

Abhishek Launches Fierce Attack on BJP, EC in Cooch Behar Rally

From Cooch Behar, where the Trinamool Congress launched its ‘NaboJowarYatra’ in 2023, the party’s national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee on Tuesday renewed his call for a political battle, launching a sharp attack on both the Election Commission and the Bharatiya Janata Party. Beginning his visit with prayers at the historic Madan Mohan Temple, Banerjee later addressed a massive gathering at the TMC’s ‘RanaSankalp Sabha’, positioning Cooch Behar once again at the centre of the state’s political discourse. In a dramatic moment during his address, Banerjee sought to underline alleged irregularities in the voter list. He claimed that several individuals who have been officially marked as deceased in Election Commission records are, in fact, alive. To make his point, he called 10 such individuals onto the stage, including AshwiniAdhikari, Kajima Khatun, MurshidAlam, Azizur Rahman, and Tapan Barman.

MI News Service, New Delhi : Eternal-owned quick-commerce firm Blinkit has dropped its '10-minute' delivery claim from all platforms amid nationwide growing concerns over delivery workers' welfare. It has revised the tag-line from "10,000+ products delivered in 10 minutes" to "30,000+ products delivered at your doorstep". Other quick commerce platforms, such as Swiggy and Zepto, may also follow suit after the intervention by the Union Ministry of Labour, which was concerned about the welfare of the delivery workers trying to meet such tight deadlines. The move follows discussions the labour ministry held with the quick commerce platforms to ensure greater safety, security and improved working conditions for gig workers. The promise of 10-minute delivery led to gig workers holding a nationwide strike on New Year's Eve in 2025, drawing attention to workers' health, safety and income.

To be sure, while the 10-minute delivery branding was still visible on the Google Play Store and iOS App store for Zepto, Instamart and BigBasket, there was no such branding for Blinkit.

In a recent post on X, Eternal Group CEO Deepinder Goyal had claimed that the 10-minute delivery promise does not pressure riders or lead to unsafe driving, as they are not shown the 10-minute timer on the app. "Quick commerce's 10-minute promise DOES NOT put pressure on gig workers, and it DOESN'T lead to unsafe driving. Why? The most common concern is that faster delivery promises translate into pressure on delivery partners to drive unsafely. That isn't how the system operates." Firstly, delivery partners are not shown customer-facing time promises.

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Western disturbance likely to end dry spell in Kashmir

MI News Service, Srinagar : A western disturbance is expected to hit Kashmir from January 16, raising hopes for a fresh spell of light to moderate snowfall in the valley, officials said on Tuesday.

According to the Meteorological Department officials, a weak Western Disturbance is likely to affect the weather system in the region on Friday, followed by a stronger system three days later. While the higher reaches have received heavy snow this winter, the plains continue to face a prolonged dry spell. This lack of precipitation has led to an increase in suspended particulate matter, with the Air Quality Index (AQI) in Srinagar hovering around the 180 mark. On Monday evening, the AQI in the summer capital reached as high as 500.

Meanwhile, cold wave conditions intensified across the valley as minimum temperatures dropped on Monday night. Srinagar recorded a low of minus 4.9 degree Celsius on Monday night, down from minus 2.4 degree Celsius the previous night, the official said. Sonamarg in Ganderbal district was the coldest place in the valley at minus 7.0 degree Celsius. Pahalgam, a base camp for the annual Amarnath Yatra, recorded minus 6.2 degree Celsius. In north Kashmir, the ski resort of Gulmarg saw the mercury settle at minus 3.5 degree Celsius. Other places like Qazigund recorded a low of minus 5.0 degree Celsius, while Kokernag and Kupwara registered minus 1.6 and minus 5.8 degree Celsius respectively. The region is currently in the "Chilla-i-Kalan", a 40-day period of extreme cold that began on December 21 and ends on January 30. During this time, temperatures frequently drop well below the freezing point

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Op Sindoor is ready to deal with any misadventure effectively : Army Chief

MI News Service, New Delhi : Operation Sindoor is only temporarily paused but is 'still on', and any possible misadventure by any adversary will be dealt with firmly and effectively, Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi said here on Tuesday, sending a firm message to Pakistan. The Army chief, addressing a press conference, said the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China has been stable, but it needs constant vigil. Extensively elaborating on various aspects of Operation Sindoor, Gen Dwivedi said it helped in resetting the strategic assumptions as the Indian military struck deep into Pakistan to dismantle its terror infrastructure and puncturing Islamabad's "longstanding nuclear rhetoric". "As you may be aware, Operation Sindoor remains ongoing, and a future misadventure will be resolutely responded to," the Army Chief reiterated. Gen Dwivedi said the operation was India's calibrated and resolute response to cross-border terrorism, demonstrating readiness, precision, and strategic clarity. He also said that the Indian Army had mobilised its troops and was ready for ground offensives. "The situation along

the northern front remains stable, but needs constant vigil. Renewed contact, and confidence-building measures are contributing to the gradual normalisation of the situation," he said. "Concurrently, capability development and infrastructure enhancement are progressing through a whole-of-government approach," he added. The Army chief said the situation in Jammu and Kashmir remains sensitive but firmly under control.

MI News Service, Sriharikota : India's storied "workhorse" rocket stumbled again on Monday, and with it came a cascade of re-actions - some refusing to call it a failure, some meeting the blow with quiet resilience, and others openly wondering whether strategically important missions are being sabotaged.

The Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV-C62), carrying the EOS-N1 Earth-observation satellite and a cluster of commercial payloads, deviated from its planned path after "disturbances" at the end of the third stage, in the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) first mission of 2026. But the overwhelming feeling was ISRO will bounce back stronger, since the Indian space community has no other alternative but to strive for a more resilient higher orbit. The saving grace remains Launch Vehicle Mark-3 which has a one hundred percent success record, which did launch a few weeks ago from the same rocket port at Sriharikota. At 10:18 am on Monday, the 44.4-metre, four-stage PSLV lifted off from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, with an ambitious manifest that included a strategic hyperspectral surveillance

satellite dubbed Anvesha and a Kestrel Initial Technology Demonstrator (KID) capsule slated for re-entry and more. In less than half an hour after launch, ISRO confirmed the anomaly, setting off a familiar, sobering post-mortem that the space community has now endured two PSLV flights in a row. ISRO chairman V Narayanan spoke moments after the anomaly, offering a precise accounting of what engineers were seeing in real time: "The PSLV is a four-stage vehicle with two solid stages and two liquid stages. The performance of the vehicle up to the end of the third stage was expected. Close to the end of the third stage, we are seeing more disturbance in the vehicle, and subsequently, there was a deviation observed in the flight path. We are analysing the data, and we shall come back at the earliest," he said.

Later he admitted the "mission could not proceed in the expected path". The chairman's remarks match ISRO's public characterization that the disturbance emerged near the end of the third stage (PS3), prompting an immediate review of telemetry and propulsion performance. Some experts

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'We are talking to them, you will find out very soon': Trump on 'deal' with Cuba

MI News Service, Washington (DC) : As the US President Donald Trump has claimed that the Caribbean nation of Cuba will soon "make a deal" with Washington, and that the US was "talking" to Havana, the Cuban top leader has pushed back the US president's warning that they would be cut off from the Venezuelan oil and money that it's relied on for decades. Though the US has claimed that they are "talking to Cuba", it was not immediately clear at what level the discussions are taking place. "No one dictates what we do," Cuban President Miguel Díaz-Canel tweeted on Monday on X, responding to Trump's insistence that the communist nation do a deal "before it's too late."

Cuba has long received mas-



sive aid packages from oil-rich Venezuela, but the capture of Venezuelan leader Nicolás Maduro during a US operation, and Trump's announcement that

Venezuela will turn over 30 million to 50 million barrels of oil to the US, is expected to leave Havana with an economic challenge. "Cuba lived, for many years, on large

amounts of OIL and MONEY from Venezuela. In return, Cuba provided 'Security Services' for the last two Venezuelan dictators, BUT NOT ANYMORE!" Trump wrote on Truth Social on Sunday. "THERE WILL BE NO MORE OIL OR MONEY GOING TO CUBA - ZERO!" he said before making the demand for a deal. Trump did not elaborate on what a deal with Havana could involve. The Cuban government has said 32 of its citizens were killed "in combat actions" during the US operation to capture Maduro. Díaz-Canel was quick to

reject external interference in Cuba's affairs. "Cuba does not aggress; it is aggressed upon by the United States for 66 years, and it does not threaten; it prepares, ready to defend the Homeland to the last drop of blood," said Díaz-Canel. In an apparent reference to Trump, he said those who turn everything into a business, "even human lives," have no moral authority to point fingers at his country. A young female doctor was raped and murdered at RG Kar Hospital. The incident sparked widespread outrage across Bengal. The police quickly arrested the accused, civic volunteer Sanjay Roy. He was tried in court and sentenced to life imprisonment. A large section of doctors launched a protest movement after Abhaya's death. Dr. Aniket Mahato, a doctor at RG Kar Hospital, was one of the prominent figures in that movement. Now, Abhaya's parents have expressed their anger against him.

Aniket had won his legal battle and secured a posting at RG Kar Hospital. However, Aniket now wants to leave his SR (Senior Resident) position at RG Kar Hospital. To be released



from his bond obligation, Aniket needs to pay 30 lakh rupees. He has appealed to the general public for financial assistance to raise this amount. Aniket also held a press conference regarding this matter.

Abhaya's parents have now expressed extreme anger regarding this matter. Abhaya's mother said, "We did not take kindly to what Aniket is doing. He fought hard and secured a posting at RG Kar Hospital. Instead of celebrating his victory, he gave it up. He told people he needed money. He said, 'I led

the Abhaya movement, give me money.'" Her straightforward question was, "Why would he ask for money in my daughter's name personally? We strongly oppose this." They also stated that they will no longer go to the CGO Complex at Aniket's behest. Abhaya's mother said, "We will go to the CGO office. We will go later. Abhaya's parents will never go under Aniket's leadership. We don't want any politics. Everyone will come with us when we call upon them, but we will not go with anyone else."

Landslide at an open-cast coal mine in Asansol: Three people died and two injured

MI News Service, Asansol: A mishap occurred during coal theft from an open-cast mine of a state-owned company! Several people were trapped when a landslide occurred in the mine in Asansol on Tuesday morning. Kulti BJP MLA Ajay Poddar said that the bodies of three people have been recovered from inside the mine. Two people have been admitted to the hospital in critical condition.

It was earlier feared that several people were trapped inside. Rescue operations began at the mine immediately after the accident.

Coal theft from open-cast mines is not uncommon in the vast area of Asansol. Many



people illegally enter these mines and extract coal, risking their lives. On Tuesday, several people had descended into the mine in the Barira area of the Kulti police station area. The mine is under the control of the state-owned company BCCL. A

landslide occurred in the mine during coal extraction.

As soon as the news of the landslide spread, locals gathered at the spot. BCCL officials also went to the scene. A police team also arrived. Rescue operations began with a JCB. However, neither the police nor the mine authorities have officially stated how many people were trapped inside or how many casualties there were. Regarding this incident, the District Magistrate of West Burdwan, S Ponnambalam, said, "We are investigating what happened. We will be able to provide details on this matter only after the investigation is complete."

Shankaracharya Flags Voter Roll Stress, Lang-Based Hate, and Bangladesh Violence at Gangasagar

MI News Service, Gangasagar: Jagadguru Swami Sri Nischalananda Saraswati, the 145th Shankaracharya of the Govardhan Peeth in Puri, on Tuesday expressed serious concern over the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in West Bengal, urging the Election Commission of India (ECI) to ensure that no eligible voter is deprived of their franchise during the process.

Addressing a press conference at Gangasagar, the Shankaracharya cited reports of individuals allegedly dying by suicide or falling critically ill due to stress linked to the SIR exercise. Terming such incidents "unfortunate and deeply

distressing," he said the revision should have been carried out over a longer period to prevent panic and anxiety among voters. "The sanctity of the democratic process must be protected. Any exercise related to electoral rolls should ensure that genuine voters are safeguarded and not subjected to unnecessary hardship," he added, emphasizing that administrative efficiency should not come at the cost of human suffering.

The Shankaracharya also condemned reports of Bengalis being allegedly assaulted or killed outside West Bengal, stating that language should never justify hatred or violence. Citing the Mahabharata, he not-

ed that Vidura spoke a "mlechha" tongue yet was revered by Lord Krishna. "Every language deserves dignity. Hatred in the name of language is unacceptable," he said.

Turning to regional developments, he expressed grave concern over attacks on Hindus in Bangladesh, warning that continued violence could have "serious and harmful repercussions" for India and the region. Emphasizing India's civilizational ethos, he said Hindutva historically conveyed peace and respect for all religions. "Killing people of other faiths is a grave anti-religious act, and those responsible must face the strictest punishment," he added.

Inter-state drug trafficking ring mastermind apprehended in Entally

MI News Service, Kolkata: Police had been searching for him for a long time. Finally, Enarul Sheikh, the kingpin of an inter-state drug trafficking ring, was caught in the police net. According to Malda district police sources, the notorious criminal was apprehended on Monday during a raid in the Entally police station area of Kolkata.

Acting on a tip-off, a special team of Malda police conducted a raid in Entally on Monday. They received assistance from the Kolkata Police. After a prolonged search, Enarul was caught red-handed.

Enarul, a resident of Malda, is one of the masterminds behind a massive drug trafficking ring that brings raw materials



for drug manufacturing from various states in the Northeast, produces brown sugar, and then smuggles it across the country. On Tuesday, Malda district Superintendent of Police Abhijit Bandyopadhyay said that the accused had made a profit of more than a thousand crore rupees through drug trafficking. He

had been wanted for a long time. Finally, the police achieved success. Because not only Enarul, but also his uncle Bhabu alias Shawkat Sheikh was arrested along with him. Police claim that thanks to Enarul and Bhabu, raw materials for drug manufacturing were brought to West Bengal from various places in the Northeast, including Manipur and Assam. Enarul had trained several young men in Kaliachak, Malda, teaching them the process of making brown sugar from the raw materials. This brown sugar was then smuggled to various states through different agents. Enarul's gang is active in states like Bihar and Jharkhand. Enarul's gang was also involved in several 'gang wars' in the Ka-

liachak area.

Recently, drug traffickers have been investing the proceeds of their drug trade in the construction industry. The accused is being produced before the Malda district court on Tuesday. An application has been made to the judge for a 10-day remand.

Police claim that Enarul's arrest is a major success in the state's anti-drug operation. At the same time, the possibility of the accused having links to Bangladesh is also being investigated. It has been learned that Enarul also has connections with various influential individuals. The police have stated that they will investigate who these individuals are and how they became associated with Enarul.

Gruesome killing in Cooch Behar: Police probe cannibalism motive

MI News Service, Cooch Behar: In a chilling incident that he shocked the Dinhatia subdivision, police have arrested a man in connection with the brutal murder of a crematorium resident, with investigators probing a possible cannibalism motive- an extremely rare and disturbing angle in criminal investigation.

The arrested accused has been identified as Firdous Alam. According to police, the victim -an unidentified man who had reportedly been living in the crematorium area for a year -was brutally killed and later brought near the accused's house, where the body was allegedly washed inside a toilet or cellar. Confirming the arrest, Dinhatia SDPO Dhiman Mitra described the crime as exceptionally violent. "The murder was committed in a very brutal manner. It is a gruesome killing," the SDPO said, adding that investigators have found "certain features indicting cannibalism."

The case came to light last Saturday when police recovered the body of an unidentified man from the crematorium area at Kursar Hat, Dinhatia. The body bore multiple injury marks, particularly around the neck, leading police to suspect homicide. Preliminary investigation suggests the murder may have taken place on Friday night. The location of the crime posed a major challenge for investigators. The crematorium area is isolated, sparsely populated, and lacks CCTV surveillance. With no immediate witnesses or identification documents found on the deceased, police initially struggled to establish the victim's identity. Local residents later informed investigators that the deceased had been residing in the crematorium premises for over a year and was believed to be mentally unstable. With no clear motive emerging in the early stages, police intensified local intelligence gathering. Acting on information from a confidential source, investigators zeroed in on Firdous Alam and arrested him. During preliminary interrogation, police claim the accused confessed to the mur-

der. According to SDPO Mitra, the accused initially stated that there was no clear motive behind the killing. "The most surprising aspect is that there appears to be no conventional motive. The murder was committed simply to kill," the SDPO said. However, further investigation and witness accounts revealed deeply disturbing details. Police stated that after the murder, the accused allegedly brought the body close to his residence and washed it in a toilet or cellar. Eyewitness statements and circumstantial evidence have raised suspicions that the accused intended to consume parts of the body. "From witness accounts and available evidence, we have reasons to believe that there was an intention to eat the body. Certain features of cannibalism have been found. This is an extremely rare form of crime," the SDPO said, while stressing that the investigation is still ongoing. Investigators have also revealed that the accused was a habitual substance abuser and was frequently intoxicated. He had reportedly been sent to de-addiction centres multiple times in the past. "His speech is highly inconsistent and incoherent. There are signs that prolonged intoxication may have caused brain damage," the SDPO said. However, police clarified that there is no documentary evidence to establish that the accused was mentally unstable, nor is there any known criminal record against him. Police suspect the victim was targeted because of his vulnerable condition and isolated living circumstances. "We believe the victim was an easy target," the SDPO added. The investigation is ongoing, and police are awaiting further forensic and medical reports to conclusively establish the sequence of events and confirm the cannibalism angle. The case has sparked widespread concern in the region, with residents expressing shock over the brutality of the crime and the disturbing nature of the allegations involved.

Prof. Abhijit Mukherjee of IIT Kharagpur Receives 2025 IAH Applied Hydrogeology Award

MI News Service, Kharagpur: Prof. Abhijit Mukherjee, Professor of the Indian Institute of Technology Kharagpur in the Department of Geology and Geophysics and the School of Environmental Science and Engineering, has been awarded the prestigious 2025 Applied Hydrogeology Award by the International Association of Hydrogeologists (IAH).

This globally recognised honour is conferred annually upon a scientist who has made outstanding contributions to the application of hydrogeology, particularly in addressing critical groundwater challenges. With this achievement, Prof. Mukherjee becomes the first scientist from India to receive the IAH Applied Hydrogeology Award, marking a significant milestone for Indian earth and environmental sciences on the global stage.

The award was presented at an international IAH event held in Melbourne, Australia. The International Association of Hydrogeologists, headquartered in the United Kingdom, is the world's largest professional organisation of groundwater specialists, with members and representation spanning 135 countries. Each year, IAH selects a distinguished individual for this high honour in recognition of exceptional scientific contributions with global relevance. In its citation, IAH acknowledged Prof. Mukherjee as a highly respected academic with an outstanding research record and an exceptional body of scholarly work.



Centre Notifies BCKV's 'Mangala' Rice Variety for Cultivation Across 17 States, long 10 years research result, the rice stables diabetes

MI News Service, Kalyani: After nearly a decade of sustained research, Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya (BCKV) has developed an early-maturing, high-yielding rice variety, 'Mangala' (Bidhan Dhan 24), which has now been officially notified by the Government of India for cultivation across 17 states. It helps in making stable diabetic patients, said BCKV, Vice Chancellor, Ashok Kumar Patra.

The Centre issued the notification on December 31, 2025, under S.O. 6123(E), allowing the variety to be grown in multiple agro-climatic zones of the country. These include parts of Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, Bihar, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh and Puducherry.

Developed after 10 years of rigorous field trials and evaluation by scientists at BCKV,



Mangala is an early-maturing rice variety that takes 120 to 124 days from sowing to harvest. The variety is suitable for cultivation in both Kharif and Rabi (Boro) seasons, making it highly adaptable for farmers across diverse regions. It is a low cost but high yielding variety.

Mangala produces medium to bold grains with a 1,000-grain weight of 22.3 grams. It has a yield potential of 6 to 8 tonnes per hectare, while its three-year mean yield stands at 5,790 kg per hectare, significantly outper-

forming national, zonal, hybrid and local check varieties, according to trial data.

In terms of grain quality, the variety contains 26% amylose, placing it in the intermediate category preferred by a large section of Indian consumers. It also records 81% hulling, 69% milling, and 60% head rice recovery, indicating excellent milling performance. The variety yields 6 to 8 tons of paddy per hectare and per 100 kg of paddy produces 79 kg. of rice. While other rice has 20 percent amylose, it has 26 percent , which helps in

keeping diabetes stable. Scientists noted that Mangala shows tolerance to leaf blast and moderate resistance to neck blast, brown spot, sheath blight, and stem borer, reducing dependence on chemical plant protection measures. Its high photosynthetic efficiency allows stable performance even under fluctuating light conditions, making it suitable for most land situations except lowland ecology.

Another key advantage is its shorter maturity period, nearly 30 days earlier than popular varieties like Lal Swarna (MTU 7029). This enables farmers to take up timely sowing of Rabi pulses, oilseeds, potato and vegetables after paddy harvest, improving overall farm income. The key persons behind the grand success of BCKV for the research are Sonnath Bhattacharjee and Prabir Bhattacharjee. Joint project heads, Shubhra Mukherjee, Director of Research and Sudhibrata Maitra, Director of farms.

SC to ask state govts to pay heavy compensation for dog-bites

From PG 1 authorities in case of deaths due to stray dog bites, and also fix the accountability and liability of those feeding them. A the two judge bench of the Top court also said authorities had not done anything for 75 years while hearing the suo motu case related to the stray dogs issue. "It's clearly a failure on their part, for 75 years...And they have created a worse situation. That's what we want to put to the states to take them to task for this. For every dog bite, and every death or injury caused to a child or old or feeble person, we are likely to fix heavy compensation to be paid by the state, for not having done anything for the last 75 years," said Justice Nath.

"And also, liability and accountability on all those who claim that they are feeding dogs and want to protect them. Protect them, fair enough, you take them home. Keep them inside your campus, your house. Why should dogs be loitering around everywhere and frightening people, biting them, causing deaths, chasing?" Justice Nath asked. The remarks came as Senior Advocate Menaka Guruswamy, representing some animal shelters, drew the court's attention to parliamentary debates from the 1950s in which the issue of stray dogs was raised in the House for the first time.

Terming the stray dogs issue a "societal challenge," she said, "the most effective remedy is to ensure that the Animal Birth Control Rules are implemented in letter and spirit". Referring to the government's reply in Parliament in the 1980s on stray dogs in Delhi, she said the minister had stated that "NDMC has discontinued the practice of killing stray dogs, but this has not led to any significant increase in their numbers as the practice of sterilising stray dogs has been introduced." "So, this is the legislator himself saying killing does not reduce numbers, sterilisation does. Rules and the statute are a culmination of the legislature recognising approaches that did not work, killing dogs, and approaches that did work - sterilisation and humane treatment," Guruswamy said. She also said data on animal bite data from 2019 to 2022 shows "staggering diminishing in the numbers post immunisation and sterilisation." "If the regulators did their job a little better, we would not have had the catastrophe we are living with now.

'We are talking to them, you will find out very soon': Trump on 'deal' with Cuba

From PG 1 country's "absolute right" to import fuel from economic partners without US interference and rejected Trump's claim that Cuba exchanged security services for Venezuelan oil and money. "The US is behaving like a criminal and uncontrolled hegemon that threatens peace and security not only of Cuba and this hemisphere but of the entire world," Rodriguez said. In subsequent comments aboard Air Force One, Trump told reporters the US was "talking to Cuba" but it was not immediately clear at what level discussions are taking place. In his comments Trump said that one of the topics he wanted addressing was "the people that came from Cuba that were forced out or left under duress." The US has long wanted regime change in communist Cuba, a country governed by a socialist political system since 1961, based on the "one state, one party" principle. A key supporter of regime change within Trump's cabinet is Secretary of State Marco Rubio, the son of Cuban immigrants who came of age immersed in Miami's exile community, rising politically within a culture where memories of the island and a deep fear of socialism remained powerful forces.

Mamata Alleges Voter Deletions Blasts SIR Irregularities in Bengal

MI News Service, Kolkata: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday launched a sharp attack on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls while addressing a press conference at Nabanna, alleging large-scale irregularities and a deliberate attempt to disenfranchise genuine voters in West Bengal.

Banerjee said she hoped that the names of genuine voters would not be deleted, but alleged that the process was being misused. Drawing a comparison with Bihar, she pointed out that the final voter list there was published only after election dates were announced. "Here, inaugurations happen when elections come, and everything ends after polls. What kind of inauguration is this?" she questioned. The Chief Minister claimed there were reports of people being brought in during 2024 and certificates being issued in their names by officers from Odisha, allegedly without informing the police. Referring to the Citizenship

Amendment Act (CAA), she said members of the Matua community should not be forced to declare that they had come from Bangladesh in 2024 in order to vote. "There is no value of that CAA. I appeal to Matua voters to go to the BLO offices and ensure their names are included," she said. Banerjee also targeted leaders from other states, saying while they were welcome to visit Bengal peacefully, Bengalis were being harassed in "double-engine" BJP-ruled states. She instructed Booth Level Agents (BLA-1 and BLA-2) to remain alert, citing security concerns and the need to maintain peace in the state. Raising questions on border security, Banerjee asked which central agencies were responsible for controlling coal smuggling, hawala operations and cross-border movements. She alleged that some micro-observers and officials were acting in favour of the BJP, a charge she said was dangerous for democracy. "Catch the real thieves and

criminals," she urged. The Chief Minister accused authorities of cancelling government certificates selectively in Bengal, while similar actions were not taken in Bihar. She alleged that bulk voter documents were being seized in districts like Malda, Tamuk, Moyna and Barrackpore, and FIRs should be lodged wherever unauthorised papers were found. Banerjee questioned why micro-observers were deployed only in Bengal and not in states like Assam, Tripura, Manipur or Nagaland. She alleged that hearings were being rushed during the Gangasagar Mela, leaving nearly 70 lakh people unheard.

Claiming severe human impact, Banerjee alleged that due to the stress of deletions, 84 people had died, four had attempted suicide and 17 had suffered strokes. "The Election Commission and the BJP must take responsibility," she said, reiterating that democracy cannot function by deleting voters' names without due process or transparency.

ICC, Maha Govt Sign MoU to Boost Industry Collaboration

The MoU was signed by Dr P Anbalagan, IAS, Principal Secretary (Industry, Investment and Services), Government of Maharashtra, and Dr Rajeev Singh, Director General, ICC, in the presence of prominent business leaders. Dr Anbalagan said the partnership would reinforce Maharashtra's commitment to creating an investor-friendly ecosystem and strengthen engagement with industry and investors. Dr Singh added that ICC would act as a bridge between policymakers and business to support sustainable economic growth.

Under the MoU, ICC and the State Government will facilitate investor interactions, policy feedback, and structured engagements to support industrial development. ICC will organise annual business delegations to Maharashtra and host ministerial and business delegations at its events across India. Regular interactions between industry and the Government will enable direct feedback on regulatory processes, infrastructure, and ease of doing business initiatives. The MoU is effective immediately and will remain valid for two years, subject to review and mutual agreement.

Western disturbance likely to end dry spell in Kashmir

The India Meteorological Department has forecast that the weather is likely to remain dry but cloudy till January 21. Meanwhile reports from Jaipur said severe cold conditions were recorded in several parts of Rajasthan over the past 24 hours, with mercury dropping to freezing 2 degree Celsius in Karauli, the Meteorological Department said on Tuesday. The Met centre said the weather remained dry across the state, while cold wave conditions were recorded at isolated places. Eastern Rajasthan witnessed light to moderate fog at several locations, with no immediate relief in sight, it said.

Abhishek Launches Fierce Attack on BJP, EC in Cooch Behar Rally

MI News Service, Kolkata: From Cooch Behar, where the Trinamool Congress launched its 'NaboJowarYatra' in 2023, the party's national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee on Tuesday renewed his call for a political battle, launching a sharp attack on both the Election Commission and the Bharatiya Janata Party. Beginning his visit with prayers at the historic Madan Mohan Temple, Banerjee later addressed a massive gathering at the TMC's 'RanaSankalp Sabha', positioning Cooch Behar once again at the centre of the state's political discourse. In a dramatic moment during his address, Banerjee sought to underline alleged irregularities in the voter list. He claimed that several individuals who have been officially marked as deceased in Election Commission records are, in fact, alive. To make his point, he called 10 such individuals onto the stage, including AshwiniAdhikari, Kajima Khatun, MurshidAlam, Azizur Rahman, and Tapan Barman. "They are alive, yet their names have disappeared from the voter list," Banerjee said, accusing the authorities of attempting to deprive citizens of their fundamental right to vote. Questioning the intent behind the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) process, Banerjee asked whether



such efforts to allegedly strip people of their voting rights would go unanswered. He alleged that the SIR exercise was being misused to target Bengalis and undermine democratic rights in the state. Turning his attention to the BJP, the Trinamool leader revisited what he described as a series of unfulfilled promises made to the people of Cooch Behar. He cited assurances related to the formation of the Narayani Battalion, the establishment of a paramilitary training centre, and plans to develop the Madan Mohan Temple as an international tourist destination. Banerjee also mocked Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 2021 announcement to convert the Cooch Behar railway station into a sports hub, claiming that the signage marking the promise has since faded without any progress on the ground.

ISRO promises to bounce back after PSLV failure

From PG 1 said ISRO should not rightly admitted that the mission had failed rather beating around the bush. Among the most affected was Hyderabad-based Dhruva Space, which had "so much riding" on PSLV-C62 through its Polar Access-1 (PA-1) stack, four satellites, five deployers, and ground infrastructure enabling seven missions for states and institutions across India and abroad. It had its signature on seven of the 16 satellites and was on the verge of making history. In the wake of the setback, Dhruva Space co-founder and CEO Sanjay Nekkanti issued a note that was strikingly stoic, reflecting the company's full-stack posture and its readiness to relaunch: "Space is inherently

complex, and India's NGEs have been steadily building space infrastructure at scale. Dhruva Space has built its vertically integrated full-stack capability by tapping into ISRO's legacy vendor ecosystem, building in-house infrastructure, and developing Space systems suitable for modular and scalable production. Dhruva Space has supported its customers by establishing critical ground segment infrastructure," he said.

"Across space and launch segments, which involve multiple interdependent systems and processes, Dhruva Space has worked alongside ISRO, INSPIRE, NSIL and other partners to enable customers with satellites, launch systems, and launch services.

Mamata greets pilgrims visiting Gangasagar mela

Speaking on the occasion, recently Mamata Banerjee said the state government has given the Gangasagar Mela a new dimension by focusing on pilgrim welfare and infrastructure development. "Our government has taken several steps to ensure the comfort and safety of pilgrims," the Chief Minister said and highlighted that extensive arrangements have been made, including beautification of the Kapil Muni Ashram and the mela premises, improved roads, uninterrupted electricity supply, elaborate lighting, safe drinking water facilities, and comprehensive sanitation measures. The state has also strengthened transport connectivity by deploying adequate buses, vessels, launches, and jetties, along with dredging of river routes to ensure smooth movement. Medical facilities have been scaled up with hospitals, doctors, nurses, ambulances, and emergency response teams stationed across the area. Accommodation facilities for pilgrims, tight security arrangements, helpads, and helicopter services for emergencies have also been put in place. The Chief Minister recently visited the site to review preparations and laid the foundation stone for the proposed 'Gangasagar Bridge' over the Muriganga river. She said the nearly five-kilometre-long, four-lane bridge would be constructed entirely with state funds at an estimated cost of Rs 1,700 crore. Once completed, it will enable direct road connectivity to Gangasagar, significantly reducing travel time for pilgrims from Kolkata.

State Steps Up Nipah Response,Nadda Calls Mamata, Assures Full Support

MI News Service, Kolkata: A high-level health alert has been sounded across West Bengal after two healthcare workers tested positive for the Nipah virus, triggering widespread concern and prompting swift action from the state government. The development marks the re-emergence of the deadly virus in the state after nearly two decades. The two patients, both nurses employed at a private hospital in Barasat in North 24 Parganas district, are currently in critical condition and are undergoing treatment on ventilator support in a dedicated isolation ward. The outbreak was officially confirmed by Chief Secretary Nandini Chakraborty and Health Secretary Narayan Swarup Nigam during a recent press conference. They said the initial detection was made at the AIIMS Kalyani laboratory, following which samples were sent to the National Institute of Virology (NIV) in Pune for final confirmation. As a precautionary measure, the state health machinery has been placed

on high alert, with hospitals instructed to follow strict infection-control protocols.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has been closely monitoring the situation and has directed the Health Department to take all necessary steps to prevent further transmission. Senior officials said surveillance has been intensified, isolation facilities expanded, and emergency medical infrastructure kept ready across districts. The state government has also activated three helpline numbers—9874708858, 9836046212, and 033-2333-0180—to assist the public and report suspected symptoms. In response to the evolving situation, Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda spoke to Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee over the phone and assured full cooperation and support from the Centre. Following the conversation, the Union Health Ministry deployed a National Joint Outbreak Response Team (NJORT) to Kolkata. The team includes experts from the National Centre for Disease Control

(NCDC) and the Department of Wildlife, who will work in coordination with state health officials to implement containment measures and trace the zoonotic source of the infection. An extensive contact-tracing operation has been launched across North 24 Parganas, Nadia, and PurbaBardhaman districts. One of the infected nurses is a resident of Katwa in PurbaBardhaman, while the other belongs to Nadia. Authorities are mapping their movements and identifying close contacts, who have been advised to remain under quarantine. Medical experts have urged citizens to remain cautious and avoid consuming fruits that appear bitten by birds or animals, as well as raw date palm sap, a known source of Nipah transmission. While political differences between the state and the Centre have surfaced during past health crises, officials said the current response reflects coordinated efforts to ensure public safety and prevent panic.

Haryana Police crack down on gang culture, remove 67 songs glorifying organised crime

culture and the glorification of violence among youth, the Special Task Force (STF) and Cyber Unit of Haryana Police have succeeded in removing or blocking 67 songs that promoted organised crime across major digital platforms.

During an extensive investigation, the STF and cyber teams found that several songs available on platforms such as YouTube, Spotify, Amazon Music, Gaana and JioSaavn were glorifying gangsters, weapons and violence, while portraying a distorted and glamorous image of criminal life.

Police officials said such content was having a negative influence on young listeners and was pushing impressionable minds towards crime.

Acting on these findings, Haryana Police coordinated with digital platforms to take down the objectionable content. Officials stressed that the action marks the beginning of a sustained campaign against online material that promotes criminal culture, with further strict measures to follow.

Director General of Police (DGP) Haryana Ajay Singhal described the move as a crucial step in safeguarding society, particularly the younger generation.

"Our aim is not only to prevent crime but also to protect youth from being drawn into the criminal world," he said.

The anti-terror agency had earlier chargesheeted two other accused-Ajay Singh and Vishal Singh-in February and November last year, respectively in the case RC-01/2023/NIA-LKW related to attempts by various leaders, cadres and sympathisers to Over Ground Workers (OGWs) of the CPI (Maoist) to re-energise the terror organisation's decrepit influence in the NRB, comprising the states of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh.

Panchayat Advancement Index: Strengthening Data-Driven Decision-Making for rural transformation

Across India's villages, a silent but powerful shift is underway. From a panchayat in Maharashtra installing CCTV and streetlights after scoring poorly on the "Women-Friendly Panchayat" theme to a village in Gujarat launching rapid sanitation drives after weak scores in the "Clean & Green Panchayat" category, the Panchayat Advancement Index (PAI) is beginning to reshape how grassroots development is planned and delivered. In many Panchayats, gaps noticed in PAI, such as low institutional delivery, poor waste management, or water scarcity, have directly triggered targeted interventions based on PAI scores.

These early use cases indicate a simple but powerful truth - when panchayats can see their strengths and weaknesses clearly, they act faster and more accurately. For decades, rural development in India relied heavily on manual reports, subjective perceptions and political priorities. Today, PAI brings a new model - transparent, data-driven & SDG-aligned, to the heart of rural administration.

Launched by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, the Panchayat Advancement Index is India's first countrywide framework to measure the progress of Gram Panchayats using objective indicators across critical areas relating to sanitation, health, governance, women's empowerment, infrastructure, environmental sustainability, etc., organised across nine themes of Localisation of Sustainable Development Goals (LSDGs) derived from 17 SDG goals. Logically, the attainment of SDGs at the national level will require actions at the local level where Panchayats can play a pivotal role. In this context, PAI provides an evidence-based mechanism for tracking progress in achieving the

LSDGs and thereby SDGs in rural areas.

The Panchayat Advancement Index (PAI) is computed through a robust, multi-step process using 435 unique local indicators across nine themes. While the Ministry of Panchayati Raj develops the indicator framework in consultation with other Ministries, Departments and State Governments, the actual data is collected by Gram Panchayats and concerned line departments through a common portal, pai.gov.in, at the GP level, which is then validated through several administrative layers, including Gram Sabha verification. The score for each theme is derived from these indicators on a 0-100 scale which, in turn, determine the overall PAI score (0-100), based on which Panchayats are classified into five grades for comparison.

The inaugural survey for the financial year 2022-23 revealed interesting insights: of the 2.16 lakh Panchayats who submitted validated data, none qualified as "Achievers" (scores above 90), 0.3% were "Front Runners" (75-89.99), 35.8% were "Performers" (60-74.99), while a majority of 61.2% were "Aspirants" (40-59.99), and 2.7% were "Beginners" (below 40). States like Gujarat and Telangana topped the chart with the highest number of high-performing panchayats.

Realising its immense potential in strengthening grassroots governance, state governments are disseminating PAI scores among various stakeholders through workshops at block, district and state levels. Panchayats have also started displaying the PAI scorecards outside their offices for transparency and citizen engagement. Discussions on PAI scores is also one of the agenda in the Gram Sabha meetings.

PAI's strength lies in its practical use.

The study's researchers analyzed data from over 900 adolescents and young adults

who participated in the Canadian Study of Adolescent Health Behaviors. In total, 16% of participants who experienced five or more adverse childhood experiences were at clinical risk for muscle dysmorphia, underscoring the significant traumatic effects that such experiences can have on mental health and well-being.

"Importantly, our study found that gender was an important factor in the relationship between adverse childhood experiences and muscle dysmorphia symptoms," says Ganson. "Boys and young men in the study who have experienced five or more adverse childhood experiences had significantly greater muscle dysmorphia symptoms when compared to girls and young women."

The authors note that boys and young men who experience adverse childhood experiences may feel that their masculinity was threatened from these experiences. Therefore, they engage in the pursuit of muscularity to demonstrate their adherence to masculine gender norms such as dominance.

Vitamin D medicine do not protect children from bone fractures: Study

A large clinical research sponsored by Queen Mary University of London and the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health discovered that vitamin D supplementation do not strengthen bone strength or prevent bone fractures in vitamin D-deficient youngsters. The findings call into question widely held beliefs about vitamin D's benefits on bone health. Around one-third of children have at least one fracture before the age of 18. This is a major global health issue, as childhood fractures can lead to life years of disability and/or poor quality of life. The potential for vitamin D supplements to improve bone strength has attracted growing interest in recent years, based on vitamin D's role in promoting bone mineralisation. However, clinical trials designed to test whether vitamin D supplements can prevent bone fractures in children have not previously been conducted.

Working with partners in Mongolia, a setting with a particularly high fracture burden and where vitamin D deficiency is highly prevalent, researchers from Queen Mary and Harvard conducted a clinical trial to determine if vitamin D supplementation would decrease risk of bone fractures or increase bone strength in schoolchildren.



Early signals show states like Gujarat using PAI scores for allocating special grants to weak Gram Panchayats to bridge critical gaps. Sikkim has decided to adopt the PAI score as a criterion for allocating performance grants under its 6th State Finance Commission. Across many states, PAI has become a key tool for evidence-based planning, helping Panchayats identify and prioritise focus areas in their Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDs). Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Sikkim, Chhattisgarh, etc. are converting top-scoring Gram Panchayats as Panchayat Learning Centres, while States like Jharkhand, Bihar, Kerala, Punjab and Rajasthan are selecting such Gram Panchayats for curated exposure visits of PRIs. Several states now link PAI performances with recognition & awards. Maharashtra offers major awards under the Chief Minister's scheme; Sikkim and MP provide financial incentives, whereas Punjab, Jharkhand, UP, Arunachal Pradesh and Tripura felicitate high-scoring Panchayats at state-level events. PAI scores are increasingly embedded in structured training programmes and

field workshops. PAI has converted hard-to-understand social, economic, and environmental indicators into easy-to-understand themes that guides targeted planning and decision-making. Dashboards, scorecards, and digital tools assist in Panchayat-level governance that is based on evidence. However, PAI is still new; its first baseline report covers 2022-23, so there aren't many long-term case studies that show direct, measurable improvements. Due to uneven technical capacity, inadequate understanding of data points and inconsistent reporting systems, data quality varies across regions. Convergence among line departments and PRIs is improving but remains fragmented. These are not challenges, but opportunities. Learning from this, the Ministry has now simplified the process for PAI 2.0 by reducing the number of unique indicators from 435 to 119, adopting more relevant and refined indicators, and improving workflows, making data collection easier and of improved quality. The Ministry's clearer operational guidelines and easier processes have led to its adoption by

almost all States/UTs, with more than 2.60 lakh panchayats participating in the second round against 2.16 lakh earlier, demonstrating a strong direction. A massive capacity-building programme has also been launched to improve the understanding of the indicators and data points among elected representatives, panchayat functionaries and line department staff. The transformative potential of PAI cannot be overstated. PAI democratises data, enabling citizens to hold their elected representatives accountable, thereby deepening democratic governance. It promotes transparency and encourages healthy competition among panchayats. As thematic PAI scores are derived from several indicators linked to various sectors, PAI, by design, encourages collaboration among ministries and departments to achieve better development outcomes. What sets the PAI apart is its alignment with the global SDGs and its innovative localisation of these goals (LSDGs) at the village level. The model truly internalises the SDG principles by measuring development through PAI scores, which makes it a unique and potentially global best practice. In sum, the Panchayat Advancement Index is a landmark initiative that redefines rural governance in India. It is a critical instrument to ensure that India meets its Sustainable Development Goals by 2030 through evidence-based, participatory, and decentralised development planning. As India strives for equitable growth and social justice in its pursuit of Viksit Bharat, the PAI stands as a beacon guiding panchayats from data to development, from insights to real impact. BRICS must commit to reformed multilateralism reflecting contemporary realities”: EAM Jaishankar

MI News Service, New Delhi: External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar on Tuesday called on BRICS to commit to a reformed multilateral system that reflects present-day global realities, stressing the need for more representative and inclusive international institutions.

Speaking at the launch of the BRICS 2026 logo, Jaishankar said the world is navigating multiple complex challenges, making the demand for a reinvigorated, inclusive, and effective multilateral order more urgent than ever.

“At a time when the world is also navigating multiple complex challenges, the call for a reinvigorated, inclusive, and effective multilateral order has never been more urgent. BRICS must commit to a reformed multilateralism that reflects contemporary realities, one where institutions like the United Nations, the WTO, IMF, and the World Bank are representative and inclusive,” he



said.

Highlighting the role of BRICS in global economic cooperation, the EAM said the New Development Bank (NDB), founded by BRICS countries, has emerged as an important instrument promoting infrastructure development and sustainable growth among its members.

He said India remains committed to supporting efforts to further strengthen the bank as a credible, responsible, and financially sustainable institution.

Jaishankar also under-

lined the importance of people-to-people exchanges as a core component of BRICS cooperation, particularly during India's chairship.

“India remains committed to supporting activities and efforts to further strengthen the bank as a credible, responsible, and financially sustainable institution. People-to-people exchanges will always remain an essential component of BRICS and especially of our chairship, with continued emphasis on youth, culture, educa-

tion, sports, tourism, and academic interactions,” the EAM stated.

Reiterating India's approach to the grouping, Jaishankar said New Delhi views BRICS as a constructive platform for dialogue and development that complements the broader multilateral system.

“BRICS is guided by the principles of mutual respect, sovereign equality, and consensus,” he said, adding that India will strive to make its chairship inclusive, practical, people-centred, and outcome-orientated.

He expressed confidence in continued cooperation, saying he looked forward to the support of all BRICS member states, partner countries, and other stakeholders as India prepares to assume the BRICS Chairship in 2026.

“I look forward to the cooperation and support of all BRICS members, partner countries, and other stakeholders as we work towards and together dur-

ing India's Chairship,” the EAM said.

The acronym BRIC was first coined in 2001 by Goldman Sachs in their Global Economics Paper, “The World Needs Better Economic BRICS”, based on analyses projecting that Brazil, Russia, India, and China would individually and collectively occupy a larger share of the global economy and become among the world's largest economies over the following decades.

In 2010, it was agreed to expand BRIC to BRICS, with South Africa joining at the 3rd BRICS Summit in Sanya in 2011.

The grouping expanded further in 2024, with Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the UAE becoming full members on January 1, 2024. Indonesia joined as a full member in January 2025, while Belarus, Bolivia, Kazakhstan, Cuba, Malaysia, Nigeria, Thailand, Uganda, and Uzbekistan were inducted as partner countries of BRICS.

Canada's PM Carney to visit India as a push for trade diversification amid US tariffs

MI News Service, Ottawa: With Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney stating that Ottawa, in order to diversify its global trade landscape, will be doubling their non-US exports by the next decade, Indian High Commissioner to Canada Dinesh Patnaik said that the Canadian PM is set to visit India in the coming weeks for the expansion of bilateral trade with New Delhi, after over two years of strained diplomatic relations.

Speaking to CBC's “Power & Politics”, the Indian Envoy on Monday stated that Carney's visit to India is aimed at diversifying Canada's trading partners amid high tariffs imposed by the US on its largest trade partner. Both India and Canada are facing high tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump on their exports: 50 per cent tariffs on India, 25 per cent of which is due to New Delhi's purchase of Russian Oil, and 35 per cent tariffs on Canada.

“In a shifting global trade landscape, Canada's new government is focused on what we can control. We're going to double our non-US exports over the next decade – to secure new opportunities for Canadian businesses, and create tens of thousands of new careers for Canadian workers.” Carney said in a post on X on Monday. Patnaik, speaking to CBC said Carney's visit is expected after India tables its Union Budget on February 1, describing the renewed engagement as a sign that “trust is back in the system.”

He added that diplomats are working to “catch up” on initiatives delayed due to a “slight gap” in relations. The diplomatic chill between the two nations began in 2023 when India expressed concerns over Canada's perceived leniency towards Khalistani separatist elements and former Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau allegations that Indian



agents were involved in the killing of NIA-designated terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar outside a gurdwara the same year.

Patnaik emphasised that the Indian government has denied any involvement, saying, “We have always said it's preposterous, absurd. It's something we don't do,” and that “there is no case against the Government of India.” The envoy further noted that Canada's approach is changing under the current leadership, stating, “There's a new prime minister who is changing the way Canada behaves,” as quoted by CBC.

In November last year, Carney accepted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's invitation to visit India in early 2026 on the sidelines of the G20 Leaders' Summit in South Africa, according to a statement from the Office of the Prime Minister of Canada.

Following the return of high commissioners in August 2025, the two prime ministers agreed to increase diplomatic staffing to meet growing consular demand and strengthen people-to-people ties. They also agreed to support reciprocal knowledge transfer as part of ongoing engagement between the two countries.

Four killed after Russia's overnight strikes: Zelenskyy



MI News Service, Kyiv: At least four people were killed after Russia launched a massive overnight aerial assault on Ukraine, deploying nearly 300 attack drones along with 18 ballistic missiles and seven cruise missiles, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said on Tuesday.

In a statement posted on X, Zelenskyy said most of the drones used in the attack were Shahed-type unmanned aerial vehicles and that Russia once again targeted Ukraine's energy-generation facilities and substations, causing extensive damage to residential and civilian infrastructure across multiple regions.

According to the Ukrainian President, the Dnipro, Zhytomyr, Zaporizhzhia, Kyiv, Odesa, Sumy, Kharkiv, and Donetsk regions came under attack, and Russian strikes on a postal terminal in Korotych in the Kharkiv region killed four people.

“Almost 300 attack drones, most of them ‘shaheds,’ along with 18 bal-

listic and 7 cruise missiles, were launched by the Russians against Ukraine last night. Once again, the main target of the strike was our energy-generation facilities and substations. Sadly, there has been extensive destruction of residential and civilian infrastructure,” Zelenskyy said.

“Dnipro, Zhytomyr, Zaporizhzhia, Kyiv, Odesa, Sumy, Kharkiv, and Donetsk regions came under attack. With no military purpose whatsoever, Russia lobbed missiles at a postal terminal in Korotych, Kharkiv region, killing 4 people,” he added, offering condolences to the families and loved ones of the victims.

Russia's strikes on Ukraine's energy-generation facilities and substations are intended to deprive households of electricity amid a cold wave gripping the country.

Zelenskyy noted that the situation in the Kyiv region also remains difficult, with several hundred thousand households cur-

rently without electricity following the strikes. He said emergency services are operating on the ground and “Points of Invincibility” have been deployed to support residents affected by power outages.

Emphasising Ukraine's resilience, the President said that Ukrainians continue to support one another wherever Russia attempts to inflict destruction, adding that internal resilience is especially critical during winter.

“Points of Invincibility have been deployed. As always, wherever Russia tries to destroy, Ukrainians support one another, and internal resilience is what is most needed right now. Every such strike against life is a reminder that support for Ukraine cannot be stopped. Missiles for air defense systems are needed every day, and especially during winter,” the Ukrainian President said.

The Ukrainian leader renewed his appeal for international support, stressing that every such strike is a reminder that assistance to Ukraine must continue, highlighting the daily need for air defence missiles, particularly in winter, and calling on the global community to respond with new aid packages.

Zelenskyy concluded that Ukraine expects accelerated deliveries already agreed with the United States and European partners, adding that Russia must learn that “cold will not help it win the war.”

US revokes over 100,000 visas of individuals involved in “criminal activity”



MI News Service, Washington: The US Department of State has announced that it has revoked more than 100,000 visas, including thousands of student and specialised visas, as part of its ongoing efforts to strengthen domestic security and enforce immigration laws. In a post on X, the Department of State said that the revocations include around 8,000 student visas and 2,500 specialised visas issued to individuals who had encounters with US law enforcement for criminal activity.

“BREAKING: The State Department has now revoked over 100,000 visas, including some 8,000 student visas and 2,500 specialised visas for individuals who had encounters with U.S. law enforcement for criminal activity,” the post read.

The department further asserted that visa revocations and deportations are being used as tools to safeguard national security. “We will continue to deport

these thugs to keep America safe,” the Department of State added in its post.

The development underscores the Trump administration's ongoing efforts to ensure compliance with its immigration laws and reinforces that visa holders must adhere strictly to all legal requirements during their stay.

Recently, the US Embassy in India, warned visa holders, especially students, that breaking the United States' Laws can have serious consequences, leading to the revocation of the visa and even deportation from the US.

“Breaking U.S. laws can have serious consequences for your student visa. If you are arrested or violate any laws, your visa may be revoked, you may be deported, and you could be ineligible for future U.S. visas. Follow the rules and don't jeopardize your travel. A U.S. visa is a privilege, not a right,” the Embassy posted on X on January 7.

South-East Asia marks 15 years since last case of polio, legacy drives broader public health gains

MI News Service, Delhi: 15 years after recording its last case of wild poliovirus, the WHO South-East Asia Region with a quarter of the world's population, continues to sustain its polio-free status while harnessing innovations and lessons from the polio programme to accelerate broader public health progress, an official statement said.

“This extraordinary achievement followed unparalleled efforts and demonstrates what can be accomplished and sustained through unwavering government leadership, a dedicated health workforce, and strong partnerships, including with communities,” said Catharina Boehme, Officer-in-Charge, WHO South-East Asia Region.

On this date in 2011, an 18-month-old girl was paralyzed by wild poliovirus in Howrah, West Bengal, India. The extensive and intensive response that followed ensured that this remained the last case of wild poliovirus in the Region. Three years later, the WHO South-East Asia Region was certified polio free on 27 March 2014.

The Region continues to maintain strict vigil

against poliovirus importation and protect children through vaccination against a disease that once caused widespread paralysis and death, as per the statement.

In 2025, more than 50,000 stool samples were collected across the Region and tested through a network of 13 WHO-accredited polio laboratories, including national, regional and global reference laboratories. Surveillance across the Region continues to exceed the standards required to maintain polio-free certification.

Adding a further layer of sensitivity to detect any potential poliovirus transmission, environmental surveillance is being conducted at 93 sites among high risk population in five countries.

As per annual WHO/UNICEF Estimates of National Immunization Coverage (WUENIC), the Region has maintained high population immunity through consistently strong immunization coverage. Coverage with bivalent oral polio vaccine and at least one dose of inactivated polio vaccine has remained above 90% for many years, the statement read.

Even during humani-



tarian emergencies, natural disasters and the COVID-19 pandemic, countries sustained high-quality surveillance and immunization services, safeguarding these hard-won gains.

Providing independent oversight, the South-East Asia Regional Certification Commission for Poliomyelitis Eradication (SEA-RCCPE) meets annually to review country progress, assess risks and verify the Region's continued polio-free status.

The polio programme

continues to deliver benefits far beyond a single disease. Member countries have applied innovations, systems and operational lessons from polio eradication to strengthen routine immunization, advance measles and rubella elimination, enhance public health laboratory capacities and emergency preparedness. These efforts have been instrumental in expanding routine immunization coverage, reaching previously unreachable communities, and closing immunity gaps.

Member countries have also recorded major progress against other vaccine-preventable diseases. The Region continues to sustain elimination of maternal and neonatal tetanus, while the introduction and scale-up of vaccines against pneumococcal disease, rotavirus, hepatitis B, Japanese encephalitis, typhoid and human papillomavirus, continues to reduce mortality and long-term disease burden.

As long as polio exists anywhere in the world, the risk of importation remains. Countries must sustain high immunization coverage, sensitive surveillance and rapid response capacities for polio as well as other vaccine-preventable diseases, the Officer-in-Charge said, as per the statement.

“The journey from polio endemicity to sustained polio-free status demonstrates that ambitious public health goals are achievable,” Boehme said, adding, “WHO remains committed to supporting countries to protect every child through strong routine immunization systems and to advance disease elimination across the Region.”

Nepal issues advisory for Iran as protests intensify, authorities resort to use of force

MI News Service, Kathmandu: Nepal's Ministry of Foreign Affairs has issued an advisory for Iran as protests continue to rise, with authorities resorting to the use of force. Hundreds of protesters are hitting the streets against rising inflation and demanding reforms. Authorities have reportedly opened fire, with casualties recorded in the hundreds as of now.

In the wake of the situation, the Foreign Ministry said, “Nepali citizens currently living and working in Iran are advised to follow the security advisory of the competent authorities of Iran, stay indoors, remain alert, and exercise caution.” Following it, the ministry has urged its citizens to halt travel amid the ongoing unrest. “Likewise, the Ministry urges all the Nepali citizens planning to travel to Iran to avoid their plan until the situation in the country returns to normal,” the Foreign Ministry added.

2nd ODI: India eye series clincher in Rajkot as New Zealand look to bounce back

RAJKOT : Following a narrow four-wicket win in the series opener at Vadodara, India will now face New Zealand in Rajkot to try to clinch the series by taking an unbeatable lead in the three-match series. The two sides will lock horns at the Niranjan Shah Stadium, a typically batting-friendly surface, where the BlackCaps will aim to level the series while the hosts will aim to grab a 2-0 lead.

India's playing XI for the second ODI will witness at least one change after Washington Sundar was ruled out of the remainder of the series following an injury. The all-rounder was replaced by Ayush Badoni in the squad as the 26-year-old received his maiden ODI call-up. Captain Shubman Gill faces a typical 'selection dilemma' after several fringe players stepped up under pressure.

The first match showed that although veterans like Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma remain crucial,

the inclusion of relatively inexperienced players like Harshit Rana is changing the team's tactical approach. As the action shifts to Rajkot, the team management must decide whether to maintain the successful lineup or rotate bowlers to reduce their workload.

India clinched their eighth consecutive ODI win over New Zealand since 2023. At home venues, they have now secured eight straight ODI victories against New Zealand since 2017.

The ODI series opener also saw India successfully chase the second-highest target against New Zealand, behind the 316 runs achieved in Bengaluru in 2010.

New Zealand responded strongly in the first game. It appeared they were done for when Kohli and Iyer were dominating, and India looked poised to win easily with a comfortable margin. However, the BlackCaps demonstrated great resilience before India secured the victory.



Rohit Sharma scored the first runs for India but was dismissed in the Power-play, while Gill had a slow start against the new ball but regained his rhythm after Kohli came in to support him.

India's No. 3 entered with confidence, aggressively facing the bowlers and hitting boundaries, establishing a strong partnership of over 100 runs with the captain. Following Gill's dismissal, Shreyas Iyer maintained the same aggressive approach, forming another steady partnership with Kohli and ensuring India stayed in command. Then, Kyle Jamieson entered the scene and took three wickets in just seven balls to dismiss Kohli and Iyer, putting New Zealand right back into the game.

With Washington injured, Rana was sent in before him, delivering a useful cameo that eased the pressure on wicketkeeper-batter KL Rahul. Even after Rana's dismissal, a hobbling Washington walked out to the middle, and together he and Rahul guided India home with an over to spare. New Zealand threw everything they had at India and pushed them all the way, but in the end, they just lacked that extra bit of firepower in the crunch moments.

The Kiwis demonstrated resilience with both bat and ball. After a solid beginning, a mid-innings slump nearly derailed them, but Daryl Mitchell's steadiness led them to a competitive score.

With the ball, they kept fighting and pushed the match until the second last over. India, on the other hand, will recognise they could have been more precise across all aspects of the game and will aim to improve in the second match on Wednesday.

NEW DELHI : Former champion Lakshya Sen and top women's doubles duo, Treesa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand, made a commanding start to their India Open 2026 campaign while men's fourth seed Chou Tien Chen of Chinese Taipei, seventh seed Kodai Naraoka of Japan and French sixth seed Alex Lanier were knocked out on the opening day of the BWF World Tour Super 750 event, organised by the Badminton Association of India, in New Delhi on Tuesday.

Sen needed just 36 minutes to seal a 21-12, 21-15 win over his academy-mate Shetty, while Treesa and Gayatri, the Syed Modi International winners, defeated Thailand's Ornicha Jongsathapornparn and Sukkitta Suwachai 21-15, 21-11 at the Indira Gandhi multi-purpose indoor stadium.

Earlier, Canada's Brian Yang packed off Chou 21-19, 21-11, Chi Yu Jen of Chinese Taipei upset Lanier 21-17, 21-19, and Kodai Naraoka retired against compatriot Kenta Nishimoto while trailing 6-21, 5-7.

With the India Open 2026 moving to a much bigger stadium this year, the focus on the opening day was on the all-Indian clash between Sen and Shetty. The 24-year-old Indian Oil Corporation employee stepped on the accelerator from the very start as he opened up a 7-1 lead in the first game, dominating the net exchanges, and did not allow his young opponent to settle down.

It was only at the end of the first game that Shetty began to find his rhythm and won six straight points to close the gap from 6-17 to 12-17, but that was too little too late.

Shetty started well in the second game as he opened up a 5-1 lead with Sen, this time struggling to control his strokes due to the side-way drift. But then the 2021 World Championships bronze medalist used his stick smashes to make the tall Shetty bend and followed it up with a tap to kick-start his comeback in the game.



before wrapping the match without much ado.

"The first match in any tournament is very important, and the conditions were a bit tricky. Since this is a big hall, we were thinking that the conditions would be slow, but the shuttle was travelling fast. Also, it's quite cold, and I was happy that I was warmed up well for the start of the match," said Sen, who will now face Nishimoto in the second round.

Before Sen took the court, Treesa and Gayatri provided a winning start to the hosts' campaign with a commanding performance. The world No. 21 Indian combination was hardly under any pressure throughout the 42-minute clash against the Thai pairing.

The Indian combination will now face seventh seeds Li Yi Jing and Luo Xu Min of China, who defeated Francesca Corbett and Jennie Gai of the USA 21-12, 21-8.

Also advancing to the second round were the men's doubles pairing of Hariharan Amsakarunan and MR Arjun, as they defeated the Malaysian combination of Ong Yew Sin and Teo Ee Yi 21-15, 21-18 in the opening round. They will next face fourth seeds Liang Wei Keng and Wang Chang of China.

Meanwhile, Shruti Mishra and Priya Konjengbam, finalists in women's doubles in National Championships, saved a total of five match-points but could not convert the one match point they earned to go down 21-11, 20-22, 24-22 in an hour and eight minutes against Lui Lok Lok and Tsang Hiu Yan of Hong Kong China.

Facing the World No. 31 Hong Kong combination, Shruti and Priya fought back from a game down to save a match point in the second game and forced a decider. In the third and final game, the Indian combination was for an all-attack strategy to save four match points and even earned one themselves.

But a lucky net chord helped the Hong Kong pairing to save that match point, and then two drive errors meant that the Indians were ousted in the opening round itself.

Former World Champion PV Sindhu, men's singles stars Kidambi Srikanth and HS Prannoy will kick off their campaign on Wednesday. Third seeds in men's doubles, Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, received a walkover in the opening round after the USA's Chen Zhi Yi and Presley Smith withdrew.

SAI's Target Asian Games Group (TAGG) to power India's karate push ahead of 2026 Asiad

NEW DELHI : A bronze medal in a top-level karate competition abroad is fuelling India's aspirations for the sport in the upcoming Asian Games in Japan, with intervention by the Sports Authority of India (SAI) helping practitioners of the sport dream big.

Alisha Subudhi's historic bronze medal at the World Karate Federation (WKF) Series A Karate Championship in Tbilisi, Georgia, has highlighted that structured support towards non-mainstream sports disciplines can reap major benefits if constant backing persists.

The Sports Authority of India (SAI), particularly through the Target Asian Games Group (TAGG) scheme, has been supporting combat sports disciplines like karate, where India has not delivered major results at the highest international level in the past.

Alisha, supported via the TAGG scheme, became the first Indian woman to medal at a Karate 1 - Series A event, defeating her Croatian opponent 8-0 in the bronze medal contest this month. A robust high-performance ecosystem was created through efforts from SAI through targeted funding, elite coaching exposure, and intensive national camps.

SAI had funded a senior National Coaching Camp in Lucknow in November-December 2025, putting forward assistance of Rs. 1.2 crore under the ANSF scheme under the Assistance to National Sports Federations (ANSF) scheme, featuring 48 athletes.

The 45-day camp, held at the SAI Regional Centre, Lucknow, focused on match simulations, tactical sharpening, psychological conditioning, and recovery protocols. Alisha was a part of the camp.

"I especially thank TAGG for giving the financial support and organising an excellent national camp in Lucknow towards our preparation for the WKF Series A," the 23-year-old Alisha said in a release issued by SAI.

In the absence of a recognised National Sports Federation for karate, the Sports Authority of India ensured uninterrupted athlete preparation by constituting a Karate Organising Committee to manage selection trials, camps, and international exposure, ensuring that performance pathways remained intact.

The committee had also conducted Open National Selection Trials in the Senior Category from 12-14 October at the SAI Training Centre in NEHU Campus, Shillong. The trials were fully managed by the Karate Organising Committee of SAI, ensuring compliance with international norms, anti-doping rules, and videography-based evaluation.

With major competitions like the Asian Games looming later this year, the sustained backing through TAGG and SAI-led national camps is expected to play a decisive role, especially in non-mainstream sports where India has not been able to make a mark internationally in the past.



'You have to keep yourself ready', KL Rahul gives life lesson to budding cricketers

VADODARA : Indian wicketkeeper batter KL Rahul was seen sharing his wisdom and experience with a group of young cricketers during Team India's training session in Vadodara, where the Men in Blue registered a four-wicket win against New Zealand in the first match of the ongoing ODI Series.

In a video shared by the BCCI on Tuesday, the 33-year-old Rahul, dressed in Team India's training kit, was seen answering questions from the budding players.

One youngster asked Rahul what to do in a situation when chances are hard to come by, to which the senior batter responded by motivating him to keep working hard and stay ready for opportunities.

"You will definitely get a chance to show your talent, whether it's in a domestic, international, or local tournament. You just have to work hard and be ready when your opportunity comes, and grab it with both your hands. As a cricketer, it's the only thing we can do," Rahul said in the video.

"It's a difficult phase for everyone when we do not get a chance,



but everyone has to go through that phase. No one can stay at the top forever. There will be anger and frustration, but try to snap out of it and do what is in your control, and leave the rest to God. Whenever God gives you a chance, use it wisely," he added.

Rahul played a fiery knock in the first ODI at the BCA Stadium. He finished the game in style by hitting two fours and a six in the 49th over to help India beat New Zealand by four wickets. Rahul scored 29 runs off just 21 balls, including two fours and a six.

KL Rahul will be in action again on Wednesday when India take on New Zealand at the Niranjan Shah Stadium in Rajkot in the second ODI of the three-match series.

Men's T20 World Cup: Four Pakistani-origin US cricketers denied visa to travel to India: Report

MUMBAI : Four Pakistani-origin cricketers, who were picked to be part of the United States team, have been denied visas to visit India, which now threatens their participation in next month's Twenty20 World Cup, a news report claimed on Tuesday.

One of the players told Telecom Asia Sport that he, along with three others, has been denied visas to travel to India for the T20 World Cup, which is being jointly hosted by India and Sri Lanka.

"Yes, it is true that three Pakistani-origin players are denied an Indian visa, which means we are unable to feature in the Twenty20 World Cup," pacer Ali Khan told (www.telecomasia.net) in a video message.

The other three players named in the 20-man USA squad for the T20 World Cup are Shayan Jahangir, Mohammad Mohsin, and Ehsan Adil, the report claimed.

According to the report, all three were born in Pakistan but are now US citizens. Under India's visa rules, all Pakistan-born people have to apply for a visa using their passport from their country of birth.

The issue means eight countries will be affected by this problem, besides the USA, players from the UAE, Oman, Nepal, Canada, England, Zimbabwe, and the Netherlands have players of Pakistani origin.

Adil was born in Sheikhupura and played three Tests and six ODIs for Pakistan between 2013 and 2015. He migrated to the USA four years ago and plays for Kingsmen USA. Khan was born in Attock in Punjab, Shayan in Karachi, and Mohsin in Mingora in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP).

The report also claimed that the issue has haunt-



ed Pakistani-origin players in the past, too, with Zulfiqar brothers -- Sikander and Saqib -- denied a visa in 2019, while another player, Shiraz Ahmed's visa delayed for the 2023 World Cup. Australia's opener Usman Khawaja (2017) and England spinners -- Rehan Ahmed and Shoaib Basheer (2024) -- have also faced visa problems in the past.

Sources in the International Cricket Council have said they are helping teams in acquiring visas, but the latest issue has increased their workload.
