Prime minister said 'swadeshi' will render strength to the country's prosperity in a similar way it powered India's freedom movement. "We have to make every home a symbol of swadeshi. We have to decorate every shop with swadeshi (goods)," he had said. PM Modi said GST reforms will strengthen the national economy and provide relief from infla-" Our initiative to simplify the tax system and make it citizen-friendly has ushered in Diwali early for the capital's traders", he said adding "It feels as if Diwali has come early this ear for the people and a festive spirit is already visible across the country. Meanwhile the festive cheer is set to lift India's travel industry this year, with strong demand from Gen Z travellers and a surge in spiritual tourism expected to drive bookings, even as overall growth faces headwinds from recent incidents and geopolitical tensions, a top executive in the travel industry said on Monday. "The beginning of the year was very strong with January, February and March accounting for unprecedented growth, in terms of yields, and it was an excellent time for the industry as a whole, he said."However, in June and July, we saw disruption following geopolitical tensions and the unfortunate Air India crash, which resulted in a moderation of growth. # PM unveils mega infra projects of Rs 5,100 crore in Arunachal, visits Tripura too

MI News Service, Itanagar / Agartala: Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Arunachal Pradesh on Monday morning and unveiled infrastructure projects worth Rs 5,125, 37 crore for further development of this furthest North Eastern state bordering China . Participating in a programme at the Indira Gandhi Park in the capital city of Itanagar, he virtually laid the foundation stones for two major hydropower projects in Shi Yomi district, and a con vention centre in Tawang. The Tato-I project, with a capacity of 186 mw, will be developed jointly by the Arunachal Pradesh government and the North Eastern Electric Power Corporation Limited (NEEPCO) at Rs 1,750 crore. It is expected to generate around 802 million units of electricity annually. Earlier in the morning the Prime minister landed at the Donyi Polo Airport in Hollongi and flew to the Raj Bhavan in Itanagar on a helicopter.

Later in the day the PM launched several other infrastructure projects worth over Rs 1.290 crore, catering to various sectors, including connectivity, health and fire safety, official sources said, adding state Governor KT Parnaik, Chief Minister Pema Khandu and Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju were also present at the event. After the government programmes the Prime Minister interacted with local entrepreneurs and members of a number of self-help groups in Itanagar. He also visited an exhibition, organised at the Indira Gandhi Park, There the PM explained to the traders how the latest GST reforms would help their businesses to grow further. He also enquired about the locally made items exhibited, and underlined the importance of promoting indigenous products as part of the government's Vocal for Local' campaign. "The inter-

From Arunachal Pradesh PM Modi travelled to Tripura to attend official functions there and performed puja and 'darshan' before inaugurating the development work of famous'Mata Tripura Sundari Temple Complex' at Matabari near Agartala. The temple, one of the 51 'Shakti Peethas', has been redeveloped under the Centre's Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual Augmentation Drive (PRASAD) scheme at Rs 52 crore. The temple was built by the erstwhile 'Maharaja' Dhanya Manikya of Tripura way back in 1501. Tripura. Chief Minister Manik Saha, his cabinet colleagues and senior government officials were present at the programme.

Following his arrival in Agartala, the Prime minister travelled to Gomati district headquarters, Udaipur, by helicopter to inaugurate the redeveloped Mata Tripura Sundari temple, 65 km south of Agartala.A senior police official said a 12-kilometre roadshow from Palatana helipad to the temple was also organised with foolproof security measures put in place. After inaugurating the redeveloped temple and the beautified surroundings, PM Modi offered puja at the Kali temple before returning to Agartala and left for Delhi. Teachers and professors have been fired or disciplined, one for posting that Kirk was racist, misogynistic and a neo-Nazi, another for calling Kirk a "hate-spreading Nazi". Journalists have also lost their jobs after

#### Skull, ribs and a bicycle found in Kalna MI News Service, Kalna: Tension

gripped Kalna on Sunday after villagers stumbled upon scattered skeletal remains in a wetland, sparking suspicious of possible murder.

According to sources, a villager had gone to the forest in Rajbanshi Para under Satgachhia Panchayat on Sunday afternoon to cut bamboo poles when he first spotted human bones, including a skull and ribs, strewn across the ground. A bicycle was also recovered near the remains. Police from Kalna police station immediately reached the spot and recovered the bones, which were later sent to Burdwan Medical College and Hospital for autopsy. Preliminary observations suggest the skeleton may have remained buried under waterlogged soil during the monsoon, surfacing only after the waters receded. However, locals strongly suspect the body was dumped in the area after being murdered elsewhere. The discovery has reignited concerns about the disappearance of Aniket Roy (25), a resident of Bandhagachh in Hooghly district, who has been missing since July. Family members of Aniket claim the recovered bicycle belongs to him, though they have not yet confirmed whether the remains are indeed his. Police have launched an investigation but remain cautious in their statements. "Only after the autopsy will we be able to confirm the cause of death and identity of the victim," said an investigating officer. The chilling find has left the area on edge, with locals demanding a thorough probe into how the skeletal remains and bicycle surfaced in the wetland. The unanswered question remains—was this a tragic death, or the silenced evidence of a

#### Child's death sparks violent family feud

MI News Service, Asansol: A seemingly trivial over bursting firecrackers turned into a violent clash between two families in North Asansol on Sunday night, leaving a child allegedly strangled and several people injured. According to police and local sources, members of Singh Family complained that children from the neighboring Yadav household were repeatedly setting off fire-

crackers in front of their residence.

Despite repeated warnings, the fireworks continued- some even allegedly being ignited under the Singh's parked diesel vehicle, raising fears of fire. Matters escalated when the elders of the Yadav family allegedly encouraged the children's behavior. The confrontation spiraled out of control, culminating in an attack on the Singh family At least 20 members of the Yadav family allegedly stormed into their residence, armed with sticks. Five members of the Singh family sustained injuries; two were released after preliminary treatment, while three remain under medical care at Asansol district hospital. The head of one Singh family member was reportedly fractured in the assault. In a shocking counter-allegation, the Yadav claimed that the Singhs had strangled their fiveyear old child under the pretext of disciplining him for bursting fire-

### 6 students injured as Toto collides with gas-filled vehicle

A tragic accident involving a Toto vehicle and a gas-filled dumper has left seven people, including six school students, seriously injured. The incident, which occurred on Monday afternoon in the Manoharpur village of the Kandi police station area in Murshidabad's Berhampur district, has sparked serious concerns about the safety of children traveling to and from school in unregulated pri-

The accident took place around 12 noon when a Toto, returning from a private school exam, was struck by a dumper truck. The collision resulted in severe injuries to all seven occupants of the Toto. The injured students have been identified as Arnab Mondal, Tausif Mondal, Toton Mondal, Arghya Mondal, Shivam Mondal, and Kaushik Ghosh. The driver of the Toto was also injured. All victims were rushed to Kandi Sub-district Hospital for urgent medical care. Unofficial School Transportation The incident has brought to light the prevalent official "pullcars" for students. According to school representative Subir Ghosh, the school does not provide its own transport. Instead, parents arrange for their children to travel in these unregulated Totos. This practice, common in the region, lacks any safety oversight and has now led to a serious accident. Parents of the injured students confirmed that their children regularly used the Toto for their daily commute. Investigation Underway Local authorities have initiated an investigation into the accident. The driver of the gas-filled dumper fled the scene and remains at large. Police at the Kandi station have stated that they are actively searching for the absconding driver and the vehicle. The condition of the injured victims is currently stable, and they are all receiving treatment at the hospital. This incident serves as a grim reminder of the dangers posed by inadequate and unsafe transportation for school-going children in

#### 9 fishermen rescued after boat hull splits in Bay of Bengal

MI News Service, South 24 Pgs: Nine fishermen from Kultali had brush with death after their fishing trawler began sinking in the Bay of Bengal while they were out catching fish. The timely intervention of the Maipith Coastal intervention and local fishermen's union saved their lives late Sunday night. According to sources, the fishermenall residents of Nagenabad Molla Para under Maipith Coastal police

station limits- had ventured out. According to sources, the fishermen - all residents of Nagenabad Molla Para under Maipith Coastal Police Station limits — had ventured out to sea on the trawler FB Masuna. While fishing near Jinjira Island, the vessel struck a submerged obstacle. The impact ruptured the boat's hull, allowing river water to gush inside. Within moments, the trawler began listing dangerously, leaving the fishermen stranded in the middle of the sea. Panic spread among the crew, who

quickly contacted members of the Maipith Fishermen's Union and informed their families. The Coastal Police were also alerted. Acting swiftly, police personnel and union members launched a separate rescue vessel. After several tense hours at sea, all nine fishermen were brought back to shore alive. One of the rescued men, Morselim Sheikh, recounted the harrowing experience: "We were fishing at night when the boat suddenly hit a cliff-like structure. The hull cracked and water started flooding in. We thought we would sink. Thankfully, we managed to inform others, and they came in time. Otherwise, we would not be alive today." The incident has once again highlighted the risks faced by fishermen venturing into the rough waters of the Bay of Bengal, particularly during the ongoing Hilsa season. Local authorities are expected to conduct checks on the safety conditions of fishing boats operating in the region.

#### Turmoil in Murshidabad over controversial block **President**

If there was an issue, it should have been raised earlier. The decision on who holds the post rests solely with the top leadership," Kabir stated. While the fresh confrontation has once again highlighted factional tensions in Murshidabad, observers note that such disputes have surfaced repeatedly in the district in recent years. Humayun Kabir himself has previously been at odds with other leaders and was even summoned before the party's law and order committee. So far, Manju Sheikh has not issued any public response to the controversy. Party insiders say the matter is expected to be taken up at higher levels of leadership in the coming days.

#### Shibpur hosts Nation's first Antarctic gallery

MI News Service, Howrah: The Shibpur Central Botanical Laboratory under the Botanical Survey of India (BSI) has added a historic feather to its cap by inaugurating the country's first-ever Antarctic Gallery and Research Centre. The initiative, unveiled in Howrah, marks a new milestone in India's scientific engagement with the frozen continent.

India has been conducting botanical research in Antarctica since 1996, with permanent stations established at Bharati, Maitri, and Dakshin Gangotri. Unlike lush vegetation, the icy terrain sustains only algae - microscopic and macroscopic species that often remain invisible to the naked eye, yet play a pivotal role in maintaining ecological balance. Scientists estimate that nearly 50 percent of the Earth's oxygen originates from algae, making their study vital amid rising concerns over global warming. The newly inaugurated Antarctic Gallery seeks to replicate the icy ecosystem, offering a window into the fragile world of algae thriving in extreme polar

#### Car crushed at Paskura fair, 2 dead & several injured

MI News Service, East Midnapore: A horrific road accident during the Vishwakarma Puja fair left two dead and at least ten injured on Sunday night, spreading panic among fair-goers on National Highway 16 near Mechgram. According to police and eyewitnesses, a Kolkata-bound traveler's car was struck from behind by a speeding trailer around 11:30 pm, causing it to overturn in front of the fairgrounds. Several people present at the fair were crushed as the vehicle flipped. Among the deceased are Bijoy Bera, secretary of the fair committee, and Riya Jana (30), a resident of Shyampur, Howrah, who had come to visit

Ten others sustained injuries in the accident. Five of the critically injured were referred to Tamluk Medical College and Kolkata hospitals, while one was admitted to Pitpur Hospital. The remaining four were treated and discharged after primary care. ASI Vijay Mandal, who was on duty at the fair, was also injured in the incident. The Panshkura police and traffic authorities have seized both vehicles involved. The driver of the trailer responsible for the collision is currently absconding, with efforts underway to apprehend him. Local residents described chaotic scenes as the accident unfolded, noting that the crowd had gathered at the fair since Sunday evening. Police are investigating the circumstances that led to the collision, including allegations of speeding and negligence. The incident underscores concerns over traffic safety during public fairs on national highways, especially when large crowds and heavy vehicles share the road.

#### 2 workers die from toxic gas while digging well

MI News Service, East Burdwan: A tragic accident claimed the lives of two labourers on Sunday morning after they were overcome by poisonous gas while digging a well for a septic tank at a private residence in Uttar Kailashpur village. According to local sources, a group of five workers had gathered at the home of Debashis Singharai to dig a well. Two of the labourers, identified as Sabir Ali Pradhan (Dhatrigram, East Burdwan) and Samu (Pandua, Hooghly), entered the well first and were immediately affected by toxic gas emanating from the confined space.

In an attempt to rescue their colleagues, the remaining three workers entered the well but were also overcome Quick action by neighbours and family members allowed the three to be pulled out and given first aid. Unfortunately, Sabir Ali Pradhan and Samu could not be saved. Police and fire brigade personnel rushed to the scene, retrieved the bodies, and sent them to Burdwan Medical College Hospital, where doctors confirmed death due to inhalation of poisonous gas. The incident has left the local community and fellow workers shaken. Authorities are investigating the circumstances of the accident and cautioning about the dangers of confined-space work, particularly in wells and septic tanks where toxic gases can accumulate quickly. #### Unidentified Youth's Body Found In **New Town**

MI News Service, Kolkata: A dramatic scene unfolded in Newtown on Monday afternoon, when the body of an unidentified youth was discovered lying near Tank No. 11 under the jurisdiction of Eco Park Police Station. The shocking sight drew crowds of onlookers and created a stir in the area, with many struggling to comprehend what had happened in broad daylight. According to local sources, several workers employed in the vicinity were carrying out routine duties in the morning when they noticed the young man. On closer inspection, they were alarmed to see him lying motionless in a pool of blood. They immediately alerted the police, who soon arrived at the scene and recovered the body. At presinvestigators are probing the circumstances behind the death. While it is unclear whether the man's demise resulted from an accident or foul play, police are actively examining all angles. Nearby, there is a labor room where several mobile phones were reported stolen on Sunday night. Officers are investigating whether the deceased was in any way connected to the theft. Speculation is also rife that the youth may have been assaulted. Forensic tests and autopsy reports are expected to provide clarity. Police sources, however, indicated that preliminary assessments suggest the possibility of an accidental death. CCTV footage from the surrounding area is also being reviewed for leads. One local worker recounted, "We are all residents of Burdwan and currently working here. Last night, four of our mobile phones were stolen from our quarters. We don't know if this boy was the one

# Tangra High-Rise Tragedy Woman Falls to Death from 25th Floor

MI News Service, Kolkata: Kolkata has once again been rocked by a shocking death in Tangra, barely days after the triple murder case that had left the city shaken. On Monday morning, the lifeless body of a 29year-old woman, identified as GarimaLodh, was recovered from beneath a high-rise building in the Canal South Road area.

According to local sources, Garima had been residing on the 25th floor of the upscale residential complex along with her parents and sister for the past year. Around 7:30 am, residents and security staff were startled by a loud thud. Rushing to the spot, they discovered Garima lying in a pool of blood, having apparently plunged from the 25th floor. The gruesome sight left the entire complex in shock. She was immediately rushed to the hospital, but doctors declared her brought dead. Police later sent the body for post-mortem to ascertain the exact cause of death. Preliminary investigations suggest suicide, though officers are not ruling out other angles. Family members told investigators that Garima had dinner with them on Sunday night before going to bed. Nothing unusual had been noticed in her behavior. However, on Monday morning she reportedly jumped out of the window of her room. CCTV footage from the building confirms that the young

woman fell from her own apartment. During the search of her room, police recovered a half-empty bottle of liquor and some scattered belongings. These findings have led investigators to suspect that she consumed alcohol before taking the extreme step. The police have registered a case and initiated further inquiry. The tragedy comes close on the heels of another disturbing incident in Tangra, where two brothers recently attempted to kill their wives and children before trying to take their own lives. One child miraculously survived, while another succumbed to injuries. The back-to-back incidents have triggered unease among residents of the Tangra locality. While the motive behind Garima's death remains unclear, police are awaiting the autopsy report and statements from her family members to piece together the circumstances leading up to the incident. The sudden death of the young woman has cast a pall of gloom over the Canal South Road neighborhood, where residents are demanding a thorough investigation.

## **Professor and 2 Others Held for | Traditional Boat Race at Kanmari** Minor's Kidnapping in Kolkata

Monday after police arrested a college professor on charges of kidnapping a minor girl. The accused, identified as Arunima Chand, is a physics lecturer at the reputed Dinabandhu Andrews College in Garia. Her alleged involvement in such a crime has shocked not only the public but also the investigating officers themselves. According to police, three people were taken into custody in connection with the case: Professor Arunima Chand, her daughter Anushka Chand Choudhury, and her brother Anubhava Chand. The trio were arrested from the Kasba police station area and are expected to be produced before court. Sources revealed that the abducted minor is a resident of the Chatal area near Dum Dum Metro Station. She went missing on Friday, September 19. After frantic searches throughout the day failed, her family lodged a missing complaint at the Sinthee police station. Investigators began combing

through CCTV footage from the locality, which ultimately provided crucial leads. The footage showed that the minor was lured by

#### Youth Dies by Suspected Suicide in Port Area

MI News Service, Kolkata: A gunshot victim was found early in the port area, triggering a flurry of questions about whether the death was a homicide or suicide. By mid-morning police established the identity of the young man: ShreshthaDurka, a resident of Hastings. Officers probing the case said the body bore a single gunshot wound to the right temple. The bullet did not exit the skull, investigators added, and forensic teams were summoned to process the scene. After recovery of the body, police traced Shreshtha's address in the Hastings police district and informed his elderly parents, who were unaware of their son's death. The couple described Shreshtha as their only child; he was unmarried. Neighbours told detectives that Shreshtha had left his home early claiming he was going out for tea. He was later found in the port area with a revolver nearby. Police suspect he shot himself in the head, and a suicide note recovered from his house appears to support that theory.

#### Taratala Flyover Height Bar Crashes **After Truck Hits, Traffic Snarls**

MI News Service, Kolkata: Traffic chaos gripped South Kolkata on Monday morning after a goods vehicle rammed into the height bar at the Taratala flyover, causing a section of the iron structure to collapse onto the road. The incident led to massive congestion along Diamond Harbour Road, leaving commuters stranded for hours at the start of the workweek.

According to police sources, the mishap occurred around dawn when a heavy goods carrier struck the height bar that had recently been installed to regulate oversized vehicles and prevent heavy trucks from accessing the flyover. The impact caused part of the iron beam to crash onto the road below. Fortunately, no casualties were reported, though the truck's windshield and upper portion were damaged. Authorities explained that the height bar had been erected only a short while ago by Kolkata Police to control the entry of large vehicles onto the busy

incident revealed lapses in enforcement. Many commuters questioned why no civic volunteers or traffic officers were present at the spot to prevent such a violation. As the collapsed structure blocked a key stretch of the arterial road, a serpentine queue of vehicles built up quickly. One motorist remarked, "Police installed the height bar to restrict heavy vehicles, but if truck drivers ignore it, what's the point? Who is ensuring compliance?" Another commuter added, "It's shocking that such a large lorry managed to get through undetected. Isn't it the responsibility of traffic police or civic volunteers to monitor this stretch, especially at night?" Police have since deployed personnel to manage traffic and oversee removal of the damaged structure.

#### **Mini Firoz Arrested** in Delhi, Kolkata **Gang Shootout Case**

MI News Service, Kolkata: Kolkata police on Sunday night arrested Mini Firoz, the prime accused in the Gulshan Colony shootout, from Delhi, bringing an end to his 10-day absconding period. Firoz, also known as Mohammad Firoz, is a local Kolkata whose gang had wreaked havoc in the residential area near the Eastern Metropolitan Bypass on September 11. Firoz has been booked under sections 109/3(5)/324(2)/351(3) of the BNS, sections 25/27 of the Arms Act, and section 9 of the West Bengal Maintenance of Public Order Act, Kolkata Police officials confirmed. "He is being brought to Kolkata on transit remand," they added. Four other accused in the case are already in police custody.

A special team of Kolkata Police traced Firoz to Delhi following a credible tip-off and apprehended him at his hideout in the national capital. Among those already arrested in connection with the case are Mohammad Amber, alias Mohammad Nafis; Md. Sajid; Ahmed Hossain, alias Md. Madhu; and Raja Khan. Sources said Md. Sajid is a close aide of Firoz. Police recovered multiple weapons from the accused during the arrests. CCTV footage from September 11 shows Firoz and his gang vandalizing bikes, assaulting shopkeepers, and hurling crude country-made bombs.

#### **DNA Confirms Monojit** Mishra's Role in South Calcutta Law College Case

Kolkata Police have stated in their chargesheet that DNA evidence links Monojit 'Mango' Mishra to the alleged sexual assault of a student at South Calcutta College. rying signs of a McCarthyist revival in the early days of the second Trump administration. After Trump ordered the dismantling of public Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) programmes, civil institutions, universities, corporations and law firms were pressured to do the same. Some were threatened with investigation or freezing of federal funds. In Texas, a teacher was accused of guiding Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) squads to suspected non-citizens at a high school. A group called the Canary Mission identified pro-Palestinian green-card holders for deportation. And just this week, the University of California at Berkelev admitted to handing over the names of staff accused of antisemitism. Supporters of the push to expose those criticising Kirk have framed their actions as protecting the country from "un-American", woke ideologies. This narrative only deepens polarisation by simplifying everything into a Manichean world view: the "good people" versus the corrupt "leftist elite". The fact the political assassination of Democratic lawmaker Melissa Hortman did not garner the same reaction from the right reveals a gross double standard at play. Another double standard: attempts to silence anyone criticising Kirk's divisive ideology, while being permissive of his more odious claims. For example, he once called George Floyd, a Black man killed by police, a "scumbag". In the current climate, empathy is not a "made-up, new age term", as Kirk once said, but appears to be highly selective. This brings an increased danger, too. When neighbours become enemies and dialogue is shut down, the possibilities for conflict and violence are exacerbated. Many are openly discussing the parallels with the rise of fascism in Germany, and even the possibility of another civil war. The parallels between McCarthyism and Trumpism are stark and unsettling. In both eras, dissent has been conflated with disloyalty. How far could this go? Like the McCarthy era, it partly depends on the public reaction to Trump's tactics.

# India mulls massive enhancement in steel capacity

Delhi: Indian steel makers are pressing ahead with plans to add new capacity, betting on the strategic imperative of maintaining domestic primary steel production outweighing concerns over global overcapacity, amid mounting trade frictions and geopolitical uncertainty.

India, the second highest producer of the alloy which goes into making a range of products from safety pins to submarines, continued its growth in output between January to June (9.2 per cent) even as the rest of the world recorded a decline (-2 per cent).

Plans are afoot to add at least 30 million tonnes (mt) of capacity by 2027 to take the installed capacity to 209.9 mt from 179.5 mt at the end of 2024, according to a report published by The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)

Going by the National Steel Mission of the Indian government, India's capacity is targeted to reach 300 mt by 2031 and steel makers in the private and public sector — JSW Steel, AMNS, JSW Steel, Jindal Steel and SAIL - have outlined big-ticket investment roadmap through the decade. The ambitious plan may be tested if projections made in the OECD report are taken into consideration. The study claimed that global steel overcapacity is estimated to reach 721 mt by 2027.

New Delhi: As Artificial Intelligence (AI) continues to reshape global markets and more high-value AI firms gear up for IPOs, Indian investors -- particularly the mass affluent -- are increasingly eyeing the US for the next wave of generational wealth creation, according to the Co-founders of Neev Finance.

There will be a lot more hunger for US-based markets. There is a lot more money made here, like just in the last 10 years, the likes of Tesla, Nvidia, Netflix, Twilio, all the big companies came, even Amazon, Microsoft, all these doubled. The Meta and blue chip like four or five times it (returns) happened. And now with the AI wave coming in, you will see a lot more AI IPOs coming in. The whole AI is being played out of San Francisco. So the Anthropic of the world, OpenAI, all this will go public IPO. So a lot more value generation will happen, and it will attract Indian investors to the US markets," said NiravKamdar, Co-Founder of US-based alternative investments platform Neev Finance.

The company, founded by former tech and analytics professionals, is positioning itself as a bridge for Indian-origin investors -- both in the US and abroad -- to access high-growth US-based investment opportunities in public equities, private markets, and tokenised assets. Executives said that the depreciation of exchange rates is prompting many affluent Indians to allocate 10-20 per cent of their portfolios in US dollar-denominated assets. "People want to hold part of their wealth in a stronger currency. It's not just about returns anymore -it's also about preserving global purchasing power," they

Beyond investing, lifestyle trends are also influencing portfolio decisions. "Many Indian professionals are planning global travel, higher education abroad, or even overseas retirement. They're starting to budget in dollars -- and that's where platforms like ours come in," said Soumyadeep Roy, CoFounder and CIO, Neev Finance. Investment preferences in India have always been influenced by various factors. Many platforms have emerged that allow investors to invest even in foreign stock markets, making it accessible to a broader audience.

According to a report by industry body PHDCCI, before the pandemic, many Indian investors favoured traditional investment options, such as fixed deposits, real estate, and gold, as stock markets were considered relatively risky by these investors; thus, they often adopted a long-term perspective when investing in stocks.

Blue-chip stocks with a history of stable performance are popular choices among retail and institutional investors.

The report added that the pandemic highlighted the importance of sectors like technology and healthcare, and investors showed increased interest in stocks related to these sectors due to the accelerated digital adoption and healthcare

#### H1B visa fee hike may slow **India's IT exports growth** to below 4%: Report

New Delhi: Growth in India's IT services exports could slow to below 4 per cent due to fresh risks from the sharp hike in H-1B visa fees, according to a report by Emkay.

The report noted that it had earlier estimated 5 per cent growth in FY26 and a 7 per cent CAGR over the next five

It stated, "Indian IT/software gross/net exports stood USD 181bn/160bn in FY25 and we had assumed 5 per cent growth in net IT services exports for FY26E, with a 7 per cent CAGR growth for next 5 yrs. This could reduce to sub-4 per cent depending on sustained H1B visa-led risks and GCC evolution". India's IT and software exports stood at USD 181 billion gross and USD 160 billion net in FY25. Global capability centres (GCCs) already contribute more than USD 65 billion in gross

The report noted that GCC evolution and adoption of new growth models by IT firms will be key in shaping the sector's

As per experts the near-term impact on revenues and margins may remain limited. However, if the higher fees sustain, it could disturb traditional export models.

MadhaviArora - Chief Economist, Emkay Global stated, "Nearterm impact may be limited on IT revenue/margins. However, if sustained, it could disturb Indian IT exports, companies' traditional models, pressurise project margins, disrupt Indian IT supply chains and on-site projects. That said, shift in delivery and export model over time towards offshoring could also pro-

wide IT export offsets".

The U.S. recently raised H-1B visa fees to USD 100,000 for new visas, from the earlier USD 1,500-4,000 range. The change does not affect existing visa holders or renewals, but could weigh heavily on Indian IT companies' dependent on new on-site visas.

Nilesh Shah, MD Kotak Mahindra AMC stated, "US restrictions on H 1 B visa will hurt Indians more than Indian IT services companies. We have to create ecosystem in India so that our companies. Hand cuffing Korean workers, abruptly changing H 1 B visa kind of steps will have adverse effects on US economy over a period of time". Over time, companies may try to offset the pressure by shifting more delivery offshore, though risks could rise further if the proposed HIRE Act is passed. (ANI)

### **Electricity demand in India set to grow** at 4.6% CAGR during FY26-30: Report

New Delhi: The electricity demand in the country is projected to register steady growth in the coming years, with YES Securities forecasting a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of about 4.6 per cent during FY26-30.

This translates into an addition of nearly 424 billion units (BUs) of demand over the period. To meet this rising requirement, the country is expected to add more than 250 gigawatts (GW) of power capacity in the same timeframe, according to the report. It stated, "As per our projec-

tions, we foresee power demand growth at a CAGR of approx. 4.6 per cent (adding 424BUs) for period FY26-30 and a capacity addition of over 250GW for the same period.

According to the report, India's power consumption has seen a significant and consistent increase in recent years.

Electricity demand rose from 1,002 BUs in FY14 to 1,695 BUs in FY25. Over the last decade, covering FY15-FY25, the demand grew at a CAGR of nearly 4.9 per cent. The pace has been faster in the more recent five-year period, FY20-FY25, when electricity demand expanded at around 5.6 per cent CAGR. The report attributed this acceleration to multiple factors, including the rapid economic recovery after the pandemic, higher manufacturing activity, and the continued electrification of both rural and urban areas.

The report also highlighted that this marks a clear upward shift in India's power consumption trajectory, reflecting the growing energy intensity of the economy

Sectoral trends show that the industrial segment continues to consume the largest share of electricity, followed by the domestic, agriculture, and commercial sectors. Renewable energy additions have also played a critical role in supporting demand growth.

With renewables now making up a substantial portion of installed capacity, the energy transition is helping India balance rising demand while promoting sustainability.

The report also highlighted that power outages in the country have drastically reduced in recent years, enabling more reliable supply and uninterrupted demand growth.

As per data, electricity consumption in India has nearly tripled since 2000, reflecting the combined impact of industrialization, urbanization, and wider electrification. Per capita consumption has climbed from around 400 kilowatt-hours (kWh) in 2000 to nearly 1,400 kWh in

# Hyundai CEO Munoz unveils Europe-focused EV rollout

New Delhi : South Korea's Hyundai Motor Co. has announced an ambitious mid- to long-term strategy to expand its hybrid electric vehicle (HEV) line up and launch region-specific electric vehicles (EVs) for Europe and India, as per a report by Pulse, the English service of Business Newspaper Korea.

With these moves, the automaker aims to boost annual sales by more than 30 per cent, from 4.14 million units in 2024 to 5.55 million units by 2030, while achieving an operating margin of up to 9 percent.

The company highlighted its commitment to overcoming the twin challenges of a 25 percent U.S. tariff on imported EVs and the global "EV chasm" of stalled demand with stronger green technology

Speaking at the 2025 CEO Investor Day held in Manhattan, New York, on Thursday, Hyundai Motor President and CEO Jose Munoz Jose Munoz unveiled the company's strategic roadmap before global investors, analysts, and credit rating officials.

Hyundai Motor plans to more than double its HEV lineup from eight models today to 18 by 2030, spanning entry-level to mid-size, large, and luxury vehicles. Its premium Genesis brand will launch its first luxury HEV next year, followed by a more afford-



able entry-level hybrid.

The company also intends to release new EVs tailored to regional markets to overcome demand stagnation. In Europe, Hyundai Motor will roll out the

Ioniq 3 next year. The vehicle was previewed earlier this month at IAA Mobility 2025 in Munich, where Hyundai Motor showcased its first small

EV concept, "Concept Three." In China, the world's largest EV market, Hyundai Motor will follow this year's launch of the Elexio compact SUV with a compact electric sedan next year, both produced locally. In India, the automaker will debut a mini electric SUV in 2027, supported by a localized supply chain.

Hyundai Motor will also introduce an extended-range EV (EREV) in 2027, leveraging highperformance battery and motor technology. Unlike standard EVs, EREVs feature an internal combustion engine that generates electricity to recharge the battery, addressing range concerns.

The company said it will continue developing software-defined vehicles (SDVs) and hydrogen-powered fuel cell EVs as part of its broader mobility portfolio. By 2030, Hyundai Motor aims to sell 5.55 million vehicles globally, 60 percent--or 3.3 million--of which will be ecofriendly models. To support this, Hyundai Motor will expand its overseas manufacturing footprint. Hyundai Motor Group Metaplant America (HMGMA) in Georgia will increase annual

500,000 by 2028, while the Pune plant in India will add 250,000 units annually upon completion in the fourth quarter of this year. Domestically, the Ulsan Innovation Plant will open next year, equipped to flexibly produce 12 different models. In the United States, Hyundai

Motor will add a mid-size pickup truck to its portfolio by 2030, building on the success of the Santa Cruz compact pickup launched in 2021.

To achieve these goals, Hyundai will invest 77.3 trillion won (USD 55.7 billion) between 2025 and 2030, including 30.9 trillion won in R&D, 38.3 trillion won in facilities, and 8.1 trillion won in strategic ventures--7 trillion won more than its previous plan. The company has also raised its profitability targets, aiming for a consolidated operating margin of 6-7 percent this year, 7-8 percent by 2027, and 8-9 percent by 2030.

"Hyundai has risen to the ranks of the world's top three automakers by global sales volume, localized operations, diversified portfolios, and group synergies," Munoz said. "We face another period of uncertainty, but just as we have overcome challenges in the past, we will once again lead change and emerge as a future mobility company." (ANI)

# "India has a geopolitical stake here": **Finnish President on Russia-Ukraine conflict**

MI News Service, Helsinki: Finland's President Alexander Stubb has urged that India should play a role in addressing the Russia-Ukraine conflict as "India has a geopolitical stake."

"I've been speaking to PM Modi recently about the situation in Ukraine. India has a geopolitical stake here. So we need to get them involved," Stubb said at the Helsinki Security Forum 2025.

Highlighting the steps needed to move toward peace, the Finnish president said, "First, we need a ceasefire; only then can we begin peace negotiations. We also need a formal date for bilateral meeting between Zelenskyy and Putin and only after that Zelenskyy can reach out to Putin by phone to discuss on what the agenda could possibly."

He added that pressure on Moscow must continue alongside support for Kyiv. Meanwhile, we need to continue ramping up economic sanctions on Russia, and we also need to ramp up the military capabilities of Ukraine by providing them



with all necessary defence means," he said.

Responding to a question on the outcome of last month's meeting between European leaders and US President Donald Trump in Washington, Stubb said work was ongoing on longterm security commitments. "We are working on the idea European security arrangements or security guarantees, and on the military side, they are pretty much ready," he stated.

In August, Prime Minister Narendra Modi also received a telephone call from the President of Finland, Stubb, the Ministry of Exter-

nal Affairs (MEA) had said in

an official statement. According to the MEA, President Stubb had shared his assessment of the recent meetings held between the leaders of Europe, the United States and Ukraine in Washington on the resolution of the conflict in Ukraine. Prime Minister Modi also reiterated India's consistent support for a peaceful resolution of the conflict and the early restoration of peace and stability.

The leaders also re-

and reaffirmed their commitment to enhance partnership in emerging fields, including quantum technologies, 6G, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity and sustainability.

The MEA added that President Stubb reiterated Finland's support for an early conclusion of a mutually beneficial India-EU Free Trade Agreement. He also affirmed support for the success of the AI Impact Summit to be hosted by India in 2026. Prime Minister Modi invited President Stubb to visit India soon, and both leaders agreed to remain in touch.

Reflecting on the conversation, PM Modi posted on X, "Had a good conversation with President Alexander Stubb. Finland is a valued partner in the EU. ways strengthen cooperation in key sectors such as trade, technology and sustainability. Exchanged perspectives on the ongoing efforts for peaceful resolution of the conflict in Ukraine.'

# Over 1000 people dead due to floods in Pakistan

tional Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has reported that at least 1,006 people have died and 3.02 million have been rescued across Pakistan amid severe rains and flash floods since June 26, The Express Tribune reported.

In a statement on Sunday, the NDMA said a total of 5,768 rescue operations were conducted nationwide, during which 273,524 relief items were distributed. Medical treatment was provided to 662,098 individuals at 741 camps set up through coordinated efforts of the NDMA, Provincial Disaster Management Authorities (PDMAs), the Pakistan Army, and other emergency services. Punjab recorded the highest fatalities with 304 deaths, including 110 children, 143 men, and 51 women. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) reported 504 deaths, comprising 90 children, 338 men, and 76 women. Sindh saw 80 deaths, Balochistan 30, Pakistan-occupied Gilgit-Baltistan (PoGB) 41, Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK) 38, and Islamabad nine. Nationwide, 1,063 people sustained injuries, with Punjab accounting for 661, K-P 218, Sindh 87, PoGB 52, PoJK 37, Balochistan five, and Islamabad three.

Rescue efforts were concentrated in Punjab, where 2.81 million people were evacuated through 4,749 operations. Sindh followed with 184,011 people rescued in 753 operations, and K-P with 14,317 people rescued in 211 opera-



tions, The Express Tribune reported.

The floods have caused widespread property and infrastructure damage. Nationwide, 12,569 homes were affected, including 4,128 destroyed and 8,441 partially damaged, while 6,509 livestock were lost. At least 239 bridges and 1,981 kilometers of roads were destroyed or damaged. K-P lost 52 bridges and 437 km of roads; PoJK 94 bridges and 201 km of roads; and PoGB

87 bridges and 20 km of roads.
Relief distributions included tents, blankets, hygiene kits, ration bags, food packs, and equipment such as solar panels, de-watering pumps, and generators. A total of 1,690 camps were established, comprising 741 medical camps that treated over 662,000 people and 949 relief camps that sheltered 152,252 individuals, The Express Tribune reported.

The NDMA said coordinated operations to deliver relief, restore infrastructure, and support rehabilitation efforts are ongoing.

# Super Typhoon Ragasa: Thousands evacuated in Philippines; HK airport to shut for 36 hours

MI News Service, Taiwan: Ahead of the landfall of Super Typhoon Ragasa, authorities in the Philippines have evacuated over 5,000 families, while flights have been cancelled and ferry services suspended on various routes in Taiwan, local media from the two countries reported on Monday.

A Reuters report cited a statement by Qantas Airways stating that Hong Kong International Airport will suspend all passenger flights for 36 hours from 8 pm (1200 GMT) on September 23 to 8 am on September 25.

Cathay Pacific is waiving rebooking and rerouting fees on flights in and out of Hong Kong from September 23rd to 25th due to the arrival of Super Typhoon Ragasa.

Thailand also issued an advisory for Passengers travelling with Thai Airways International to Kaohsiung in Taiwan and Hong Kong from Monday to Wednesday to keep their flights updated, according to the Bangkok Post. As of 2 pm (local time) the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration said that a Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 5 was hoisted over Babuyan Islands due to the Typhoon 'Ragasa' which is locally being called 'Nando', Philippines News Agency (PNA) reported.



super 'yphoon packing 295km/h wind gusts, is moving westwards and is forecast to make landfall over the thinly populated Babuyan group of islands off the northern coast of Luzon in the Philippines between 2pm and 5 pm today before heading towards southern China, authorities said as per the state media outlet.

An estimated 5,000 families, equivalent to 14,000 individuals have been preemptively evacuated in four regions in Luzon amid the threat of Super Typhoon 'Nando', the Office of Civil Defense in Philippines said according to PNA.

Schools and government offices in many parts of Philippines, PNA reported, have been shut and authorities have warned of flooding and landslides and damage to homes and infrastructure. Meanwhile, according to local carriers and transportation authorities in Taiwan, Super Typhoon Ragasa disrupted domestic transport today, forcing the cancellation of all flights to outlying islands after noon and the suspension of 88 ferry services on 13 routes according to a news report in Focus Taiwan. Taiwan's Central Weather Adminis-

tration (CWA) has issued both sea and land warnings for Typhoon Ragasa. Its storm circle reached the Hengchun Peninsula at 11 am today. Ragasa is expected to come closest

to Taiwan from Monday afternoon and have its greatest impact on the island through Tuesday, Taiwan's Central News Agency reported. Meanwhile, authorities in Guangdong Province in south China on Mon-

day raised its wind emergency response

to Level II, with two cities announcing a series of suspension measures ahead of the approach of Typhoon Ragasa. Chinese state media Xinhua said classes will be suspended in schools in the cities of Zhuhai and Jiangmen while work, production, public transport and business operations will also be suspended later on Tuesday, accord-

ing to the local flood, drought and wind

We feel cheated.

# What is the online betting app case in which Robin Uthappa appeared before ED? Yuvraj Singh, Sonu Sood too summoned

After former cricketers Suresh Raina And Shikhar Dhawan, ex-India star Robin Uthappa appeared before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in connection with a money laundering case linked

to an online betting app.
Uthappa (39) reached the agency's office in New Delhi around 11am. The ED, reportedly, questioned him and recorded his statement under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

The case is linked to a platform named

What is the 1xBet online betting case? 1xBet is, reportedly, a global book-maker with 18 years in the betting industry, and its customers can place bets on sporting events, with the company's website and app.

ED is probing tax evasion and duping charges against betting platforms, which includes the 1xBet betting app.

The agency is questioning celebrities to understand how the betting company approached them for endorsements, and also to find out their point of contact in India for the deals. Investigators are looking into how celebrities received payments, too - whether the money was paid in cash, through illegal hawala transfers, or via regular bank accounts. The agency is also checking if these payments hap-



pened in India or abroad. The key question posed to the cricketers and actors is that whether they

knew that online betting and gaming is illegal in India. The agency has requested copies of all contracts, and are checking if

relevant emails were sent and documents signed between the celebrities and 1xBet. The ED is also examining what the

celebrities did with the money they got and whether any of these funds are "proceeds of crime" under the PMLA, that is, whether the money came from illegal

The Union government recently banned real money online gaming in India by bringing a legislation.

The online betting app market in India was estimated to be worth over \$100 bil-

#### **Manchester City ready to sell Erling Haaland** for £150 million? Striker's transfer value revealed amidst Barcelona interest

 ${\bf F}^{\, {\scriptscriptstyle C}}$  Barcelona are planning to replace Robert Lewandowski with Bayern Munich's Harry Kane in what is seen as a short-term deal. While Polish captain Lewandowski is 37, his English counterpart is 32, meaning he can't be around for very long either. Raphinha and Ferran Torres are scoring goals in plenty, keeping the plan of signing a veteran striker a reliable model for Hansi Flick's team as things stand. But what about the long

Earlier reports had said that Barcelona were looking to sign Erling Haaland from Manchester City. The 25-year-old goal machine, who is breaking scoring records at ease, joined Pep Guardiola's team in 2022 from Borussia Dortmund. In his debut Premier League season, Haaland scored 36 goals, making him the player to score the most goals in a single campaign. He also became the fastest player to 10 Premier League hat-tricks after 48 games. On the European stage, the Norwegian scored 5 goals against RB Leipzig in a single Champions League knockout match, becoming only the third player to do so. He also became the fastest to score 30 goals in the competition when he reached the mark in just 25 appearances.

Will Manchester City sell

Haaland? Erling Haaland, not long after his arrival from Dortmund, had confirmed that he was interested in fresh challenges as his career progressed. This meant that he was not planning to spend his best years as a Citizen and may consider a switch when an interesting prospect was available despite having signed a long-term deal that is meant to keep him at the Etihad until he is 34. There were also theories of Real Madrid combining Haaland with Kylian Mbappé in the future with the Los Blancos in the process of building another 'Galacticos' era. It was very much later that

Barcelona started to emerge as a serious contender to sign Haaland. While his interest in joining the Catalans is largely unknown, many had ruled out Barca having the financial muscle to get Haaland. They were struggling financially in recent years although the La Liga win under Flick had helped them improve their situation.

If Haaland is determined to leave, City will have to ensure the sale of their talismanic striker brings in some real contributions to their coffers. According to Football Insider, the Manchester City higher-ups have set a price tag of over £150 million for any team interested in signing the player next season.

FC Barcelona, for their part, will have to carefully evaluate whether it's feasible to pursue his signing next summer.

## Bavuma ruled out with calf injury; de Kock back in white-ball squads for South Africa

NEW DELHI [INDIA] : South Africa's Test captain Temba Bavuma has been ruled out of the team's first assignment in their World Test Championship (WTC) title defence, against Pakistan, after suffering a calf strain. Bavuma picked up the injury during the recent white-ball tour of England and is expected to be sidelined for six to eight weeks. In his absence, Aiden Markram will lead the Test side, as per ESPNcricinfo.

The squad has also seen a recall for offspinner Simon Harmer, who last played a Test in March 2023. He joins Senuran Muthusamy and Prenelan Subrayen in the spin attack. Firstchoice spinner Keshav Maharaj, recovering from a groin injury sustained in England, will only be available for the

In another big development, wicketkeeper-batter Quinton de Kock has reversed his retirement from ODI cricket and has been named in both the ODI and T20I squads for the Pakistan tour. De Kock's last international appearance was in the T20 World Cup final in Barbados in June

South Africa have opted to rest most of their all-format players, bar-ring Corbin Bosch and Dewald Brevis, for the white-ball leg of the Pakistan tour. David Miller will captain the T20I squad, while Matthew Breetzke will lead the ODI squad.

Ahead of the Pakistan Tests, South Africa will also play a T20I in Namibia to inaugurate the new stadium in Windhoek. That fixture will feature a second-string squad led by Donovan Ferreira, which includes de Kock, Nandre Burger, Gerald Coetzee, Reeza Hendricks, Lhuan-dre Pretorius, and Rivaldo Moonsamy. Ferreira has also earned a place in

the ODI squad to face Pakistan, alongside Burger, Coetzee and de Kock. Leftarm spinners George Linde and Bjorn Fortuin have been brought back into



the mix, legspinner Nqaba Peter has been also included. Notably, Tabraiz Shamsi, who declined a national contract, has been left out, as has pacer Anrich Nortje, who has also not signed

The Test squad retains most of the core that clinched the WTC mace against Australia in June. Brevis, Subraven and Zubayr Hamza are the fresh additions, while there is no space for Dane Paterson or Lungi Ngidi, who has been included in the white-ball squads. Kagiso Rabada, Marco Jansen and Wiaan Mulder lead the pace unit.

"Temba's calf strain will unfortunately keep him sidelined for six to eight weeks, but the focus is on giving him the best chance to be fully ready for the India tour in November," Proteas head coach Shukri Conrad said, as quoted from ESPNcricinfo.

Naturally, we are disappointed not to have Temba available. He has been such an important leader and batter for us in the Test side, and his pres-

ence on and off the field will be missed," he noted.

"At the same time, the majority of the Test squad have experience of playing in the subcontinent and understand the demands that come with it, so I'm confident they will embrace the challenge. Pakistan is one of the tougher places to tour, and with spinfriendly conditions expected and Keshav only available from the second game, it was important to have an experienced campaigner like Simon in the squad to provide extra depth in the spin department," he added.

De Kock's comeback follows months of speculation about his international future. While he never formally retired from T20Is, he had not been picked since the 2024 T20 World Cup and his long-term commitment was unclear. Head coach Shukri Conrad confirmed that discussions with the wicketkeeperbatter have now ensured his availability for the national team again.

"Quinton's return to the white-ball space is a major boost for us," he said, as quoted from ESPNcricinfo.

When we spoke last month about his future, it was clear that he still has a strong ambition to represent his country. Everyone knows the quality he brings to the side, and having him back can only benefit the team," he noted.
On the appointments of stand-in
