The torrential downpour that lashed Kolkata on Tuesday night turned deadly, claiming eight lives across the city, including seven within Kolkata limits. On Wednesday morning, Mayor and Urban Development Minister Firhad Hakim visited the homes of two victims, where Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee personally spoke to the bereaved families over the phone, assuring them of government support. At around 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Hakim reached the Ekbalpore residence of Jitendra Singh, a Mominpur resident who lost his life after coming in contact with electric current in the flooded locality. Hakim spoke with Singh's family members before moving on to Thakurpukur, where he met the relatives of another victim, Shubho Pramanik. PG 3

Bihar polls would mark beginning of end of Modi govt's 'corrupt rule': Kharge



MI News Service, Patna: Launching a blistering attack on the BJP, Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Wednesday once again accused the party of orchestrating "vote chori" and communal polarisation and asserted that the Bihar Assembly elections would mark the beginning of end of the Modi government's "corrupt rule". "The 2025 Assembly elections will prove to be a milestone not only for Bihar but for the entire country. This will mark the beginning of the countdown and the end of the corrupt rule of the Modi government," Kharge said. In his opening remarks at the Congress Working Committee (CWC) meeting here, Kharge also made an apparent reference to US President Donald Trump's recent statements and actions and took a dig at Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "Our problems at the international level are the result of diplomatic failure of Narendra Modi and his government. The very friends whom the Prime minister boasts about as 'my friends' are today putting India in numerous troubles," Kharge said. "Today, when our voters list is being officially tampered with, it is essential that we hold our extended CWC meeting in Bihar, the mother of democracy, and reaffirm our pledge to protect this country's democracy and Constitution," the Con-

gress President said. Asserting that the foundation of democracy is fair and transparent elections, Kharge said serious questions are being raised today about the fairness and transparency of the Election Commission itself. Instead of answering questions on the revelations from various states, the EC is demanding affidavits from us, Kharge said. "Following the example of Bihar, a conspiracy is now being hatched across the country to remove the votes of millions of people," the Congress President said, referring to the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls in Bihar. "Vote theft means theft of rations, pensions, medicine, children's scholarships, and exam fees belonging to Dalits, tribals, backward classes, extremely backward classes, minorities, the weak, and the poor, he said. PM Modi to launch development projects worth Rs 1.08 lakh crore

MI News Service, Jaipur : Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of a slew of development projects during his visit to Rajasthan's Banswara on Thursday worth Rs 1.08 lakh crore, including the Rs 42,000 crore Mahi-Banswara nuclear plant, officials said.

The projects span across key sectors such as energy, water, infrastructure, health and urban development, they said. Among the projects to be launched, the proposed 2,800 MW nuclear facility is the most important as it is expected to play a crucial role in the state's journey toward energy self-sufficiency, officials said. Apart from the 2, 800 MW Mahi Banswara

Nuclear Power Project, which will play a crucial role in strengthening India's energy sector, the Prime Minister will virtually flag off two new Vande Bharat trains - Bikaner and Jodhpur to Delhi - and the Udaipur-Chandigarh Express. He will also inaugurate and lay the foundations for projects in other states during the programme. This will be PM Modi's 16th visit to Rajasthan in the 22 months since the Bhajanlal Sharmaled BJP government assumed office in December 2023. His frequent visits underline the state's political and developmental importance, said officials. The Prime Minister has actively participated in major events, including the swearing-in ceremony, eight election rallies, and several administrative programmes. Notably, he launched the e-Seva Quick App during the Rajasthan High Court's Platinum Jubilee in Jodhpur in August 2024, and laid the foundation for Rising Rajasthan and the ERCP Phase-I in December 2024. His May 2025 visit to Bikaner was the first after Operation Sindoor. At the event, Prime Minister Modi will lay the foundation stone for several mega projects, including the Rs 42, 000 crore Mahi Banswara Nuclear Power Project with a capacity of 2, 800 MW. In Bikaner, a 590 MW renewable energy project worth Rs 8, 500 crore will also

be initiated. To strengthen energy infrastructure, 15.5 GW of power transmission lines will be developed across Jaisalmer, Barmer, Sirohi, Nagaur, and Bikaner at a cost of Rs 13, 183 crore. In the water sector, 15 drinking water projects worth ₹5, 884 crore will be launched across 11 districts, including Banswara, Udaipur, Dungarpur, Dholpur, Sawai Madhopur, Barmer, Dausa, Churu, Ajmer, Bhilwara, and Sikar. For connectivity and infrastructure, the foundation will also be laid for the construction of two flyovers, a bridge over the Banas River, and 119 Atal Pragati Paths in Bharatpur, with an investment of Rs

2 crocodiles strayed from Kolkata zoo



MI News Service, Kolkata: A day after West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee accused power utility CESC of negligence leading to ten electrocution deaths in Kolkata and nearby areas following unprecedented deluge, flooding the entire city yesterday, the discom has disowned responsibility, saying that the deaths were unrelated to its network. Incidentally the Chief minister had expressed condolences to the families of those passed away in the city in one day in electrocution . Kolkata woke up to a deluge a day after heavy rain of over 300 mm in four hours through the previous night. Many areas were waterlogged, over 100 flights were affected, and traffic was disrupted. Amid the calamity, 10 people died, of electrocution. While the state government has blamed CESC --Calcutta Electric Supply Corporation -- for the tragic deaths and said it must compensate the victims, the discom disagrees. In a video statement, CESC spokesperson Avijit Ghosh said that eight electrocution deaths were reported in Kolkata and nearby areas yesterday. "We conducted a deep dive investigation into the deaths. Five of them were caused by faulty internal wiring at homes and a factory. Two deaths were caused when the victims touched street

Jaishankar calls for stronger Global South solidarity for UN reform

MI News Service, New Delhi/ New York : External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has called for greater solidarity among Global South nations, a renewed commitment to multilateralism, and a collective push to reform the United Nations and other global institutions.

He made the remarks at a High-Level Meeting of Like-Minded Global South countries here on Tuesday on the sidelines of the 80th session of the United Nations General Assembly. Sharing details of the meeting in a post on X, Jaishankar said in the face of a proliferation of global concerns and multiplicity of risks, "it is natural that the Global South turns to multilateralism for solutions". Outlining a structured approach for how the Global South can engage with world affairs, the minister made five key proposals to strengthen the collective voice and influence of the developing nations. He emphasised the importance of utilising existing forums to strengthen consultations among the Global South with a view to enhancing solidarity and encouraging collaboration". Jaishankar also called for comprehensive reform of the UN and "multilateralism as a whole".He said the Global South must bring its specific strengths, experiences and

Youth Electrocuted While Fetching Water Amid Rains

MI News Service, South 24 Pgs: What began as a routine chore ended in tragedy afternoon when a 22-year-old youth was fatally electrocuted while attempting to fetch water in his flood-hit village. The victim, identified as Anis Ghorui, a resident of Ramkantpur in Panakua Gram Panchayat under Bishnupur police station. Had ventured out through accumulated rainwater to draw drinking water when he came in contact with a live current. Neighbors rushed him to MR Bangur Hospital, but doctors declared him dead on arrival.

According to his father, Sanjit Ghouri, the young man had earlier removed the cover of their home's solar system. Continuous overnight rainfall had left the equipment exposed and fully electrified. "As soon as he turned on the switch, he was thrown off. The electricity cut instantly. My son lost his life in moment, "the grieving father recounted, urging that such negligence should not claim the lives of other children. Family members say Anis was in good health and had dinned with them the previous night before going to bed. None could have foreseen that a simple act of fetching water would end his life. The incident has sparked aguish in the locality, exposing yet again the lethal dangers of unprotected electrical system in flood-prone rural Bengal. Heavy overnight rainfall had left the area submerged, creating deadly trap where electricity and water combined with fatal consequences. For the Ghorui family, the sudden death of their young son is loss heavy to bear. For the community, it is a grim reminder that lapses in electrical safety- when combined with the flooding- can turn the most ordinary acts of survival into fatal accidents.

Visa-Bharati's pre-puja eviction sparks uproar

MI News Service, Birbhum: In a move that has triggered sharp political backlash and anxiety among local traders, Visva-Bharati University has issued a controversial eviction order against roadside hawkers just days before Durga Puja. On September 17, the university authorities circulated a notice declaring that no hawker would be allowed to operate along a 2.5-kilometre stretch between the Visva-Bharati International Guest House and the Fire Brigade intersection. The order directs all vendors to vacate the area within seven days, effectively dismantling businesses that have operated in the vicinity for decades.

The timing of the noticeon the eve of Bengal's biggest festival-has set off a storm. Traders, already preparing for the festive rush, now face the prospect of sudden displacement. "We have been doing business here for 25 to 30 years. We don't litter, we follow Visva-Bharati's rules and maintain cleanliness. Why this decision now, just before Puja? If our business shuts down, how will we feed our families? How will our children study?" asked a distraught shopkeeper. Political parties have seized on the issue. The Trinamool Congress accused the new Vice-Chancellor of following the "same anti-people path" as his controversial predecessor, Vidyut Chakraborty. "To deprive ordinary traders of their livelihood before Puja is absolutely wrong," the party declared. The Left echoed similar sentiments, demanding immediate

Bomb explodes at TMC leader's house, panic in Dinhata

MI News Service, Cooch Behar: A sudden bomb explosion at the residence of a Trinamool Congress leader in Dinhata late Tuesday night sent shockwaves through the Sahebganj Gram Panchayat area, raising serious security concerns on the eve of Durga Puja. The blast occurred at around 2 a.m. at the house of Kohinoor Khatun Bibi, former head of the Gram Panchayat, and Muzaffar Rahman Mintu, block president of the Trinamool Congress Minority Cell. A loud explosion shook the locality, causing widespread panic among residents. Smoke was seen billowing from the

Youth drowns while fleeing police raid in Nadia

Krishnaganj : A youth drowned in a pond while allegedly trying to escape a police raid in Nadia's Krishnaganj on Monday night. His body was recovered on Tuesday morning, triggering tension and protests in the area. The deceased has been identified as Rama Biswas, a resident of the locality.

Police said they had gone to No. 9 Ghata area of Majdia to investigate a burglary at an elderly woman's house. During the probe, officers raided a gambling den inside a local mango orchard, where liquor consumption was also reported.

According to witnesses, three men tried to flee the spot. Two managed to escape through the orchard, while Biswas jumped into an adjoining pond. He went missing immediately. Despite overnight searches, he could not be traced. Divers were deployed on Tuesday mornout after a brief search. Locals alleged that gambling and liquor dens had been operating in the area for a long time, but repeated complaints to police went unheard. Bottles, glasses, and playing cards were recovered from the orchard during the raid, sources said.

The body has been sent for post-mortem. Biswas's family members have accused police of negligence, while resentment continues to brew ing, and his body was fished in the locality.

Cabinet approves Rs.69,725 crore Package to Revitalize India's Shipbuilding and Maritime Sector

Delhi: Recognizing the strategic and economic importance of the maritime sector, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, today approved a comprehensive package of Rs.69,725 crore to revitalize India's shipbuilding and maritime ecosystem. The package introduces a four-pillar approach designed to strengthen domestic capacity, improve longterm financing, promote greenfield and brownfield shipyard development, enhance technical capabilities and skilling, and implement legal, taxation, and

policy reforms to create a robust maritime infrastructure.

Under this package, the Shipbuilding Financial Assistance Scheme (SBFAS) will be extended until 31 March 2036 with a total corpus of Rs.24,736 crore. The scheme aims to incentivize ship building in India and includes a Shipbreaking Credit Note with an allocation of Rs.4,001 crore. A National Shipbuilding Mission will also be established to oversee the implementation of all initiatives.

In addition, the Maritime Development Fund (MDF) has been approved with a corpus of Rs.25,000 crore to provide long-

The special nanomaterial called graphitic carbon nitride (g-C?N?) can stimulate brain cells -- without the need for electrodes, lasers, or

The findings, published in the journal ACS Applied Materials and Interfaces, demonstrate that graphitic carbon nitride helps neurons grow, mature, and communicate more effectively by tapping into the brain's own electrical activity.

'This is the first demonstration of semiconducting nanomaterials directly modulating neurons without external stimulation," said Dr. Manish Singh, who led the study from INST.

"It opens new therapeutic avenues for neurodegenerative diseases

like Parkinson's and Alzheimer's," Singh added. The material also boosted dopamine production in lab-grown brain-

like cells and reduced toxic proteins linked to Parkinson's disease in

Normally, treatments such as deep brain stimulation (DBS) require surgical implants, while other methods use magnetic or ultrasound waves to reach brain tissue. Although these are effective, they are also invasive or limited.

Graphitic carbon nitride, on the other hand, can "talk" to neurons

When placed near nerve cells, it generates tiny electric fields in response to the brain's voltage signals. These fields open calcium channels on neurons, triggering growth and improving connections between cells -- without any external device.

The material, acting like a smart switch, responds to neurons' resting and active states, creating the right conditions for healthy brain

This biocompatible nanomaterial, with the ability to stimulate brain cells and reduce disease-linked proteins, offers a potential non-invasive therapy for millions.

The breakthrough could also impact futuristic technologies such as "brainware computing."

Scientists worldwide are experimenting with brain organoids -- tiny lab-grown brain tissues -- as biological processors. Coupling them with semiconducting nanomaterials like g-C?N? could make these living computers more efficient, opening new frontiers in bio-inspired com-

The researchers pointed out that more preclinical and clinical studies are needed before human applications.

"We believe this marks a paradigm shift in neuromodulation research. "From treating brain injuries to managing neurodegeneration, semiconducting nanomaterials hold immense promise for the



In its Global report on hyper-tension 2025, during the 80th United Nations General Assembly, the WHO shared the example of India for its successful pricing approaches for essential hypertension medicines.

comprehensive "India's approach to improving hypertension care, including its National Free Drugs Service Initiative, the promotion of the use of generic medicines, and the imposition of price ceilings on essential antihy-pertensive medicines, has yielded substantial public health gains and improved blood pressure control rates," the WHO said.
Launched in 2018-2019, the

government's India Hypertension Control Initiative (IHCI) ensured a reliable supply of free, qualityassured generic antihypertensive medicines in public sector clinics. It was also supported by simple, protocol-driven treatment regimens and robust medicines procurement systems.

In addition, the National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) also set the price ceilings for essential medicines, including antihypertensives, under the Drug Price Control Order and the National List of Essential Medicines

The NPPA calculated these ceiling prices based on average market prices, ensuring medicines remain affordable while allowing fair profit margins for



approach manufacturers.The kept out-of-pocket costs low for patients and thus enabled the public health system to provide a reliable supply of affordable, quality-assured generic medi-

cines, the report said.

The WHO said that studies indicate that when hypertension medicines are procured and dispensed through public sector channels or Jan-Aushadhi generic medicines stores, annual costs per patient can be up to 80 per cent lower than in the private sector, further enhancing affordability and access

The report stated that before these reforms were initiated, hypertension control rates in India were low -- only about 14 per cent of hypertensive adults achieved blood pressure control.

However, "recent programme from Punjab Maharashtra show that among patients retained in care and treated according to protocol, blood pressure control rates rose to 70-81 per cent at follow-up, with mean systolic blood pressure

reductions of 15-16 mmHg", the

WHO said. "These improvements demonstrate that public investment in affordable, accessible antihypertensive medicines not only enhances clinical outcomes but also reduces the economic burden of cardiovascular disease, offering a high value return by preventing costly heart attacks, strokes, and related complica-tions," the global health body the global health body

Meanwhile, the WHO report showed that 1.4 billion people lived with hypertension in 2024, yet just over one in five have it under control either through medication or addressing modifiable health risks.

The analysis of data from 195 countries and territories shows that 99 of them have national hypertension control rates below 20 per cent. Only 28 per cent of low-income countries report that all WHO-recommended hypertension medicines are generally available in pharmacies or primary care facilities

Why integrating perinatal mental health in national programmes is important



New Delhi: There is an urgent need to integrate perinatal maternal mental health into national programmes to help fight postpartum depression, anxiety and other such conditions among new mothers, said health experts on Monday.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), worldwide, about 10 per cent of pregnant women and 13 per cent of women who have just given birth experience a mental disorder, primarily depression.

India has more than 25 million births per year, but most women with mental health problems during pregnancy and one year after birth (the "perinatal period") go undetected and untreated, especially in rural areas.

A recent systematic review among perinatal women in India found that the prevalence rates for perinatal depression ranged from 14-24 per cent in community-based studies, while some meta-analyses reported a pooled estimate of around 22 per cent for postpartum depression.

Although maternal mortality in India has reduced by over 50 per cent since the early 2000s to 97 deaths per 100,000, maternal suicide constitutes an increasing proportion of maternal deaths. A recent report in Kerala estimated that maternal sui-

cide accounted for nearly one in five maternal deaths in 2020. There is an urgent need to integrate perinatal maternal mental health into national programmes in India," said Prof. Rajesh Sagar, AIIMS.

Speaking at an expert consultation on perinatal mental health in the national capital, the expert raised concerns over the lack of a dedicated initiative to support new mothers facing mental health issues.

'While women's mental health is mentioned in policies such as the National Mental Health Policy 2014, the Mental Health Care Act 2017, and others, there is no dedicated programme or

screening mechanism in place," Sagar said.

The experts, including Prof. Prabha Chandra from NIMHANS, highlighted gaps in training for doctors, nurses, and ASHAs, the lack of culturally relevant tools, and the stigma that prevents women from seeking psychological help even when screened positive.

They called for state-specific strategies, collaboration across states, capacity building, and mandatory history-taking during antenatal care.

"It is critical to ensure that perinatal mental health is not seen as a standalone as this might increase the stigma and discrimination that women with perinatal mental health problems face; rather it should be included within the routine antenatal and postnatal care that pregnant and lactating women receive, thus making it sustainable," said Dr. Y.K. Sandhya, Program Lead - Mental Health, The George Institute for Global Health



ISSF Junior World Cup: First medals set to be decided in non-Olympic event

NEW DELHI: The first medals of the ISSF Junior World Cup New Delhi 2025 will be decided on Thursday, with the 50m Rifle Prone event for both men and women set to start proceedings at the Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Range, here in India's national

when he departed.

The Olympic events will start on Friday (September 26), with the 10m Air pistol finals scheduled. A total of 208 shooters from 18 countries will be participating in 18 events, 15 Olympic and three Non-Olympic events, with a total of 54 medals to be earned.

India will field 10 athletes, five each in both the junior men's and women's categories, for the 50m Rifle Prone event, a non-Olympic event which has 21 athletes in the fray for the medals.

The Indian challenge will be spearheaded Asian Championship bronze medallist Vedant Nitin Waghmare and 50m Rifle 3 Positions (3P) gold medallist in Shymkent, Anushka H. Thokur. The other athletes in the men's section are Rohit Kanyan, Kushagra Singh Rajawat, Deependra Singh Shekhawat, and Kunal Sharma, while Nimrat Kaur Brar, Saniya Sapale, Aadhya Agrawal, and Anshika will be in



action in the women's category.

The host nation, India, will lead the field with a strong contingent of 69 athletes, while other participating nations include the United States of America (20), Italy (10), Czechia (9), Islamic Republic of Iran (8), Croatia (7). Great Britain (6), United Arab Emirates (5), Slovakia (5), Qatar (4), Oman (4), Spain (8), Finland (3), Netherlands (3), Cyprus (3), New Zealand (2), Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (2), along with 40 Individual Neutral Athletes (AIN).

This will be the second and final World Cup for Juniors this year, following the first event hosted in Suhl, Germany, earlier this year in May, where India finished on top of the medals table with 11 medals, including 3 gold, 4 silver, and 4 bronze.



Men's T20I rankings, India duo of Chakravarthy have retained their top spots in the batting and bowling charts, respectively.

Despite going wicketless in the recent Super Fours outing against Pakistan in the Asia Cup, Chakaravarthy bowled an economical spell of 0-25 that helped control the scoring rate and has consolidated his place at the top with a 14 rating-point gain. Seam-bowling all-rounder

Hardik Pandya is up six places to 60th place in bowlers' rankings, while retaining top spot in allrounders' rankings in the shortest format. Abhishek, meanwhile, has managed to hold on to the top spot due to his quick-fire 38 against Oman in India's final group stage encounter, before smashing a match-winning 74 to chase down Pakistan's total of 171 on Sunday. His teammate, left-handed batter Tilak Varma. who helped finish the chase against Pakistan with an electric 30 not out off 19 balls, has gained a position to be at number three in the batters' rankings. In terms of other rankings gainers through the Asia Cup, Pakistan leg-spinner Abrar Ahmed has surged to number four in bowlers' rankings following a significant leap of 12 places taking



his tally to 703 rating points. It comes on the back of him returning with a miserly spell of 1-8 against Sri Lanka that helped Pakistan revive their campaign. Abrar had earlier picked up 2-

13 against the UAE, though he endured a subdued outing against India (1-42). angladesh's left-arm pacer Mustafizur Rahman also returned to the top 10 after a six-place jump, recovering from a brief dip in form last week. So far, he has claimed six wickets at an average of eight in his last two matches, reaffirming his value in the T20I setup. Pakistan's Haris Rauf (up nine places to 28) is the other notable gainer in the bowling charts. In the batting rankings, Sahibzada Farhan climbed 31 places to reach 24th spot after a fluent 58 off 45 balls against India, while Hussain Talat made a staggering jump of 1474 places to joint 234th following his match-winning knock against Sri Lanka. Bangladesh's Saif Hassan also made a mark, rising 133 places to 81st after his 61-run effort in the Super Four stage. Among allrounders, Pakistan's Faheem Ashraf moved up 12 places to joint 39th, rewarded for his consistent control with the ball, while Sri Lanka's Wanindu Hasaranga climbed to seventh place after picking four wickets in his last
