Shukla who has begun his long-awaited journey back to India after successfully completing the Ax-4 mission, marking a historic milestone as the first Indian aboard the International Space Station, shared an emotional message as he boarded his flight home. "As I sit on the plane to

come back to India, I have a mix of emotions running through my heart. I feel sad leaving a fantastic group of people behind who were my friends and family for the past one year during this mission. I am also excited about meeting all my friends, family and everyone in the country for the first time post mission. I guess this is what life is — everything all at once," Shukla reflected. The Ax-4 mission, launched under Axiom Space's commercial programme with international collaboration, saw Shukla engage in critical research experiments, outreach initiatives, and operational work supporting next-generation space objectives His presence on the mission was celebrated not only as a personal achievement but also as a moment of pride for India, highlighting the country's growing role in global space exploration.

Acknowledging the support he received, Shukla wrote, "Having received incredible love and support from everyone during and after the mission, I can't wait to come back to India to share my experiences with all of you. Goodbyes are

Trump signals US may not impose secondary tariffs on India over Russian oil

MI News Service, Washington (DC): President Donald Trump has indicated that the US may not impose secondary tariffs on countries including India, for continuing to procure Russia crude oil. There were apprehensions that additional secondary tariffs would have hit India in case the US decided to enforce them.

"Well, he (Russian President Vladimir Putin) lost an oil client, so to speak, which is India, which was doing about 40 per cent of the oil. China, as you know, is doing a lot...And if I did what's called a secondary sanction, or a secondary tariff, it would be very devastating from their standpoint. If I have to do it, I'll do it. Maybe I won't have to do it," Trump said on Friday. The US president made the remarks in an interview with Fox News aboard Air Force One en route to Alaska for a high-stakes summit meeting with Putin. The meeting, however, concluded without reaching any agreement on ending the Russia-Ukraine war.

Independent counseling: Higher Edu Dept denies nod to JU

The state Higher Education department has reportedly turned down a proposal by Jadavpur University (JU) to conduct an independent spot counselling round for undergraduate engineering admissions, sources within the university have confirmed. The proposal, submitted by JU's Dean of Engineering and Technology, Saroj Mandal, sought to hold a single round of decentralised, on-the-spot counselling for admission to approximately 1,200 seats across 15 engineering departments, immediately after the results of the West Bengal Joint Entrance Examination (WBJEE) 2025 are declared. The plan was intended to fast-track admissions in view of the delay in the publication of WBJEE results. The WBJEE 2025 was held on April 27, but the results have been delayed due to legal complications surrounding OBC reservations. According to sources, the Directorate of Technical Education under the Higher Education department has rejected the proteachers' association, JUTA, has criticised the decision, arguing that decentralised counselling would have expedited admissions and ensured the timely commencement of classes, something the university has successfully managed in the past.

Trump signals US may not impose secondary tariffs on India over Russian oil

will take all necessary measures to safeguard its national interests and economic security," it said.

Meanwhile, the tariffs

imposed on India for pur-chases of Russian oil may have pushed New Delhi further into the Beijing-Moscow axis and this lack of focus by Washington is an "unforced error", a former top White House official has said. National Security Adviser during the first Trump administration John Bolton made the comments a day before the "high-stakes" summit meeting between Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin in Anchorage, Alaska on Friday. "When Trump slapped tariffs on India for buying Russian oil, but not China which also purchases Russia oil, it may have pushed India further into the Beijing-Moscow axis. This lack of focus by the Trump Admin is an unforced error," Bolton said in a post on X. Experts have pointed out that Washington has not imposed similar duties on China, which buys significantly more Russian energy

than Delhi. Bolton, who was present for the first summit between Trump and Putin in Helsinki in 2018, noted that

the White House has imposed secondary tariffs on countries like India for buying oil and gas from Russia. "They have slapped the 25 per cent tariff on India, although it hasn't gone into effect yet. I can tell you the reaction in India to that. particularly with no tariff slapped on China, which bought an awful lot more oil and gas from Russia, is the Indians are incandescent about this," Bolton said. Bolton referred to the possible visit by Putin to India later this year and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to China for the first time since 2018. "Obviously both Moscow and Beijing are going to try to bring India closer to them. I mean, this could have negative consequences (for the US), because it wasn't well thought through,' Bolton said. Last week, when Modi had a telephone conversation with Putin, he invited the Russian leader to India later this year for the 23rd India-Russia Annual Summit. Modi is expected to travel to China later this month, after a gap of over seven years, to attend the Tianjin Summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation to be held from August 31 to Septem-

High Court upholds Rs 14.49 Cr arbitral award to Sourav Ganguly



The Calcutta High Court recently dismissed a petition filed by Percept Talent Management Ltd. and its affiliate, upholding an arbitral award of Rs 14.49 crore in favour of former Indian cricket captain Sourav Ganguly. The case arose from a 2003 Player Representation Agreement (PRA) under which Ganguly had appointed Percept as his exclusive commercial manager. The bench of Justice Ravi Krishan Kapur ruled that the arbitral award dated December 9, 2018, along with a supplementary award dated March 8, 2019, required no interference under Section 34 of the Arbitration

and Conciliation Act, 1996. tribunal awarded Ganguly Rs 14.49 crore, with 12 per cent annual interest from November 21, 2007, until the date of payment, as well as Rs 50 lakh in legal costs. The dispute arose after Percept terminated the PRA on November 21, 2007, citing Ganguly's non-selection in the Indian cricket team for a continuous period of over six months in 2006. However, the tribunal found that Ganguly's re-selection in November 2006 ended the event of variation that triggered the right to terminate. The High Court upheld this reasoning, noting that the contract required such rights to be exercised while the variation continued. The court also noted that Percept continued to manage Ganguly's commercial affairs after issuing the termination notice, amounting to a waiver of the termination.

The sheer extent of the burglary has left the family and the neighborhood stunned. Bula Choudhury, now residing in Kolkata, occasionally visits the Uttarpara home. On hearing of the theft, she rushed to the spot and broke down in tears as she realized that her lifetime achievements had been looted. "I have brought honor to the country. But the administration has no responsibility to protect that honor? Is

voice choked with emotion. This is not the first time the house has been targeted. Family members revealed that the Uttarpara residence has been burgled three times in the past, prompting repeated complaints to the police. A police picket was once stationed, but it was withdrawn after a few days. Since then, the house has remained unguarded and vulnerable. Following the complaint, senior officials including Uttarpara Police Station IC Amitabh Sanyal, ACP Ali Raja, and Serampore DCP Arnab Biswas visited the site. Gold, cash worth Rs10 lakh recovered in Bakura Burglary bust

Study reveals how intake of ultra-processed foods associated with increased risk of death

CHICAGO: Older persons who reported consuming more ultraprocessed foods were nearly 10 per cent more likely to die after a median follow-up of 23 years than older adults who reported consuming less processed food, according to a recent study.

The results are drawn from a sizable study that followed more than 500,000 persons in the United States for about thirty years. The findings showed that consuming more ultra-processed foods was linked to slight increases in deaths from heart disease and diabetes, as well as deaths from all causes. However, there was no correlation observed in deaths from cancer.

Our study results support a larger body of literature, including both observational and experimental studies, which indicate that ultra-processed food intake adversely impacts health and longevity," said Erikka Loftfield, PhD, Stadtman Investigator at the National Cancer Institute. "However.

Study finds how new blood test helps imprové cancer treatments



ZURICH [SWITZERLAND]: The likelihood that treatment will be successful for cancer increases with early detection. Almost every kind of cancer is covered by this. Evaluating the advantages and disadvantages of each type of therapy on an individual basis and keeping a regular eve on treatment outcomes are also essential components of effective patient care.

Oncologists have various techniques at their disposal to accomplish this, including the use of imaging equipment and invasive procedures including punctures, tissue samples, and endoscopic procedures.

An improved technique, a kind of liquid biopsy that examines blood samples rather than organs or tissues, has recently been further developed by researchers at the University of Zurich (UZH) and the University Hospital

The method sequences and analyses DNA fragments circulating in the blood of patients. "Our method can be used in the future for risk assessments, treatment monitoring during follow-up care and early detection of cancer recurrence, in principle for all types of tumors," said Zsolt Balazs, co-first author of the study at the UZH Department of Quantitative Biomedicine.

Since the method is based on blood samples, it is less invasive than performing tissue biopsies, for example. Moreover, taking blood samples is fast and more practical in day-to-day hospital operations, as fewer appointments for diagnostic interventions are needed, sparing those affected lengthy waits.

The new method for analysing liquid biopsies can help oncologists more accurately determine tumour activity and spread. This will enable them to develop therapies that are tailored to individual patients. "We can see earlier and more quickly how much the cancer has spread in the body and how well a patient is responding to a specific treatment, or whether there will be a relapse," said

In the lab, the researchers analysed the gene fragments circulating in the blood for changes in the DNA that are characteristic of the specific type of cancer. The method analysed alterations in the number and length distribution of the fragments. "The liquid biopsy technique enables us to discriminate between biologically less and more aggressive metastatic cancer disease - perhaps even earlier than using imaging technology," said co-first author Panagiotis Balermpas, a professor at the Department of Radiation Oncology at USZ.

The researchers tested their method on patients

undergoing radiotherapy, including several HPV-positive patients. HPV stands for human papillomavirus, which can also cause cancer. The number of HPV DNA fragments found in the blood allowed the researchers to observe the development of tumours. For head and neck cancer, they found that a higher concentration of HPV DNA might be an early indication of cancer recurrence, which could be combated using immunotherapy.

"The more a tumour metastasizes, the poorer the patient's quality of life. This also applies to local recurrences that aren't detected early. It is key that we individualise treatment as far as possible, taking into account the potential benefits of all therapies as well as their influence on the patient's quality of life," concluded Balermpas, who oversaw the treatment of patients with head and neck tumours in the study.

Study finds key steps in stem cell therapy for rare bowel disease



LONDON: Hirschsprung disease patients may benefit from stem cell therapy, according to a recent study conducted by scientists at the Universities of Sheffield and UCL

In the case of Hirschsprung disease, a small number of nerve cells in the large intestine are absent. Due to the intestine's inability to contract and transport stool, blockages may occur. This may result in constipation and, in rare cases, a dangerous intestinal infection known as enterocol-

Around 1 in 5000 babies are born with Hirschsprung disease. The condition is usually picked up soon after birth and treated with surgery as soon as possible however patients frequently suffer debilitating, lifelong symptoms, with multiple surgical procedures often required.

Alternative treatment options are therefore crucial. One option that has been explored by researchers involves using stem cell therapy to generate nerve cell precursors, which then produce the missing nerves in the intestine of those with Hirschsprung disease after transplantation. This in turn should improve the intestine's func-

However, this procedure has not been carried out on human tissue from people with

Hirschsprung disease until now.

The research, published in Gut and funded by the Medical Research Council, is a collaborative effort between researchers at UCL and the University of Sheffield which began in 2017

Researchers at the University of Sheffield focused on the production and analysis of nerve precursors from stem cells. These were then shipped to the UCL team, who prepared the patient gut tissue, undertook the transplantation and maintenance of the tissue and then tested the function of the tissue segments.

The study involved taking tissue samples donated by GOSH patients with Hirschsprung disease as a part of their routine treatment which were then cultured in the lab. The samples were then transplanted with stem cell-derived nerve cell precursors which then developed into the crucial nerve cells within the gut tissue.

Importantly the transplanted gut samples showed increased ability to contract compared to control tissue suggesting improved functionality of the gut in those with the disease.

Principal Investigator, Dr Conor McCann (UCL Great Ormond Street Institute of Child Health) said: "This study is a real breakthrough in our cell therapy work for Hirschsprung disease. It really shows the benefit of bringing the expertise of different groups together which will hopefully benefit children and adults living with Hirschsprung dis-

Dr Anestis Tsakiridis, Principal Investigator at University of Sheffield said: "This has been a fantastic collaboration, led by two talented early career scientists, Dr Ben Jevans and Fay Cooper. Our findings have laid the foundations for the future development of a cell therapy against Hirschsprung disease and we will continue our efforts to bring this to the clinic in the next few

The results of this study demonstrate for the first time the potential of stem cell therapy to improve the functionality of the intestine in those with Hirschsprung disease which, in turn, could lead to improved symptoms and better outcomes for individuals with the disease.

Researchers find how physical exercise prevents nerve damage during chemotherapy

BASEL [SWITZERLAND] : Damage to nerves brought on by cancer therapies frequently results in symptoms that endure a lifetime. In some circumstances, medication has not worked. Simple exercises can prevent nerve injury, according to research. The research was conducted

by an interdisciplinary German team led by a sports scientist at the University of Basel. Over time, advancements have been made in cancer therapy. The quality of life following rehabilitation is becoming increasingly important; it is no longer only about surviving. Unfortunately, many cancer medications, from chemotherapy to modern immunotherapies, attack the nerves as well as the tumour cells. Some therapies, such as oxaliplatin or vinca alkaloids, leave 70 to 90 per cent of patients complaining of pain, balance issues, or feelings of numbness, burning or tingling.

These symptoms can be very debilitating. They can disappear following cancer treatment, but in around 50 per cent they become chronic. Specialists call it chemotherapy-induced peripheral neuropathy, or CIPN for short.

A research team led by sports scientist Dr Fiona Streckmann from the University of Basel and the German Sport University Cologne has now shown that specific exercise, concomitant to cancer therapy, can prevent nerve damage in many cases. The researchers have reported their findings in the journal JAMA Internal Medicine.

The study involved 158 cancer patients, both male and



treatment either with oxaliplatin or vinca-alkaloids. The researchers divided the patients at random into three groups. The first was a control group, whose members received standard care. The other two groups completed exercise sessions twice a week for the duration of their chemotherapy, with each session lasting between 15 and 30 minutes. One of these groups carried out exercises that focused primarily on balancing on an increasingly unstable surface. The other group trained on a vibration plate.

Regular examinations over the next five years showed that in the control group around twice as many participants developed CIPN as in either of the exercise groups. In other words, the exercises undertaken alongside chemotherapy were able to reduce the incidence of nerve damage by 50 to 70 per cent. In addition, they

increased the patients' subjectively perceived quality of life, made it less necessary to reduce their dose of cancer medications, and reduced mortality in the five years following chemotherapy. The participants receiving vinca-alkaloids and performing sensorimotor training had the largest benefit.

A lot of money has been invested over the years in reducing the incidence of CIPN, explains Streckmann. "This side effect has a direct influence on clinical treatment: for example, patients may not be able to receive the planned number of chemotherapy cycles that they actually need, the dosage of neurotoxic agents in the chemotherapy may have to be reduced, or their treatment may have to be terminated."

Despite the investments made, there is no effective pharmacological treatment to date: various studies have shown that medications can neither prevent nor reverse this nerve damage. However, according to the latest estimates, USD 17,000 are spent per patient every year in the USA on treating nerve damage associated with chemotherapy. Streckmann's assumption is that "doctors prescribe medications despite everything because patients' level of suffer ing is so high."

In contrast, the sports scientist emphasizes, that the positive effect of exercise has been substantiated, and this treatment is very cheap in comparison. At the moment, she and her team are working on guidelines for hospitals so that they can integrate the exercises into clinical practice as supportive therapy. In addition, since 2023 a study has been ongoing in six children's hospitals in Germany and Switzerland (PrepAIR), which is intended to prevent sensory and motor dysfunctions in children receiving neurotoxic

Study finds chemo medicine may cause significant hearing loss in longtime cancer survivors

FLORIDA: Researchers from Indiana University and the University of South Florida performed an interdisciplinary study that produced important results regarding the long-term consequences on cancer survivors of one of the most

widely used kinds of chemotherapy.

The study, which tracked a cohort of testicular cancer survivors who received cisplatinbased chemotherapy for an average of 14 years, was published in the Journal of the American Medical Association Oncology. It found that 78 per cent of the survivors have significant difficulties in everyday listening situations, which negatively affects their quality of life. This interdisciplinary study is the first to examine hearing loss progression and real-world listening problems in cancer survivors over an extended length of time.

"It's important that we understand the realworld effects of patients' sensory problems and if we can understand that, then we can develop better therapeutic strategies and preventive measures to improve the long-term quality of life for cancer survivors," said Robert Frisina, distinguished university professor and chair of the USF Department of Medical Engineering.

Cisplatin is commonly used in chemotherapy treatments for a variety of cancers, including bladder, lung, neck and testicular. It is administered intravenously and affects various parts of the body. However, the ears are particularly vulnerable as they have little ability to filter out the drug, causing it to become trapped. This leads to inflammation and the destruction of sensory



cells that are critical for coding sound, causing permanent hearing loss that can progressively get worse well after cisplatin treatments are

Lead author Victoria Sanchez, associate professor in the USF Health Department of Otolaryngology Head & Neck Surgery, said that despite the known risks, there's a nationwide lack of routine hearing assessments for patients undergoing chemotherapy. "Most patients still do not get their hearing tested prior to, during or after chemotherapy. Our study highlights the need for regular auditory evaluations to manage and mitigate long-term hearing damage."

The research team found higher doses of cisplatin led to more severe and progressing hearing loss, especially in patients with risk factors, such as high blood pressure and poor cardio vascular health. They also experienced increased difficulty hearing in common environments, such as a loud restaurant. "It will be critically important to follow these patients for life. Their current median age is only 48 years, and eventually they will enter the years at which age-related hearing loss also begins to develop,' said Dr. Lois B. Travis, Lawrence H. Einhorn

Professor of Cancer Research at Indiana University School of Medicine and a researcher at the IU Melvin and Bren Simon Comprehensive Cancer Center. This research is part of The Platinum Study, an ongoing research effort led by Dr. Travis and funded by the National Cancer Institute to study cisplatintreated testicular cancer survivors.

The hope is that this study will inspire further investigation into alternative chemotherapeutic protocols and preventive measures, such as FDA-approved drugs to prevent or reduce

This research gives oncologists the information they need to explore alternative treatment plans that could reduce the long-term side effects, such as altering the dosages and timing of the cisplatin in the treatment, when that

could be an appropriate option," Frisina said. Innovative solutions, such as Pedmark, a new FDA-approved injection that mitigates cisplatin-induced hearing loss in children, represent promising steps forward, according to

"We want to protect our hearing or treat a hearing loss if hearing damage occurs," Sanchez said. "Hearing allows us to connect to the world we love. Staying connected through conversations with family and friends, enjoyment of music and entertainment, staying safe and finding pleasure in our vibrant surroundings. Promoting optimal hearing for overall wellness is essential for healthy living.

No pressure as only Indian in US Open Junior Tennis Championships: Kriish Tyagi



BENGALURU (KARNATAKA) : Bengaluru's Kriish Tyagi, the only Indian who will be vying for honours at the upcoming US Open Junior Tennis Championships 2025 scheduled to begin from August 31 to September 6, is optimistic of a memorable outing, and his confidence stems from solid preparations and a grand debut at the recent Wimbledon Junior Championship last month.

"Before Wimbledon, I was travelling a lot, playing tournaments and didn't have much time to train. But for the US Open, we skipped a few events to make time for physical, mental and skilful training.

I feel more ready now," Tyagi told the Karnataka State Lawn Tennis Association.

"One key thing I want to bring to the US Open is strength, physical dominance and mental resilience during clutch points.

They were cheering loudly for the home team, but I used that energy. At one point, I was shouting and celebrating after every point. My partner and I had a great rhythm. We had a plan and we executed it."

Kriish, as a young player, made the most of his time at Wimbledon watching and learning from other players and recalled, "I learned a lot just by observing how the top handle games or fight back. That experi-

For Kriish, the journey of professional tennis has brought a lot of learning, self-discovery and a deeper understanding of the sport. "It's been a journey of ups and downs," he explains, after a three-hour-long practice match at the SM Krishna Tennis Stadium in the heart of the city.

As the only Indian junior at Wimbledon and now at the US Open, he opened up about whether he is under pressure and said, "Not really," he shrugs. "I enjoy pressure."

His home state, Karnataka, has a rich tennis legacy, and being part of that ecosystem excites him. "I was training on the same grass courts with senior pros, doing ice baths and recovery therapies, and I felt like I belonged. I know there's a long way to go, but it felt like a step in the right

CSK signs Dewald Brevis under IPL Player Regulations

NEW DELHI [INDIA] : South African batting sensation Dewald Brevis was officially signed by the Indian Premier League (IPL) franchise Chennai Super Kings (CSK) as per the IPL Player Regulations 2025-2027, clause 6.6 under Replacement Players on Saturday.

Brevis was signed in full accordance with the IPL Player Regulations 2025-27, specifically clause 6.6 under 'Replacement Players' which states, "A replacement Player signed pursuant to either paragraph 6.1 or 6.2 can be recruited at a League Fee which shall not be more than the League Fee that would have been payable to the injured/unavailable Player for the relevant Season. If a Replacement Player is recruited during a Season, the League Fee actually paid to him will be reduced to take account of the




Franchisee's matches during the relevant Season which took place before he was registered and any other relevant deductions under the Player Contract.'

Brevis concluded a memorable debut season (IPL 2025) with the five-time champions with a blistering half-century that helped CSK conclude a disappointing season with a victory over table-toppers Gujarat Titans (GT).

After ten appearances for Mumbai Indians (MI) from 2022-24, in which he made 230 runs in 10 matches at an average of 23.00, a strike rate of over $1\overline{3}3.72$ and the best score of 49, Brevis had a solid season with CSK, scoring 225 runs in six innings at an average of 37.50, strike rate of 180.00, with two fifties. He came in mid-season as an injury replacement for bowler Gurjanpreet Singh, who was bought for a price of RS. 2.2

The Chennai Super Kings franchise finished at the 10th spot in the IPL 2025 after winning just four games out of their 14 games in the competition. Last year, the CSK franchise also failed to qualify for the playoffs, finishing fifth after winning seven out of their 14 games in the tournament.

3rd T201: Maxwell, Marsh fifties help Australia beat South Africa




CAIRNS [AUSTRALIA] : Brilliant half-centuries from captain Mitchell Marsh and right-hand batter Glenn Maxwell took the hosts, Australia, to a two-wicket win in the third and final T20I of the series against South Africa, which was being played at Cazaly's Stadium here on Saturday

With this victory, the Men in Yellow registered a 2-1 series win over the Proteas. Maxwell (62* runs off 36 balls) was awarded the Player of the Match, whereas Tim David (150 runs in three matches) was announced the Player of the Series award.

In pursuit of a 174-run target, Australia were tottering at 122/6, and a Maxwell special became the need of the hour. From ball one, Maxwell looked destined to deliver and flaunted his potential to clear the delivery when Australia desperately needed it.

He reduced the equation to run-a-ball before the 12th over. but was forced to watch a catastrophe in the penultimate over.



While standing helpless at the non-striker's end, as Corbin Bosch executed a maiden doublewicket over, bringing down the equation to 10 required from six.

Maxwell sprinted for a double and then punched the ball away

back with back-to-back dot balls, but Maxwell reverse scooped the ball to clear the short third fielder and guided his side over the line. Other than Maxwell, who scored runs in the chase, was the

who scored 54 runs from 37 deliveries, which came with the help of three fours and sixes each. For the South African side. three wickets were scalped by Bosch, who conceded 26 runs in

his four overs and bowled one maiden over. Two wickets each were taken by Kagiso Rabada (2/32 in 4 overs) and Kwena Maphaka (2/36 in 3 overs), whereas one wicket was bagged by Aiden Markram (1/6 in 2 overs) in their respective spells.

Earlier in the match, after winning the toss, Australia opted to field first and struck early, removing the Proteas captain in the very first over for just 1.

Lhuan-dre Pretorius was the next to fall, dismissed by Nathan Ellis for 24, leaving South Africa

Ryan Rickelton struggled to get going, managing a run-a-ball 13 before falling to Adam Zampa. The Proteas were 49/3 in 6.5

From there. Brevis and Tristan Stubbs steadied the innings with a 61-run partner-

ship. Brevis brought up his halfcentury in just 22 balls, helping South Africa reach 100 in 10.1

Australia finally breathed a

sigh of relief when Ellis removed Brevis in the 12th over. The youngster's explosive knock included six sixes and just one

Stubbs followed soon after, making 25 off 23 balls before being bowled by Zampa. Corbin Bosch's stay was brief

as he was dismissed by Josh Hazlewood for 1, leaving the Proteas struggling at 138/6 in

16.2 overs. Senuran Muthusamy was the final wicket to fall, scoring 9.

South Africa eventually finished on 172/7, as Rassie van der Dussen helped them to cruise to that total with the help of his unbeaten 38. Ellis was the pick of the bowlers with 3/31 in his four overs, while Zampa returned 2/24 and Hazlewood 2/30.
