not only new temperature records but also

a worsening of these impacts -- and we must prepare for that," C3S Director Carlo Buontempo said.

Human activities, especially the burning of fossil fuels, have pumped large amounts of heat-trapping greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. This has raised the planet's temperature, altered the climate and led to more frequent and severe floods, droughts, storms and other extreme weather events. At the UN climate conference in Paris in 2015, countries pledged to limit the average global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees

Celsius compared to pre-industrial levels to avoid the worst impacts of climate change.

The year 2024 was the first calendar year with a global average temperature 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels.

However, a permanent breach of the 1.5-degrees Celsius limit refers to long-term warming over a 20 or 30-year period.

Scientists at Copernicus said the average sea surface temperature (SST) for July 2025 was 20.77 degrees Celsius, the third-highest value on record for the month, 0.12 degree Celsius below the July 2023 record.

Arctic sea ice extent was 10 per cent below average, ranking joint second-lowest for July in the 47-year satellite record, virtually tied with 2012 and 2021.

Antarctic sea ice extent was 8 per cent below average, ranking third-lowest on record for the month, a less extreme anomaly than those seen in July 2023 (15 per cent below average) and 2024 (11 per cent below average).

WHO updates recommendations on use of antibiotics for COVID-19 patients

New Delhi :The World Health Organisation (WHO) has advised against the use of antibiotics even in patients with severe Covid when a concurrent bacterial infection is not suspected.

The global health body has released updated recommendations for the clinical management of people with Covid which, it said, are based on evidence generated from recent meta-analysis of outcomes of patients treated with antibiotics for the virus.

"For patients with non-severe COVID-19 and a low clinical suspicion of a concurrent bacterial infection, we recommend no empirical antibiotics. For patients with severe COVID-19 and a low clinical suspicion of a concurrent bacterial infection, we suggest no empirical antibiotics," the WHO said.

The WHO said that as COVID-19 epidemiology and severity have changed, and as emergency measures have subsided, the evidence behind a number of recommendations has changed.

In parallel, evolution of health systems and the global environment have meant that the recommendations are implemented in a very different context in 2024 compared to 2020.

These guidelines have evolved from the first version in 2020 in line with new information and changing circumstances of the pandemic, the WHO said.

"Notable changes to COVID-19 disease over this time have been overall reduced infection rates and reduced disease severity. Emergency measures which were imposed have also been removed, and care for patients with

COVID-19 has become more integrated with usual healthcare systems.

"This different environment has prompted a review of the scope and content of all existing guidance. In order to maintain a clear focus and relevance, we have removed recommendations which would be considered general medical principles, and those which are no longer specific to the management of COVID-19," the WHO said.

The new recommendations on use of antibiotics were prompted by the publication of data from a systematic review and meta-analysis, and the pressing need to address antimicrobial resistance.

The WHO said the updated guidelines are for people directly or indirectly involved in the health care of patients with Covid and post COVID-19 condition. This includes clinicians, allied health care workers, facility managers and hospital administrators.

The SARS-CoV-2 continues to infect several thousands of people daily leading to preventable morbidity and mortality across the world, the WHO said.

The roll-out of vaccines and treatment for COVID-19, and increasing population immunity from infection has substantially reduced hospitalization, severity of disease, and mortality.

"However, the virus continues to evolve in terms of infectivity, immune escape, and disease severity. This guideline robustly and transparently addresses the changing landscape and evidence availability, and the continual development of treatment and management strategies for COVID-19," the WHO stated.

Researchers discover that unique immune cells stop metastatic cancer

New York [US] : The majority of cancer deaths are caused by metastatic disease, which occurs when cancer spreads from the primary tumour to other areas of the body, and researchers understand how cancer cells escape the primary location to seed new tumours, it is unclear why some cancer cells produce new tumours decades later and others do not. A research team at the National Cancer Institute-designated Montefiore Einstein Comprehensive Cancer Centre (MECCC) has uncovered a natural immunological response in mice that prevents escaping cancer cells from growing into tumours elsewhere in the body. The study was published today in the journal Cell.

"Preventing or curing metastases is the most critical challenge in cancer," said study leader Julio Aguirre-Ghiso, Ph.D., director of MECCC's Cancer Dormancy Institute. "We think our findings have the potential to point to new therapies to prevent or treat metastatic disease." The study's co-first authors are Erica Dalla, Ph.D., a former student, and Michael Papanicolaou, Ph.D., a postdoctoral fellow in Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso's lab.

Cells that migrate from primary tumors and seed metastatic tumors are called disseminated cancer cells (DCCs). Some DCCs behave aggressively, immediately starting tumors in new tissue, while others remain in a state of suspended animation referred to as dormancy. "It's long been a mystery how some DCCs can remain in tissues for decades and never cause metastases, and we believe we've found the explanation," said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso, who is also professor of cell biology, of oncology, and of medicine and the Rose C. Falkenstein Chair in Cancer Research at Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Breast cancer and many other types of cancer metastasize to the lungs. In research involving three mouse models of metastatic breast cancer, Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso and colleagues determined that when breast cancer DCCs spread to the lung's air sacs (alveoli), they are kept in a dormant state by immune cells known as alveolar macrophages.

"Alveolar macrophages are the lung's first responders, defending the organ against bacteria and dangerous substances like environmental pollutants," said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso. These specialized macrophages, he notes, appear early in embryonic development and reside within lung tissue for life.

Researchers identify new potential treatment for cardiac arrhythmias

Arizona [US] : A recent study by researchers at the University of Arizona College of Medicine - Phoenix and the University of California Davis Health discovered a new target for developing a medication to treat atrial fibrillation, the most prevalent kind of irregular heart rhythm.

According to the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, atrial fibrillation, also known as AFib or AF, accounts for approximately one in every seven strokes and is associated with a considerable increase in morbidity and death. The American Heart Association predicts that more than 12 million people will have AFib by 2030, and existing treatment approaches are inadequate, according to researchers.

Proteins involved in physiological processes of the heart have been a target of research for AFib for some time. Until recently, most research suggested that treating AFib through inhibition of specific small-conductance calcium-activated potassium channels, or SK channels, could either reduce or worsen arrhythmias under different conditions.

"Our study used pioneering experimental and computational approaches to decipher how the human SK2 channel can be dynamically co-regulated. The study is especially timely considering inhibitors of SK channels are currently in clinical trials to treat AFib, making further insight into their regulatory mechanisms paramount," said Nipavan Chiamvimonvat, MD, chair of the Department of Basic Medical Sciences at the U of A College of Medicine - Phoenix. The paper, "Atomistic Mechanisms of the Regulation of Small Conductance Ca2+-Activated K+ channel (SK2) by PIP2," was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

The research team examined the role of a lipid - phosphatidylinositol 4,5-bisphosphate, or PIP2 - in regulating the SK2 channel. PIP2 is an integral component of all plant and animal cell membranes and acts as a messenger for a variety of signaling pathways in the body. "Because PIP2 plays such an essential role in multiple ion channels, regulating cardiac ion channels through PIP2 presents a new mechanism for the lipid regulation of cardiac excitability and function," said computational biologist Ryan Woltz, PhD, the paper's co-first author and an assistant research professor at the College of Medicine - Phoenix.

Currently, SK channels are the only known potassium channels that are upregulated in heart failure, and their regulation plays a critical role in cardiac excitability and how disturbances in the heart's rhythm develop. "Since PIP2 is known to be dysregulated in heart failure, our study provides critical translational insights into possible mechanisms of cardiac arrhythmias in heart failure," said co-first author Yang Zheng, PhD, a post-



doctoral research fellow at the College of Medicine - Phoenix. Using comparative modeling, the research team generated human SK2 channel models in closed, intermediate and open states. They then used molecular dynamics simulations to explore the molecular mechanisms of SK2 channel modulation by PIP2.

"Structural insights from our study will be useful to design novel inhibitors of SK2 channels to treat cardiac arrhythmias," said Vladimir Yarov-Yarovoy, PhD, a professor at UC Davis Health.

Co-senior author Igor Vorobyov, PhD, an associate professor at UC Davis Health, said the team is already using similar computational approaches to study other SK channel subtypes.

"I am thrilled to participate in this collaborative multi-university and multidisciplinary research study and looking forward to a continued collaboration," Vorobyov said. "We are currently working on applying a similar pioneering experimental/computational approach to modulation of SK channels by drug molecules, which may enhance or inhibit function of these ion channels and can be used as prospective treatment options for AFib and other cardiovascular diseases." 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Researchers find how cells recognize, repair DNA damage

Wurzburg [Germany] : When cells divide, there is a substantial risk of genetic harm. After all, the cell must repeat its whole genetic material, including billions of genetic letters, before it can divide. This repeatedly produces "reading errors" in the genome. Other factors, including as exposure to sunlight, alcohol, and cigarettes, are also responsible for the buildup of DNA damage over a person's lifetime.

Of course, the cell is not impotent in the presence of such injuries. It contains a large library of biological mechanisms that are activated in response to DNA damage. The precise term for this is DNA damage response (DDR). Specific signaling pathways are usually responsible for the immediate recognition and repair of DNA damage, ensuring the cell's survival.

A team of scientists from Julius-Maximilians-Universitat Wurzburg (JMU) in Bavaria, Germany, has recently conducted a closer examination of one of these signaling routes. The researchers discovered a new mechanism for the DNA damage response that is mediated by an RNA transcript. Their findings serve to widen the conceptual perspective of the DNA damage response and link it more closely with RNA.

Dr Kaspar Burger, junior research group leader at the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, was responsible for this study. The group has published the results of their investigations in the journal Genes & Development.

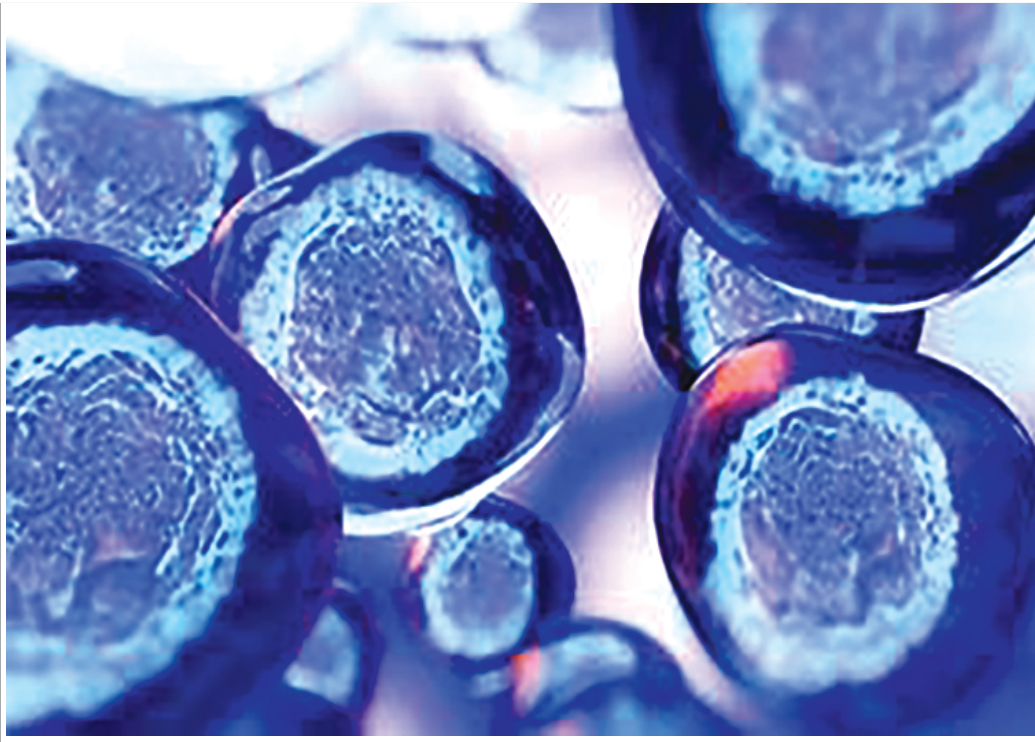
"In our study, we focused on so-called long non-coding RNA

transcripts. Previous data suggest that some of these transcripts act as regulators of genome stability," says Kaspar Burger, explaining the background to the work. The study focused on the nuclear enriched abundant transcript 1 - also known as NEAT1 - which is found in high concentrations in many tumor cells. NEAT1 is also known to react to DNA damage and to cellular stress. However, its exact role in the DNA damage response was previously unclear.

"Our hypothesis was that RNA metabolism involves NEAT1 in the DNA damage response in order to ensure the stability of the genome," says Burger. To test this hypothesis, the research group experimentally investigated how NEAT1 reacts to serious damage to the genome - so-called DNA double-strand breaks - in human bone cancer cells. The result: "We were able to show that DNA double-strand breaks increase both the number of NEAT1 transcripts and the amount of N6-methyladenosine marks on NEAT1," says the scientist.

Methyladenosine marks on RNA transcripts are a topic that scientists have not been dealing with for very long. They fall into the area of epitranscriptomics - the field of biology that deals with the question of how RNA modifications are involved in the regulation of gene expression. Methyl groups play a key role in this. It is known, for example, that RNA modifications are often misplaced in cancer cells.

The experiments conducted by Kaspar Burger and his team show that the frequent occurrence of DNA double-strand breaks causes excessive methylation of NEAT1,



which leads to changes in the NEAT1 secondary structure. As a result, highly methylated NEAT1 accumulates at some of these lesions to drive the recognition of broken DNA. In turn, experimentally induced suppression of NEAT1 levels delayed the DNA damage response, resulting in increased amounts of DNA damage.

NEAT1 itself does not repair DNA damage. However, as the Wurzburg team discovered, it enables the controlled release and activation of an RNA-binding DNA repair factor. In this way, the cell

can recognize and repair DNA damage highly efficiently.

According to the scientists, knowledge about the role of NEAT1 methylation in the recognition and repair of DNA damage could open up new therapeutic options for tumors with high NEAT1 expression. However, it must first be clarified whether these results, which were obtained in simple cell systems, can also be transferred to complex tumor models.

Kaspar Burger's research was supported by the German Cancer Aid and the Mildred Scheel Early

Career Center for Cancer Research (MSNZ) in Wurzburg.

Whenever cells divide, there is a high risk of damage to the genetic material. After all, the cell has to duplicate its entire genetic material and copy billions of genetic letters before it divides. This repeatedly results in "reading errors" of the genome. However, other factors are also responsible for the accumulation of DNA damage in the course of a person's life: exposure to sun light, alcohol and cigarettes are just a few examples of factors that are known to damage the genetic

material and thus can cause cancer, among other things.

Of course, the cell is not powerless in the face of such lesions. It has an extensive catalog of cellular mechanisms that are set in motion following DNA damage. DNA damage response, or DDR for short, is the technical term for this. Specific signaling pathways usually initiate the immediate recognition and repair of DNA damage, thus ensuring the survival of the cell.

A team of scientists from Julius-Maximilians-Universitat Wurzburg (JMU) in Bavaria, Germany, has now taken a closer look at one of these signaling pathways. The group has identified a new mechanism of the DNA damage response that is mediated via an RNA transcript. Their results help to broaden the conceptual view on the DNA damage response and to link it more closely with RNA metabolism.

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Now, mandatory Bhagavad Gita lessons in Gujarat school textbooks

MI News Sevice, Ahmedabad: In a major decision, the Gujarat government announced mandatory learning of the Bhagwad Gita in the first language textbooks for Classes 9 to 12.

The textbooks will now contain the Bhagavad Gita's value-based chapters in Gujarati, Urdu, Hindi and English.

The move is part of the state's implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, rolled out by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led Union government.

The NEP 2020 policy introduced by the Centre focuses on incorporating ancient Indian culture, traditions, and knowledge systems in the country's education system. The Bhagavad Gita is the most read spiritual and religious book in India among Hindus. Throughout history, non-Hindus have also looked at it for spiritualism and translated it into other languages, including Persian by Mughal prince Dara Shukoh (son of Shah Jahan).

However, the move is likely seen as yet another extension of the growing and overt influence of Hindutva policy on India's education system. A few years ago, the then-BJP-led Karnataka government banned hijabs in schools, triggering nationwide protests and disrupting the education of Muslim girls who faced discrimination.

Interestingly, when the state government in-

troduced the mandatory learning of the Bhagavad Gita in Gujarat schools in the Assembly, it received unanimous support from the Opposition, including Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and Congress, The Wire reported.

Last academic year, the Gujarat state government launched a supplementary textbook on the Bhagavad Gita for students of classes 6 to 8.

Minister of State for Education Praful Pansheriya maintained the move "aims to include the spiritual principles and values. "Students will feel proud and connected to the rich, diverse, ancient culture and knowledge systems and traditions of India through the teachings of 'Shrimad Bhagavad Gita.'"

The supplementary textbook on the revered scripture, which is part of the epic Mahabharata, will nstill moral values among students, he added.

The textbook was launched on the occasion of Gita Jayanti, a Hindu observance marking the day the Bhagavad Gita conversation took place between Arjuna, a Pandava and warrior prince, and Lord Krishna on the battlefield of Kurukshetra.

Pansheriya had said the supplementary textbook will soon be sent to schools across Gujarat. "Two more parts, for students of classes 9 to 12, will be made available soon," the minister had said then.

Pak Army Chief set for US trip, 2nd In 2 months, amid Trump's tariff war

MI News Sevice, New Delhi: Pakistan Army chief Field Marshal Asim Munir is set to visit the US for the second time in two months, according to reports in the Pakistani media. This visit, which signals a deepening of ties between Islamabad and Washington, DC, comes amid rising tension between the US and India over tariffs on exports. It also comes after Trump's trade deal with Pakistan, under which he has offered Islamabad's a preferential tariff rate and plans to explore its oil reserves.

US President Donald Trump yesterday announced an extra 25 per cent tariff on Indian exports as a 'penalty' for New Delhi continuing to import Russian crude oil. Trump warned other countries that buy Russian oil of similar measures.

After the total tariffs on Indian exports to the US rose to 50 per cent, the Ministry of External Affairs responded that the US targeting India over Russian oil imports is "unfair, unjustified, and unreasonable".

"We have already made clear our position on these issues, including the fact that our imports are based on market factors and done with the objective of ensuring the energy security of 1.4 billion people..." "It is therefore extremely unfortunate the US should choose to impose additional tariffs on India... for

actions that several other countries are also taking in their own national interest," the government said.

Earlier, Pakistan Field Marshal Munir visited Washington in June, and Trump hosted him for lunch at the White House. In fact, during his previous visit, Munir had hinted that he expected to return to the US later in the year, according to a report in the Pakistani newspaper Dawn

Munir's US trip plan also follows a trip to Pakistan by General Michael Erik Kurilla, head of the US Central Command (CENTCOM), in July. During this visit, the Pakistani government also conferred the US General with the Nishan-i-Imtiaz (military).

Ties between India and the US have been uneasy in the aftermath of Operation Sindoor, India's counterstrike after the Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that left 26 innocents dead. Trump has repeatedly claimed that he brokered the ceasefire between India and Pakistan, a claim denied by the Narendra Modi government. "We had said from day one that our action was non-escalatory. No leader in the world asked us to stop Operation Sindoor," Prime Minister Modi said during the Operation Sindoor debate in Parliament. Tariff hikes have followed these claims.

Jammu and Kashmir bans 25 books for 'radicalising youth, glorifying terrorism'

MI News Sevice, J&K: The Jammu and Kashmir government has banned the publication and circulation of 25 books, including works by prominent authors such as Maulana Maududi, Arundhati Roy, A.G. Noorani, Victoria Schofield, and David Devadas. The books have been deemed by the authorities as promoting "false narratives" and "glorifying terrorism," posing a threat to national sovereignty and integrity.

In an order issued by the Home Department on August 6, the government stated that certain literature circulating in Jammu and Kashmir propagates secessionist ideologies and incites violence. The order, invoking Section 98 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, emphasized that credible intelligence and investigative findings suggest that the dissemination of

such material has played a "critical role" in radicalising the region's youth.

According to the government, the banned books allegedly mislead the public by distorting historical facts, glorifying terrorists, vilifying security forces, and promoting religious radicalisation and alienation. The literature, it said, fosters a "culture of grievance, victimhood, and terrorist her- oism," thus influencing the youth towards extremism.

"These books and publications have been systematically used to excite secessionism and endanger the sovereignty and integrity of India," the order stated, citing Sections 152, 196, and 197 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita as applicable legal grounds for the ban. The government has now declared all existing copies of the listed works to be forfeited.

Israel starves 197 Palestinians to death in Gaza

MI News Sevice, Gaza: Gaza's hospitals have recorded four new deaths "due to famine and malnutrition over the past 24 hours", according to the enclave's Health Ministry, raising the total number of hunger-related deaths to 197, including 96 children.

The United Nations said Israel's blockade of Gaza means the lives of more than 100 premature babies are in "imminent danger", as a lack of fuel impedes "life-saving" operations in hospitals.

Slovenia has announced a ban on all imports from illegal Israeli settlements in the occupied West Bank. Israel's war on Gaza has



killed at least 61,258 people and wounded 152,045. An estimated 1,139 people were killed in Israel during the October 7, 2023, attacks, and more than 200 were taken captive. Israel's assault on the Gaza Strip continued in

the early hours of Thursday morning, with at least 23 people killed in attacks across the enclave since dawn, medical sources tell Al Jazeera.

One more child starved to death in Gaza since dawn, adding to 193

Woman held for promoting Al-Qaeda urged Pak Army chief to invade India: ATS

MI News Sevice, Ahmedabad: A Muslim woman who was arrested last week for allegedly promoting the banned Al-Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS), a banned terror outfit on social media, had appealed to the Pakistan Army General Asim Munir to invade India during Operation Sindoor, to "unify Muslim lands" under "Project Khilafat", Gujarat Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) claims.

Shama Parveen Ansari was arrested from her residence in Bengaluru on July 29 for sharing extremist and anti-India content of the AQIS and some other radical preachers. She ran

two Facebook pages and an Instagram handle comprising over 10,000 followers.

On May 9, two days after India launched Operation Sindoor against terror dens in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), Ansari uploaded a post on her FB account appealing to Gen Munir to seize the "golden opportunity" to attack India, according to a release.

In the FB post, which had the photo of Munir, Ansari stated, "You have a golden opportunity... adopt Project Khilafat for the implementation of Islam, unify Muslim lands, and march forward to eliminate Hindutva and Zionism...So march

forward."

In a video Ansari shared on her Instagram account, she can be heard criticising Indian Muslims for extending their support to the Army and condemning the Pahalgam terror attack.

In another video clip Ansari shared, the Imam of Lahore's Lal Masjid Abdul Aziz can be heard making provocative statements about establishing the Khilafat System in India through armed revolution against the government, said the release.

A third video shows an AQIS leader talking about "Ghazwa-e-Hind" (a law for Islamic war) against the Indian state, particu-

larly targeting members of the Hindu community and institutions of democratic governance, the Gujarat ATS said.

Ansari was linked to one of the four persons nabbed two weeks ago for allegedly sharing the provocative content through their Instagram accounts, as per the Gujarat Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS). These four persons, including two from Gujarat, were arrested from different locations in a multi-state operation, officials earlier said. All five individuals have been booked under various sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

Protests held in Slovenia against Gaza violence

MI News Sevice, Ljubljana: Several hundred people gathered in front of the Slovenian parliament on Wednesday to protest the ongoing violence in the Gaza Strip.

While calling for an immediate ceasefire, the protesters also urged the Slovenian government to end all cooperation between public institutions and their Israeli counterparts.

Waving banners and chanting slogans, the demonstrators expressed solidarity with the Palestinians and demanded concrete action from both the Slovenian authorities and the international community.

"This is the second protest I've attended this

week," said Mija, one of the demonstrators outside the parliament.

The protest was part of a series of public demonstrations held across Slovenia in recent weeks in response to the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

On the same day, more than 50 university professors and scholars released a series of open letters calling on Slovenian universities to suspend all academic ties with Israeli institutions.

"Slovenian universities have an undeniable academic and ethical duty to act in response to the systematic violations of international law and human rights being committed by the State of Israel," one of the letters read.

Asim Munir to become Pakistan's President? Their Army Says...

MI News Sevice, Islamabad: The Pakistan Army has denied as "baseless" the rumours that Army chief Asim Munir plans to become the next president.

The army's response came following rumours and a wave of disinformation on social media during the previous weeks that Munir plans to replace President Asif Ali Zardari.

Army spokesperson Lt Gen Ahmed Sharif Chaudhry, in an interview with The Economist, made it clear that the army chief has no interest in the presidency and no such proposal is under consideration, the state-run PTV posted on social media on Wednesday.

"Talks about Field Marshal Asim Munir becoming



the president of Pakistan are completely baseless," he said.

On July 10, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi rejected rumours regarding the possible ouster of President Zardari and termed it a "malicious campaign." He said that President Zardari "enjoys a strong and respectful relationship with the leadership of the armed forces." Naqvi stressed that Munir's "sole focus" was Pakistan's strength and stability, and "nothing else".

"Move Population, Bomb City": Inside Netanyahu's Gaza takeover plan

MI News Sevice, Gaza: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's security cabinet is expected to meet on Thursday to finalise a decision on the expansion of Israel's military operations in Gaza, despite serious misgivings from senior military officers. The phased plan proposes conquering vast stretches of the Gaza Strip, potentially over five months, again displacing around a million Palestinians, according to a report by The Times of Israel.

Netanyahu has said Israel must "complete" the defeat of the Palestinian group Hamas in order to secure the release of hostages still held in Gaza since the October 2023 attack that triggered the war.

On Wednesday, the Israeli military issued new enforced displacement orders in parts of Gaza City, in the north, and Khan Yunis in the south, adding to fears that the Netanyahu government

is preparing to order the full occupation of the Palestinian territory later this week. The military spokesman said ground troops were preparing to "expand the scope of combat operations".

The Israeli media, citing officials speaking on condition of anonymity, have also predicted an escalation of operations, including in densely populated areas where hostages are believed to be held, such as Gaza City and refugee camps.

Inside Israel's Plan Israel's plan reportedly focuses on first seizing Gaza City and expanding aid distribution centres in coordination with the United States. It aims to destroy what remains of Hamas in the Gaza Strip and pressure the group into freeing 50 hostages it is still holding-- of whom, around 50 are believed to be alive, according to a report by the Times of Israel.
