Kolkata Electrocution Deaths: Cal HC Seeks Report from State, Municipality, and CESC

The Calcutta High Court took suomotu cognizance of the deaths caused by electrocution during the recent flooding in Kolkata. Acting Chief Justice Soumen Sen and Justice Apurba Sinha Ray's division bench directed the state government, Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC), and the Calcutta Electric Supply Corporation (CESC) to submit detailed reports. The court has sought information on the compensation promised to victims' families and the measures being taken to repair and upgrade the city's drainage and canal system. Both the civic body and the CESC must also clarify what immediate steps they adopted to prevent further tragedies. The bench fixed November 7 as the deadline for submission of the reports, with the matter scheduled for hearing on the same day. PG 3

GST reforms will continue and tax burden to ease further, says PM



MI News Service, New Delhi in the indirect tax regime by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has reiterated that the reforms in GST will continue and the tax burden on citizens will further ease as the economy gains more strength. The Prime minister emphasised that the nation currently possesses strong willpower for reforms, backed by democratic and political stability, along with policy predictability. Incidentall, from September 22 a next-generation reform in GST with only two slabs, has comes into affect . PM v Modi said the structural reforms in Goods and Services Tax (GST) are set to give new wings to country's growth story. Addressing the gathering after inaugurating the Uttar Pradesh International Trade Show 2025 at Noida on Thursday, PM Modi said his government has significantly reduced taxes, curbed inflation, and increased both income and savings for the people. He said that by making income up to Rs 12 lakh tax-free and implementing new GST reforms, citizens are set to save Rs 2.5 lakh crore this year alone. The Prime Minister said the government introduced reforms

implementing GST in 2017, a significant step towards strengthening the economy, followed by further reforms in September of this year. "Today, the country is proudly celebrating 'GST Bachat Utsav'. I want to tell you that we are not going to stop here. In 2017, we brought GST... and then again (brought reforms) in We will further strengthen the economy. As the economy continues to grow, the tax burden will continue to decrease. With the blessings of the citizens. the reforms in GST will continue," he said. The Prime Minister also accused opposition parties, particularly the Congress, of spreading falsehoods to cover up their own governance failures, asserting that during the Congress regime, excessive taxation burdened ordinary citizens. "The poor, new middle class, and middle class have all benefited with higher savings (due to IT benefits and GST reforms). Despite this, some political parties are trying to confuse people. Congress and its allies are

Villagers protest irregularities in school land records

Medinipore: Tension erupted in Nandigram as local residents staged a protest alleging financial irregularities and illegal transfer of school land at the historic Brajmohan Tiari Shiksha Niketan (BMT High School). The deputation to the Nandigram SI office claimed that land records of the school and nearby institutions were allegedly manipulated, raising questions over transparency and administrative oversight.

According to residents, prior to 1920, separate land parcels existed under the names of Brajmohan Tiari High School, Nandigram High School, and Nandigram English Medium High School. They alleged that in recent months, with administrative involvement, records were amended to consolidate all land under the name of BMT Shiksha Niketan. The villagers further claimed that some plots were sold below government-approved rates, while newly acquired land for an English medium school was purchased at double the official valuation. These allegations prompted local residents to demand a detailed inquiry, questioning the legality of the

However, the school inspector denied any wrongdoing, asserting that all transactions were conducted with proper government approval. Ranjit Kumar Shasmal, headmaster of BMT Shiksha Niketan, clarified that historical land records were fragmented due to multiple donations over the years, and the recent corrections were made to consolidate and regularize the property in accordance with government procedures. He added that the previously existing schools-Nandigram High School and English Medium High School-no longer operate independently. Members of donor families, including Shambhu Tiari, supported the school's stance, stating that all land transfers and acquisitions for the new English medium school were executed transparently and with proper authorization. The protest has highlighted the sensitivity of historical land ownership and record-keeping in educational institutions, as well as the need for clear communication between authorities and local stakeholders to prevent

Festive cheers overshadowed by worker unrest in Alipurduar tea Garden

MI News Service, Alipurduar: As the festive season approaches, tea garden workers in Alipurduar district are staging protests, demanding bonuses and wages that remain unpaid, highlighting growing unrest in the region's plantation sector. Workers at Joy Birpara Tea Garden have halted work, citing failure of management to disburse Puja bonuses. Sources indicate that nearly 50% of tea gardens in Alipurduar district have yet to issue bonuses, despite assurances from the Deputy Labour Commissioner that payments would be completed by September 24.

The crisis is compounded by the closure of three major gardens-Lankapara, Ramjhora, and Madhu-leaving approximately 5,000 workers unemployed. While some gardens remain operational on government records, they are re-

management of private investors, leaving workers in financial uncertainty. A faction of the Greater Cooch Behar Peoples' Association (GCPA) underscored they wanted a separate Cooch Behar state and issued a fresh set of demands to the state and central governments.

"As the 2026 elections are ahead, Bangshibadan Barman is trying to use his clout as a bargaining chip to exert pressure on Trinamool and the BJP," said a political veteran in Cooch Behar.

At the meeting, Barman reminded people that according to the merger agreement signed in 1949 by the then royals of the princely state of Cooch Behar and the Indian government, Cooch Behar was supposed to be a 'C' category state.

"Instead, it was reduced to a district of Bengal. The Centre should consider the agreement and take necessary steps. We have no problem if the special intensive revision of electoral roll is conducted in Cooch Behar as we are sons of the soil." he said.

"Ahead of the elections, we will see what decisions these parties (the BJP and Trinamool) take on issues we have flagged. Accordingly, we will decide whom to support,"

Migrant worker from Malda killed in Mysore

area of Malda as news emerged that Khairul Jamal (54), a migrant worker from the district, was allegedly beaten to death in Mysore, Karnataka. Khairul had gone to Karnataka in April seeking employment to support his family.

According to family sources, a group of miscreants attacked him on Wednesday night. The next day, the devastating news reached his village, leaving his family-including his wife and a younger daughter studying in Class 8-in profound grief. His elder daughter is already married. The incident has ignited local outrage, with leaders of the District Trinamool Workers' Organization (INTTUC), including President Biswajit Halder, visiting the bereaved family on Thursday. They condemned the alleged attack, pledged support to the family, and highlighted a broader pattern

facing harassment and violence in other states. Past incidents in Murshidabad, including attacks on Bengali workers in Sandeshkhali and Farakka, have fueled concern about the safety of migrant laborers. Reports suggest that workers have been assaulted for speaking their native language, prompting interventions at the state and national levels. Trinamool Congress leaders, including Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee and All India Secretary Abhishek Banerjee, have publicly condemned such attacks and raised the matter in Parliament. Authorities in Karnataka have yet to provide a detailed explanation for the assault. Questions remain about the motive behind Khairul's alleged beating and the circumstances surrounding his death. The victim, Lipika Santra, wife of Prashant Santra, a resident of Rangmahal, alleged that she borrowed money at exorbitant interest rates to start a small business. However, when the business failed, the couple was unable to meet the relentless interest demand. What followed, she claimed, was a cycle of mental, physical and financial torture at the hands of local women, who not only harassed her but allegedly went as far as coercing her to sell of her kidneys to repay the debt. Lipika admitted she initially agreed under pressure but returned home without undergoing to operation, fearing for her family's future. The harassment

then escalated. According to Lipi ka, she was forcibly thrown out her house, locked up, and left humiliated in front of her neighbors. The family abandoned their home six months ago and begun living a rented house elsewhere. The nightmare, however, did not end. On Wednesday, Lipika alleged that a group of women from the locality vandalised her ancestral home, smashing furniture and looting household items including a television, cupboard, and ceiling fans. The victim has lodged a formal complaint at Jagatballabhpur Police Station, seeking justice and protection. Shockingly, when approached for comment, several women of the village flatly denied any involvement in the incident. The case has triggered outrage in the area, raising fresh questions about the unchecked menace of loan sharks, the silence of law enforcement, and the plight of vulnerable borrowers who are often pushed to the edge of desperation.

spur number 7½ of Bakshiganj Gram Panchayat. This marks the second mortar shell recovered along the Teesta in just seven days, following a similar discovery in the Mainaguri police station area. Authorities suggest that munitions swept away during the 2023 floods are gradually surfacing along the river's banks, posing a continuing threat to local residents and farmland.



Ladakh crisis is govt's own creation, alleges opposition

by the Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) in support of cliactivist Sonam Wangchuk, who was leading a hunger strike. Lieutenant Governor of the Union territory, Kavinder Gupta, also chaired a security review meeting today and called for heightened vigilance to safeguard peace. The agitation for Ladakh's statehood spiralled into violence, arson and street clashes in Leh on Wednesday. The unrest broke out during a shutdown called by the Leh Apex Body (LAB), which has been spearheading a five-year campaign seeking statehood Ladakh. Protesters torched a Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) office, a police vehicle, and several private cars. The Union home ministry later announced that the situation had been brought under control and that no further violence had occurred after 4 pm. However, In its statement, the ministry appealed to the public not to circulate old or inflammatory videos through the media or social

media platforms.

"Except for the regrettable incidents earlier in the day, the situation in Ladakh was brought under control by 4 pm," the ministry noted, adding that the central government remains committed to meeting the aspirations of Ladakh's people by ensuring appropriate constitutional safeguards. Officials said police and paramilitary forces, deployed in large numbers across the town, used tear gas shells to disperse crowds and restore order. Residents of Ladakh have also been pressing for inclusion of the Union Territory under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution, which covers provisions for the administration of tribal areas in Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, and Mizoram under Articles 244(2) and 275(1). In August 2019, the BJP-led government revoked Article 370 and divided the former state of Jammu and Kashmir into the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. Activist Sonam Wangchuk on Wednesday brought an end to his 15-day hunger strike following the outbreak of clashes in Leh over demands for statehood and the inclusion of Ladakh under the Sixth Schedule.



Amit Shah to Inaugurate Three Durga Puja Pandals in Kolkata

MI News Service, Kolkata: Union Home Minister Amit Shah is expected to arrive in Kolkata this evening and is scheduled to unveil three Durga Puja pandals on Chaturthi, Friday, including the famous Santosh Mitra Square pandal in the central part of the city. His visit comes at the invitation of Leader of Opposition SuvenduAdhikari, who recently visited New Delhi and requested Shah's presence in Kolkata during West Bengal's biggest festival, Durga Puja. According to a tenta-tive schedule, Shah, after reaching Kolkata, will meet with the top state leadership and is likely to review preparations ahead of the 2026 state assembly elections, scheduled for April-May. After spending the night in a hotel, Shah is slated to inaugurate a Durga Puja at Lake Avenue in South Kolkata, followed by the Santosh Mitra Square Puja in Bowbazar, organised

by BJP Councillor Sajal Ghosh, a key party func-Santosh Mitra Puja, one of Kolkata's must-see celebrations, is known for addressing contemporary issues through its themes. This year, the theme "Operation Sindoor" pays tribute to the Indian Armed Forces for their targeted action against anti-India terrorist hideouts in Pakistan. To mark their 90th year, the organisers have chosen to salute the Indian forces, with Union Home Minister Amit Shah scheduled to inaugurate the pandal before visitors' entry on Chaturthi. Following this, Shah will visit Salt Lake to inaugurate the Eastern Zonal Cultural Centre (EZCC)'s Durga Puja before returning to Delhi on Friday evening. Party sources said Shah's final itinerary is still under consideration by the Union Home Ministry, as he is expected to arrive from

Kolkata Braces for Rain During Durga Puja After Recent Flooding

MI News Service, Kolkata: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued fresh warnings of rain during Durga Puja, raising concerns for pandal hoppers, commuters, and festival organisers alike. According to the IMD, a low-pressure system is forming over the Bay of Bengal and is likely to intensify into a depression by September 26 before crossing the Odisha-Andhra coast the following morning. Under its influence, South Bengal, including Kolkata, is expected to receive light to moderate rainfall almost daily over the next week. The department has issued a specific alert for September 27, predicting heavy rainfall at isolated places in South 24 Parganas and Jhargram. Along with rain, thunderstorms and lightning are likely, accompanied by gusty winds reaching speeds of 40-50 kmph in parts of Kolkata and adjoining districts. This fresh bout of showers is expected to coincide with the festive peak days-Sashthi to Ashtamiwhen pandal hopping draws massive crowds across the city. The IMD has cautioned that the downpour may trigger traffic congestion, waterlogging in low-lying areas, and temporary flooding of underpasses.

"In the coming days, I want to see more women's forces in the police. When I was MP, I used to come here by boat due to waterlogging. After many complaints, this place was restructured. Massive Fire Breaks Out At A Guest-House

MI News Service, Kolkata: Just days before Durga Puja, panic gripped south Kolkata on Thursday morning when a massive fire broke out in a multi-storied building on Prince Appear Shah Boad Prince Anwar Shah Road. Five fire tenders rushed to the spot and fire personnel immediately began opera-tions to bring the blaze under control. The building houses a hotel, café, offices, and on the ground floor, a bank branch. Surrounded by several residential houses and located along one of the city's busiest stretches, the incident created widespread panic among residents and commuters. According to the fire department, no one was trapped inside, and no

injuries have been reported. The fire was first noticed around 11 a.m. on the fourth floor of a guest house within the building. According to initial reports from the fire department, a makeshift kitchen had been set up in an improvised wooden structure. It is suspected that the blaze originated there before spreading rapidly to other parts of the building. Within minutes, thick black smoke engulfed the area, while flames raged from the top floor, making the situa-

tion look alarming.
All guests, staff, and residents were quickly evacuated from the premises, and the police cordoned off the entire stretch to control traffic. Vehicular movement on Prince Anwar Shah Road came to a halt, causing major disruption in the morning hours. Fire department officials said prelimi-nary investigations point to an electrical short circuit as the possible cause of the blaze. However, the exact source is yet to be confirmed. Authorities are also examining whether the topfloor extension of the guest house had the required clearances from the municipal corporation. Fire Minister Sujit Bose, who was monitoring the situation, said the fire brigade is working at full capacity to contain the flames. He added that the legality of the building's rooftop extension will also be investigated, and appropriate action will be taken if violations are found.

Kolkata Electrocution Deaths:

Cal HC Seeks Report from State, Municipality, and CESC

MI News Service, Kolkata: The Calcutta High Court took suomotu cognizance of the deaths caused by electrocution during the recent flooding in Kolkata. Acting Chief Justice Soumen Sen and Justice Apurba Sinha Ray's division bench directed the state government, Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC), and the Calcutta Electric Supply Corporation (CESC) to submit detailed reports. The court has sought in-

formation on the compensa-

tion promised to victims' families and the measures being taken to repair and upgrade the city's drainage and canal system. Both the civic body and the CESC must also clarify what immediate steps they adopted to prevent further tragedies. The bench fixed November 7 as the deadline for submission of the reports, with the matter scheduled for hearing on the same day. The unprecedented waterlogging following Tuesday's torrential rain left Kolkata resembling a submerged city. Vast stretches of roads and residential areas were under water, creating a dangerous mix of flooded streets and live electric wires. Several high-voltage cables snapped and fell into the water, triggering multiple fatal accidents. In Netajinagar, a cyclist was electrocuted after coming in contact with a live wire, dying instantly on the spot. In Kalikapur, a similar tragedy occurred, while further incidents were reported in Ballygunge Place and Beniapukur. In some cases, res-



difficulty retrieving bodies due to stagnant water and continuing risks of electrocution. Altogether, at least nine people died from electrocution across the city and its adjoining areas in the aftermath of the heavy rainfall. The spate of accidents has sparked widespread anger and raised serious questions about the preparedness of civic and power authorities in dealing with such crises.

Kolkata Mayor Firhad Hakim personally visited the home of Jitendra Singh, who died of electrocution in Ekbalpur. The mayor met the grieving family, spoke at length with them, and assured full support. He announced that Singh's two sons would receive assistance with their education and eventual employment, promising the family would not be left alone in their loss. Hakim emphasized that, following Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's instructions, the state government would stand by every affected family in their time of need.

Kolkata Police on High Alert: Crackdown on **Open Wires and Safety Measures Intensified**

MI News Service, Kolkata: With Durga Puja around the corner, Kolkata Police has stepped up precautionary measures to ensure safety and smooth festivities across the city. In a meeting held on Wednesday, Lalbazar authorities directed officers-in-charge (OCs) of all police stations to conduct thorough inspections in their respective areas to identify and remove open or unprotected electrical wires that could pose a risk. The move comes in the wake of Tuesday's tragedy, when at least eight people were electrocuted after coming into contact with live wires submerged in rainwater. Given forecasts of further rainfall during the festive days, police are determined to prevent any repeat of such incidents. Lalbazar officials are also coordinating with the Calcutta Electric Supply Corporation (CESC) to secure lamp posts and cables across the city.

In preparation for crowd management, police officers and constables have been instructed to report for duty with raincoats and umbrellas. From Thursday night, coinciding with Tritiya, police deployment will intensify across major puja pandals and popular zones.

The plea, filed through advocates Amritesh Mishra and Sarah, said Section 34 of the Act mandates that all government establishments should reserve not less than 4 per cent of the total number of vacancies for PwBD, of which a minimum of 1 per cent must be specifically reserved for persons with blindness and low vision. The petition said the UPSC, which conducts CMSE for recruitment to various posts under Central Health Services, Indian Railways, and other government establishments, has failed to

opportunities," it added. With appropriate accommodations, the plea said, such professionals are fully capable of performing various essential duties associated with public healthcare roles.

The plea said UPSC has also released the examination notice for CMSE-2025, which suffers from the same flaw as the notification for CMSE 2024.

Despite there being 705 vacancies, not a single one of them (let alone 1 per cent of them) were reserved for candidates blindness/low vision, it argued. Raising "reasonable apprehension", the petitioner said "grave injustice" which plagued CMSE-2024 and CMSE-2025 would continue in the next cycle. The plea, as a result, sought directions to the EPWD department to identify the posts that can be occupied by the blind and low vision persons in the combined medical services.

It also sought a direction to DoPT, DoEPWD and Union Ministry of Family Welfare to work out and provide reasonable accommodations required by persons with blindness and low vision in the combined medical services.



NIT Rourkela's indigenous, cost-effective device to help tackle heel pain



New Delhi : Researchers at the National Institute of Technology Rourkela (NIT Rourkela) have developed a lowcost and indigenous force plate that enhances gait profiling and enables better development of footwear and treatment strategies to reduce heel pain.

Heel pain is one of the most widespread foot ailments in adults. It is often linked to overloading of the plantar fascia -a band of tissue that supports the arch of the foot.

However, in many cases, changes in the heel pad -- a fatty tissue under the heel can also cause the problem. This issue acts as a shock absorber when we stand, run, or walk. With too much stress, the heel pad loses its cushioning ability to the foot, causing pain and discomfort. The condition can also be caused by aging, injury, obesity, diabetes, and ill-fitting

The new force plate works by measuring the multi-axial ground reaction forces (GRF). The GRF measured from the force plates is then used to diagnose the abnormal gait pat-

The device will be useful in sports academics, educational institutes, hospitals, and rehabilitation centers in India, as it is affordable compared to the existing foreign suppliers.

"Most neuromuscular disorders will affect the gait pattern of an individual. Since gait requires precise coordination of muscle strength and balance, disturbances in any of these can alter the walking pattern and the corresponding GRF," said Prof. A. Thirugnanam from IIT Roorkee.

"Some common neuromuscular diseases like myopathies, peripheral neuropathies, neuromuscular junction disorders, spasticity, ataxia, Parkinson's disease, cerebral palsy, etc., can alter the GRF. These abnormalities in GRF can be diagnosed using the force plate," Thirugnanam added.

Force plates are globally recognised as essential diagnostic tools for analysing human musculoskeletal health. Due to high costs and the lack of Indian manufacturers, its availability in India remains limited.

Imported force plates usually cost between Rs 30-50 lakhs. The indigenously developed force plate will cost between Rs 8 to 10 lakhs (approx), offering a cost reduction of nearly 70-85 per cent, making it an affordable alternative.

US sanctions two Indian nationals, pharmacy linked to fentanyl-laced pills

MI News Service, Washington: The US Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) has imposed sanctions on two Indian nationals- Sadiq Abbas Habib Savved and Khizar Moham mad Iqbal Shaikh- along with an India-based online pharmacy, KS International Traders, for their roles in supplying hundreds of thousands of counterfeit prescription pills laced with fentanyl and other illicit drugs to victims across

the United States. The action, announced on Wednesday, targets the growing threat of illegal online pharmacies contributing to the US opioid crisis. "The US Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) sanctioned two Indian nationals, Sadiq Abbas Habib Sayyed and Khizar Mohammad Iqbal Shaikh, for their role in collectively supplying hundreds of thousands of counterfeit prescription pills filled with fentanyl and other illicit drugs to victims across the United States. OFAC is also designating one India-based online pharmacy for its role in these criminal operations," a statement from the depart-

"Too many families have been torn apart by fentanyl. Today, we are acting to hold accountable those who profit from this poison," said Under Secretary for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence John K Hurley. "Treasury will continue to advance President Trump's commitment to Make America Fentanyl Free by targeting drug traffickers," Hurley said.

According to the Department of Treasury, Sayyed and Shaikh collaborated with narcotics traffickers in the Dominican Republic and the US to market counterfeit pills as legitimate pharmaceutical products, such as Oxycodone, Adderall, and Xanax, which were instead filled with dangerous substances like fentanyl, fentanyl analogues, and methamphetamine. The duo used encrypted messaging platforms to conduct their illegal operations. Both were previously indicted in September 2024 by a



federal grand jury in the Southern District of New York on narcotics-related charges.

"Based in India, Sadio Abbas Habib Sayyed (Sayyed) and Khizar Mohammed Iqbal Shaikh (Shaikh) worked with Dominican Republic- and U.S.based narcotics traffickers to sell counterfeit pills to Americans. Sayyed and Shaikh marketed and sold these pills as discounted, legitimate pharmaceutical products, which were instead filled with illicit drugs like fentanyl, a fentanyl analogue, and methamphetamine. Both Sayyed and Shaikh have used encrypted messaging platforms to conduct their illegal business and market their product to victims," the statement read.

According to the statement, Shaikh, the owner of KS International Traders, also known as KS Pharmacy, continued operating the online pharmacy despite the indictment. The Treasury highlighted the role of illegal online pharmacies, including those based in India, in fuelling the fentanyl crisis by supplying counterfeit pills and precursor chemicals to the US and Mexican cartels. These operations deceive consumers into believing they are purchasing safe medications, exacerbating the opioid overdose epidemic, which remains the leading cause of death for Americans aged 18 to 45, as per the Treasury Department.

The sanctions target individuals and entities contributing to the international proliferation of illicit drugs. As a result, all property of Sayyed, Shaikh, and KS International Traders in the US or under US control is blocked, and transactions involving them are prohibited unless authorised by OFAC. Violations could lead to civil or criminal penalties.

The action was coordinated with the Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement

Administration (DEA), Homeland Security Investigations, Internal Revenue Service -Criminal Investigations, and the US Postal Inspection Service. The Treasury noted that the US and India continue to collaborate under the US-India Drug Policy Framework to combat drug trafficking and its global impact.

On October 4, 2024, the DEA issued a warning about the surge in illegal online pharmacies, underscoring the dangers of counterfeit pills laced with fentanyl and methamphetamine.

RPF/Eastern Railway Gears Up for Durga Puja Festival Rush

way Protection Force (RPF), Eastern Railway, has drawn up comprehensive security measures to manage the heavy passenger rush during the upcoming Durga Puja festival, commencing from 27th September 2025.

Security arrangements will focus on around 400 railway stations, each experiencing a peak footfall of at least 30,000 passengers during the festive period. To regulate the large crowds, designated holding areas for staggered passenger movement have been set up at seven major stations,

China Open: Sinner kickstarts Beijing campaign with Cilic win; home hope **Zhang loses in first round**



BEIJING: Italian Grand Slam winner Jannik Sinner made a quick start in his bid to reclaim the China Open trophy, powering past two-time finalist Marin Cilic 6-2, 6-2 in the first round even as China's Zhang Zhizhen lost 6-4, 6-2 to France's Terence Atmane on the Lotus Court on Thursday.

Competing for the first time since his US Open final defeat to Spaniard Carlos Alcaraz, with which he also ceded the No. 1 spot in the ATP Rankings, Sinner bounced back emphatically. The 24-year-old Italian, who triumphed on his Beijing debut in 2023 and reached last year's final, saved the only break point he faced upon return to the Chinese ATP 500 event, according to Infosys ATP Stats.

Sinner will aim to keep pace in his battle with rival Alcaraz for ATP Year-End No. 1 presented by PIF honours across the remaining months of the season. He trails the Spaniard, who is competing in Tokyo, by 2,590 points in the PIF ATP Live Race To Turin.

Sinner will next face Terence Atmane for the second time in as many months. The French qualifier earlier defeated Zhang Zhizhen for his first tour-level win since his surprise run to the semi-finals in Cincinnati, where he was halted by Sinner in the pair's first ATP head-to-head clash.

The opening set went on serve

world No. 68 Atmane broke in the 10th with a forehand winner. In the second set, the Frenchman capitalised on Zhang's double fault to break in the fourth game, added another break in the eighth, and closed out the match in 71 minutes.

Wildcard entrant Zhang, 28, has a career-high ranking of No. 31 and is regarded as China's most successful male tennis player. However, injuries have hampered his progress this year, keeping him sidelined since the Indian Wells Masters in March and drop-

ping his world ranking to 370.

The Shanghai native made his return at last week's Hangzhou Open, where he defeated compatriot Bu Yunchaokete in the first round before falling to Dalibor Svrcina of the Czech Republic.

Earlier in the day in the Chinese capital, Alexandre Muller sprang an early upset by rallying past Karen Khachanov 4-6, 7-6(5), 6-4 for his first Top 10 win on hard courts and third overall (3-9). He will next play Fabian Marozsan, who ousted Benjamin Bonzi 7-6(1), 6-3 on his Beijing debut. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina also booked his spot in the second round with a clinical 6-1, 6-3 victory over Camilo Ugo Carabelli. The Spaniard, who hit 21 winners, including six aces, awaits eighth seed Daniil Medvedev or Cameron Norrie

LONDON : Premier League champion Liverpool will meet FA Cup holder Crystal Palace in the standout tie of the fourth round of the Carabao Cup football tournament.





Nothing can beat people cheering India at the stadiums, says Smriti ahead of ODI WC

NEW DELHI : India's in-form vice-captain Smriti Mandhana feels the energy of home crowd will be a defining factor as the co-hosts gears up to play in the 2025 Women's ODI World Cup, starting on September 30. India will open their campaign

against co-hosts Sri Lanka in Guwahati, as they begin their quest to win their first-ever World Cup. "We all have been waiting for this World Cup. A lot of things have changed for women's cricket in India since 2013 when I was a kid. "I am really excited to see

how the stadiums turn out and the way they will support. The Women's Premier League (WPL) has made us immune to the loud crowd as well. Nothing can beat people cheering India at the stadiums," said Smriti on JioStar on She also recalled of the time

when she received her first Indian jersey. "I remember I was 17 when I got the India jersey in my room. I don't think I can forget it. I wore it and sent the photos to my parents and my brother. They were very emotional. Challenges are a part of who you are." Smriti reflected on the challenges behind her quest to play for India. "The biggest challenge for me was, I was in Sangli, and not many girls used to play cricket then. A lot of times, for camps, I had to travel from Sangli to Pune, and spend 4-5 months away from home. As a 14-year old to do that, and miss out on school, it was very challenging.

Smriti further spoke about when she felt proud while wearing Indian jersey and the changes



she made after the side failed to enter 2024 T20 World Cup knockouts. "I think the Commonwealth semi-final against Australia was when I felt extremely proud about wearing this jersey. I think our belief has changed a lot and it only changes with what work you put behind it." "When the effort is there, the fight will always be there. That's one thing that has majorly changed with this team, everyone believes they are match-winners. The last T20 World Cup was something which hit me quite a lot. I thought to myself, 'I don't want to feel like this as an athlete in my life'. Post that, a lot of fitness and nutritional changes have come into place.

India all-rounder Deepti Sharma talked about how special it is to wear the Indian jersey and

how the team's mindset has evolved over a long period of time. "Whenever I wear this blue jersey, I try to make every moment count in it. There are goose bumps when we line up for the national anthem.

"When I made 188 against Ireland in South Africa, that was the highest score for India. I scored those runs as an opener and I am really proud about that moment in an India jersey.

"Our mindset has changed now a bit, regardless of the team we are facing and the format. We focus on what we can pull off and always talk about positive things and apply the same on the ground. We talk to Amol sir in our practice sessions and the main thing is to try and come out of our comfort zone to plan for different situations," she said.
