SC dismisses Justice Varma's plea for invalidation of panel report

MI News Service, New **Delhi**: The Supreme Court on Thursday dismissed Allahabad High Court judge Yashwant Varma's plea seeking invalidation of a report by an in-house inquiry panel, which found him guilty of misconduct in the cash discovery row.

A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and A G Masih said Justice Varma's conduct does not inspire confidence and his plea should not be entertained.

The apex court held that in-house procedure and the judges committee appointed by the then CJI adhered to the stipulated procedure and sending of the report to the Prime minister and President with recommendation for his removal was not unconstitutional.

Justice Varma had contested both the findings of the panel and the CJI's recommendation to the President and Prime Minister for his removal.

ever, dismissed a separate plea filed by a lawyer seeking an FIR in connection with the allegations, stating there was no ground for criminal

The court said Justice Varma's conduct does not inspire confidence, and his plea should not be entertained. The Supreme Court had earlier told Justice Varma that his conduct did not inspire confidence and also defended the CJI's authority to act on any judicial misconduct, saying he cannot be merely a "post office but has certain duties to the nation.

Trump's first tranche of 25 % tariffs on India comes into effect

Though the sweeping new tariffs have been imposed on several countries, India is facing the steepest hike of 50 per cent like Brazil. Earlier last week a 25 per cent tariff on Indian imports came into effect following a directive signed by US President Donald Trump in the White

But in a fresh blow, Trump on Thursday announced an additional 25 per cent duty on India for buying Russian oil, bring-ing the total tariff burden on Indian goods to 50 per cent. The second round of tariffs will come into force on August 27, 21 days from the latest announcement.

The new duties range from 10 per cent to 40 per cent, with countries like Laos and Myanmar facing 40 per cent, Pakistan 19 per cent, Sri Lanka 20 per cent, the UK 10 per cent, and

"The Government of India is currently directly or indirectly importing Russian Federation oil, the order stated. This new tariff, which takes effect August 27, raises the overall duty on most Indian goods to 50 per cent, tying India with Brazil for the highest rate among US trading partners. The measure, enacted under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act, reinforces the national emergency de-clared in 2022 clared concerning Russia. Trump described the action as "necessary and appropriate" to address the continuing threat posed by Russia and maintain existing emergency measures.

While shipments already in transit or cleared before September 17 are exempt, the 25 per cent duty will otherwise apply broadly, in addition to existing addition levies. The US defined "indirect" imports as purchases made via intermediaries or countries where the oil's origin can be traced to Russia.

India strongly con-demned the decision, calling it "unfair, unjustified and unreasonable" The Ministry of External Affairs said its energy imports serve national secuneeds highlighted that European nations continue to trade with Russia at far higher levels.

The tariffs come after months of tense negotiations with several US allies and trade partners. The European Union. Japan, and South Korea accepted a 15 per cent duty on key exports such as automobiles to avoid the higher 25 per cent rate. Others, like Switzerland and India, failed to secure exemptions.

Trump defended his policy by saying some countries have shown willingness to align with US trade and national security interests, while others have not. "There are also some trading partners that have failed to engage in negotiations with the United States or to take adequate steps to align sufficiently with the United States on economic and national security matters," the executive order said.

Economists warn the impact of these tariffs could soon be felt across the US economy. According to Bloomberg Economics, the average US tariff rate has now jumped to 15.2 per

Mamata Banerjee targets voter list overhaul, Bengali identity ahead of 2026 polls

MI News Service, Jhargram:, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Thursday launched a scathing attack on the Election Commission of India (ECI) and the central government over the ongo-ing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll, warning that the exercise could be a veiled attempt to disenfranchise voters, especially from marginalised communities.

Speaking at an event marking World Adivasi (tribal) Day in Jhargram, Mamata Banerjee alleged that the central government was attempting to manipulate the voter list under the guise of bureaucratic formalities. She also pledged to resist what she described as a conspiracy against Bengali identity, indicating that the twin issues of voter disenfran-chisement and linguistic pride would shape her campaign in the 2026 state assembly elections.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has alleged a major conspiracy under the guise of voter list revision. Speaking on the issue, she said, "Everyone must first check whether their name is on the voter list. A new conspiracy is being hatched by the Centre to delete names.'

"If someone tells you to fill out a form promising benefits, don't do it without understanding. Your details could be used to remove your name from the voter list. Then they will send you an NRC notice," New voters should re-

member, parents' certificates will be required. The double-engine government is behind this conspiracy." she added.

Referring to the controversial National Register of Citizens, the Chief Minister alleged that the new voters' list norms require individuals born before or in 2002 to produce their parents' birth certificates. "Only 60% had birth certificates back then. How can those born after 2004 be expected to provide their parents' certificates?" she questioned, calling the demand discriminatory and impracti-Mamata Baneriee further alleged that the Election Commission had changed rules arbitrarily,

saying, "Just possessing an EPIC card isn't enough anymore. You need to cross-check your name in the new voter list." She accused the Centre of targeting state government officials for resisting these changes. "Two of my officers were suspended and sent notices yesterday. On what basis? The elections haven't even been announced yet. I won't let anyone be punished unjustly," she said.

Earlier this week, the Election Commission had recommended against two Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) in West Bengal for alleged lapses in the voter list revision process. The Commission also wrote to West Bengal Chief Secretary Manoj Pant urging discipli-nary action. The Chief minister also turned her fire on BJP leaders for comments allegedly questioning the legitimacy of the Bengali language. "If Bengali is not a language, then in what language was the national anthem written? What language did Tagore, Swamiji, Raja Rammohan Roy, and

Vidyasagar speak?" she asked, adding, "Language is identity. Language is pride.'

In a pointed criticism of the BJP, Mamata Banerjee said, "These people were born with silver spoons in their mouths. They don't understand the struggles of the working

On Thursday, once again from Jhargram, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee launched a sharp attack on the BJP over the alleged harassment of Bengalis in other states, particularly in BJP-ruled states. Targeting the saffron party on the issue, she said, "We have brought back more than 2,000 people. Even now, atrocities continue in states like Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Assam — they are being sent off to Bangladesh."

Her remarks mark a sharp escalation in political rhetoric ahead of the 2026 state elections, with the Trinamool Congress positioning itself as the defender of both voter rights and Bengali cultural iden-

Abhishek Banerjee accuses EC of 'shameless role' in denying voters democratic rights

(TMC) new leader in the Lok Sabha Abhishek Banerjee, MP, on Thursday joined party supremo and Chief minister Mamata Banerjee in launching yet another scathing attack on the Election Commission of India (ECI), accusing it of compromising its constitutional neutrality and attempting to undermine the voting rights of genuine citizens of West Bengal.

Addressing a news conference before leaving for Delhi to attend a dinner at Rahul Gandhi's residence for formulating a joint strategy on Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and discuss fielding a joint candidate for the forthcoming elec-tion of a new Vice Presi-dent (following the resignation of Jagdeep Dhankar), TMC All India General Secretary Abhishek Banerjee said, "The EC also needs to understand and realise that it is an impartial, unbiased organisation and it has to operate within the ambit of

the Constitution."
The TMC MP went on to accuse the poll body of playing an "active and shameless role" in denying legitimate voters their democratic rights.

"Now the EC has taken a shameless role to snatch the voting rights of genuine voters," he alleged. "Yesterday, I saw a re-

port that a residential certificate had been issued under the name of Donald Trump. You should ask the Election Commission about it instead of shooting ques-tions at us," the TMC leader told reporters.

Banerjee also alleged that the ECI was being used by the BJP as a tool "so that the established Bengalis of Bengal, who speak Bengali and live in Bengal cannot exercise their voting rights.'

Questioning the EC's mandate, Banerjee alleged that the poll panel was in-

terfering in areas beyond its jurisdiction.

Defending the autonomy of the elected state government, the TMC second in command after the Chief minister, stressed, "It was voted to power for the third consecutive term in 2021 by 12 crore people of Bengal.

The government is solely committed and accountable to these 12 crore people, not to any political party or any central government, Abhishek Banerjee said

Incidentally, only yesterday while addressing a massive rally at Jhargram Chief minister Mamata Banerjee also came down heavily on the ECI and said it is working as the "puppet of BJP'.

Also ridiculing the Commission for demanding documents for identification of true voters, which are next to impossible for the common voters anywhere in India to produce, for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of ECI, she gave the example of Abhishek Banerjee, who is also her nephew, to explain the difficulties .

'The Election Commission says those born before 2002 will have to produce the birth certificates of their parents. Take Abhishek's example. He was born in 1987. He is now 37 years old. From where will he get the birth certificates of his parents? Can Amit Shah produce the birth certificates of his parents?" Mamata Banerjee asked the people at the meeting here after her third 'Bhasha Andolan" (language movement) march after Kolkata and Bolpur . Since the day Bihar's

SIR drive became public, Mamata Banerjee has been warning that the Commission's real target is Bengal - due to vote next year – and "genuine" vot-ers will be deprived of their right.

India will not compromise, ready to pay heavy price, declares PM Modi

MI News Service, New Delhi: In a subtle message directed towards US President Donald Trump after his announcement of imposing 25 per cent additional tariff on India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Thursday that "India will never compromise on the interests of its farmers and dairy sector", and declared he was "prepared to bear a significant personal cost if necessary"

In a strong statement a day after Trump ratcheted up tariffs on Indian goods to 50 per cent, even as the two nations discuss a bilateral trade deal, Prime minister Modi said though the trade deal has not yet been struck over the US demand for greater access to India's agricultural and dairy market, in any way 'we are not going to comprise any further". . .

Incidentally the US wants reduced tariffs on products like corn, soybeans, apples, almonds and ethanol, as well as increased access for American dairy products. New Delhi is, however, resisting these demands as these will have a direct bearing on farmers.

"Hamare liye apane kisanon ka hit sarvoch prathamikta hai. Bharat apne kisanon, pashu paalakon aur macchuaare bhai-bahanon ke hiton ke saath kabhi bhi samjhuata nahin karega. (For us, the interests of farmers are our top priority. India will never compromise on the interests of its farmers, dairy farmers and fishermen)," Modi said while addressing a

three-day global conference to mark the birth centenary of late renowned agri-scientist M S Swaminathan.

To protect farmers' interests, the Prime minister said he was ready to personally pay the huge price. "Main jaanata hoon ki vyaktigat roop se mujhe bahut badee keemat chukaanee padegee. Lekin main iske liye taiyaar hoon." (I know that I will personally have to pay a heavy price. But I am ready for it).

Further, he said, "Mere desh ke machhuaaron ke liye, mere desh ke pashu paalokon ke liye aaj Bharat taiyaar hai.' (Today, India is ready (to pay the price) for the fishermen and dairy farmers.)

Modi also released a commemorative coin and stamp in honour of the legendary scientist.

During his address, the Prime minister highlighted various schemes implemented by his government for the all-around development of the farm and allied sector. He also stressed the need to sustain food production amid the growing challenges of climate change and called for developing more climate-resilient varieties of crops, including heat-resistant. Trump announced an additional 25 per cent tariff on the South Asian nation on Thursday, taking the total levy on Indian goods being exported to the U.S. to 50 per cent -



"Golden spoon logic won't work"- Mamata Banerjee on SIR

MI News Service, Bolpur: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has once again raised strong objections to the ongoing SIR process, allegation it is a disguised attempt to implement the National Register of Citizens (NRC). Speaking at a Tribal Day event on Bolpur on Thursday, she questioned the practicality and fairness of the documentation requirements being imposed, particularly the demand for parental birth Certificates for the born after 2004.

Referring to recent guidelines reportedly introduced during the SIR process in Bihar, Mamata Banerjee said, "Is it possible for everyone to have their parents' birth certificates?

When I came to power, only 60 percent of people even had their own birth certificates." Highlighting the reality of many citizens who were born at home or lack formal documentation, she remarked, "We are also home-delivered. Many only have school certificates. Do those who practice law or come from privileged backgrounds have such documents? They were born with golden spoons. How can they understand the struggles of ordinary people?" Mamata Banerjee urged the public to be cautious, stating, "No one should fill up any form without knowing what it is for. There is a larger plan in motion. I don't know if I should say this or not, but it seems like a conspiracy to delete names again." She also questioned recent recommendations to suspend government employees under the SIR process. "Under what law are such decisions being taken before the elections? There must be transparency and accountability. This is not the first time the Chief Minister has voiced her concern over the SIR process, which she believes poses a risk to the rights and identity of common citizens. Her latest remarks reflect growing political tension over the issue, with critics warning that the process could disenfranchise large sections of the

Multiple homes vandalized despite security cover

MI News Service, Cooch Behar: Fresh unrest has erupted in the Nazirhat No. 2 Gram Panchayat area of Dinhata, where the homes of four local residents associated with a prominent political organization were allegedly attacked and vandalized on Thursday morning. Among the victims are a current gram panchayat member, a local women's wing leader, a grassroots worker, and a former mandal-level leader. Evewitnesses and victims claim that a group of miscreants stormed the houses, ransacked property, and assaulted family members, including

an elderly woman and a pregnant woman—who has since been hospitalized. The gram panchayat member, who had been granted police protection by a High Court order two months ago, expressed shock that such a serious incident could occur despite security measures being in place. "My house was ambushed early this morning. They beat up my elderly mother and brother-in-law and looted everything they could," she said. The situation has created considerable tension in the area, especially in light of recent allegations of harassment against a high-profile opposition leader in a neighboring region. In response to the allegations, a local regional president of another political group denied any involvement, stating that their leadership was not present in the area at the time. "Our team was in Sahebganj attending a scheduled organizational meeting. I have no idea who carried out the vandalism," he said. Local authorities have launched an investigation into the incident, which has drawn significant public attention due to its brazenness and the apparent failure of previously mandated security measures.

Water dividers collapse, traffic banned

MI News Service, Birb**hum:** A critical situation has emerged at the Tilpara Barrage in Siuri, Birbhum, following the collapse of multiple water dividers, severely affecting the structure's integrity and forcing a complete shutdown of vehicular movement across the barrage. Officials report that uncontrolled sand mining from surrounding sandbanks—both upstream and downstream of the barrage—is the primary cause of structural dam-

age. According to government sources, a significant portion of the barrage deck has already eroded, leading to the collapse of several key water dividers. Cracks in two major dividers were detected days ago, and those have since worsened. On Thursday morning, around five to six smaller dividers collapsed entirely. The downstream section of the barrage has suffered considerable damage, and further collapses are feared as instability in-

creases. Local administration and engineers have rushed to the spot, and repair work is currently underway. However, concerns about a potential disaster have led to strict movement restrictions. While the passage of heavy vehicles was already prohibited, Birbhum Superintendent of Police announced on Thursday that the movement of twowheelers and small fourwheelers has also been banned until further notice. Pedestrians are the

only ones currently allowed to cross the structure. "The repair work is ongoing, but safety remains a major concern. Previously, large vehicles were restricted; now, even small vehicles are not allowed due to visible collapses at certain points. the SP stated. Authorities are continuing to monitor the situation closely, while emphasizing the urgent need to address illegal and excessive sand extraction that has contributed to the

the highest levied on any U.S. trading partner and making it at par with Brazil. "For us, our farmers' welfare is supreme," Modi said adding "India will never compromise on the wellbeing of its farmers, dairy (sector) and fishermen. And I know personally I will have to pay a heavy price for it". Trade talks between India and the United States have reached the fifth round of negotiations over disagreement on opening India's vast farm and dairy sectors and stopping Russian oil purchases. But PM Modi did not directly refer to the U.S. tariffs or trade

The new tariff, effective from August 28, is to penalise India for its purchase of Russian oil. How-India's foreign ministry has said the decision was "extremely unfortunate," and that "India will take all necessary steps to protect its national interests.

The U.S. is yet to announce any similar tariff for China, which is the biggest buyer of Russian oil. Experts have said China has been spared so far as it has a bargaining chip with the U.S. over its reserves of rare earth minerals and other such commodities, which India "The U.S. tariff hike lacks logic," Dammu Ravi, secretary of economic relations in India's foreign ministry has remarked and said that "this is a temporary aberration, a temporary problem that the country will face, but in course of time, we are confident that the world will find solutions.

India has started making moves to signal that it might have to consider other partnerships in the coming months in the face of Trump's tariffs, which have led to the worst diplomatic showdown between the two countries in years.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Modi is preparing for his first visit to China in over seven years, suggesting a potential realignment in alliances as relations with Washington fray.

Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva said on Wednesday he would initiate a conversation among the BRICS group of developing nations about how to tackle Trump's tariffs.

He said he planned to call Modi on Thursday, and China's Xi Jinping and other leaders. The BRICS group also includes Russia and South Africa.

Ravi said "like-minded countries will look for cooperation and economic engagement that will be mutually beneficial to all

Vladimir Putin, informed sources said. Doval arrived in Moscow late Wednesday. The visit comes at a time of growing geopolitical friction, particularly after US President Donald Trump announced an additional 25% levy on India for oil purchases from Russia, raising the total tariff burden on India to 50%, the highest on any US trade partner, along with Brazil.

According to the official Russian news agency TASS, discussions at the meeting included Russian oil supplies, bilateral defence deals, and broader regional security issues. 'The current escalation of the geopolitical situation was also discussed," the agency reported.

Top on the agenda reportedly were the delivery timeline of the remaining S-400 missile systems, which played a pivotal role during the India-Pakistan military standoff and Operation Sindoor in May 2025. This marks Doval's first visit to Russia since Operation Sindoor, though he met with Russian officials at the SCO NSA meet in Beijing in June.

Another key issue likely to surface is Russia's recent recognition of the Taliban regime in Afghanistan, a move that

has implications for India. Doval's visit will be followed by a broader diplomatic engagement, with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar scheduled to visit Russia in the third week of August for the India-Russia Inter-Govern-Commission (IRIGC-TEC) meeting. The IRIGC-TEC is the principal mechanism for managing bilateral trade, economic, scientific, and technological cooperation. India last hosted the commission's meeting in November 2024; it is now Russia's turn to convene the dialogue. Jaishankar's visit comes at a critical juncture, with tensions rising over Washington's escalat-ing tariffs on Indian goods—linked to New Delhi's continued oil imports from Russia.

Given the IRIGC's mandate to address trade and economic issues, sources said the energy partnership with Russia and the US threat of punitive economic measures will be central to discussions during Jaishankar's visit.

The high-level engagement underscores India's intent to protect its strategic autonomy while deepening ties with Russia, especially in energy and defence, despite pressure from the West.

The NSA's meetings in Moscow took place a day after Russian President Vladimir Putin held talks with US Special Envoy Steve Witkoff, who is attempting a last-ditch diplomatic push to secure a Ukraine ceasefire before the August 8 deadline set by Trump, who has threatened further sanctions if breakthrough achieved.

Abhishek mocks Centre over Trump voter list incident and 50% tariff row

namool Congress national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee launched a scathing attack on the central government on Thursday, accusing both of bias, failure, and complicity in democratic processes. Speaking to the media at Kolkata's Dum Dum Airport before leaving for Delhi to offi-cially take charge as TMC's leader in the Lok Sabha, Banerjee launched a sharp attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi after former U.S. President Donround of 25% tariffs on India, reportedly citing India's oil trade with Russia as the reason. This brings the total additional tariff to 50%. Taking a dig at Modi, Abhishek said, "Questions about Donald Trump should be directed at those who posed for photos with him, those who campaigned for him in Texas, and those whom Trump himself came to India to campaign for."

Highlighting the economic implications, he added, "A 50% tariff will undoubtedly have

pharmaceuticals, textiles, and other services will suffer. Employment will decline, and this will impact India's economy. It's a clear diplomatic failure, and India must respond firmly."

Abhishek continued his criticism, saying, "The government that once boasted of a 56-inch chest is now being humiliated by countries like China and the U.S. I've visited 11 nations as part of delegations - not one has issued a single condemnation against Pakistan, let alone applying pressure. Whose failure is this?" Banerjee referred to Trump's recent announcement that the U.S. will impose a 50% import duty on Indian products - a move that could significantly impact Indian exporters. While Modi responded saying India

would never compromise its farmers' and fishermen's interests, Banerjee dismissed the Centre's diplomacy as a failure. "This is a clear diplomatic failure of the Modi government. It will cost us jobs and economic damage," he said. Banerjee also took

suspension of MGNREGA. AwasYojana, and Jal Jeevan Mission funds to West Bengal, framing it as part of a broader pattern of political discrimination. Banerjee didn't spare the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) either. "We respect the judiciary, but CBI has lost public trust due to political misuse," he added.

Stringent monitoring for 'Taruner Swapna' scheme to prevent fund misuse

MI News Service, Kolkata: In a significant move to entransparency and prevent financial irregularities, the West Bengal government has introduced a more stringent monitoring process for the disbursement of financial aid under the 'Taruner-Swapna' scheme — an initiative aimed at supporting Higher Secondary students purchasing mobile phones or tablets. Under the scheme, eligible students receive a one-time grant of ₹10,000 to facilitate their academic needs in the digital age.

This year, following reports of misappropriation in the previous cycle, the disbursement process has been meticulously restructured. A detailed process flow chart outlining each step of the application and verification procedure has already been circulated to all educational institutions across the state.

The scheme extends to both general stream and vocational students at the Higher Secondary level. However, specific instructions and additional clarifications have been issued this year, particularly for students under the Technical Education Department's vocational stream. These guidelines will be equally applicable to students in the general stream.

Last year, multiple complaints emerged re-

garding funds being credited to incorrect or unauthorized accounts, instead of reaching the intended student beneficiaries. Subsequent investigations led to the arrest of several individuals, including contractual teaching and non-teaching staff from different schools.

To prevent a recurrence, the government has now mandated strict oversight at every stage of the application and verification process. Each student will receive an application form from their respective school. To apply, students must submit a duly filled form along with photocopies of their bank passbook, a cancelled cheque, and Aadhaar card.

Metro to replace water cool chillers with air cool chillers to conserve ground water

Service

Kolkata: Rapid depletion of ground water reserve is a big concern for the world. With the advent of new technologies and progress of civilization, natural resources like water are being used more and more. Experts have already warned about the negative impact of such extensive use of ground water on mother nature. Ground water is part of hydrologic cycle. Ground water contributes to streams in most physiographic and climatic settings. It may cause land subsidence. It takes thousands of years to accumulate ground water. So, ground water depletion means we are extracting more than what is being replenished. In order to preserve precious ground water in a densely populated city like Kolkata, Metro Railway, Kolkata has taken a great initiative and is going to introduce modern alternative cooling system in Blue Line, India's oldest Metro Corridor soon. For this, a tender has already been opened and evaluation work is going on. After evaluation, the work order will be placed. Work will commence from 2026 and

will be completed by 2029. In this initiative, out of 15 underground stations, the cooling system of 11 underground stations of Blue Line is earmarked for change from traditional water cool chiller to air cool chiller immediately. The familiar scene of cooling towers outside Metro stations is going to change. For this ambitious project, Central Government has already allotted 150 Cr. Once this is implemented, Metro Railway will be able to save 18 crore litters of ground water consumption annually. This amount of ground water is required to run the water cool chillers for making Metro stations cool every year. Once air cool chiller replaced the water cool chillers then this huge amount of water

will be saved which in turn help to protect environment and water resources. A study on ground water resources has shown that at Borough VII and Borough VIII of Kolkata Municipal Corporation ground water level is declining at a rate of 30 cm per year in comparison to 11 cm per year in other boroughs. This initiative will help to arrest this trend and ground water level will be preserved for posterity. This initiative shall certainly reduce the rate of fall of ground water in Kolkata. Ground water depletion scenario is placed below:

erage: (-19%) In Blue Line there are 46 water cool chillers expiring its codal life at eleven different stations now. Out of which

30 water cool chillers of eight stations are earmarked for immediate replacement, Remaining water cool chillers located at Netaji Bhawan, Jatin Das Park, Maidan and Mahatma Gandhi Road stations are earmarked for replacement by air cooled chillers and Metro Railway is committed to funding civil works required for creating space for air cooled chillers. Final decision will be taken after discussion with the experts and detailed design consultant. Water cooled chillers of Rabindra Sarobar, Kalighat, Chandni Chowk are expiring its codal life within three years. They will be also converted to air cooled chillers immediately before they expire its codal life.

record-breaking global temperatures is over for now, according to climate agency Copernicus, even as July 2025 ranked as the third-warmest July on record worldwide.


The agency also reported that the past 12 months (August 2024 to July 2025) were 1.53 degrees Celsius warmer than the pre-industrial average.

The agency said July's global average surface air temperature of 16.68 degrees Celsius was 0.45 degrees Celsius above the 1991-2020 average for the month.

It said July 2025 was 0.27 degree Celsius cooler than the record of July 2023 and 0.23 degree Celsius cooler than July 2024, which was the second

Scientists at Copernicus Climate Change Service (Ĉ3S) said July 2025 was 1.25 degrees Celsius above the estimated 1850-1900 average used to define the pre-industrial level.

Researchers identify new potential treatment for cardiac arrhythmias

Arizona [US] : A recent study by researchers at the University of Arizona College of Medicine - Phoenix and the University of California Davis Health discovered a new target for developing a medication to treat atrial fibrillation, the most prevalent kind of irregular heart rhythm.

According to the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, atrial fibrillation, also known as AFib or AF, accounts for approximately one in every seven strokes and is associated with a considerable increase in morbidity and death. The American Heart Association predicts that more than 12 million people will have AFib by 2030, and existing treatment approaches are inadequate, according to researchers.

Proteins involved in physiological processes of the heart have been a target of research for AFib for some time. Until recently, most research suggested that treating AFib through inhibition of specific small-conductance calcium-activated potassium channels, or SK channels, could either reduce or worsen arrhythmias under different conditions.

"Our study used pioneering experimental and computational approaches to decipher how the human SK2 channel can be dynamically co-regulated. The study is especially timely considering inhibitors of SK channels are currently in clinical trials to treat AFib, making further insight into their regulatory mechanisms paramount," said Nipavan Chiamvimonvat, MD, chair of the Department of Basic Medical Sciences at the U of A College of Medicine - Phoenix. The paper, "Atomistic Mechanisms of the Regulation of Small Conductance Ca2+-Activated K+ channel (SK2) by PIP2," was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

WHO updates recommendations on use of antibiotics for COVID-19 patients

Delhi ;The World Health Organisation (WHO) has advised against the use of antibiotics even in patients with severe Covid when a concurrent bacterial infection is not sus-

The global health body has released updated recommendations for the clinical management of people with Covid which, it said, are based on evidence generated from recent metaanalysis of outcomes of patients treated with antibiotics for the virus.

"For patients with non-severe COVID-19 and a low clinical suspicion of a concurrent bacterial infection, we recommend no empirical antibiotics. For patients with severe COVID-19 and a low clinical suspicion of a concurrent bacterial infection, we suggest no empirical antibiotics," the WHO said.

The WHO said that as COVID-19 epidemiology and severity have changed, and as emergency measures have subsided, the evidence behind a number of recommendations has

In parallel, evolution of health systems and the global environment have meant that the recommendations are implemented in a very different context

in 2024 compared to 2020. These guidelines have evolved from the first version in 2020 in line with new information and changing circumstances of the pandemic, the WHO

"Notable changes to COVID-19 disease over this time have been overall reduced infection rates and reduced disease severity. Emergency measures which were imposed have also been removed, and care for patients with COVID-19 has become more integrated with usual healthcare systems.

This different environment has prompted a review of the scope and content of all existing guidance. In order to maintain a clear focus and relevance, we have removed recommendations which would be considered general medical principles, and those which are no longer specific to the management of COVID-19," the WHO said.

The new recommendations on use of antibiotics were prompted by the publication of data from a systematic review and meta-analysis, and the pressing need to address antimicrobial

The WHO said the updated guidelines are for people directly or indirectly involved in the health care of patients with Covid and post COVID-19 condition. This includes clinicians, allied health care workers, facility managers and hospital administrators.

The SARS-CoV-2 continues to infect several thousands of people daily leading to preventable morbidity and mortality across the world, the WHO

The roll-out of vaccines and treatment for COVID-19, and increasing population immunity from infection has substantially reduced hospitalization, severity of disease, and mortality.

"However, the virus continues to evolve in terms of infectivity, immune escape, and disease severity. This guideline robustly and transparently addresses the changing landscape and evidence availability, and the continual development of treatment and management strategies for COVID-19," the

Researchers discover that unique immune cells stop metastatic cancer

New York [US]: The majority of cancer deaths are caused by metastatic disease, which occurs when cancer spreads from the primary tumour to other areas of the body. and researchers understand how cancer cells escape the primary location to seed new tumours, it is unclear why some cancer cells produce new tumours decades later and others do not. A research team at the National Cancer Institute-designated Montefiore Einstein Comprehensive Cancer Centre (MECCC) has uncovered a natural immunological response in mice that prevents escaping cancer cells from growing into tumours elsewhere in the body. The study was published

today in the journal Cell.
"Preventing or curing metastases is the most critical challenge in cancer," said study leader Julio Aguirre-Ghiso, Ph.D., director of MECCC's Cancer Dormancy Institute. "We think our findings have the potential to point to new therapies to prevent or treat metastatic disease." The study's cofirst authors are Erica Dalla, Ph.D., a former student, and Michael Papanicolaou, Ph.D., a postdoctoral fellow in Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso's lab.

Cells that migrate from primary tumors and seed metastatic tumors are called disseminated cancer cells (DCCs). Some DCCs behave aggressively, immediately starting tumors in new tissue, while others remain in a state of suspended animation referred to as dormancy. "It's long been a mystery how some DCCs can remain in tissues for decades and never cause metastases, and we believe we've found the explanation," said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso, who is also professor of cell biology, of oncology, and of medicine and the Rose C. Falkenstein Chair in Cancer Research at Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Breast cancer and many other types of cancer metastasize to the lungs. In research involving three mouse models of metastatic breast cancer, Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso and colleagues determined that when breast cancer DCCs spread to the lung's air sacs (alveoli), they are kept in a dormant state by immune cells known as alveolar macronly

"Alveolar macrophages are the lung's first responders, defending the organ against bacteria and dangerous substances like environmental pollutants," said Dr. Aguirre-Ghiso. These specialized macrophages, he notes, appear early in embryonic development and reside within lung tis-

Researchers find how cells recognize, repair DNA damage

Wurzburg [Germany] : When cells divide, there is a substantial risk of genetic harm. After all, the cell must repeat its whole genetic material, including billions of genetic letters, before it can divide. This repeatedly produces "reading errors" in the genome. Other factors, including as exposure to sunlight, alcohol, and cigarettes, are also responsible for the buildup of DNA damage over a person's lifetime.

Of course, the cell is not impotent in the presence of such injuries. It contains a large library of biological mechanisms that are activated in response to DNA damage. The precise term for this is DNA damage response (DDR). Specific signaling pathways are usually responsible for the immediate recognition and repair of DNA damage, ensuring the cell's survival.

A team of scientists from Julius-Maximilians-Universitat Wurzburg (JMU) in Bavaria, Germany, has recently conducted a closer examination of one of these signaling routes. The researchers discovered a new mechanism for the DNA damage response that is mediated by an RNA transcript. Their findings serve to widen the conceptual perspective of the DNA damage response and link it more closely



The experiments conducted by Kaspar Burger and his team show that the frequent occurrence of DNA double-strand breaks causes excessive methylation of NEAT1,



which leads to changes in the NEAT1 secondary structure. As a result, highly methylated NEAT1 accumulates at some of these lesions to drive the recognition of broken DNA. In turn, experimentally induced suppression of NEAT1 levels delayed the DNA damage response, resulting in increased amounts of DNA dam-

NEAT1 itself does not repair DNA damage. However, as the Wurzburg team discovered, it enables the controlled release and activation of an RNA-binding DNA repair factor. In this way, the cell can recognize and repair DNA damage highly efficiently.

According to the scientists, knowledge about the role of NEAT1 methylation in the recognition and repair of DNA damage could open up new therapeutic options for tumors with high NEAT1 expression. However, it must first be clarified whether these results, which were obtained in simple cell systems, can also be transferred to complex tumor models.

In a major decision, the Gujarat government announced mandatory learning of the Bhagwad Gita in the first language textbooks for Classes 9 to 12.

The textbooks will now contain the Bhagavad Gita's value-based chapters in Gujarati, Urdu, Hindi and English.

The move is part of the state's implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, rolled out by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led Union government.

The NEP 2020 policy introduced by the Centre focuses on incorporating ancient Indian culture, traditions, and knowledge systems in the country's system. The education Bhagavad Gita is the most read spiritual and religious book in India among Hindus. Throughout history, non-Hindus have also looked at it for spiritualism and translated it into other languages, including Persian by Mughal prince Dara Shukoh (son of Shah Jahan).

However, the move is likely seen as yet another extension of the growing and overt influ-ence of Hindutva policy on India's education system. A few years ago, the then-BJP-led Karnataka government banned hijabs in schools, triggering nationwide protests and disrupting the education of Muslim girls who faced discrimination.



Of the 30 players who made the cut, Champions League winners Paris Saint-Germain had the most in the list with nine from the club. Ousmane Dembele, Gianluigi Donnarumma, Desire Doue, Achraf Haikimi, Khvicha Kvaratskhelia, Nuno Mendes, Joao Neves, Vitinha and Fabian Ruiz were the nominations from PSG with most of the names being on





expected lines. Barcelona and Liverpool were the next most dominant clubs in the 30-member list with four players apiece from their respective sides. Robert Lewandowski, Lamine Yamal, Raphinha and Pedri were the nominees from the La Liga champions. Meanwhile, their archrivals Real Madrid had three nominations with Kylian Mbappe, Vinicius Jr and Jude Bellingham making the cut.

Premier League champions Liverpool had new-signing Florian Wirtz making the cut while the usual suspects in Mohammad Salah, Virgil van Dijk and Alexis Mac Allister were the players to make the list from the Reds. The voting system for the 30-member list officially opens today with the winner of the award to be announced in September.

REVEALED: How Rohit Sharma's intervention made Yashasvi Jaiswal make a crucial career decision



ashasvi Jaiswal is one of **■** India's next-gen superstars across all formats. Known for his attacking style of play and fearless attitude at the crease, Jaiswal has already made a name for himself in India's Test side, averaging 50-plus from 24 Tests with six hundreds and 12 fifties. Two of those tons came on India's recent tour of England which ended 2-2. In T20Is, Jaiswal's strike-rate is an astounding 164 from a sample size of 23 games and he has a century alongside five fifties to his name. The only drawback for him thus far is that Jaiswal has played just a solitary ODI game in his career. That should, of course, change with time as the

senior players are phased out from the side.

While it all looks good for Jaiswal in international cricket, he was on the verge of a stunning domestic transfer from Mumbai to Goa earlier this year. Allegedly disappointed at not getting the required seniority in the side, the southpaw had readied the formalities for the move to Goa, also submitting an NOC request to the Mumbai Cricket Association. Jaiswal's exit seemed a near certainty as the MCA aren't known to be cold towards their players in such situations. Remember, Prithvi Shaw with a more controversial scenario got his NOC smoothly with no hassles at all. Therefore,

Jaiswal's transfer seemed a done deal and that's when veteran Rohit Sharma intervened in this

Rohit was captain when Jaiswal made his Test debut and the duo has shared immense rapport as an batting pair at the top of the order. Most importantly, Jaiswal has huge respect for Rohit, like most young players in India's setup. A source close to the MCA admitted to the Mumbai Mirror that Rohit's timely intervention made Jaiswal rethink his move and eventually, the 23year-old reversed his stance of moving away from the Mumbai

"Rohit asked Yashasvi to stay on in Mumbai at this stage of his career," MCA president Ajinkya Naik said in his chat with Mumbai Mirror.

"He (Rohit) explained to Yashasvi that there was a lot of pride and prestige in playing for a team like Mumbai, which has won the Ranji Trophy a record

"Rohit also told Yashasvi that he must not forget that it was because of Mumbai cricket that he got a platform to show his talent and go on to play for India, and he must be grateful to the city for that. It was here in Mumbai that he started playing cricket on the maidans and then was picked for all the age group teams of Mumbai," he added.

After having a constructive discussion with his senior teammate and former captain, Jaiswal decided to reverse his stance on leaving the Mumbai

host Group D of the Qualifiers from November 22 to 30, 2025. India will begin the Qualifiers with a clash against Palestine (November 22) before taking on Chinese Taipei (November 26), Lebanon (November 28) and Iran (November 30).

The draw saw 38 teams divided into seven groups -- three of six teams each and four of five. They will contest the Qualifiers in a single round-robin centralised league format, with the seven group winners progressing to the 21st edition of the Finals, where they will join the nine AFC representatives from the FIFA U17 World Cup 2025 who have automatically qualified --Uzbekistan, Saudi Arabia, Korea Republic, DPR Korea, Japan, Tajikistan, United Arab Emirates and Indonesia.

For the Qualifiers draw, the 38 teams were seeded into six pots based on a points system derived from their final rankings across the previous three editions of the Finals. India was seeded in Pot 2 and placed in a separate Hosts Pot before the draw to ensure they

were not drawn in the same group as other hosts

The AFC U17 Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2026 will take place from May 7 to 24, 2026, and the top eight finishers will qualify for the FIFA U17 World Cup Qatar 2026. After missing out on qualifying

for the 2025 tournament, India will aim to bounce back and appear in the AFC U-17 Asian Cup for the 10th time in history.

While the mutual admiration has always been there about their respective cricketing skills, Dhoni also went on to add a juicy bit of info on how things are off the field between them.

"He also sings well. He is a good singer. He is a good dancer. He is good in mimicry. If he is in the mood, he is very, very enter-

taining," said Dhoni about Kohli at the event.

It was under Dhoni's captaincy that Kohli made his international debut in 2008. There have been multiple stories about how the Jharkhand man had immense faith in Kohli during the latter's early days and backed him no

That the depth of their relation is still intact is proven from Kohli's statements in recent years. The 36-year-old had been facing a decline in the last five years including shocking captaincy exits from all formats in 2021-22. It was also a time when his form in all three formats was dipping. While he managed to dig himself up in white-ball cricket, Kohli ended his Test career on a disappointing note.

However, during his emotionally low moments, Kohli revealed how Dhoni was the only cricketer who stood by him for moral sup-

"The only person who, apart from my childhood coach and family, genuinely reached out to me has been MS Dhoni. He (Dhoni) reached out to me and you can rarely get in touch with



day, 99 per cent he will not pick up (the phone), because he just does not look at the phone. So, for him to reach out to me, twice it has happened now, and one of the things that he'd mentioned in the message while reaching out to me was that: 'when you are expected to be strong and looked at as a strong individual, people forget to ask how are you

doing? Meanwhile, Dhoni continued to give his trademark poker face when asked about his IPL future. Kings franchise is part of folklore and the former India captain chose to leave the audiences in a bit of suspense, as he always "I have always said that there

is a lot of time for me to decide, but if you are asking about coming back in a yellow jersey I we will always be in a yellow jersey, whether I am playing or not, is a different matter," Dhoni said.
